FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a vehicular charger amplifier showing our new design;

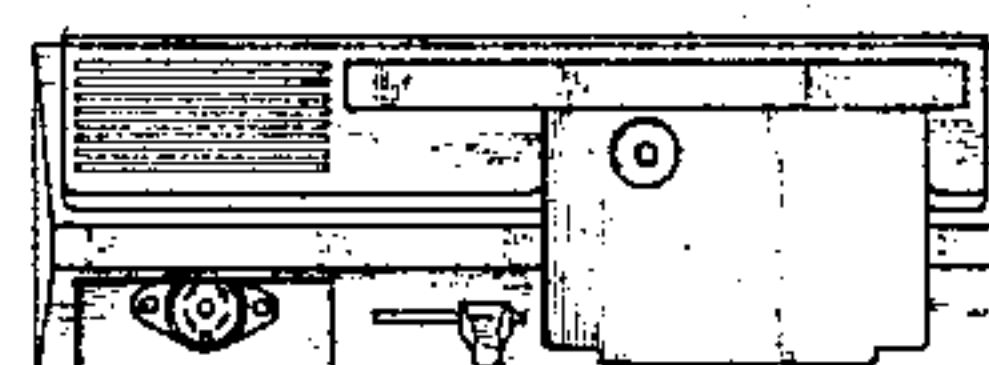
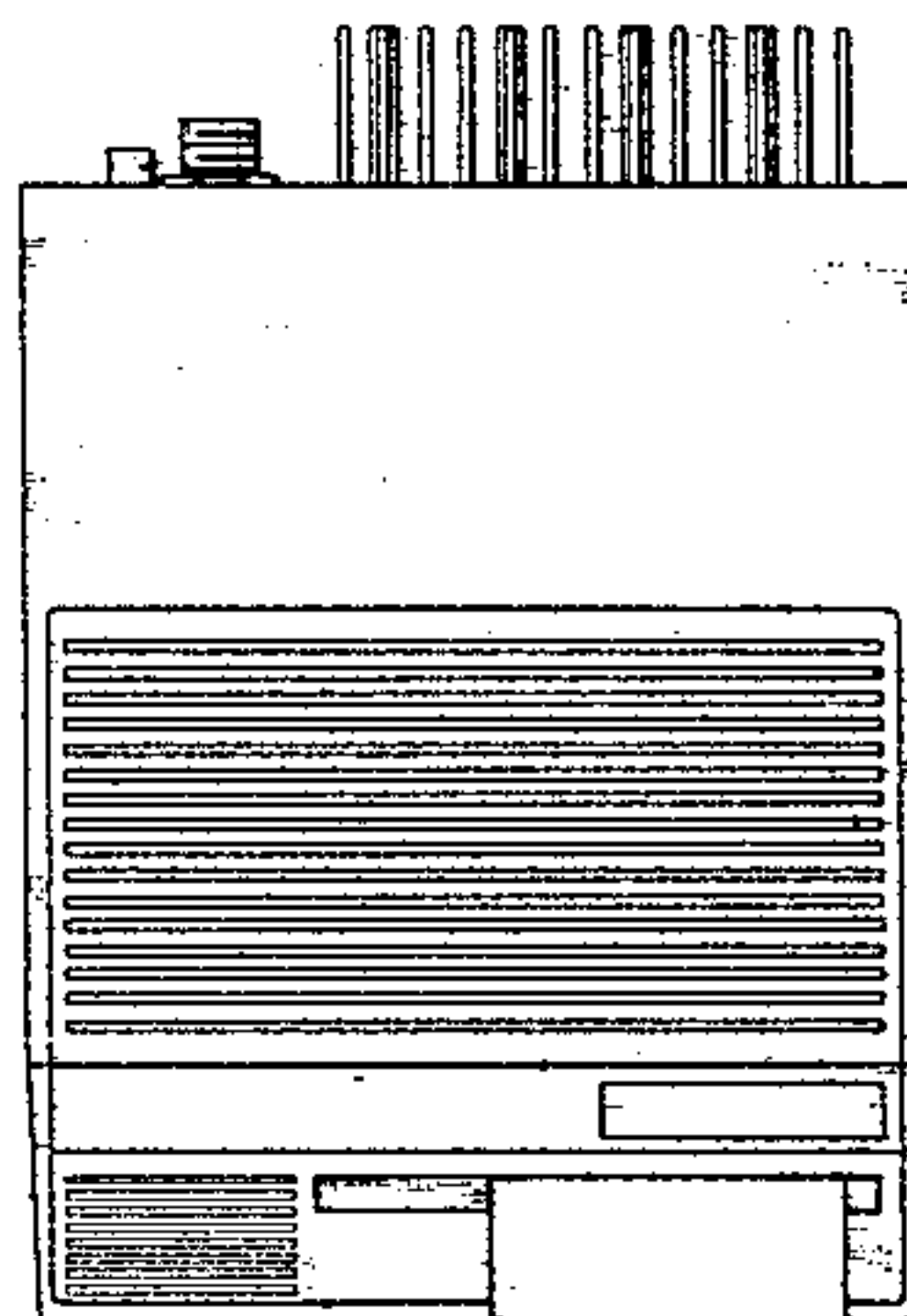
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof.



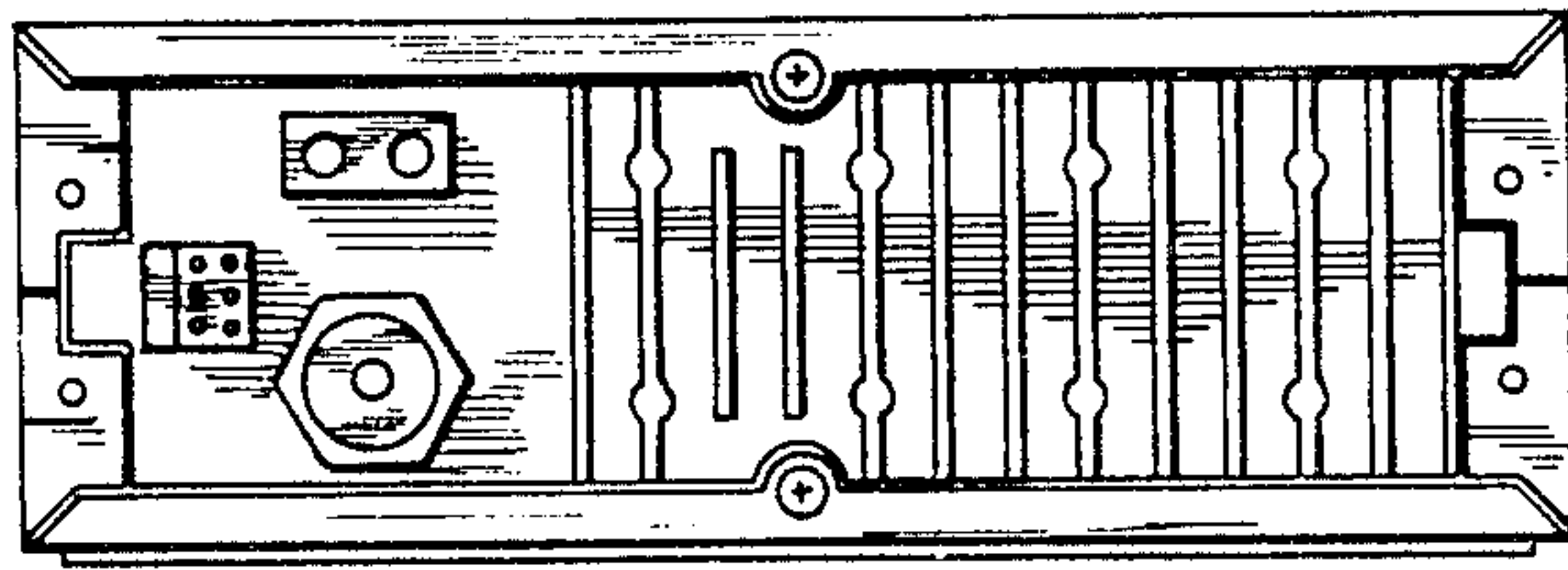

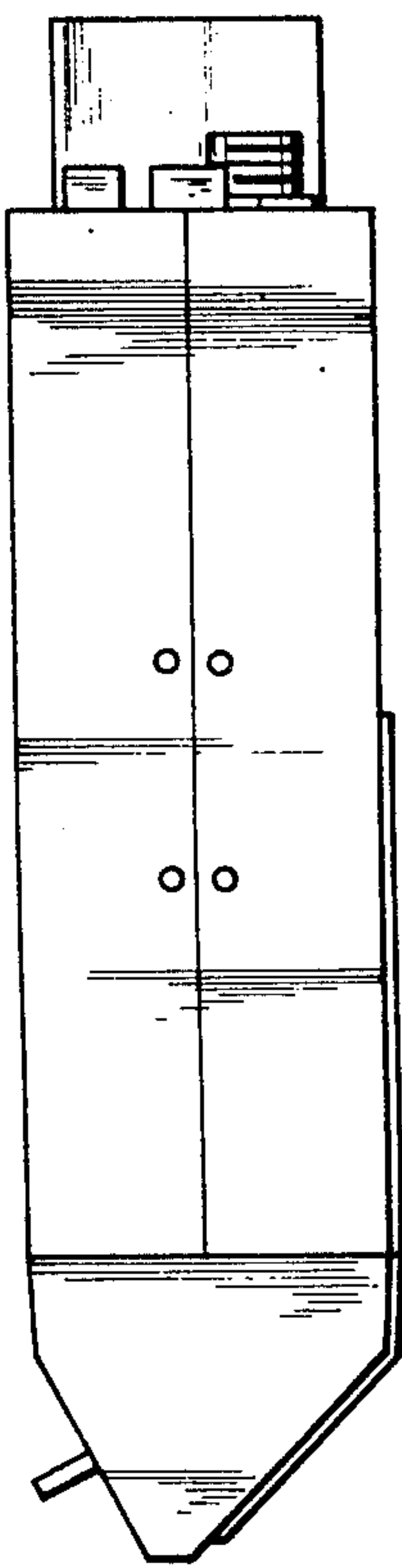

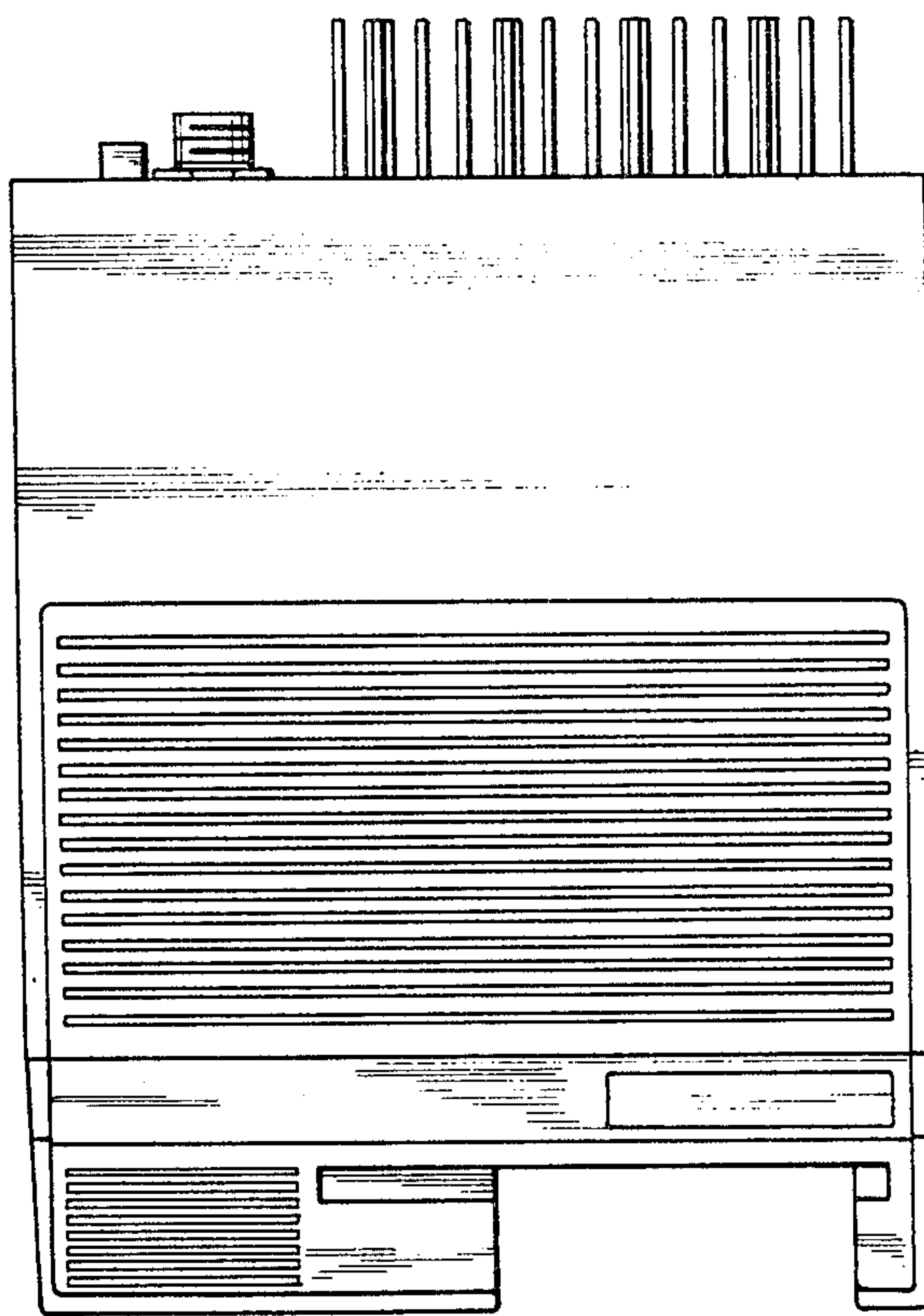

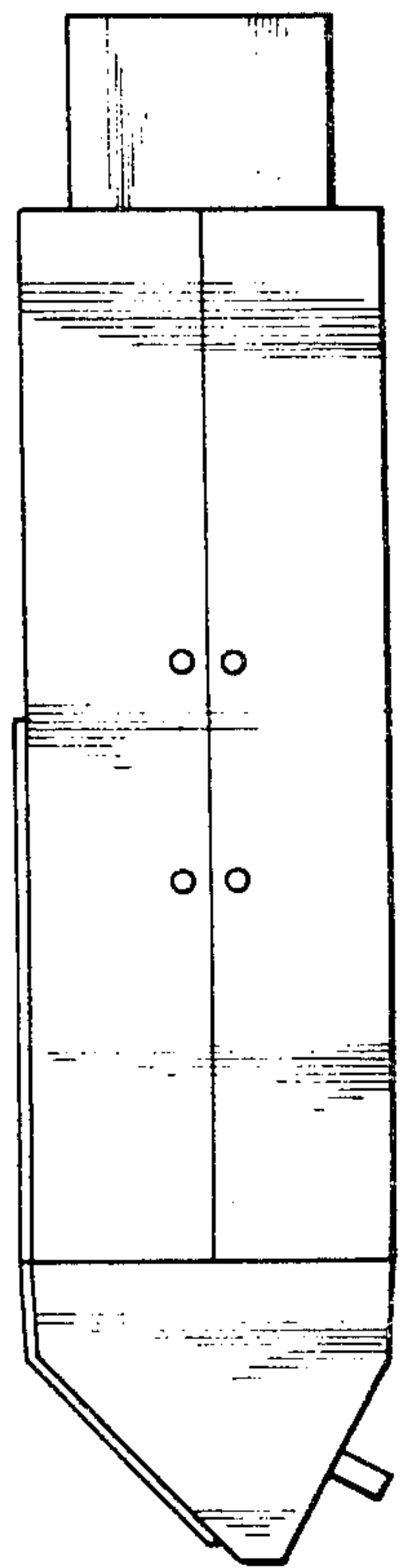

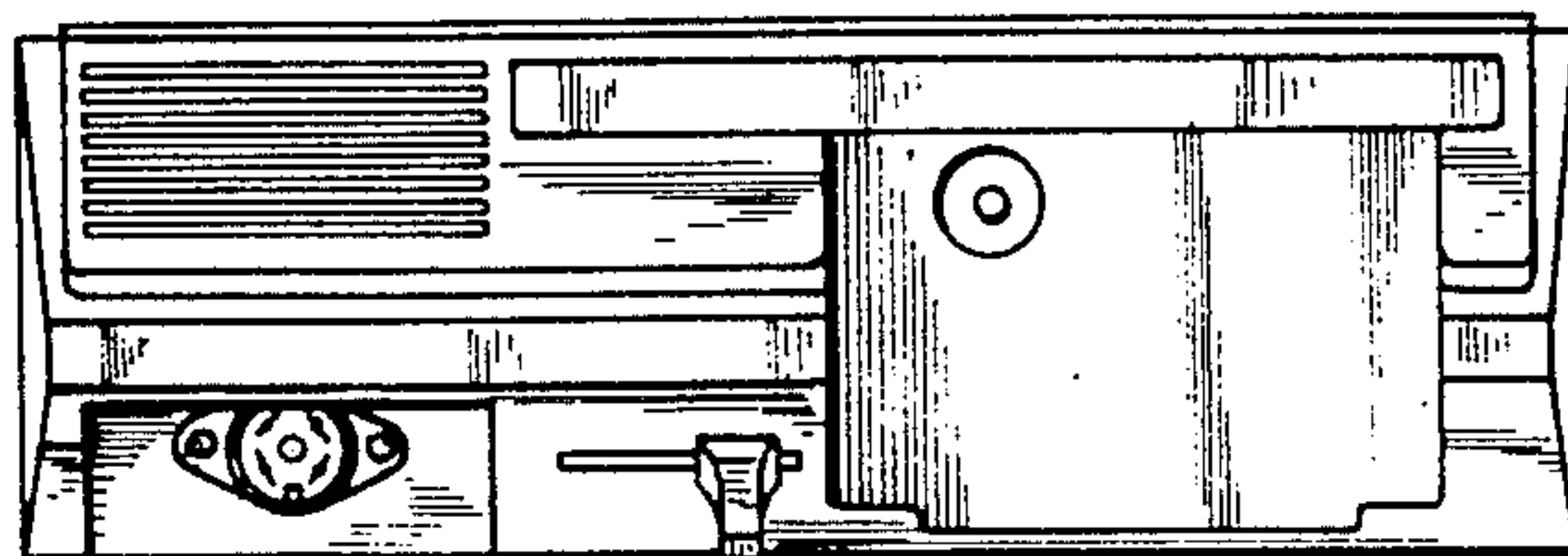

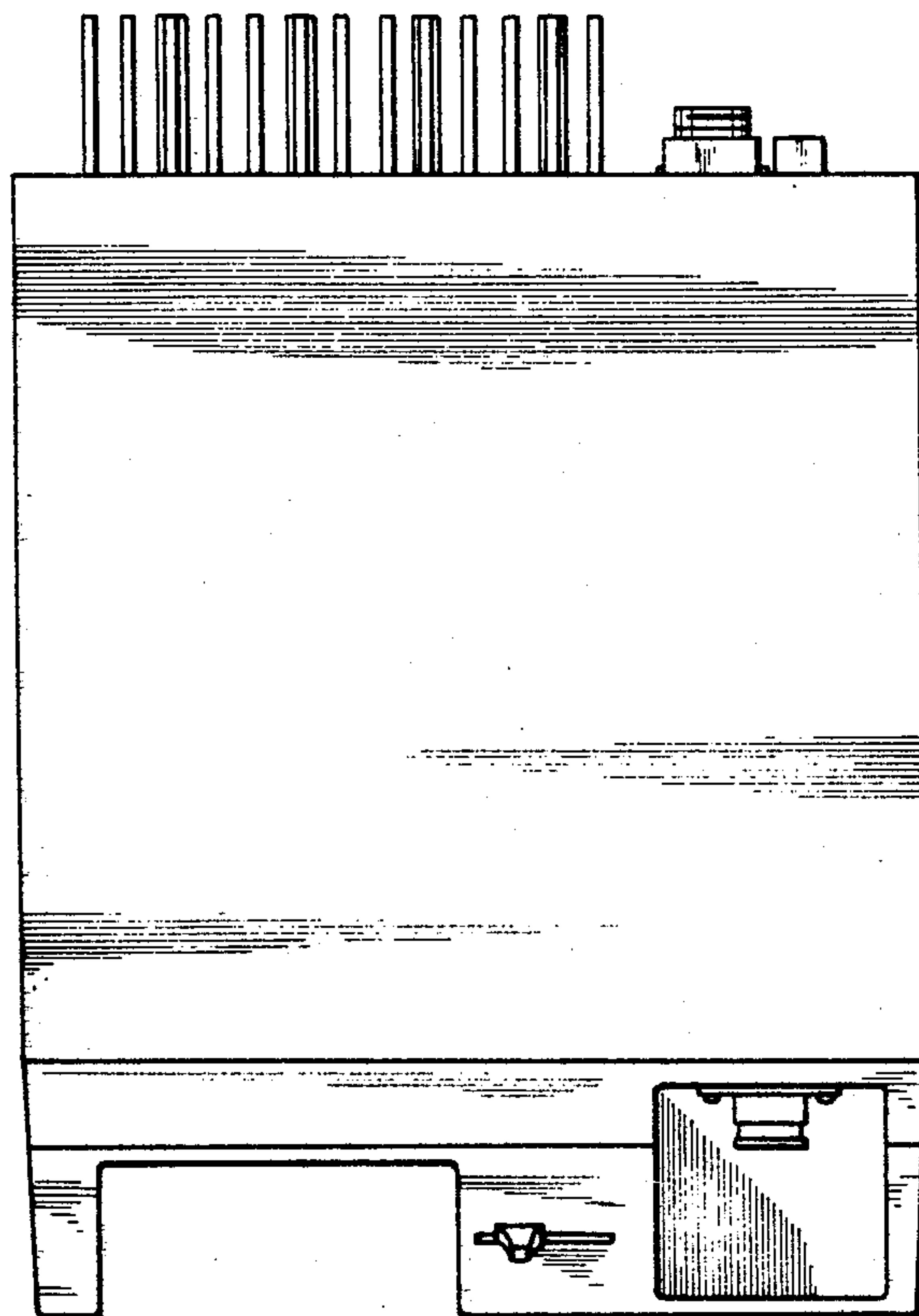
