The ornamental design for eyeglasses with flip-up lenses, substantially as shown and described.

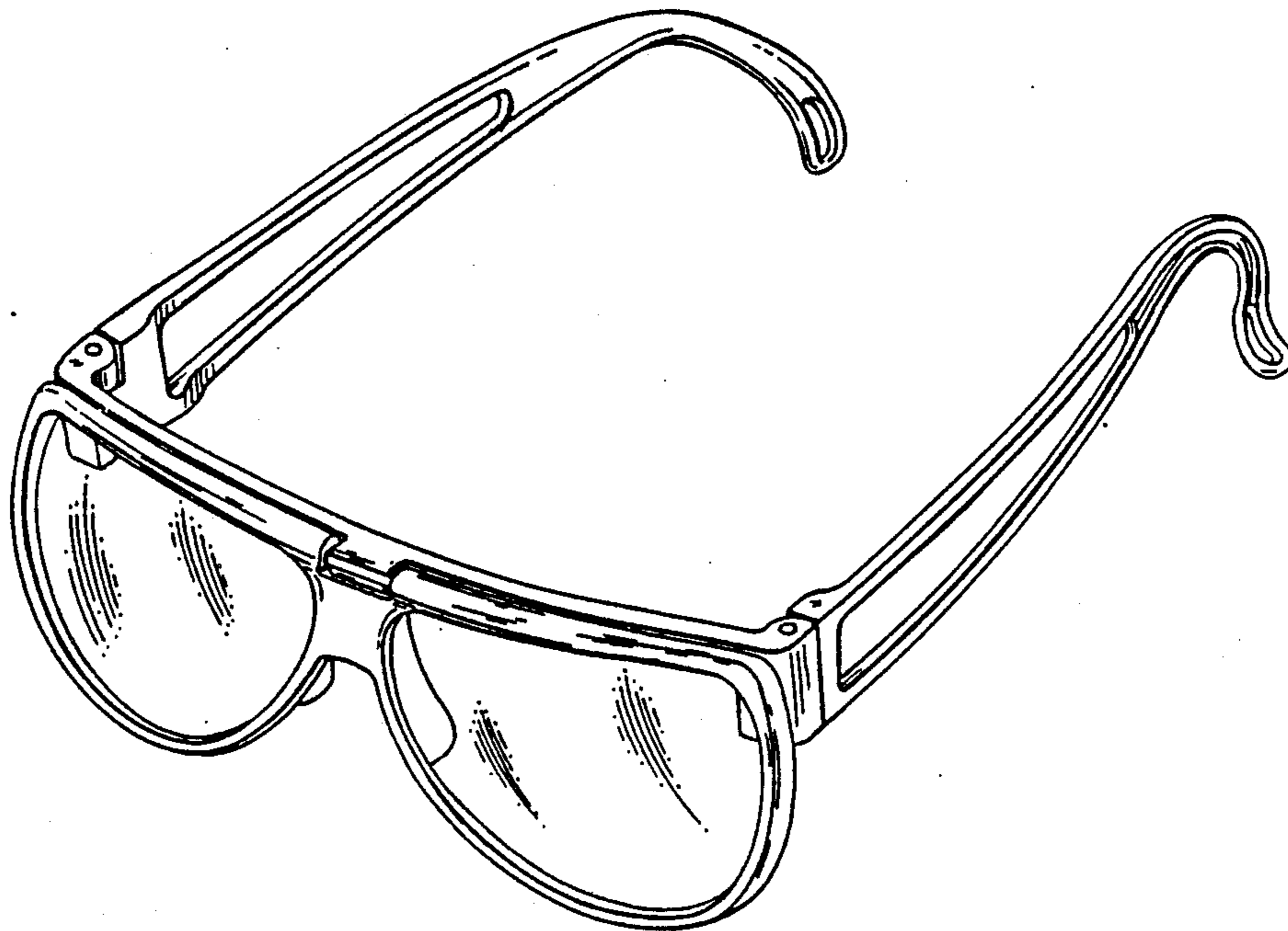
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of the eyeglasses with flip-up lenses showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof with the lenses shown in the flipped-up position;

FIG. 4 is a front perspective view thereof.



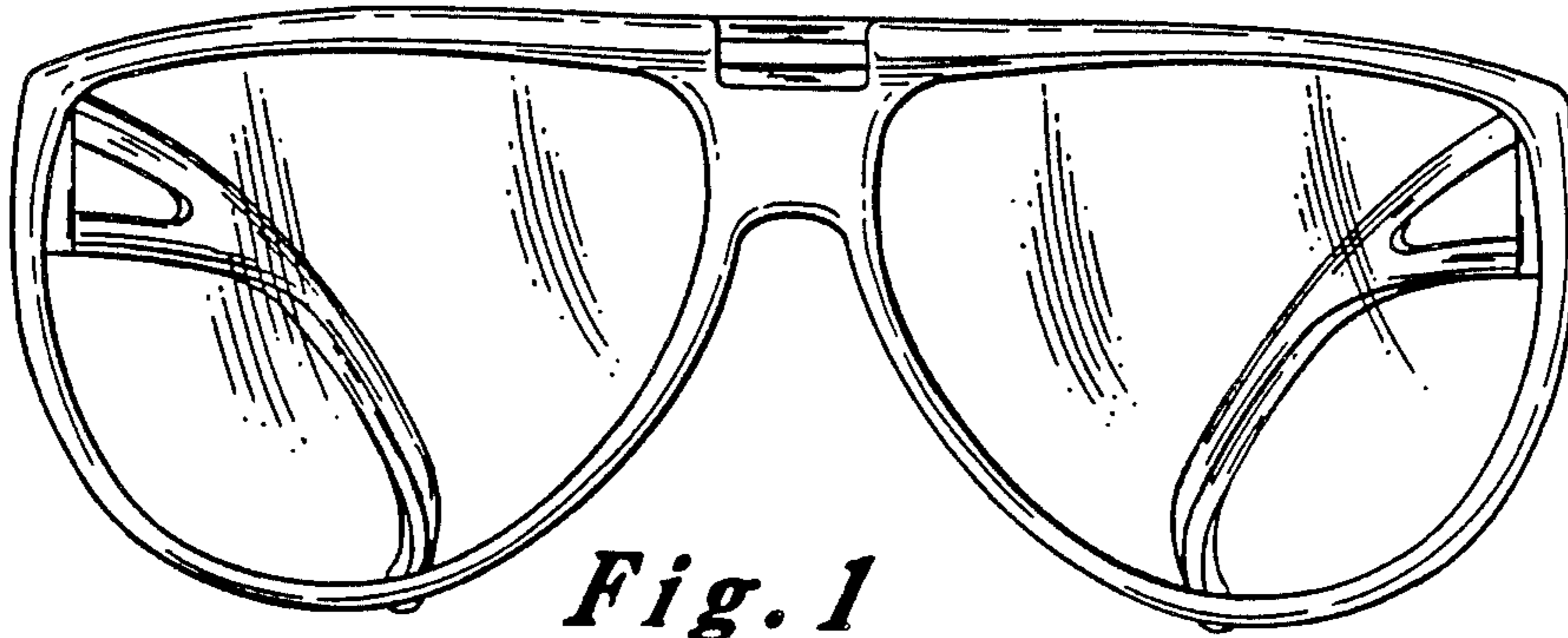

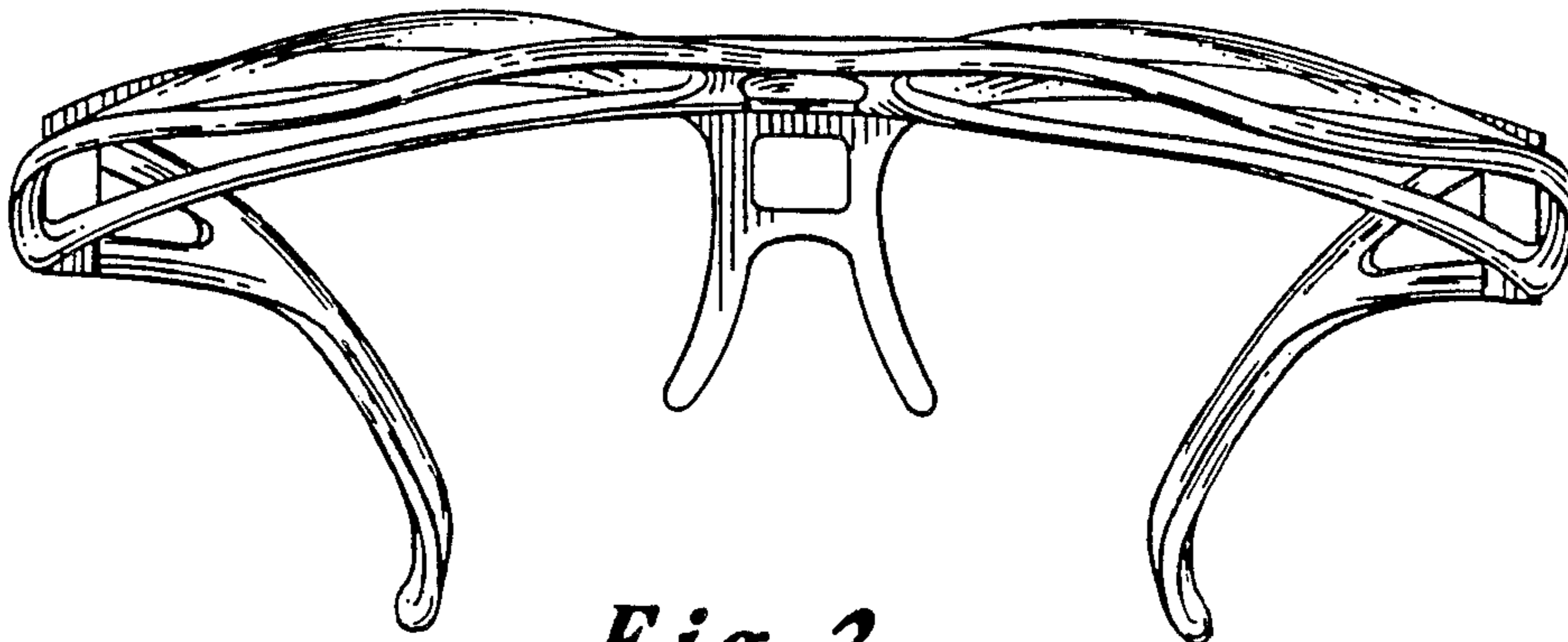

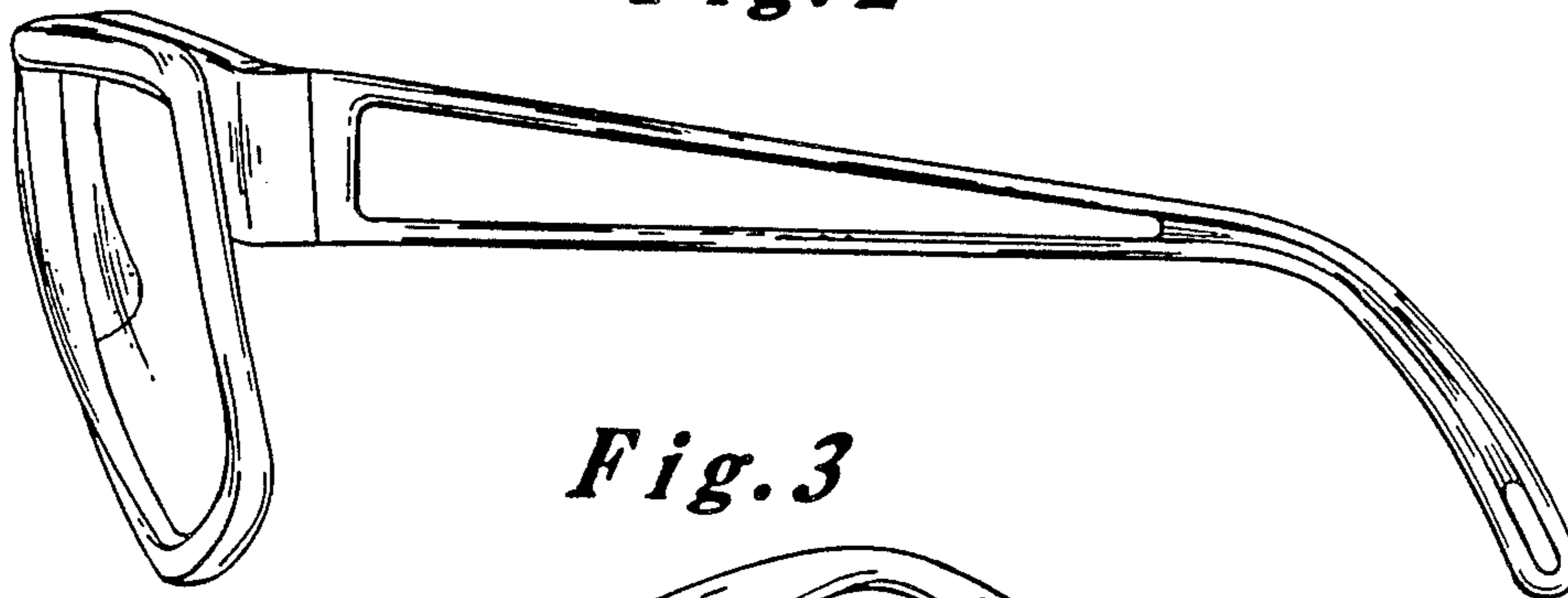

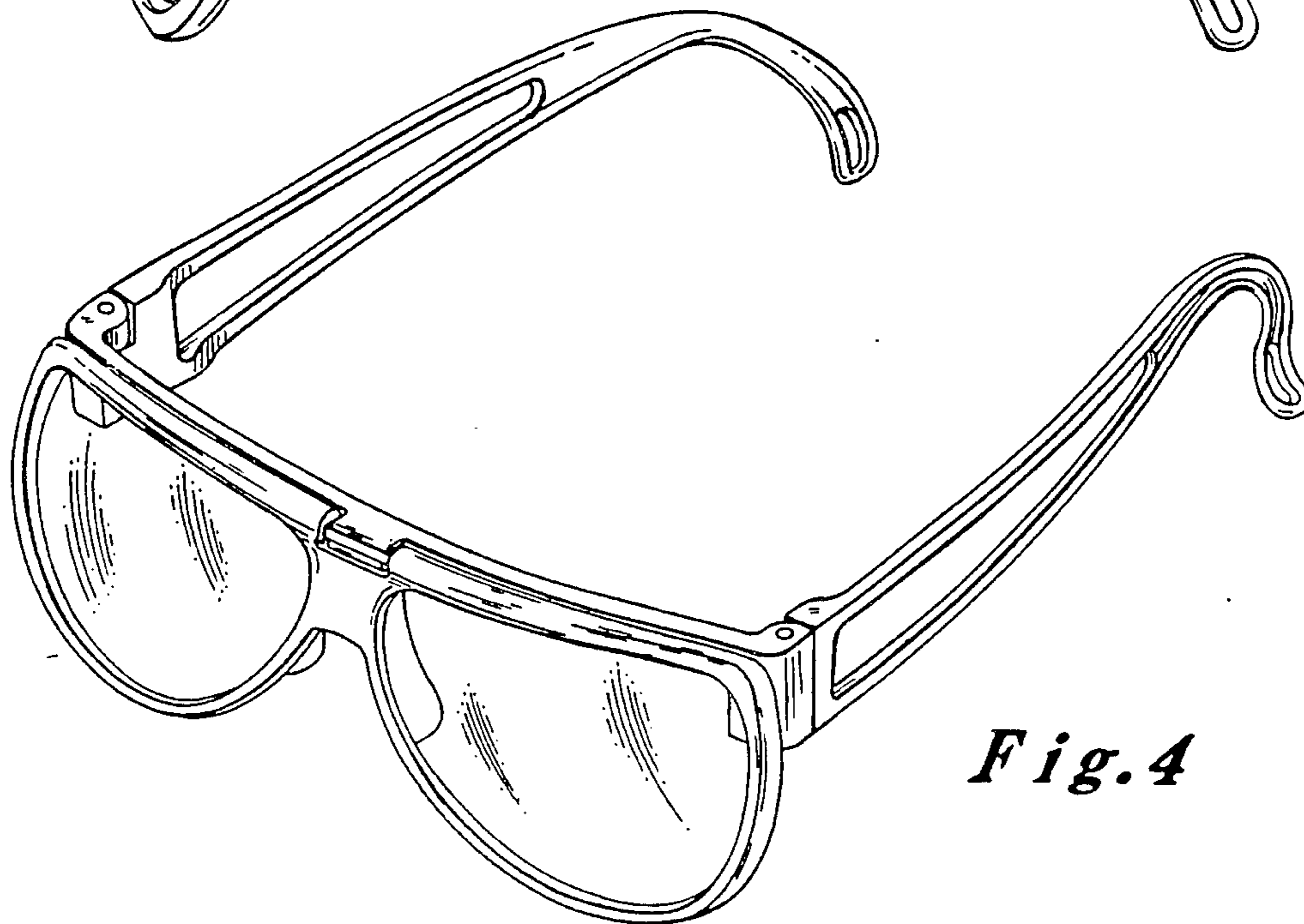
