FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

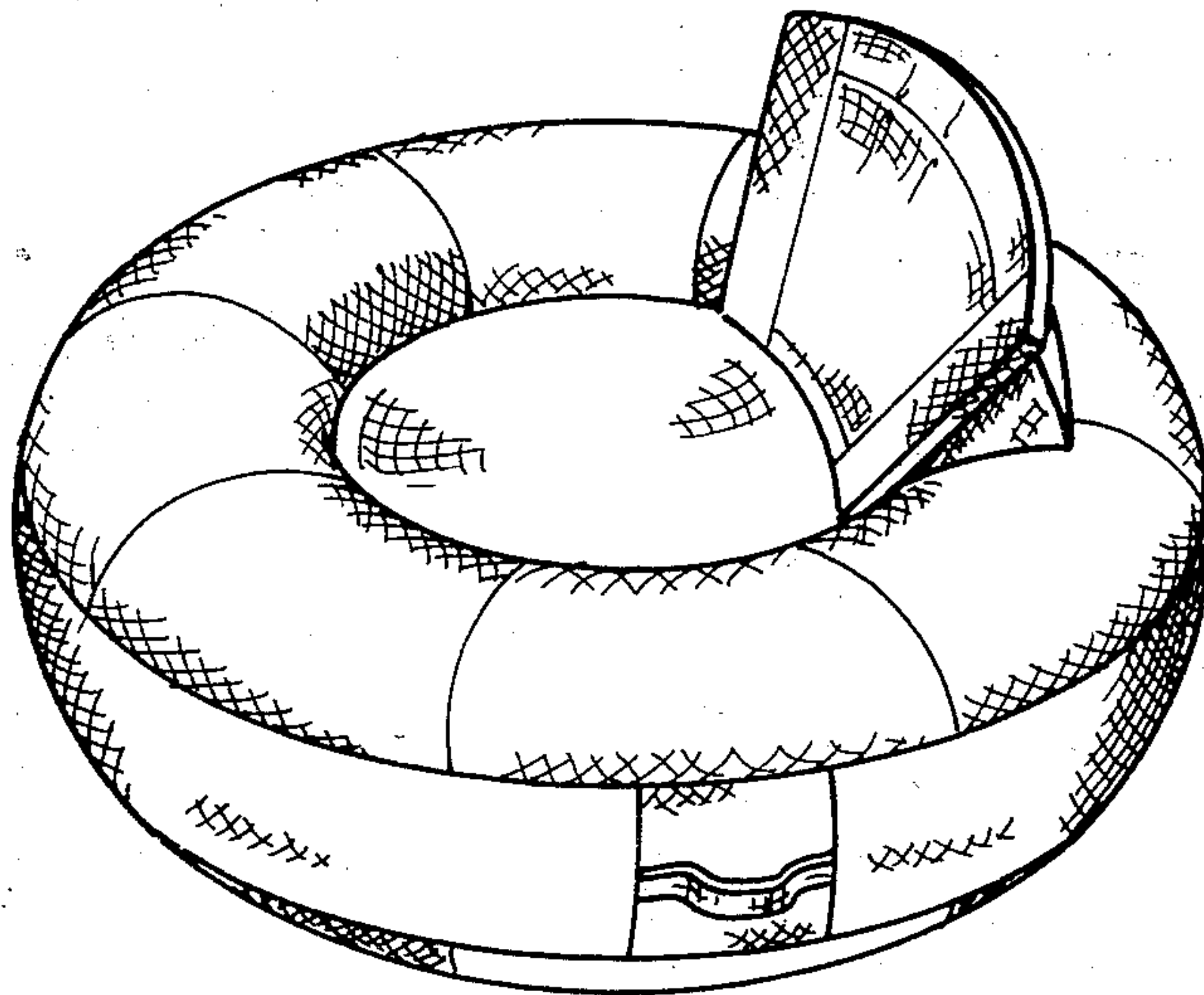
FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a perspective view thereof, with the removable back rest in exploded condition.



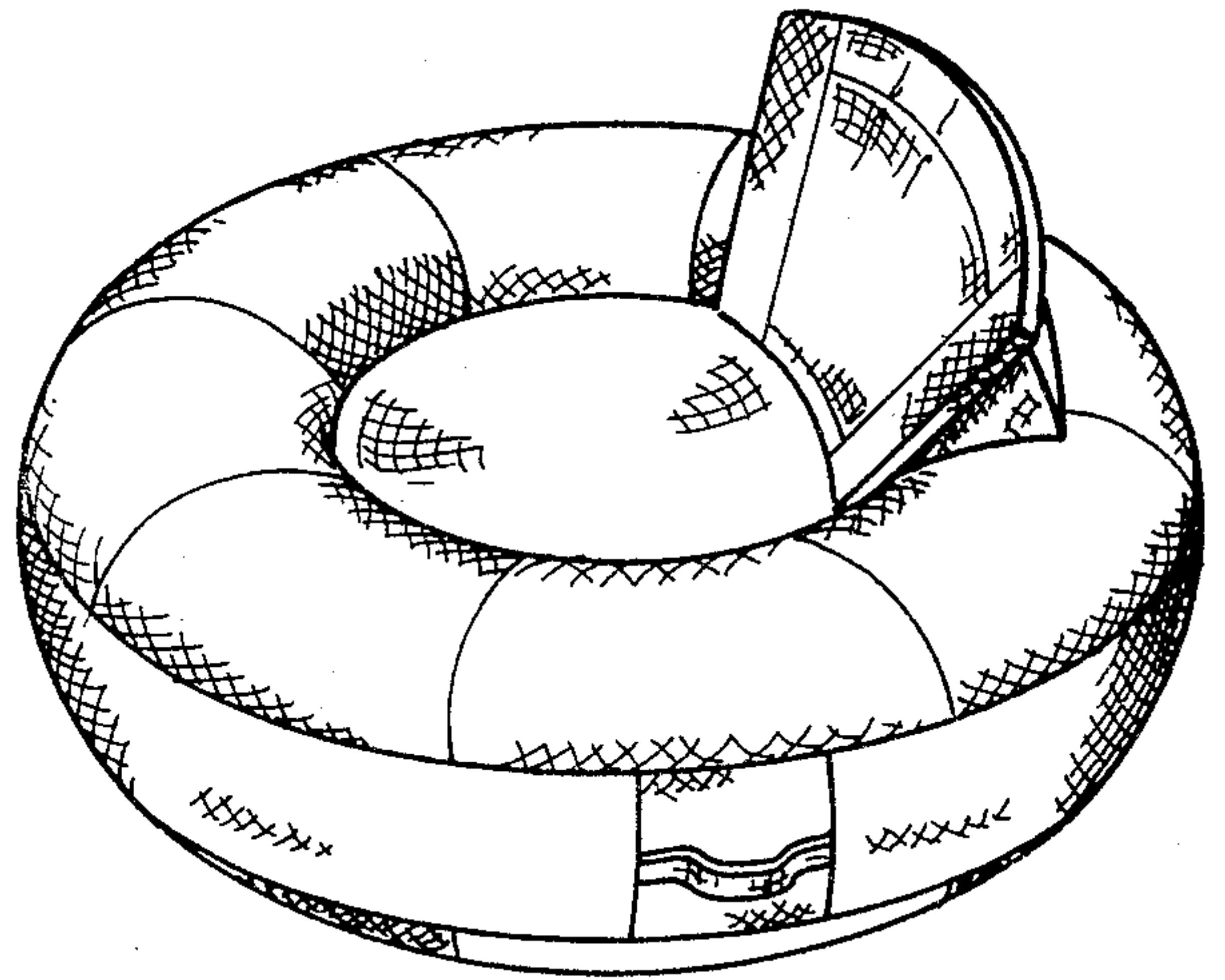

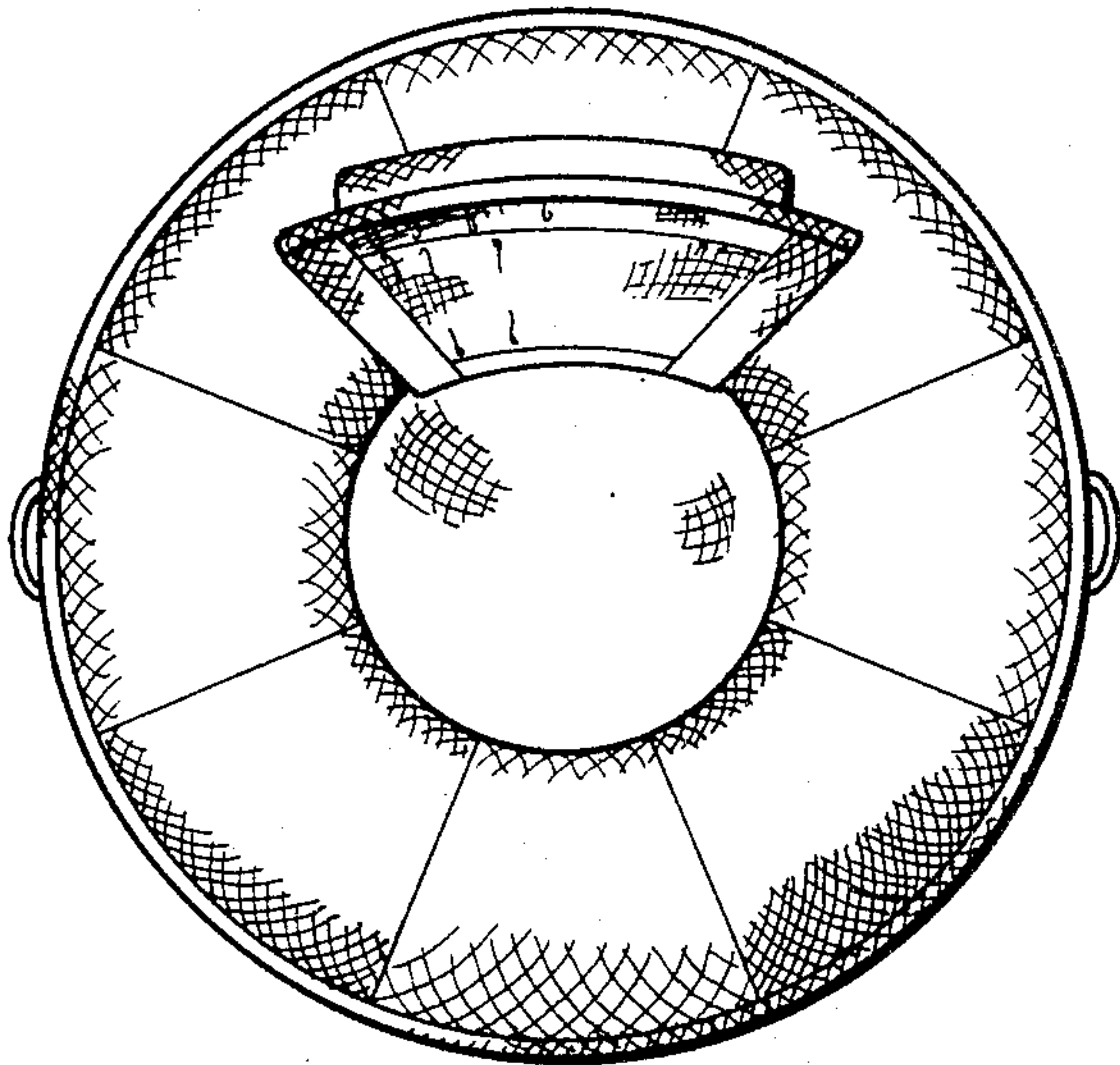

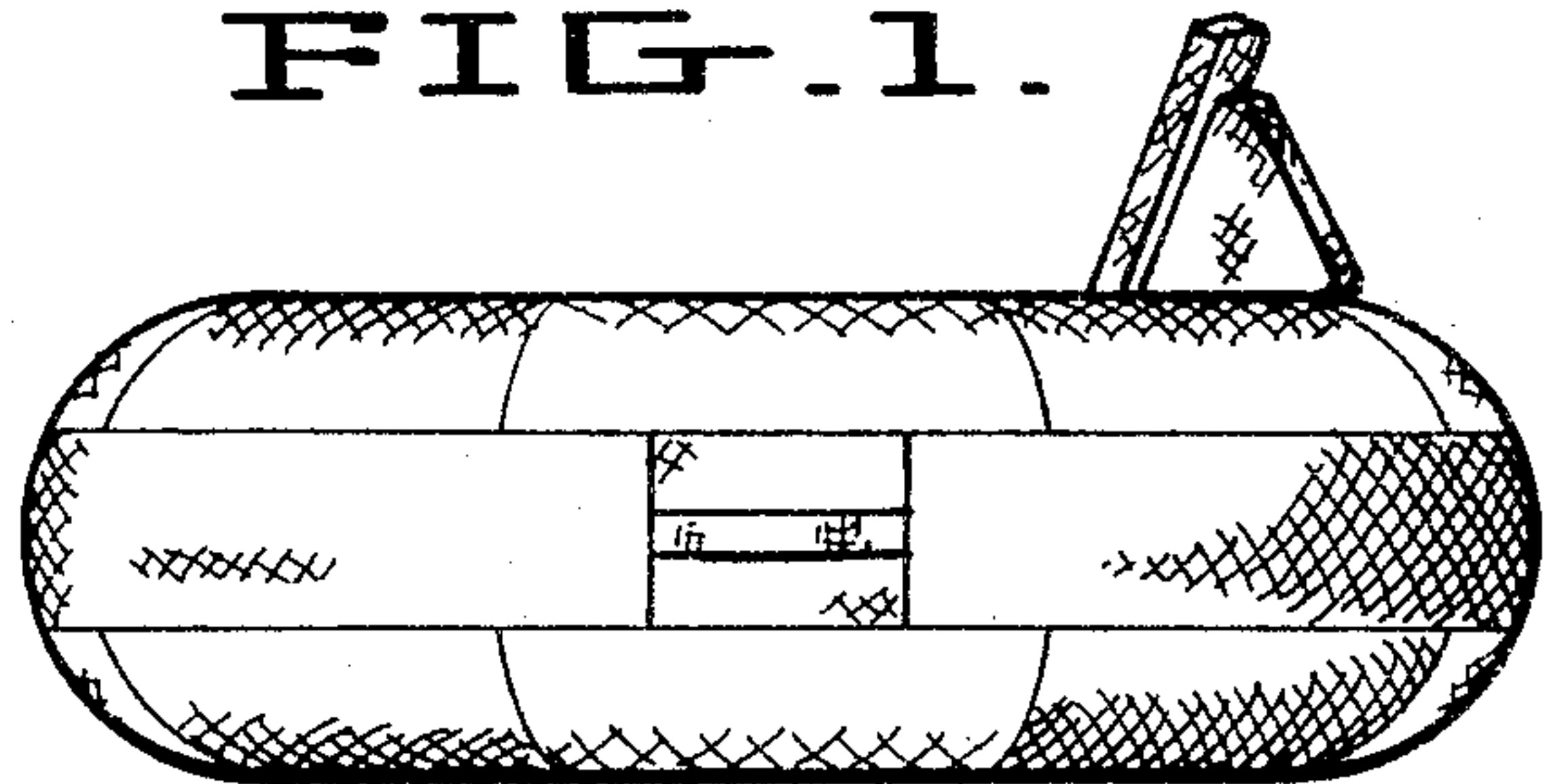

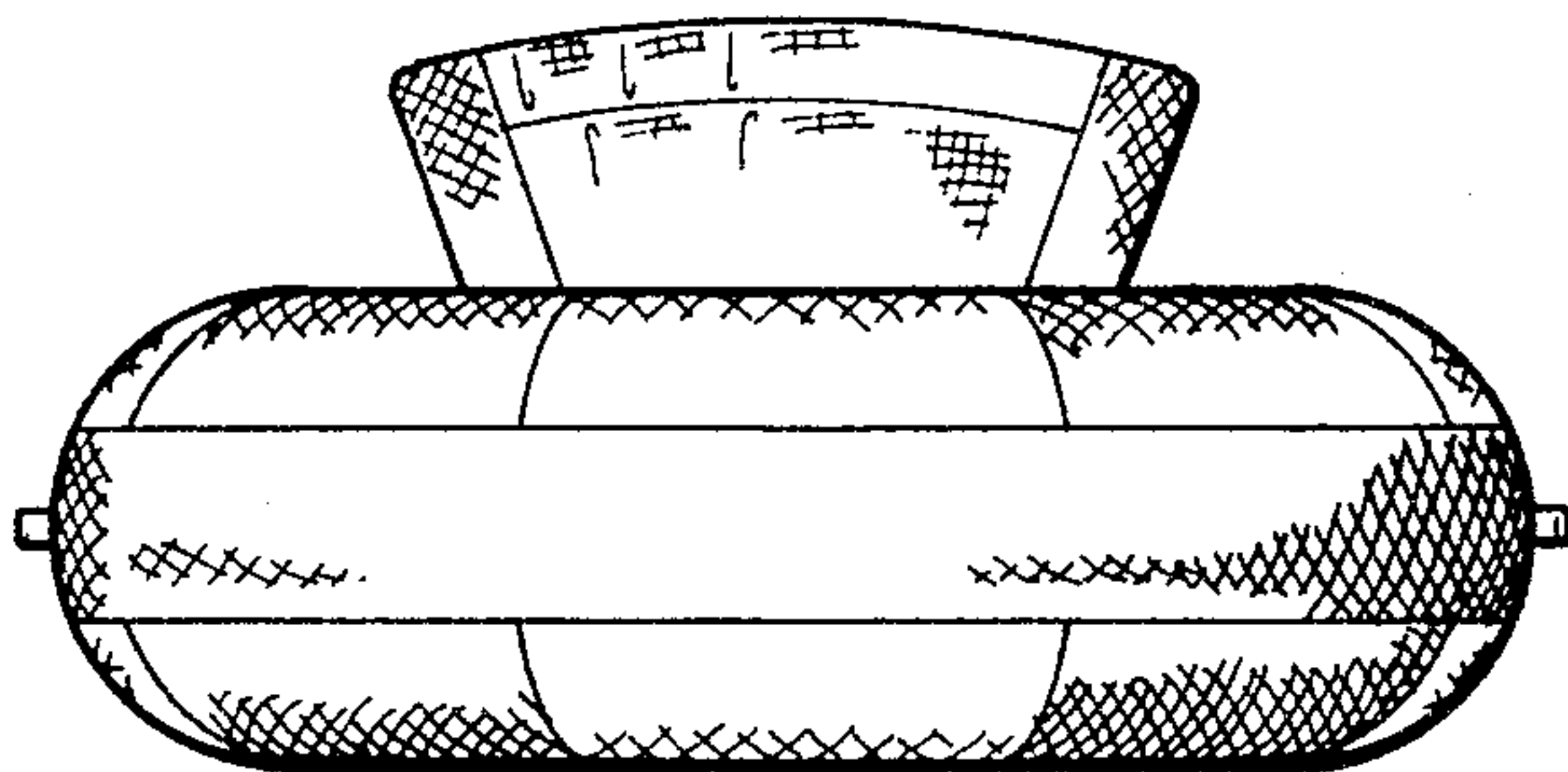

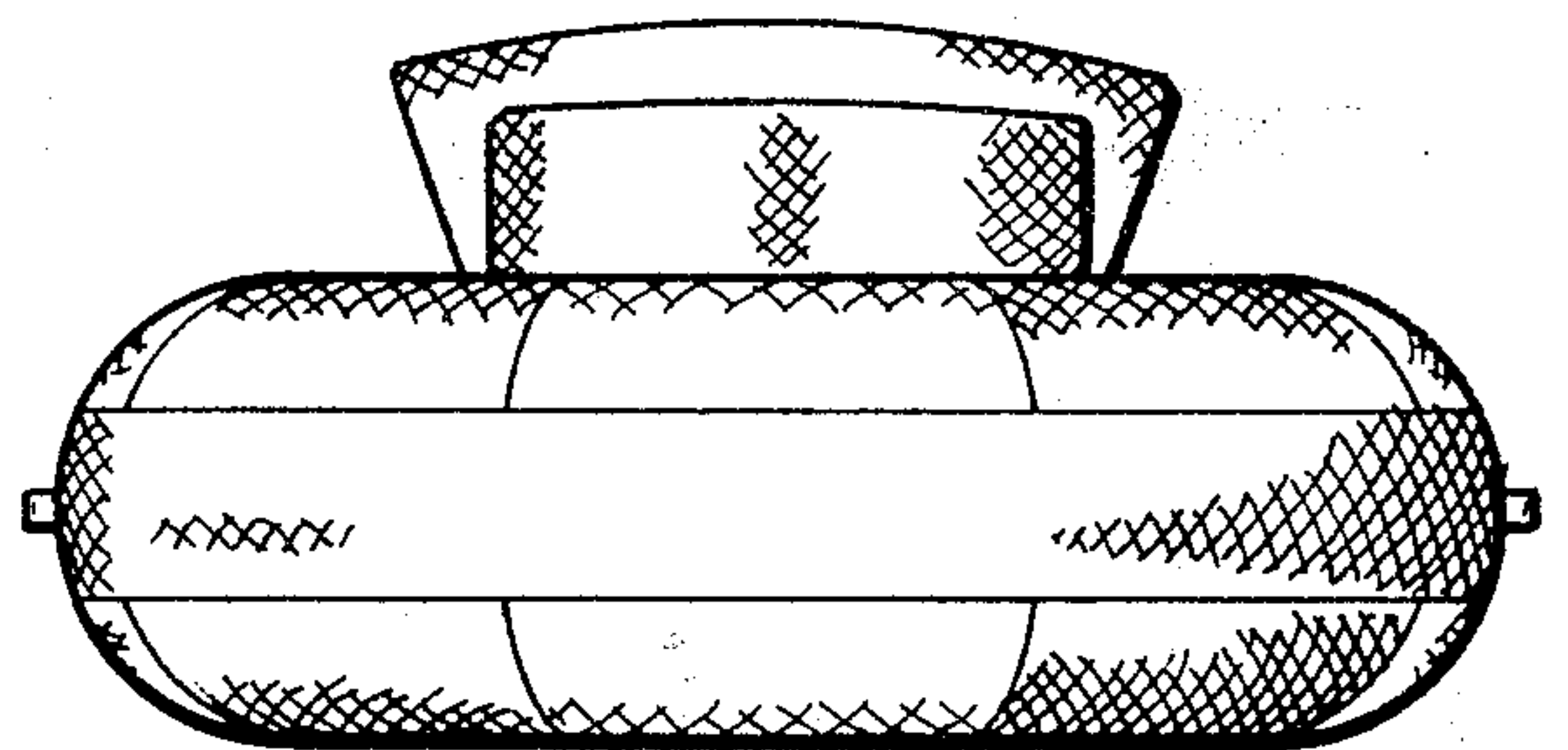

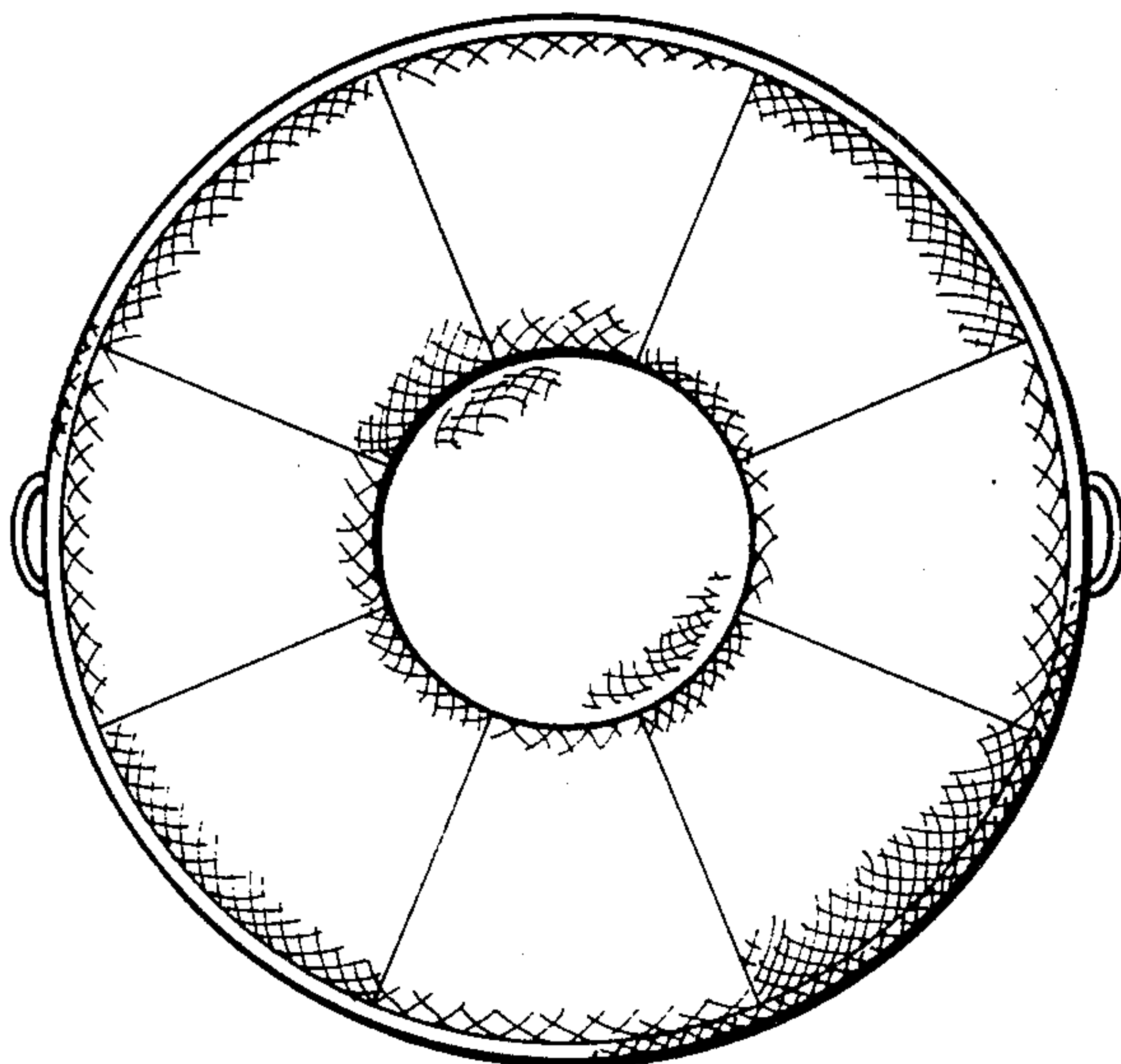

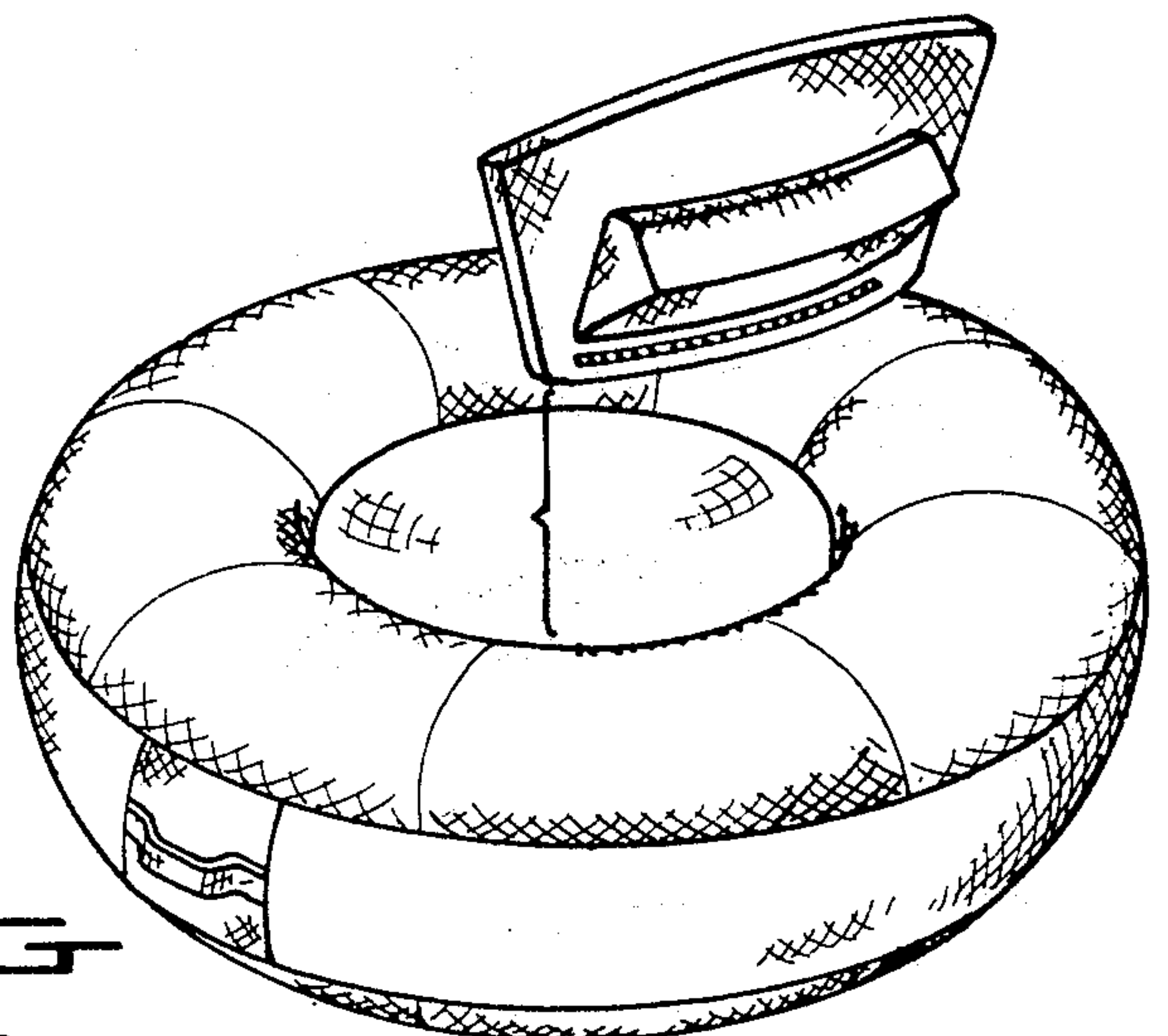
