[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for an article of flatware, substantially shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a fork, it being understood that the bottom plan view is flat and unornamented;

FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof, it being understood that the right side is substantially similar to that shown in FIG. 2;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken substantially along the line 5—5 shown in FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a top plan view of an article of flatware showing my new design as embodied in a spoon, it being understood that the bottom plan view is flat and unornamented;

FIG. 7 is a left side elevational view of the spoon of FIG. 6, it being understood that the right side elevational view is substantially similar to that shown in FIG. 7;

FIG. 8 is a rear elevational view of the spoon of FIG. 6;

FIG. 9 is a front elevational view of the spoon of FIG. 6; and

FIG. 10 is a cross-sectional view taken substantially along the line 10—10 shown in FIG. 6.
