[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a decalcomania or the like for china dinnerware, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The FIGURE is a top plan view of my new design for a decalcomania or the like for china dinnerware, the fragmentary broken line showing of china dinnerware being illustrative of environmental structure only. The decalcomania is of no substantial thickness.
