DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a left side elevational view of a shoe outsole showing our new design;

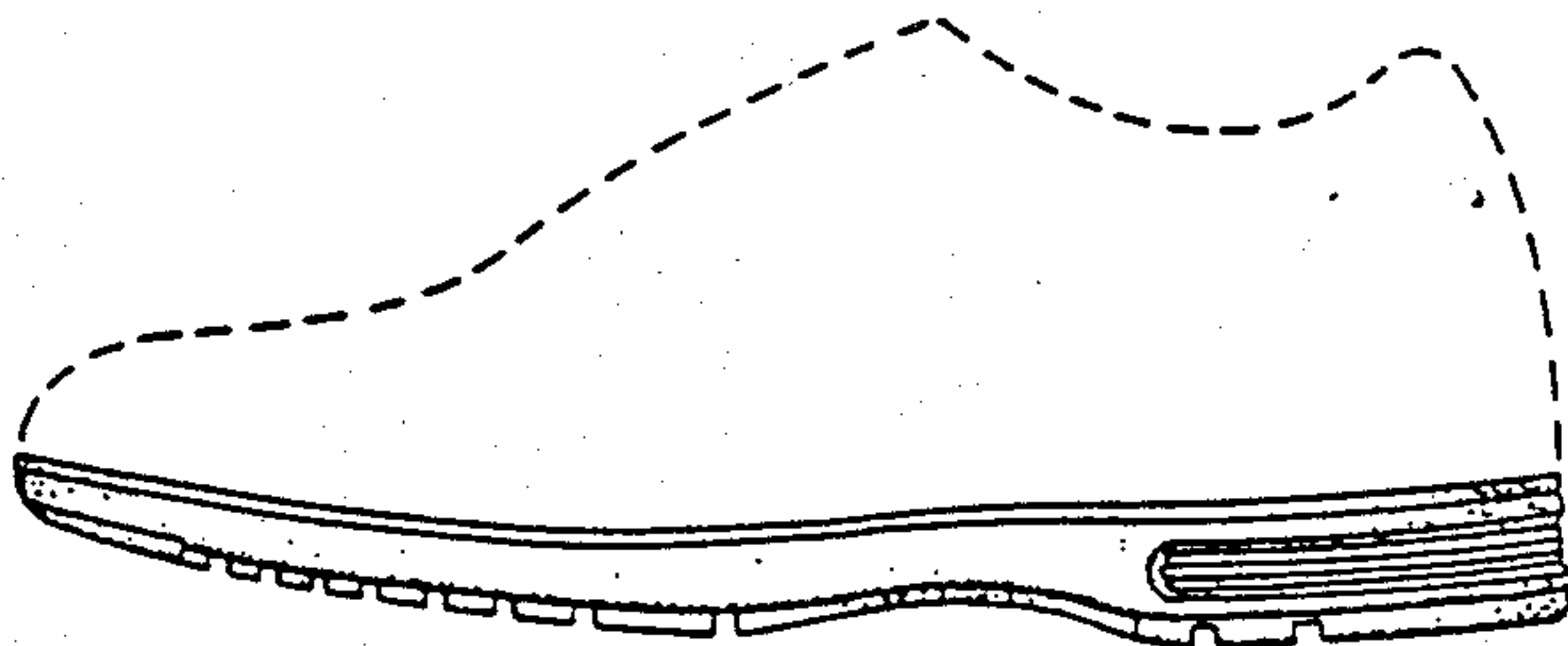
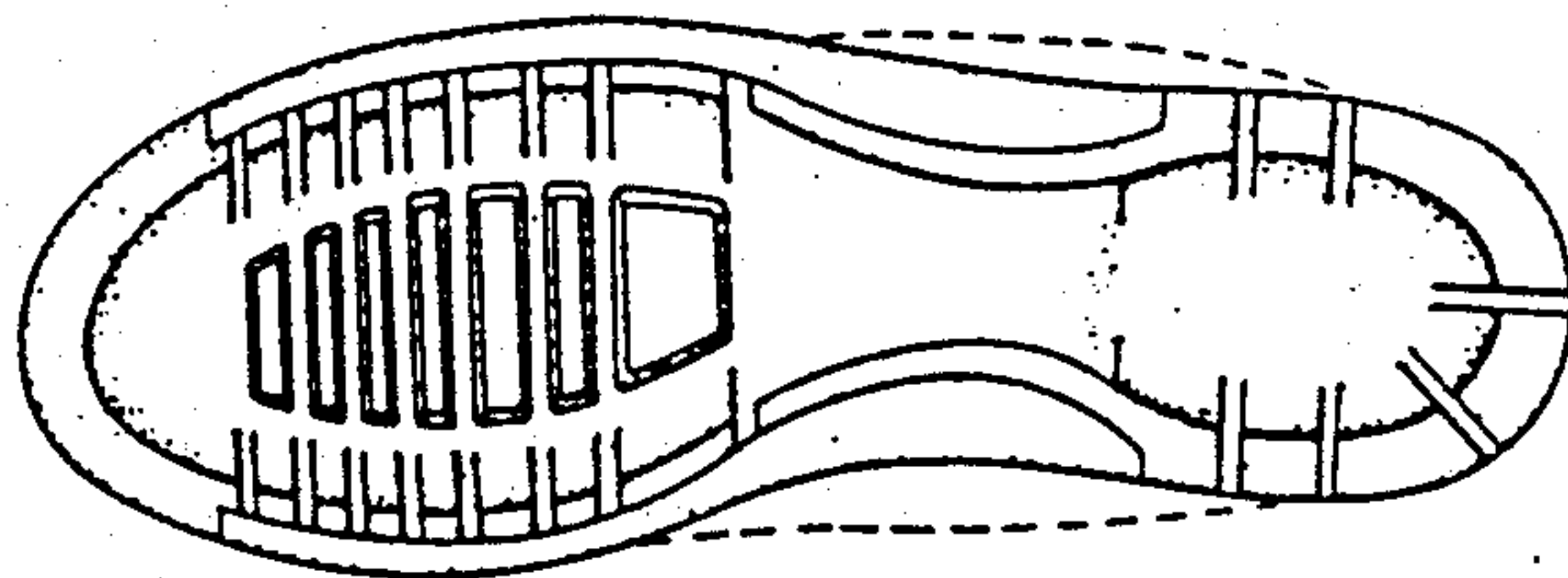
FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof, the top being plain and unornamented;

The broken line showing of a shoe is environmental only and forms no part of the claimed design.



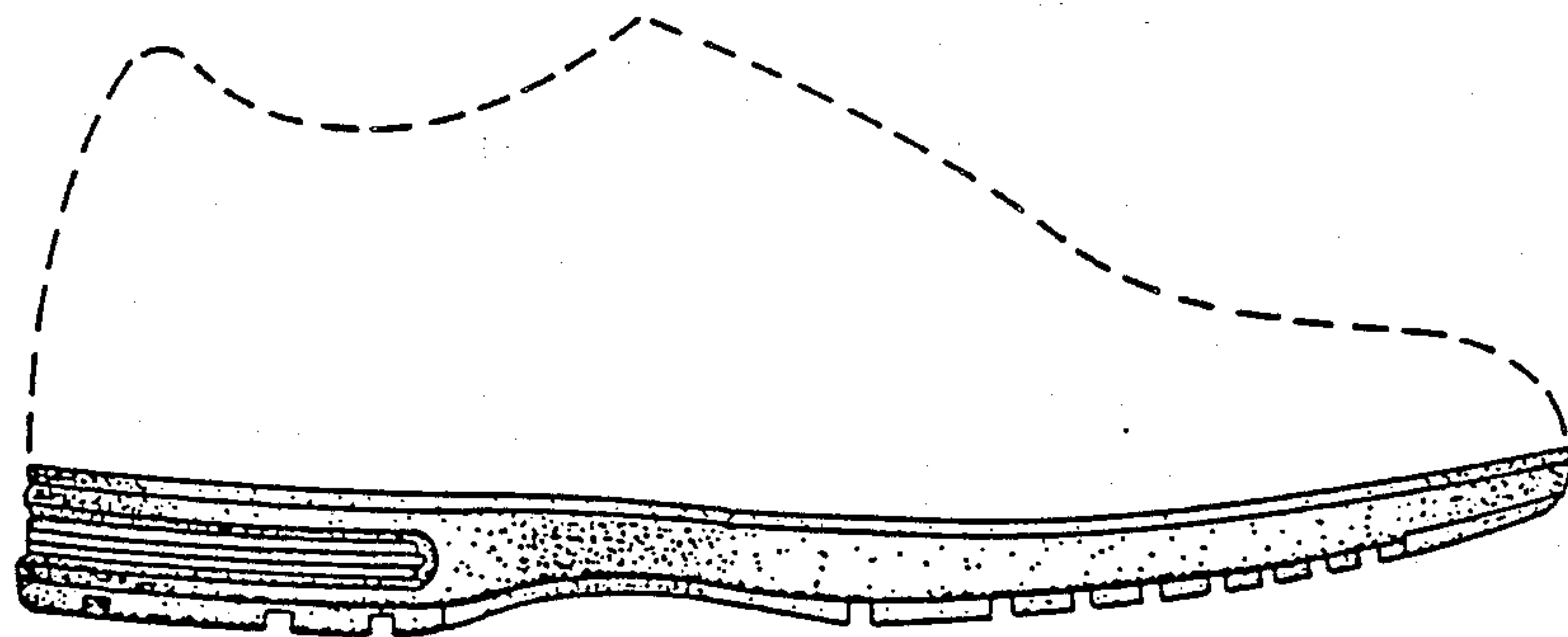

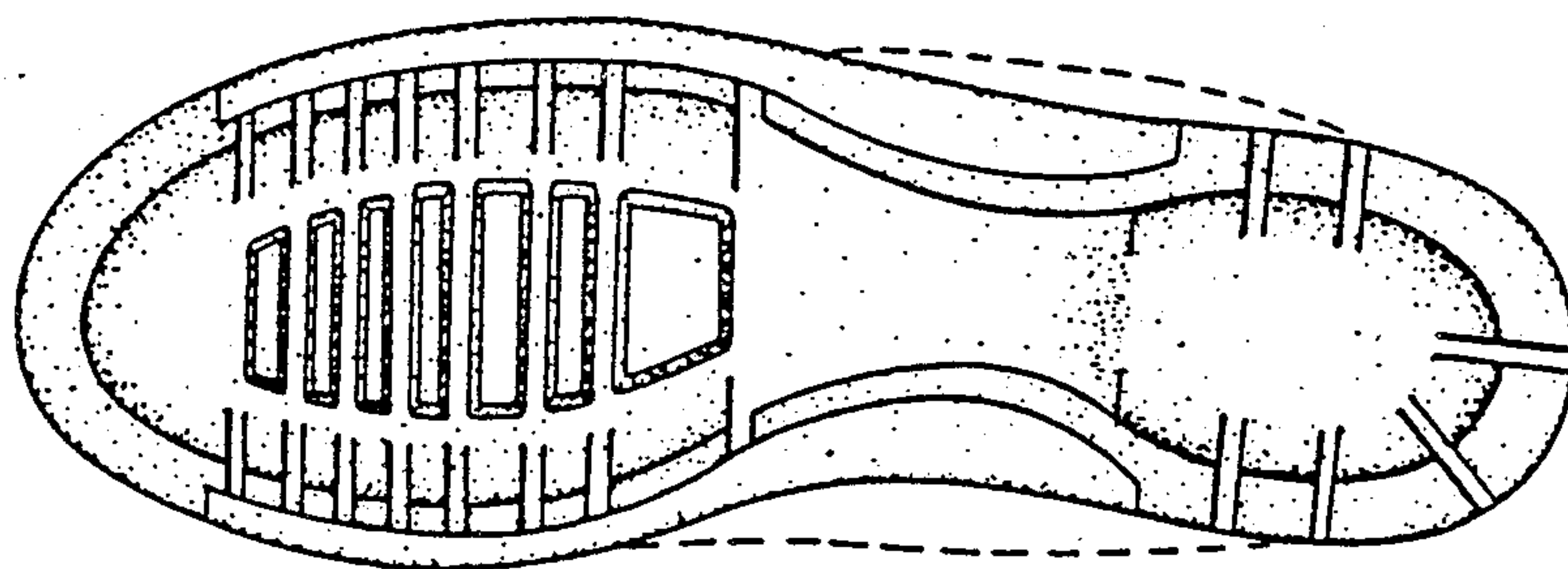

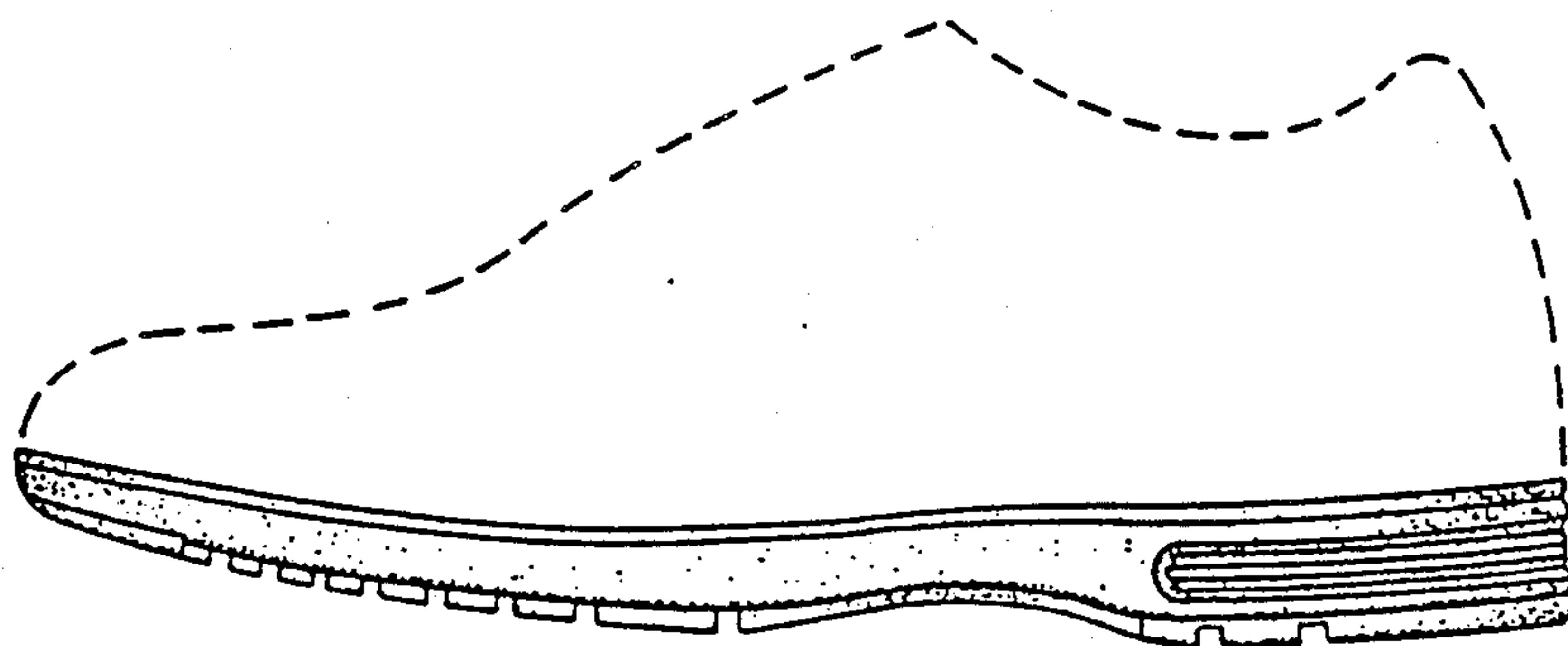

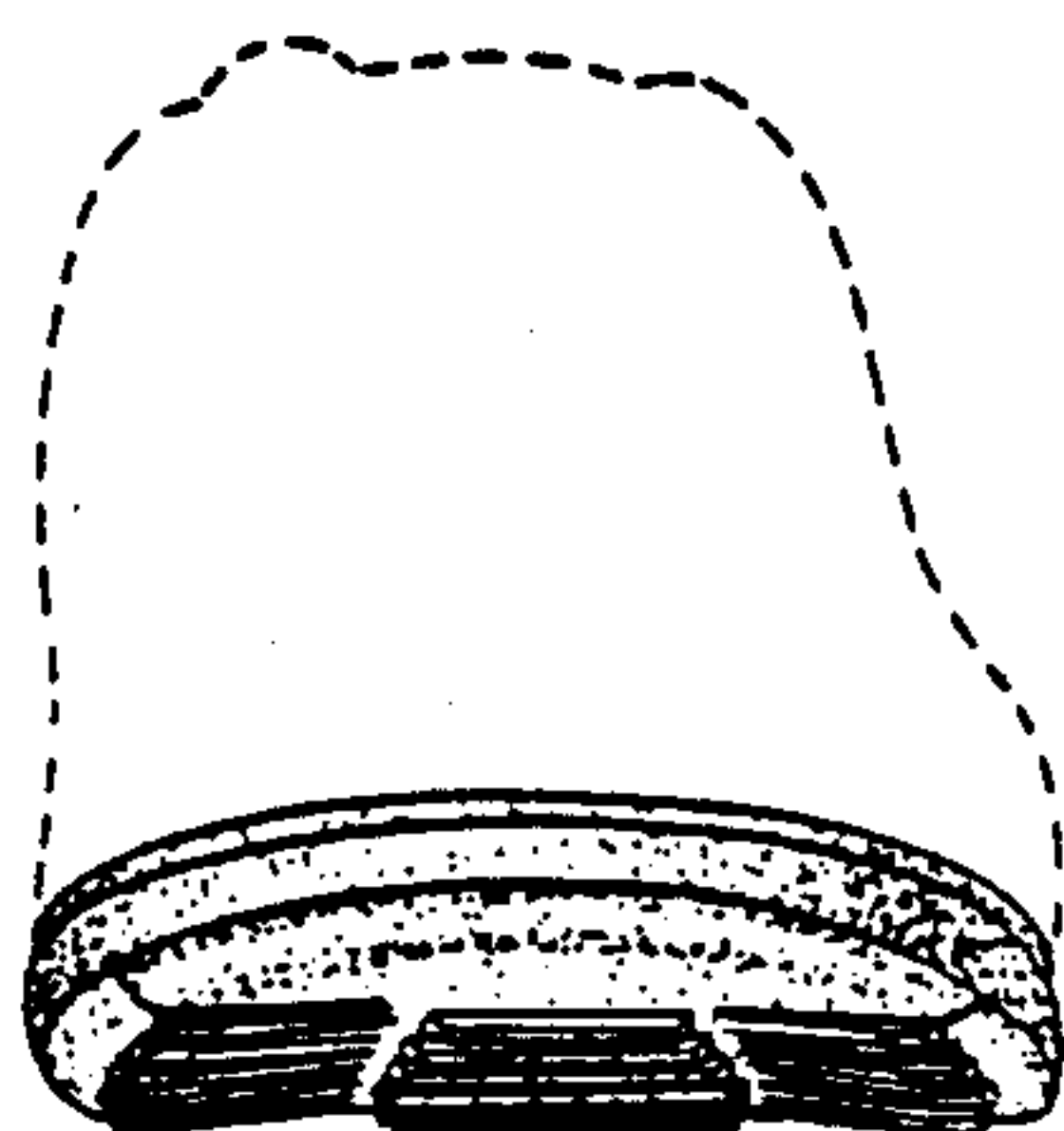

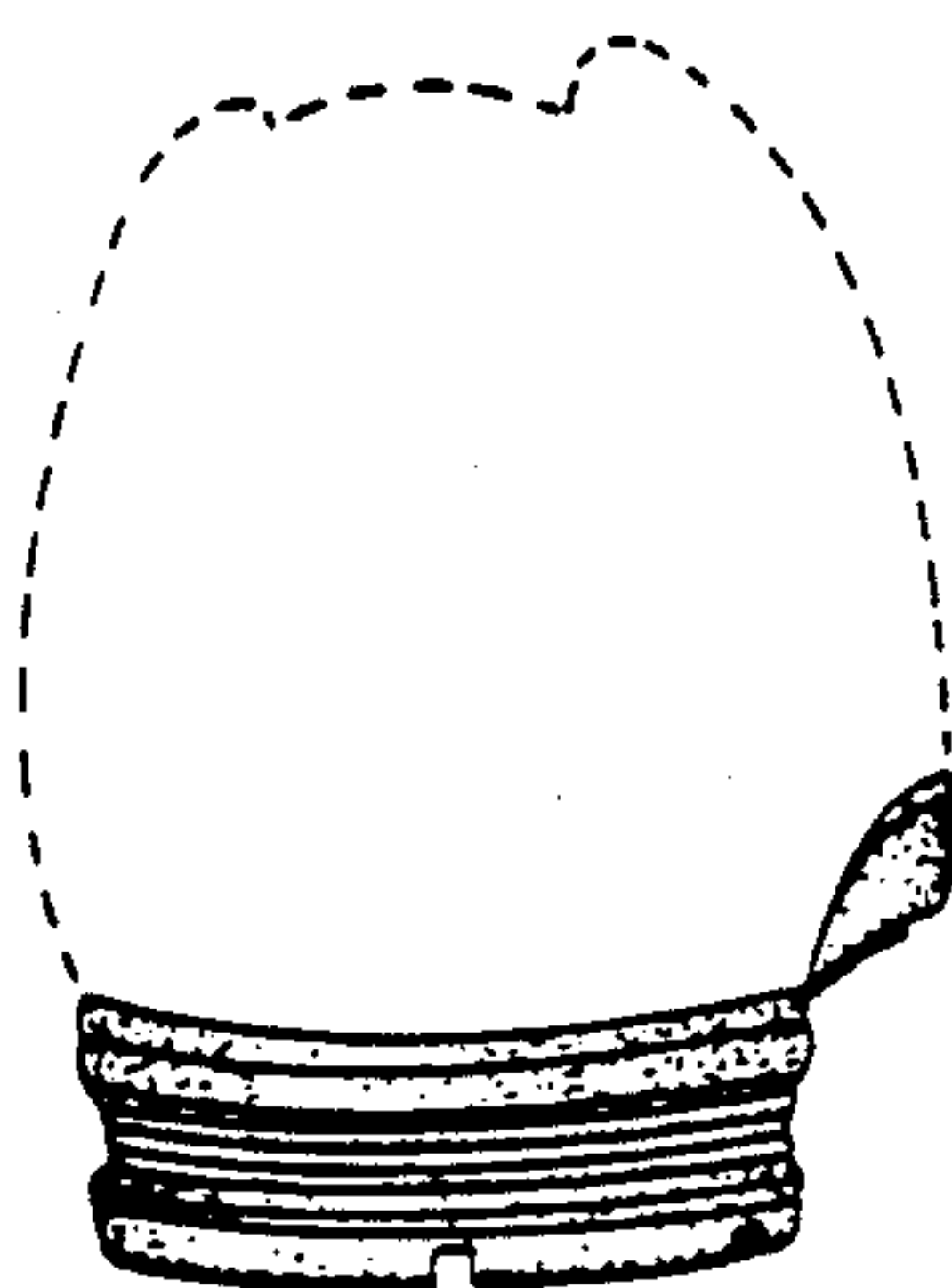
