[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a decalcomania or the like for china dinnerware, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of my new design for a decalcomania or the like for china dinnerware; and FIG. 2 is a top plan view of a second embodiment of my new design for a decalcomania or the like for china dinnerware.

The decalcomania is of no substantial thickness. The fragmentary broken line showing of china dinnerware in each figure is illustrative of environmental structure only.

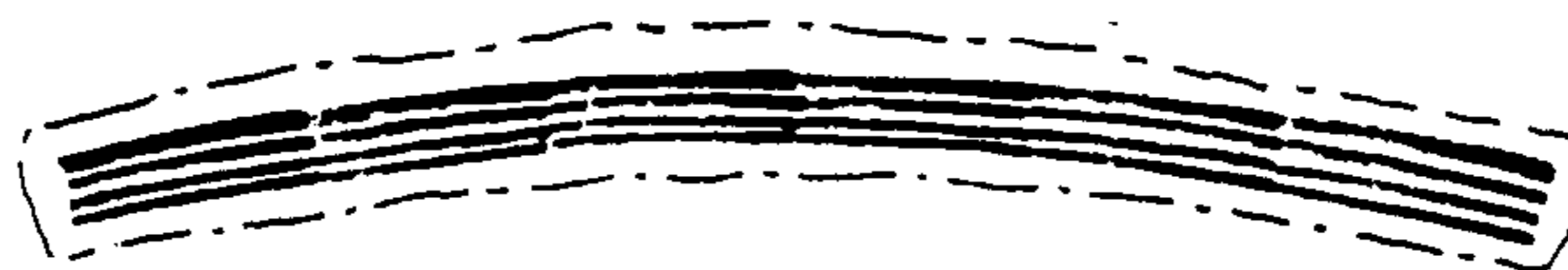

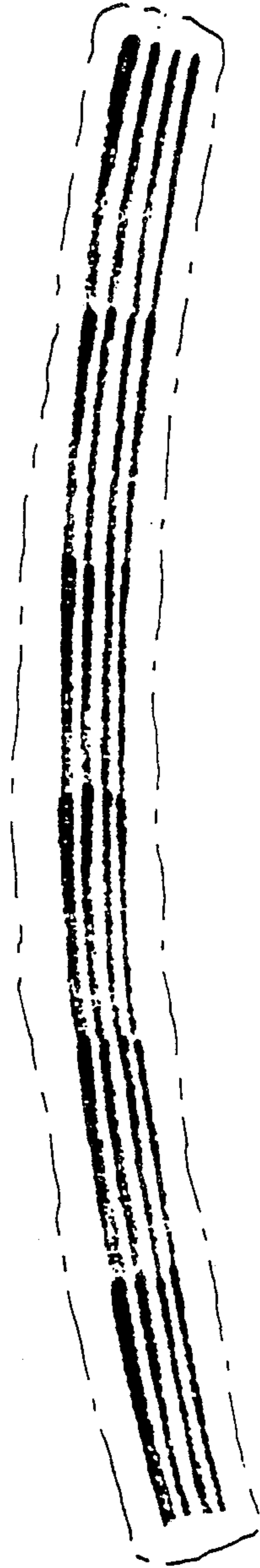
