FIG. 3 is a front side elevational view of FIG. 1, the rear side elevational view being substantially identical therewith;

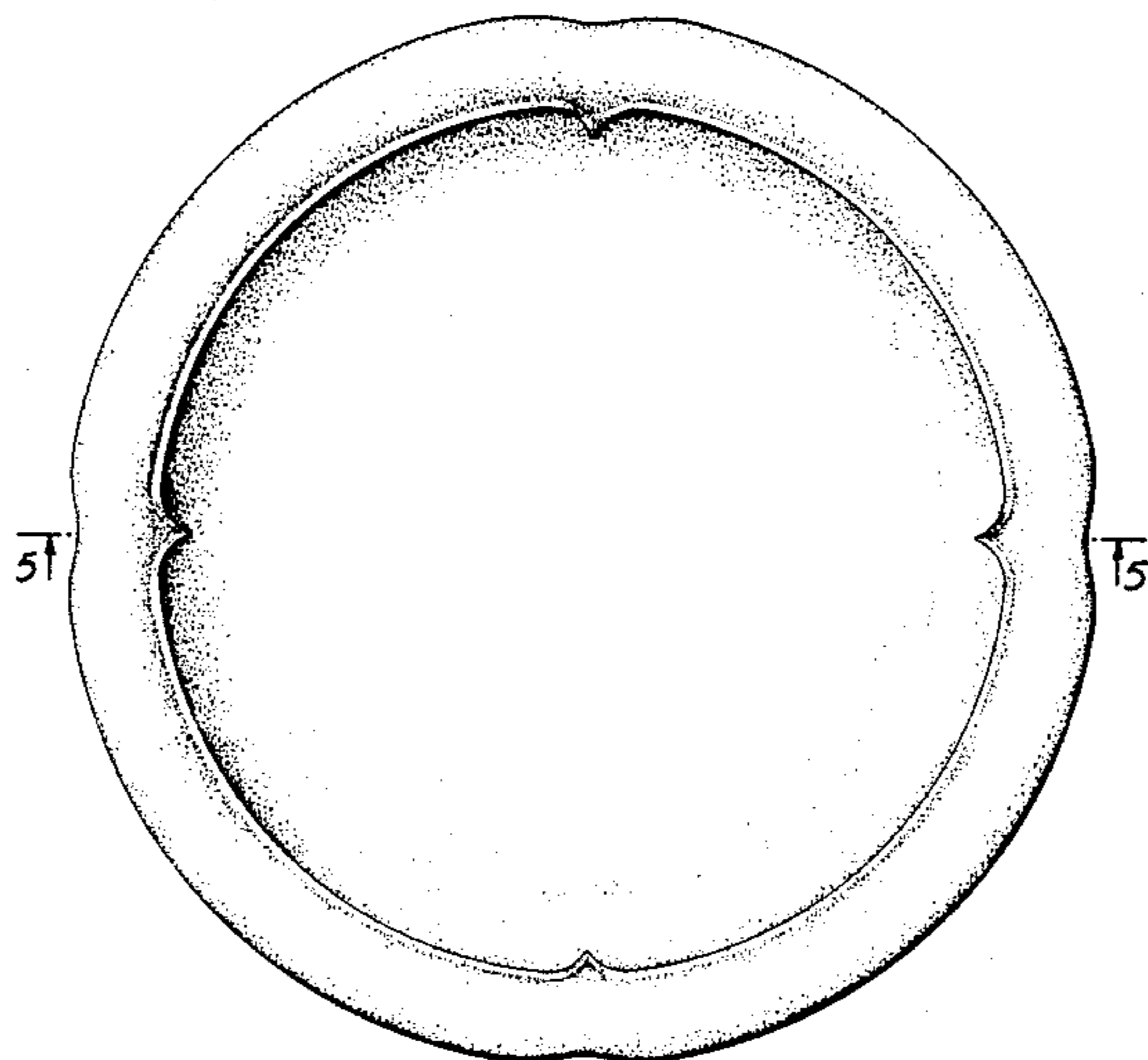
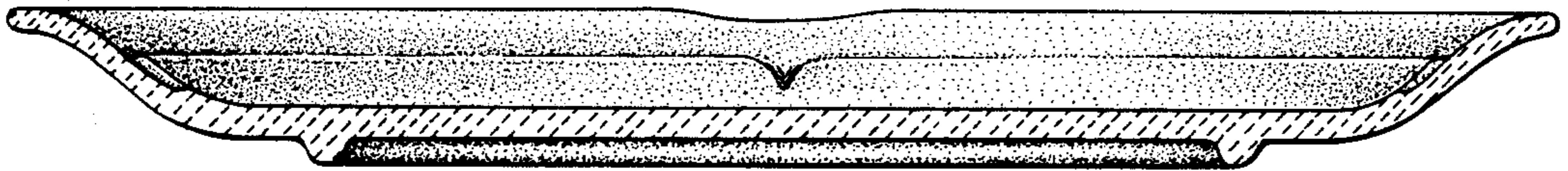
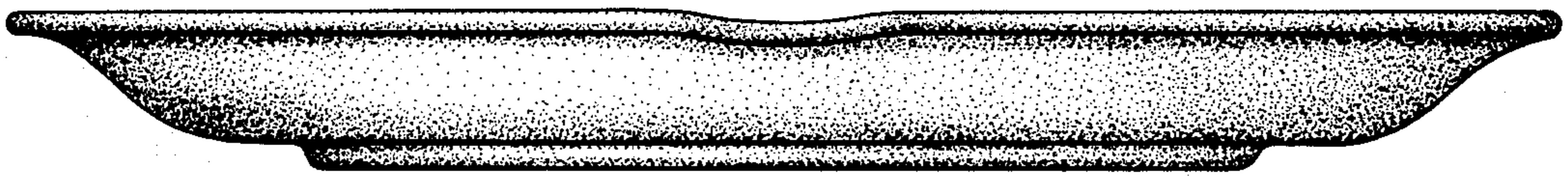
FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view of FIG. 1, the left side elevational view being substantially identical therewith;

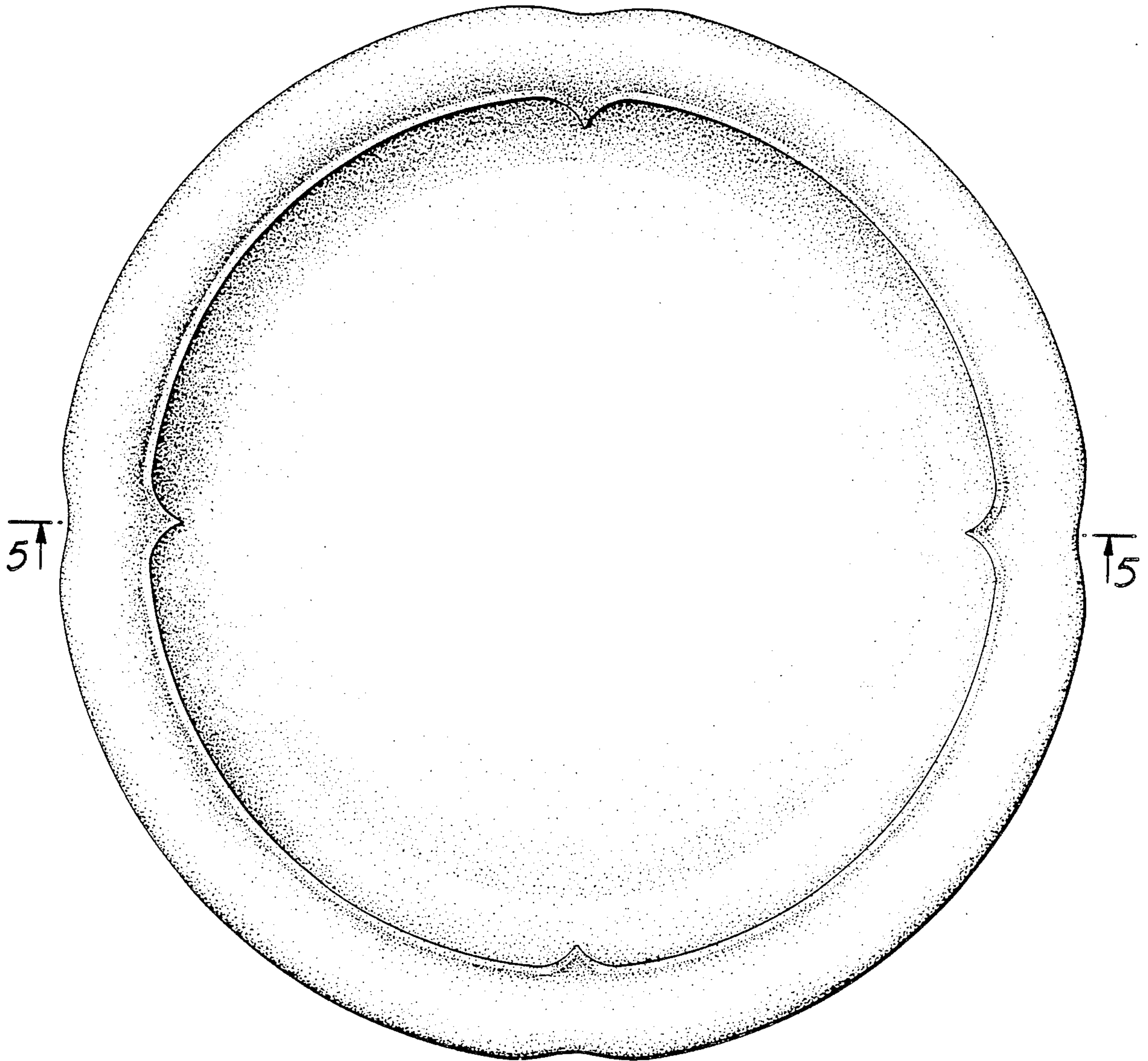

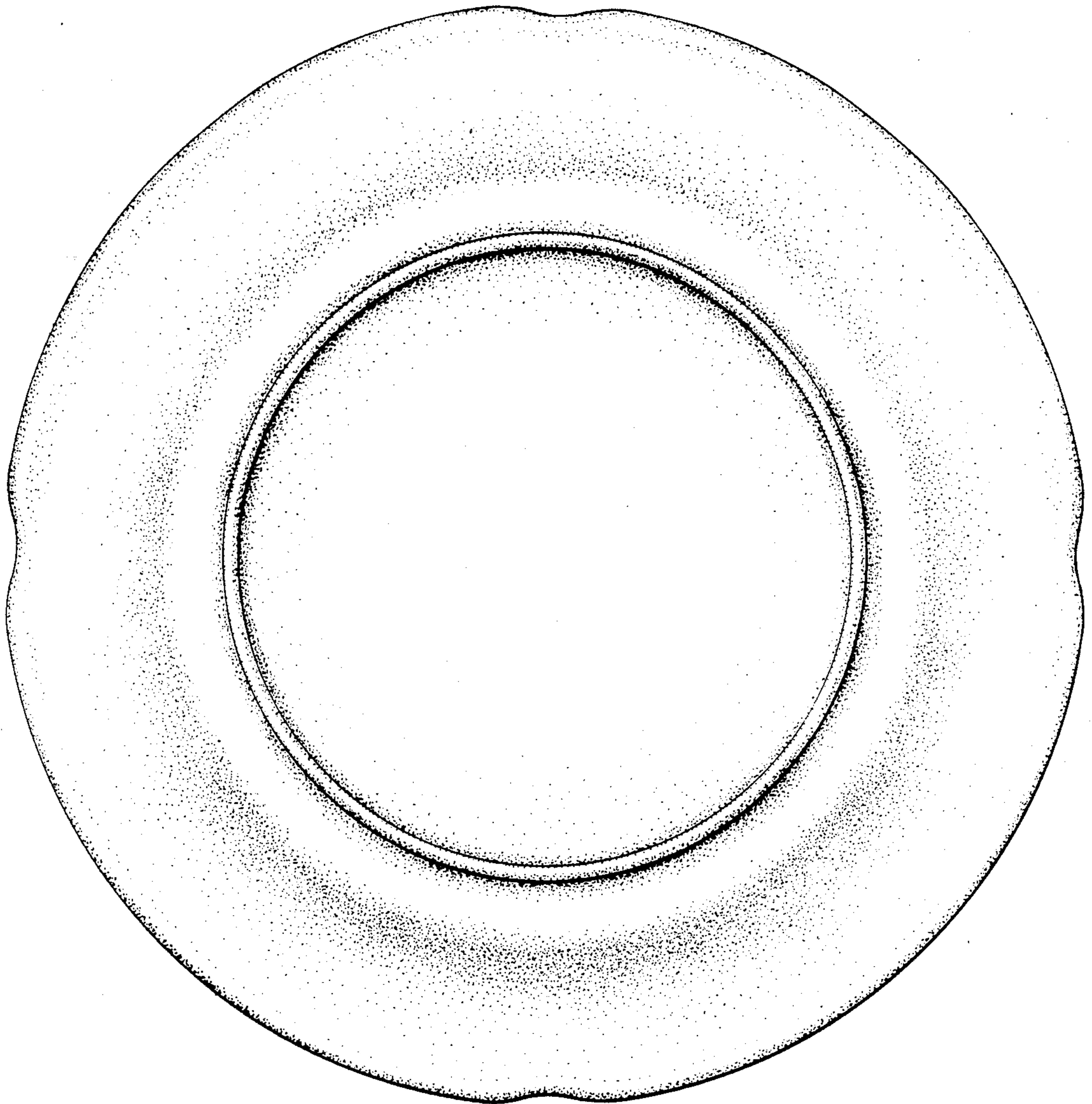

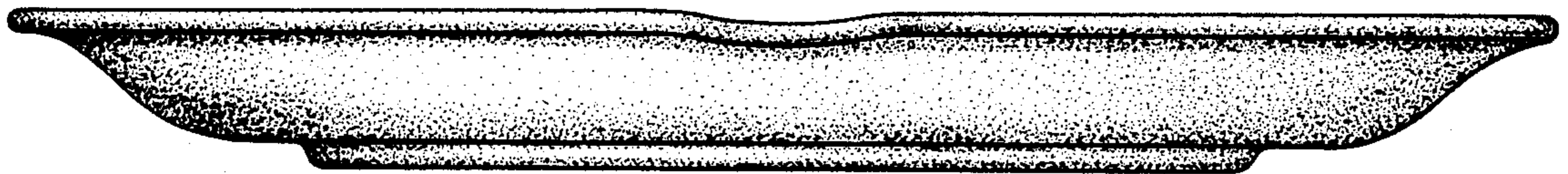

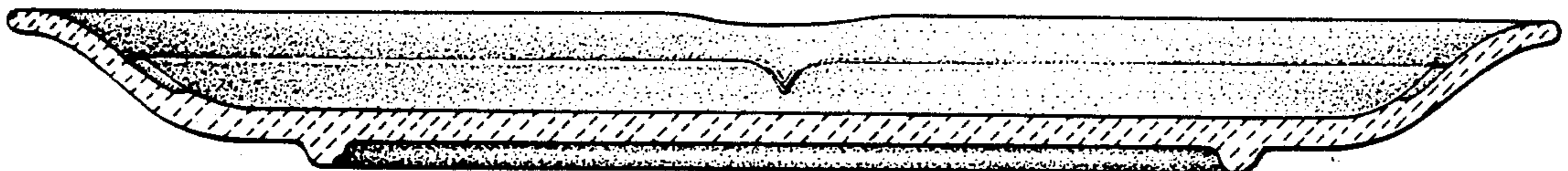
