FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of a kettle showing my new design, the side opposite is a mirror image;

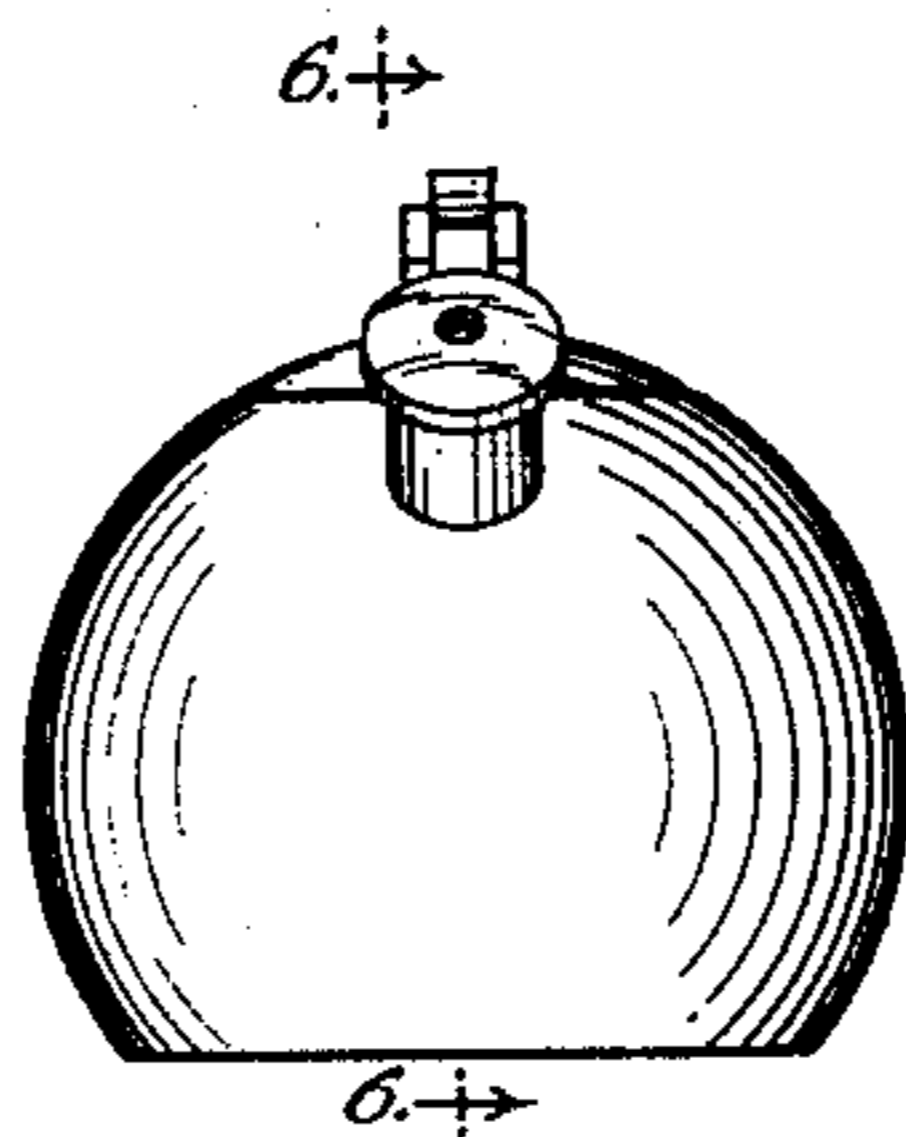
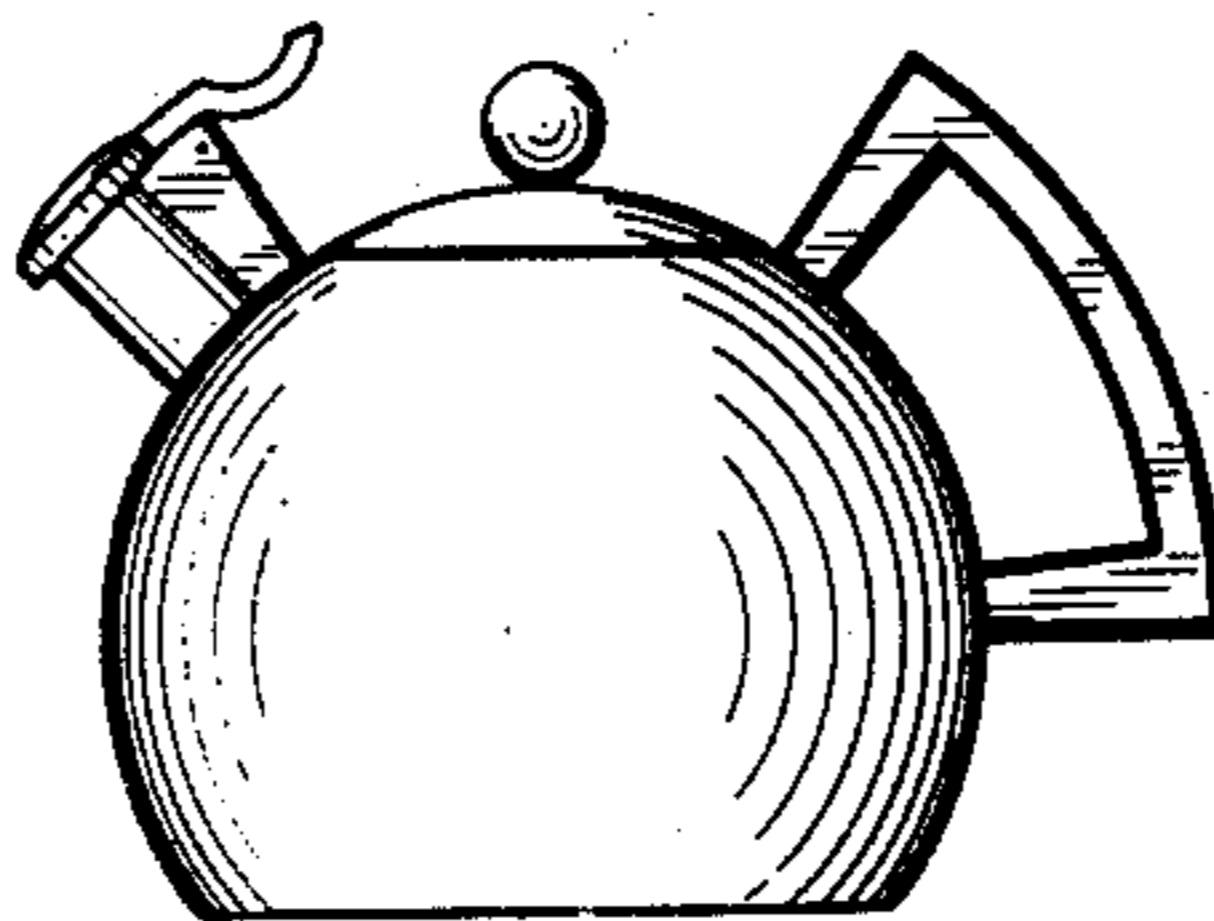
FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

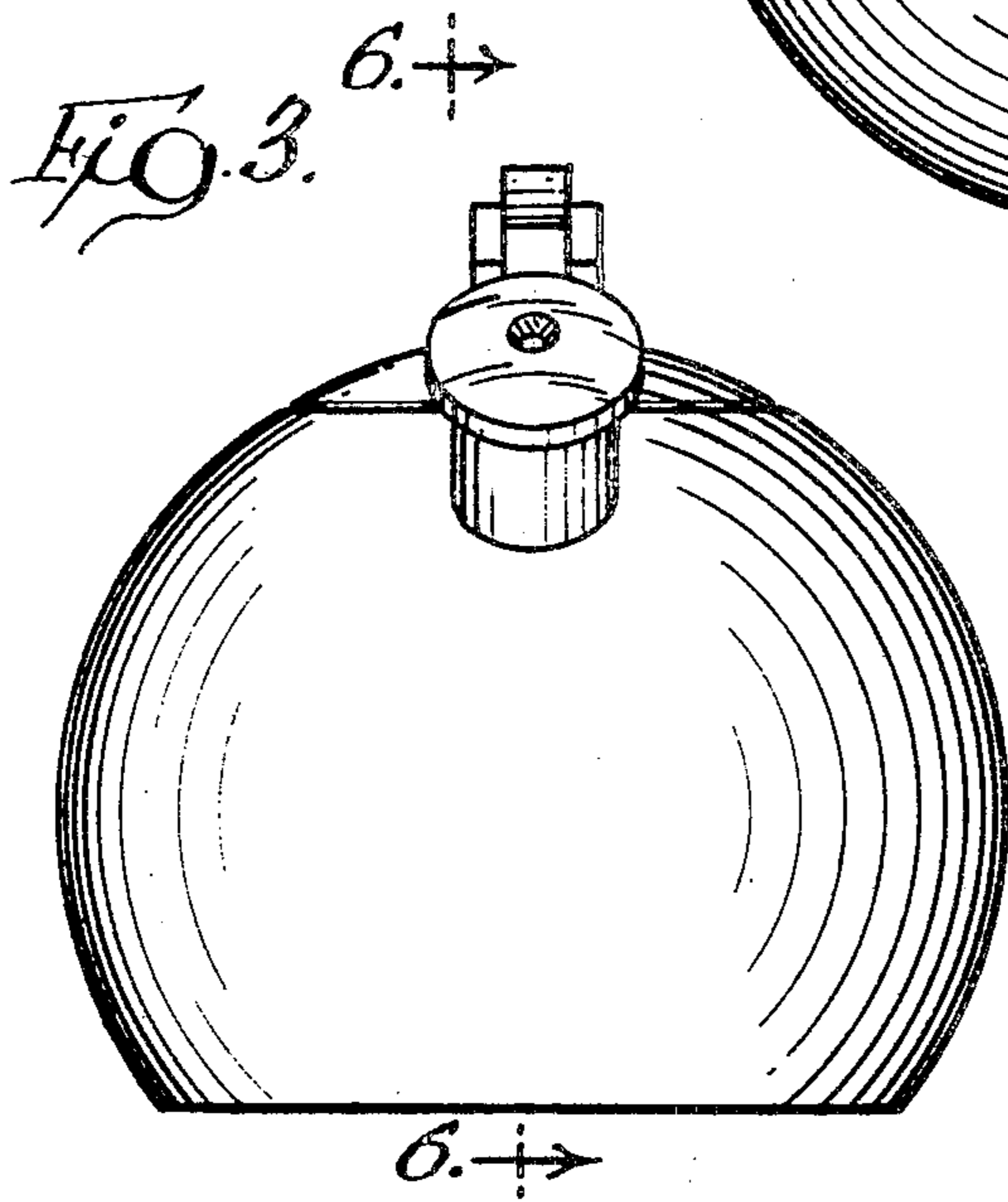
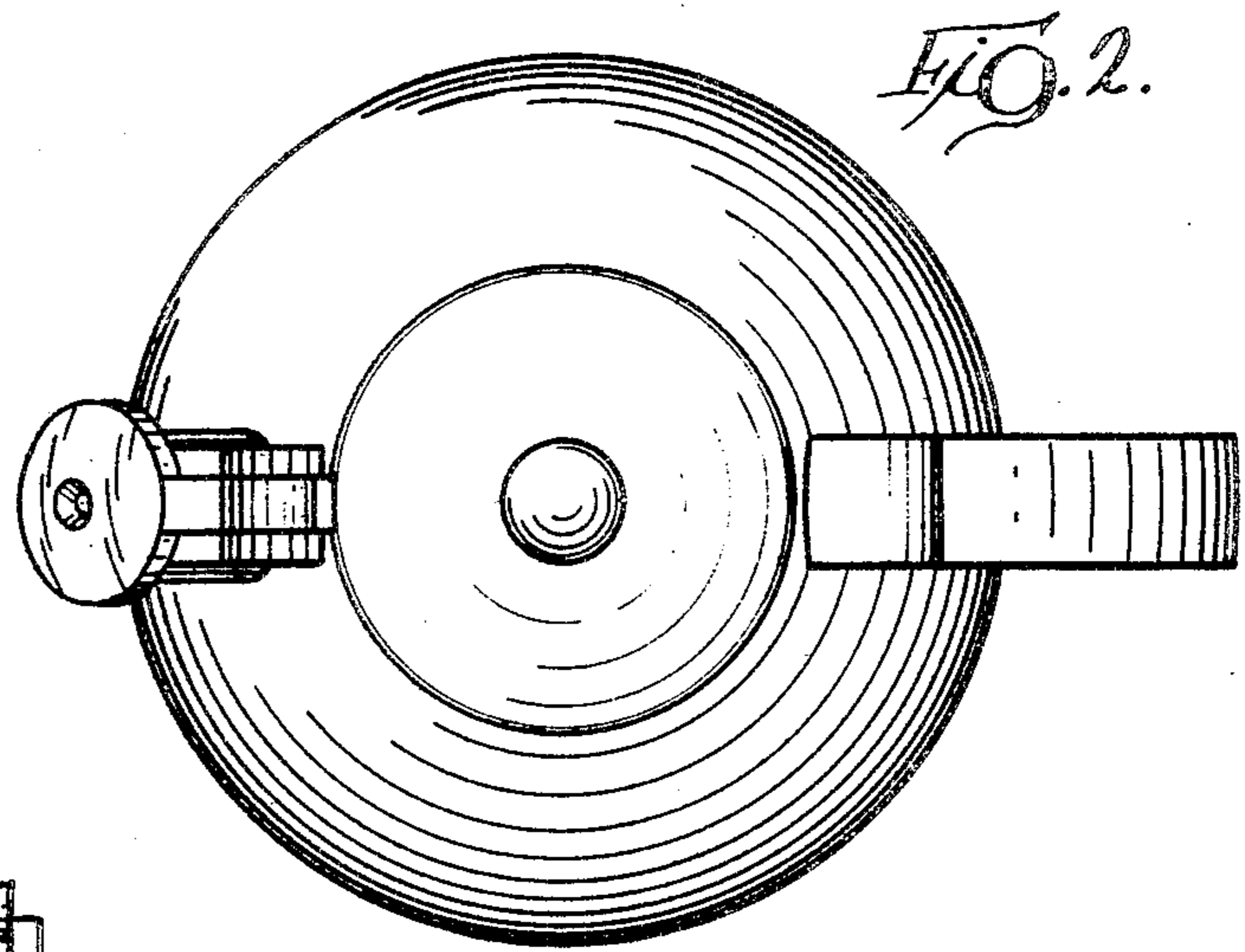
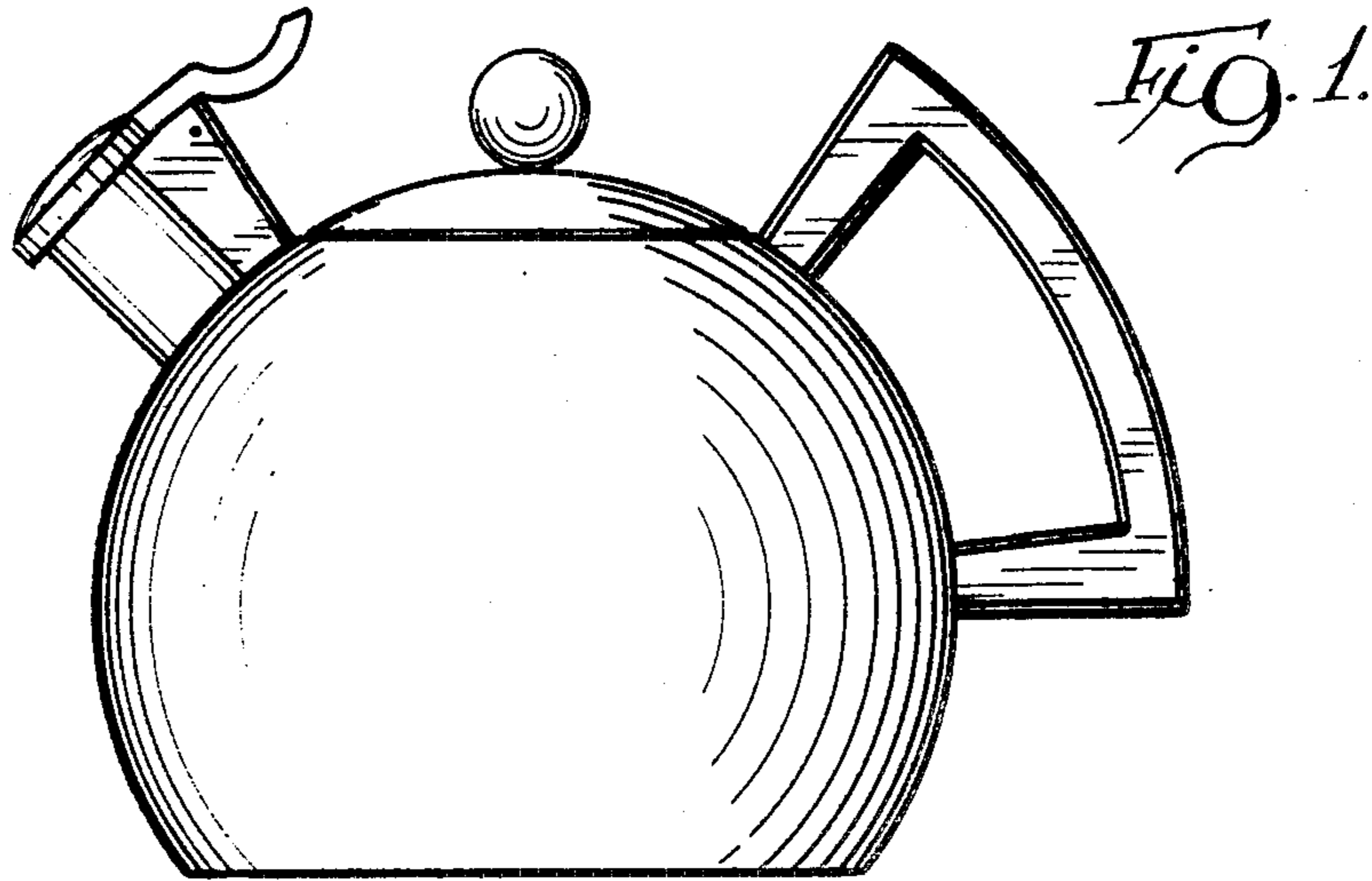
FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a cross-sectional view thereof, as viewed along line 6-6 of FIG. 3.





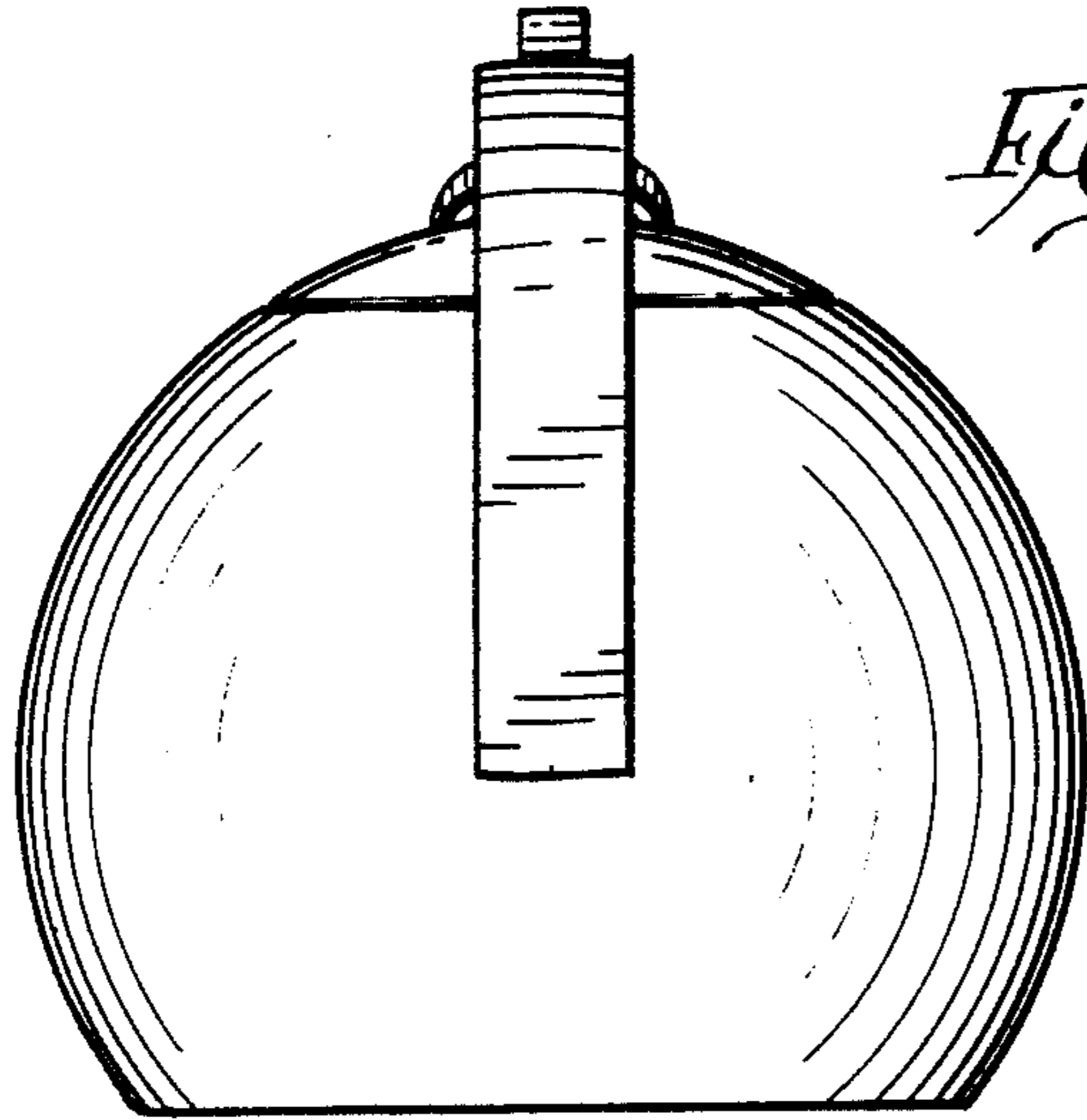

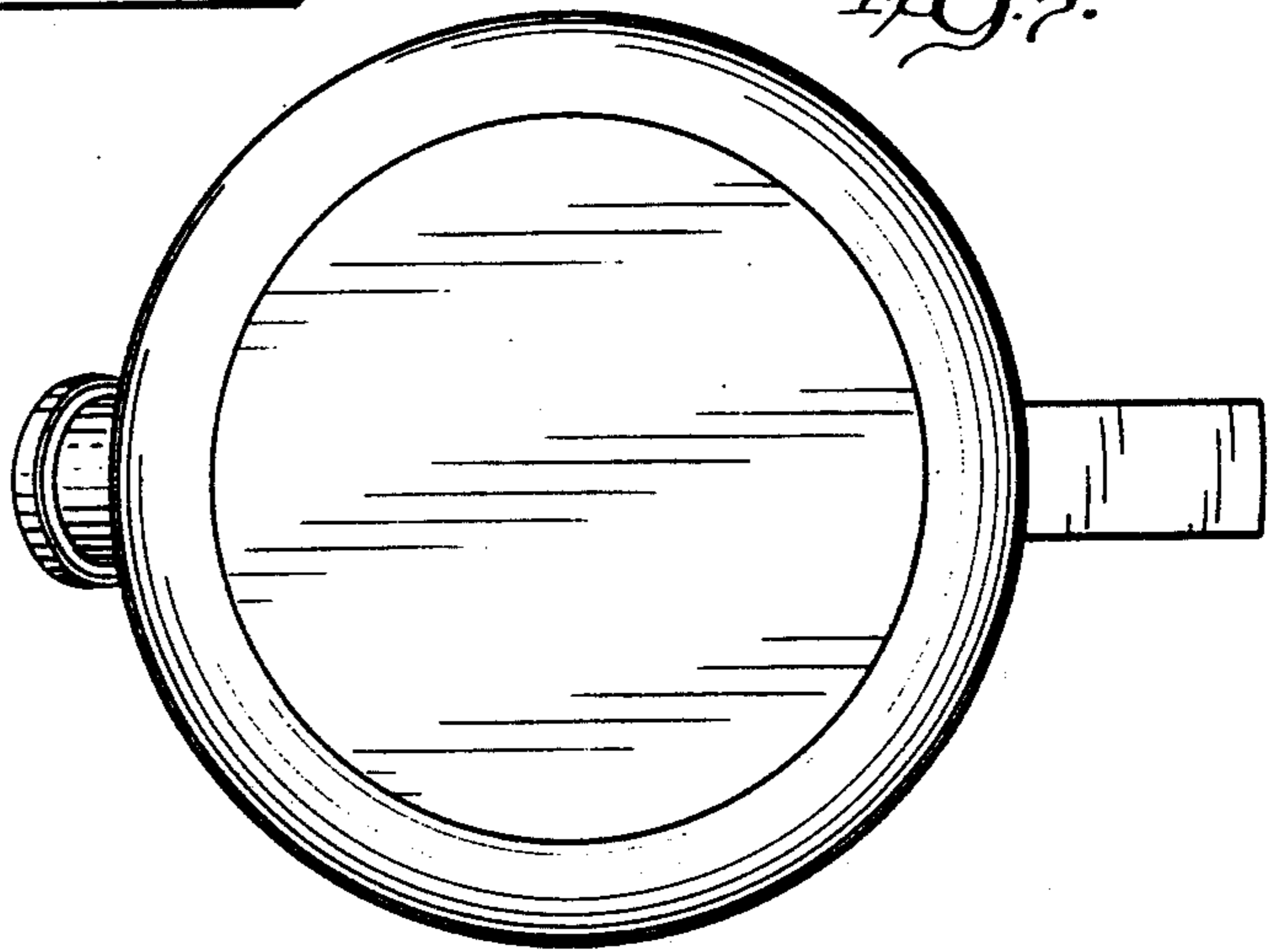

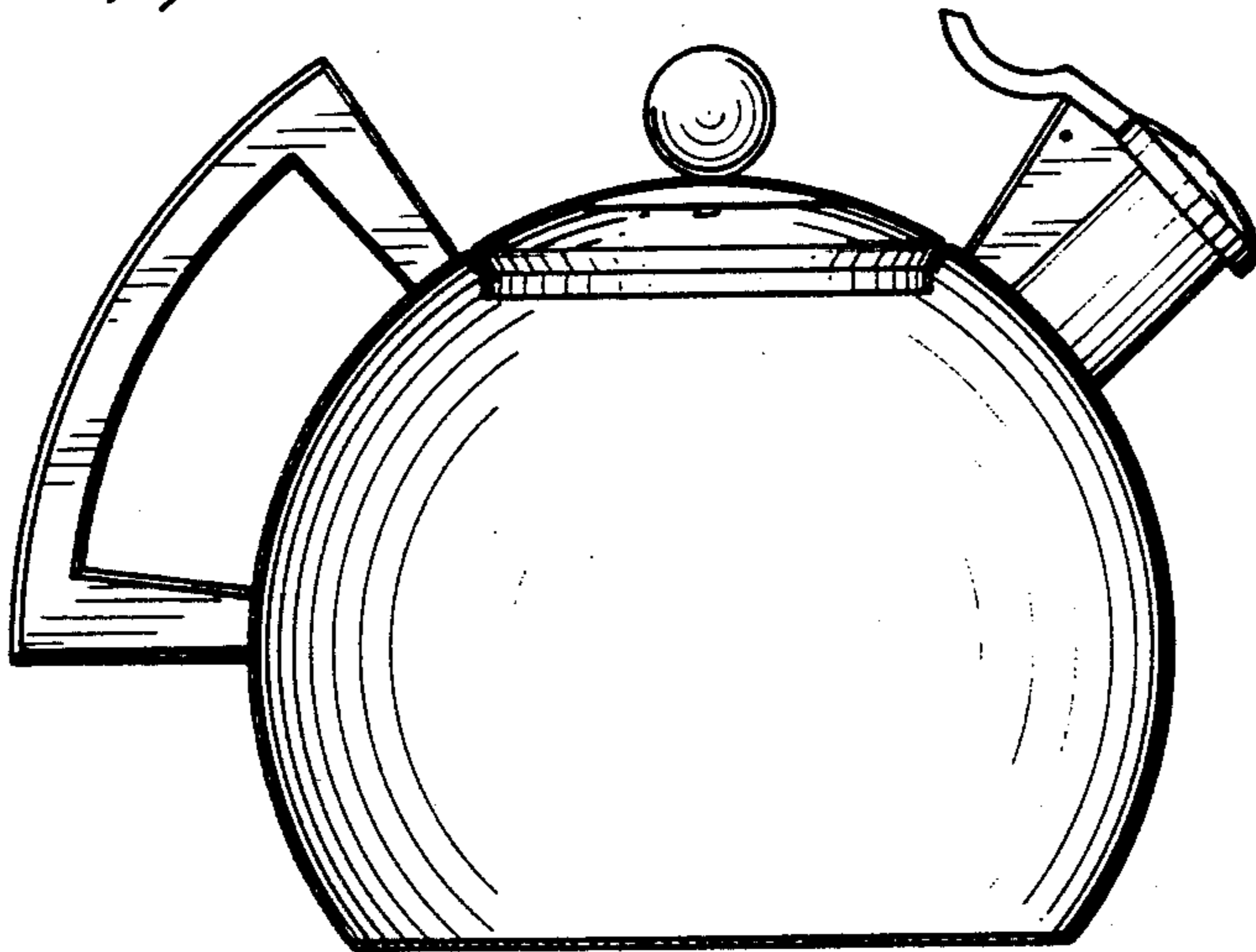
