FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof.

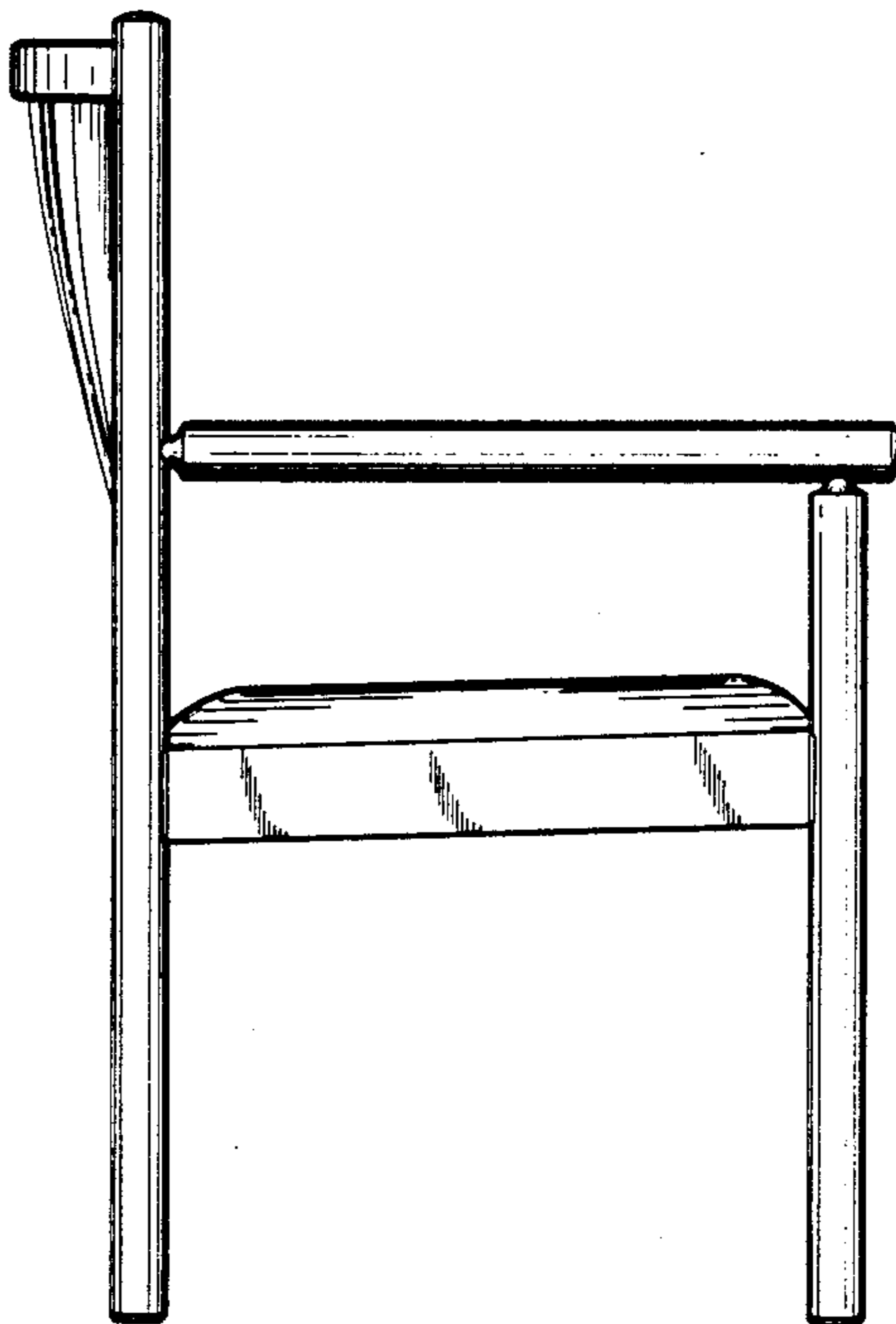
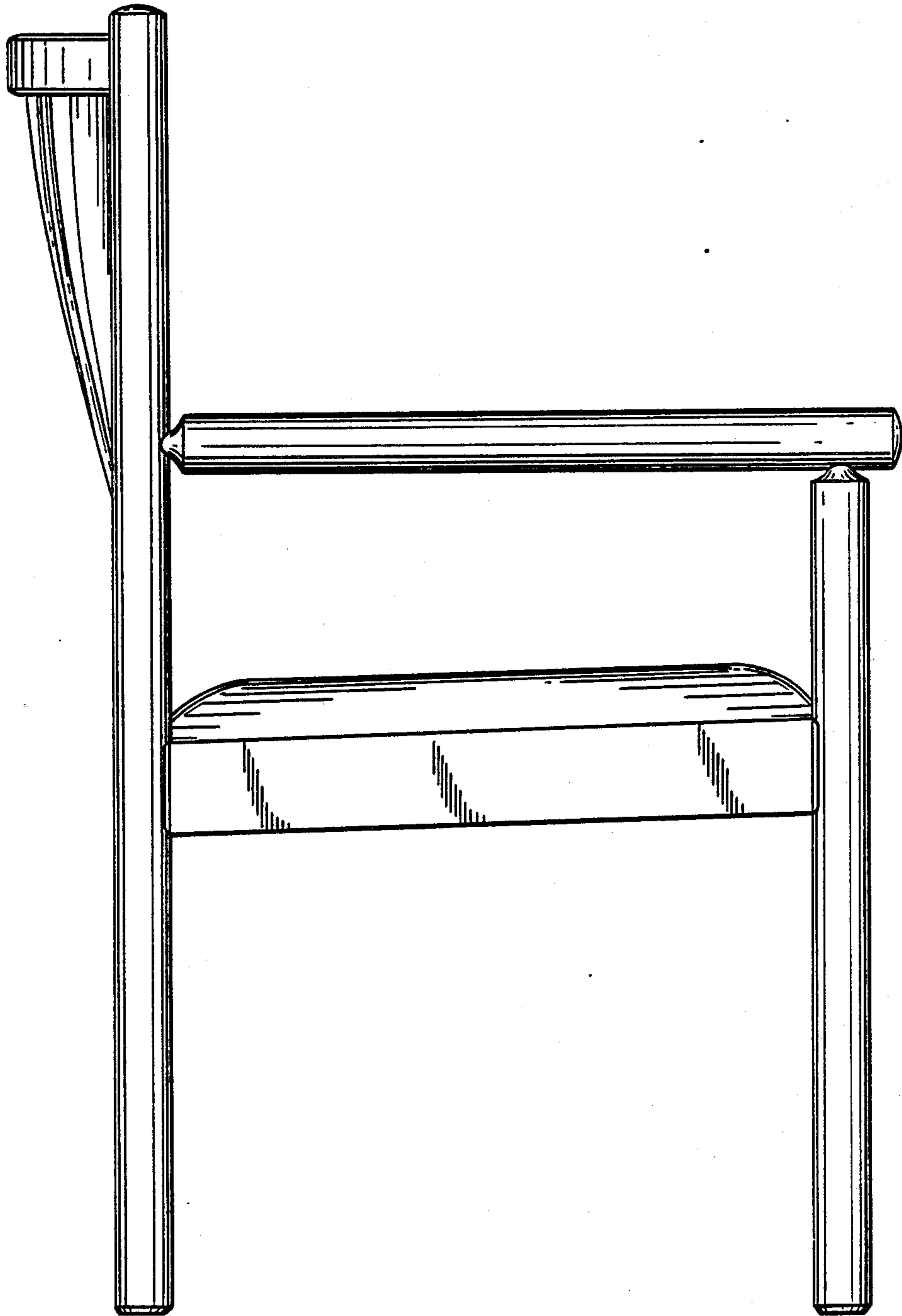

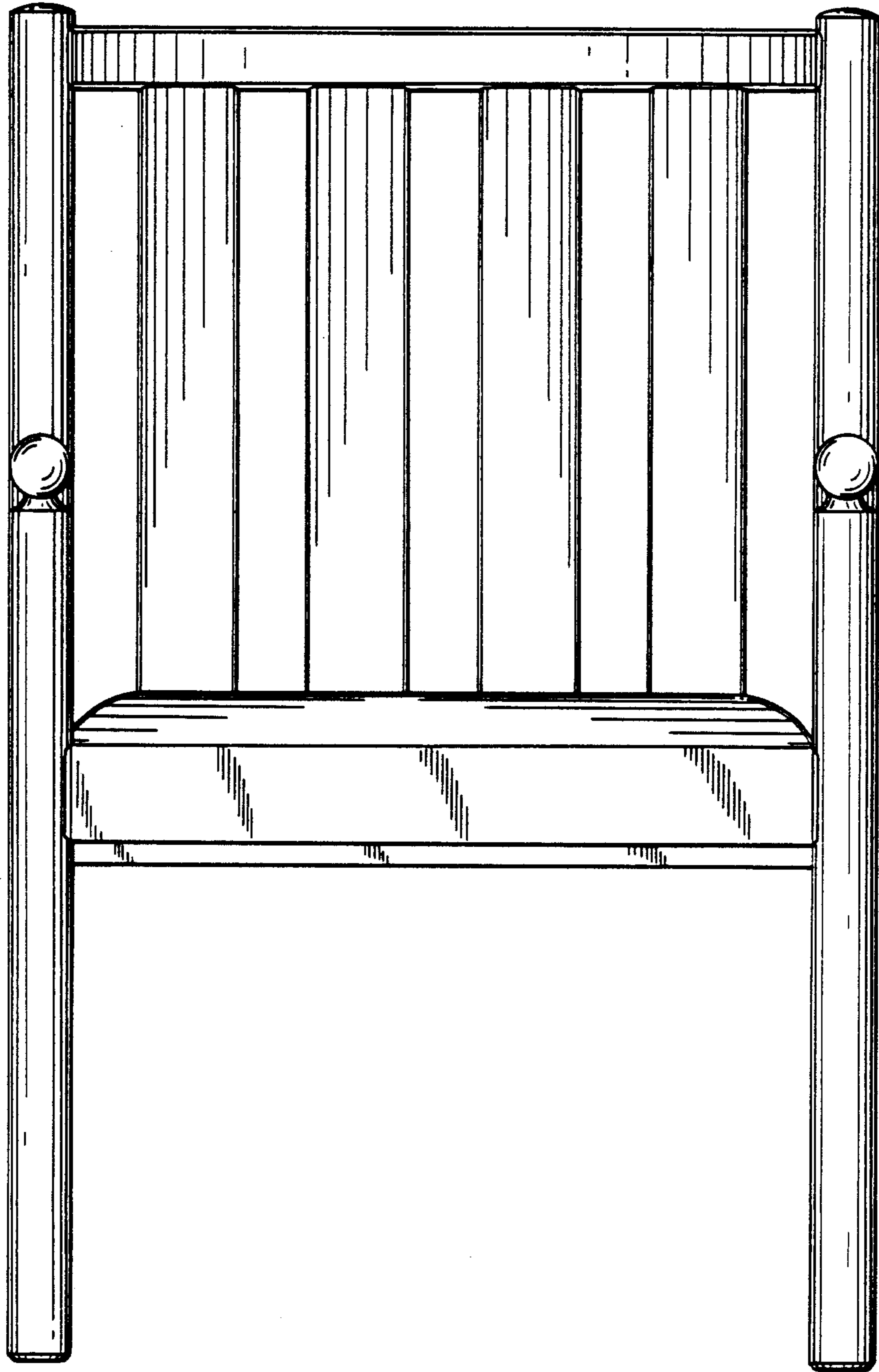

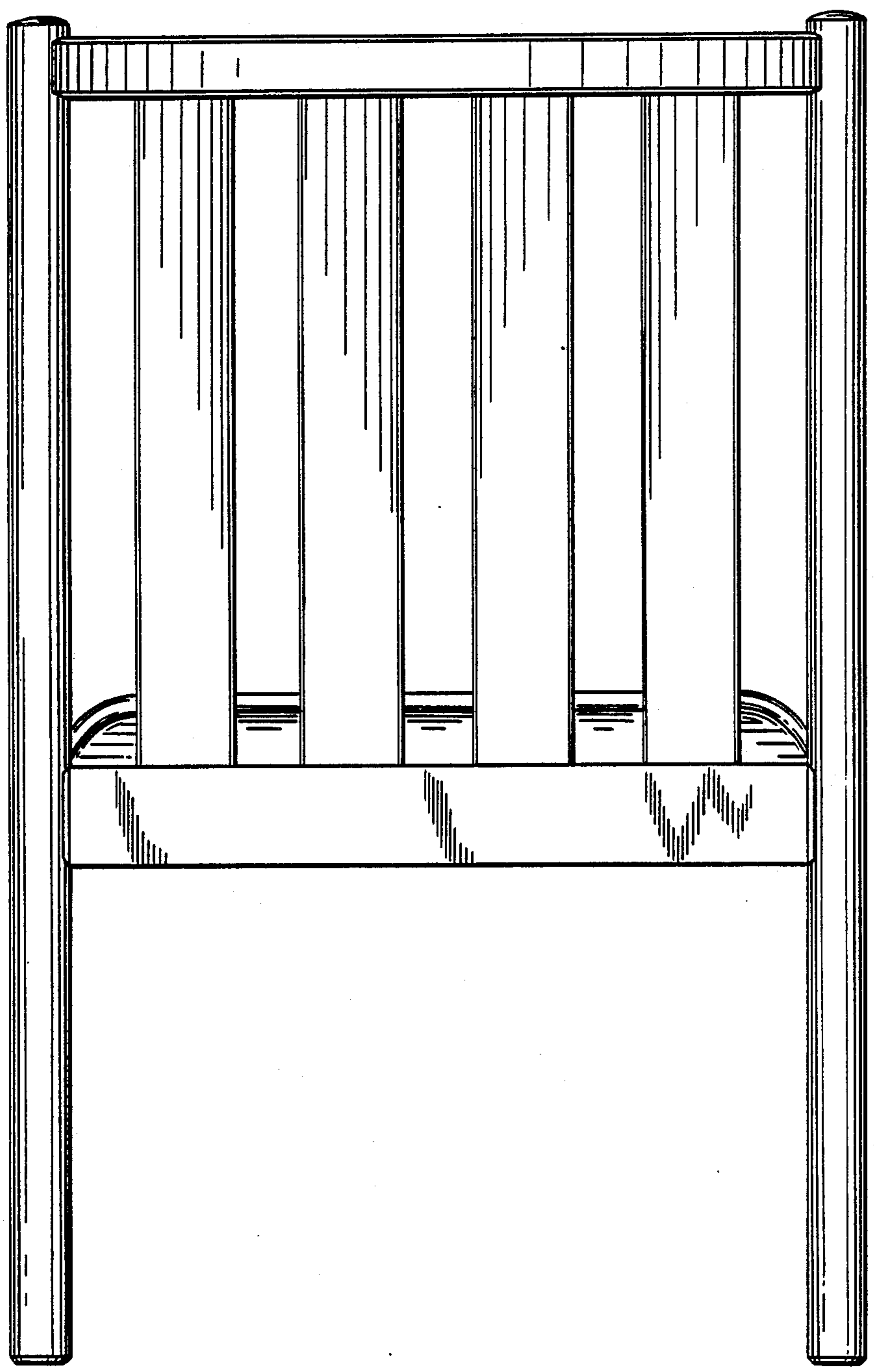

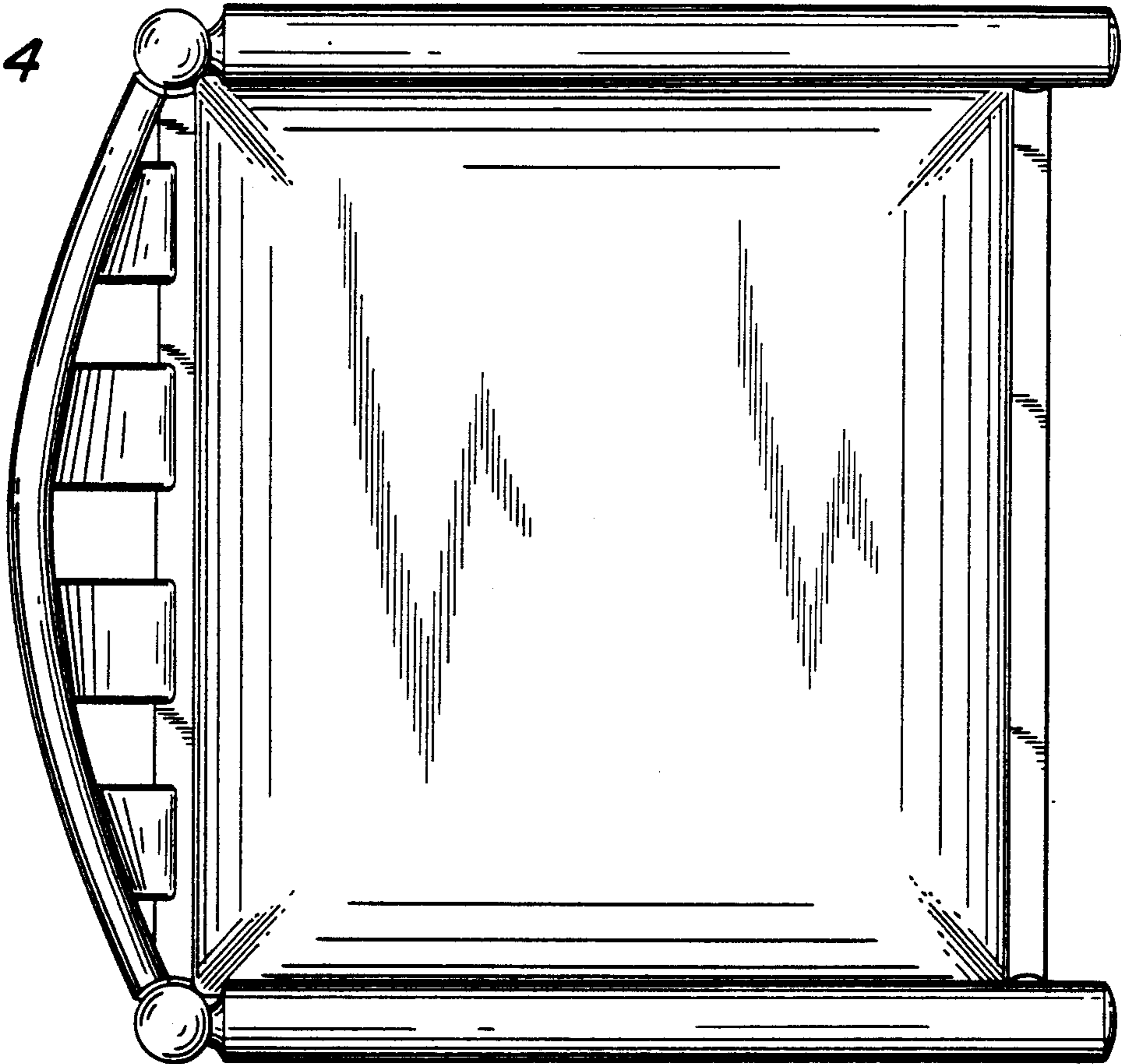
