[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a stroller pack, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a rear perspective view of a stroller pack showing my new design, the stroller pack is shown as it would be seen on a stroller;

FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view of a stroller pack;

FIG. 3 is a front perspective view of FIG. 2;

FIG. 4 is a front perspective view of FIG. 1;

FIG. 5 is a rear perspective view of a stroller pack showing a second embodiment, the stroller pack is shown as it would be seen on a stroller;

FIG. 6 is a rear perspective view of a second embodiment of the stroller pack;

FIG. 7 is a front perspective view of FIG. 6; and

FIG. 8 is a front perspective view of FIG. 5.

The broken lines shown in FIGS. 1, 4, 5 and 8 are for illustrative purposes only and form no part of the claimed design. The mesh pattern which is partially shown in all views for ease of illustration is understood to be continuous throughout the areas.
