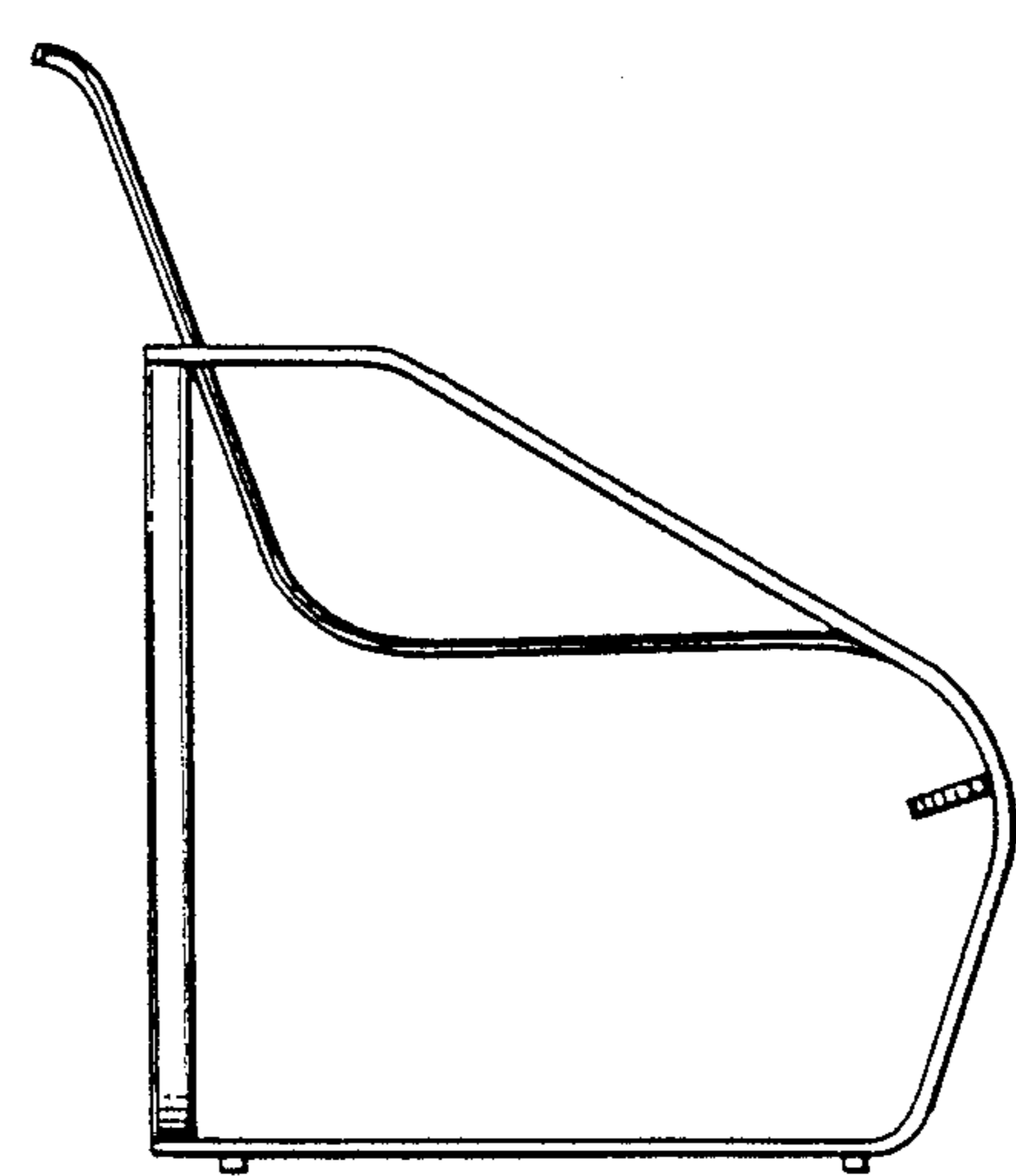
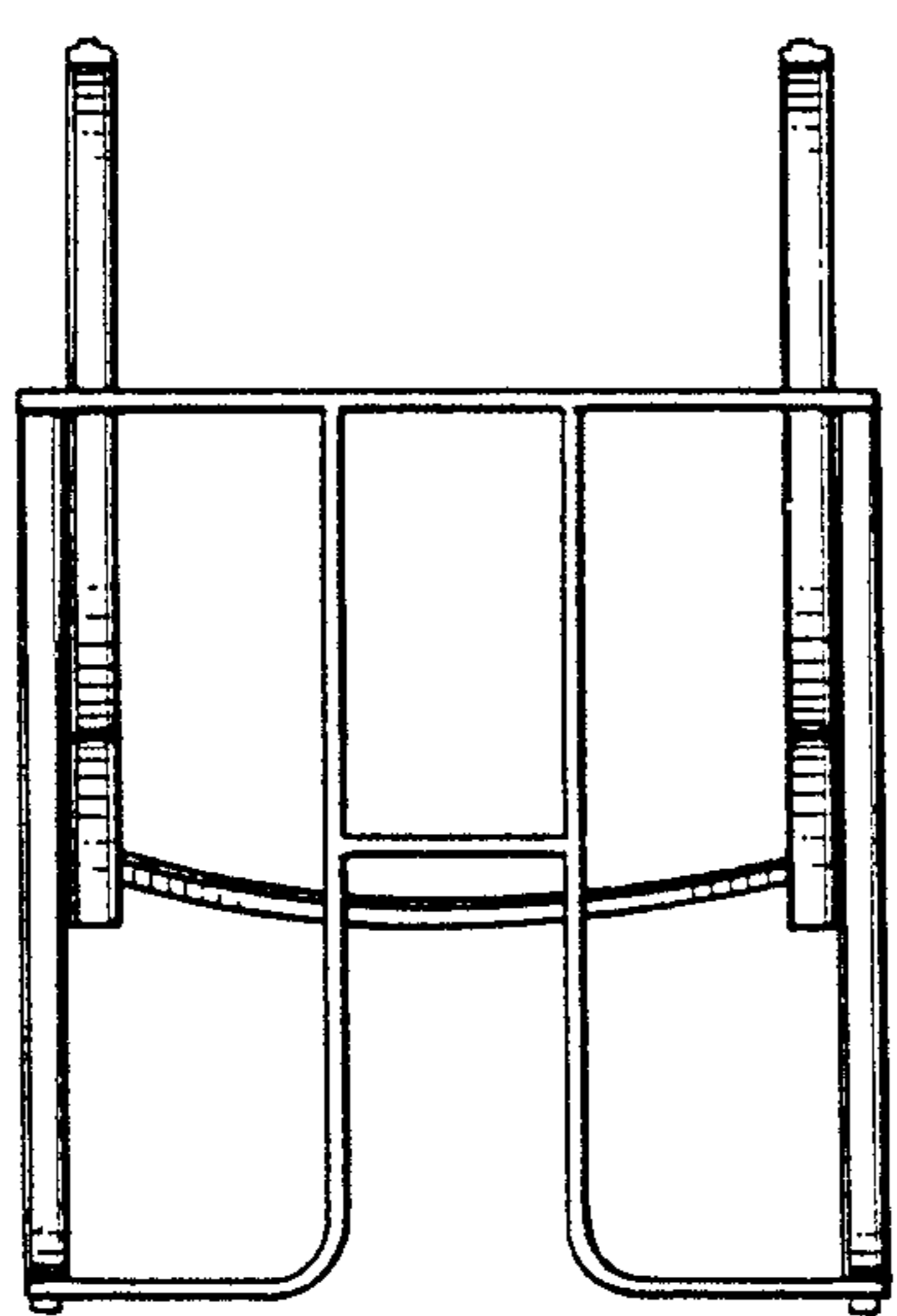

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view.



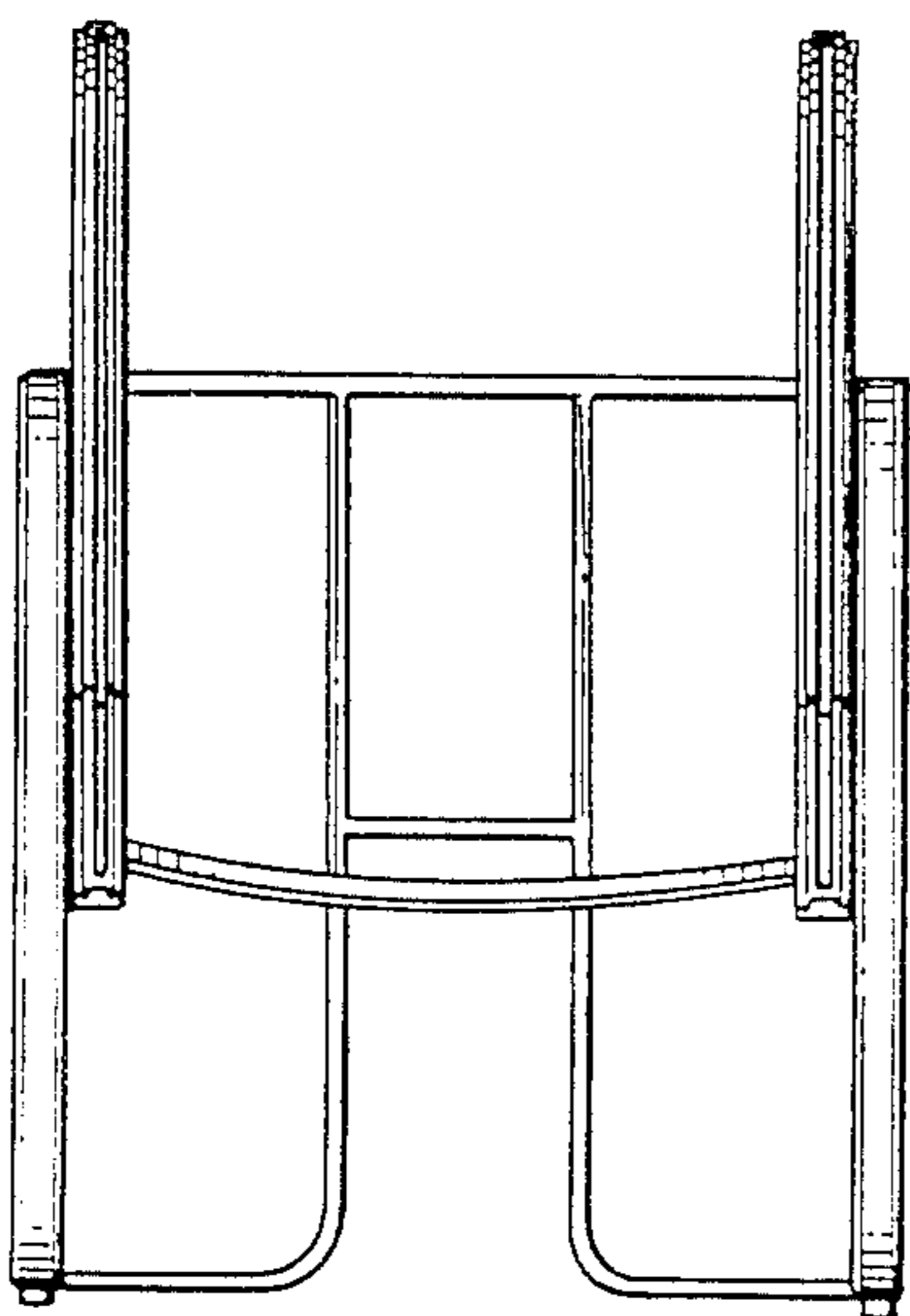

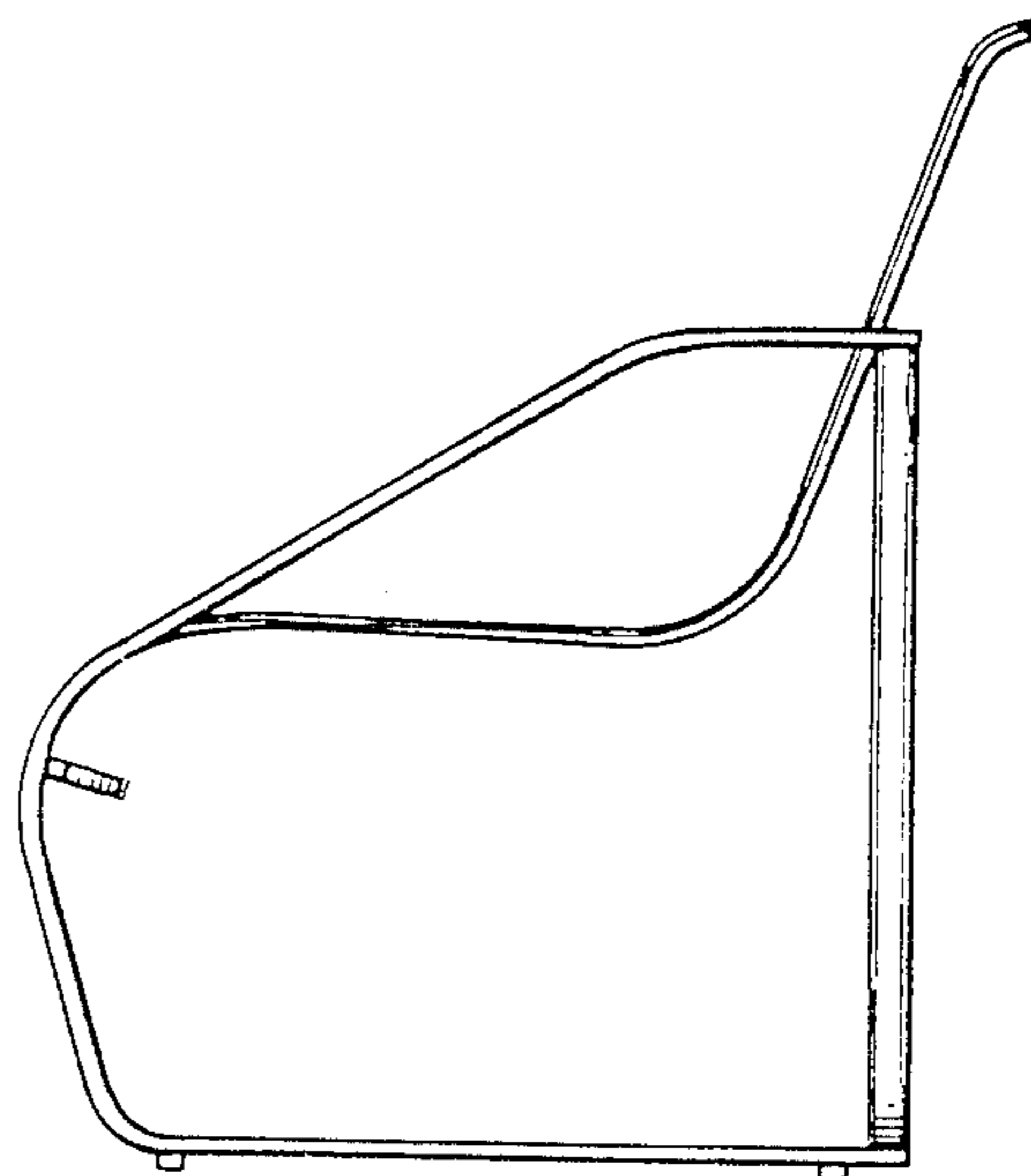

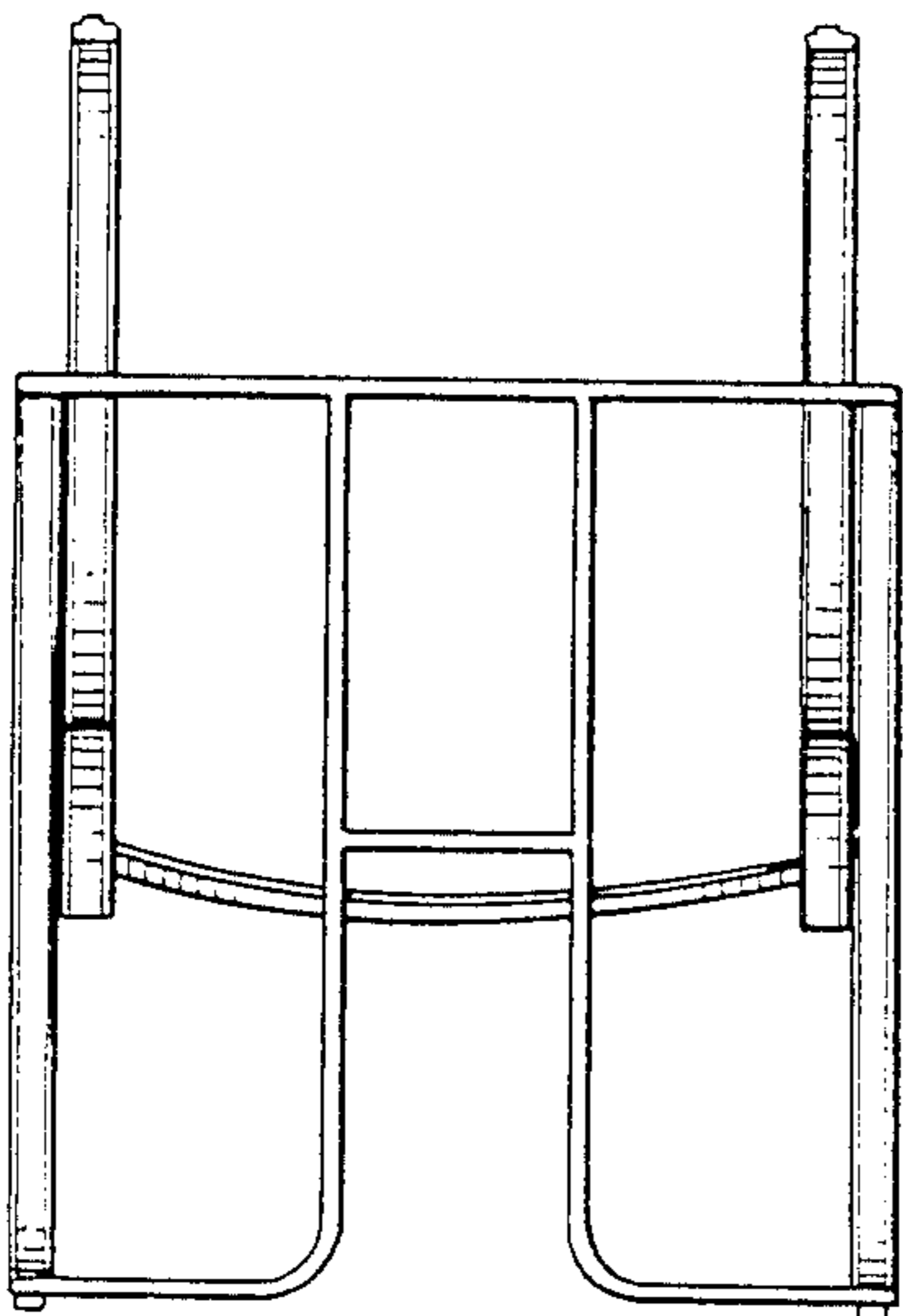

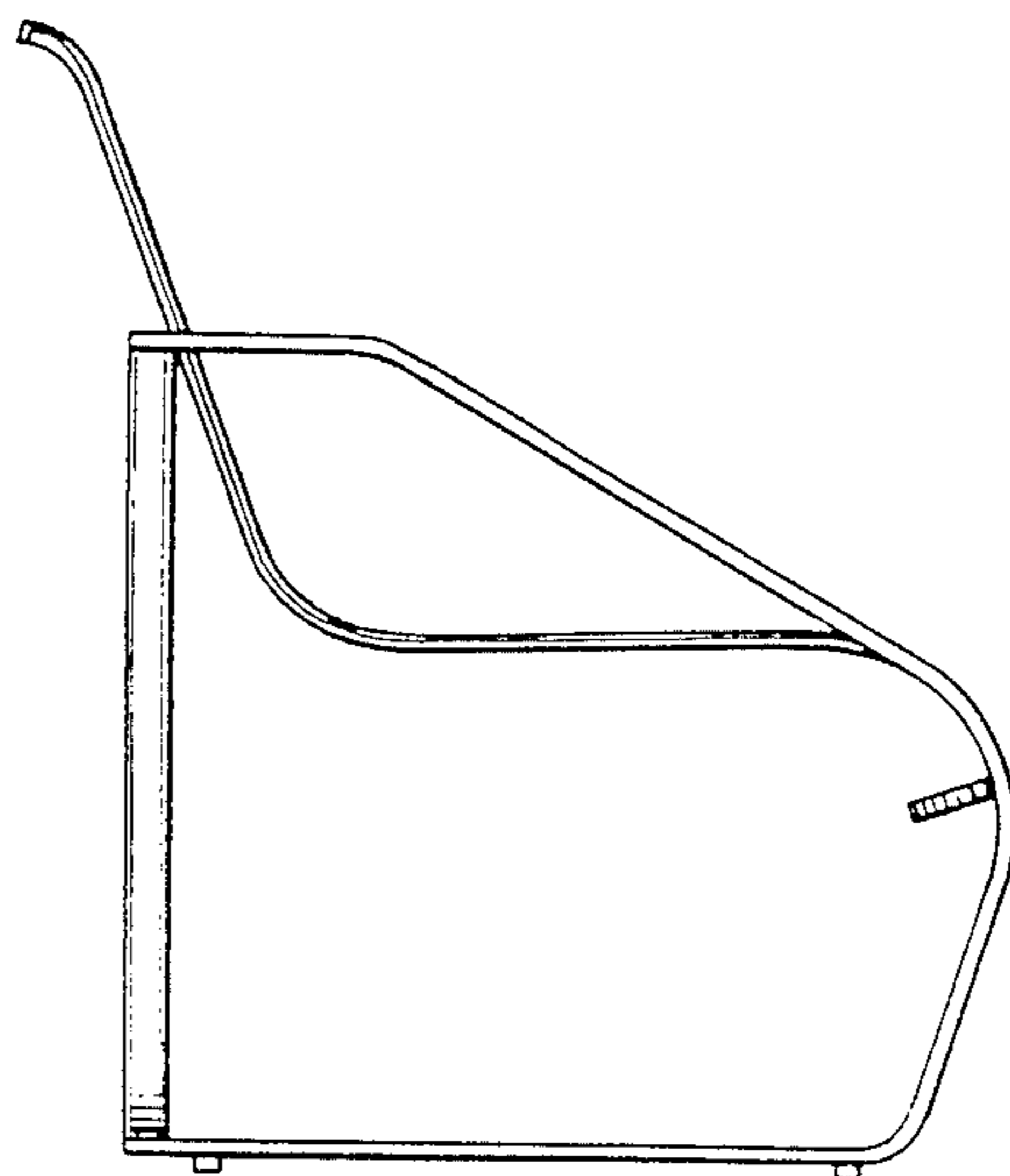

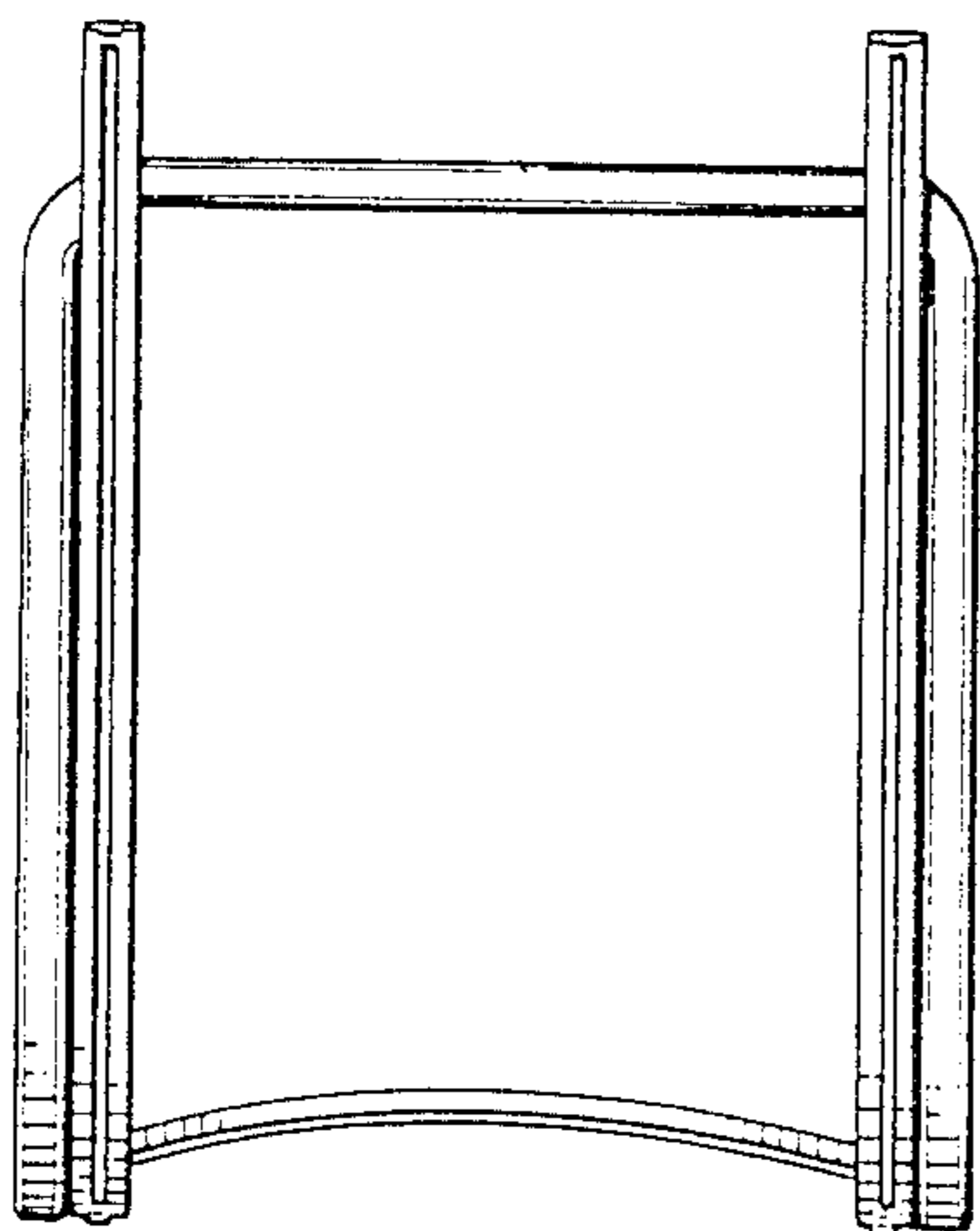

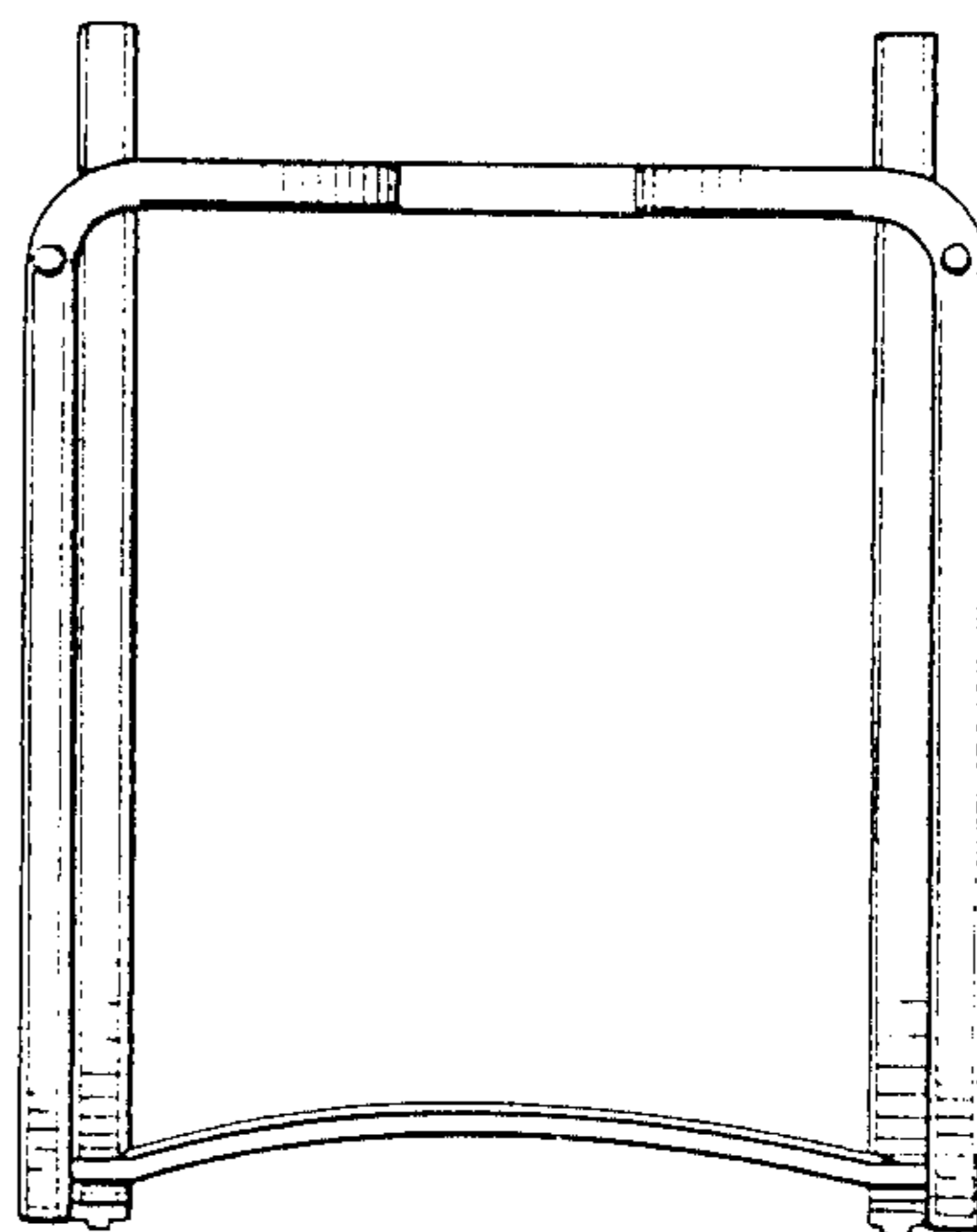
