The ornamental design for a floor polishing machine, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a floor polishing machine showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof; FIG. 3 is a rear perspective view thereof; and FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof. The electrical cord is shown broken away in FIGS. 1 and 3 for ease of illustration.

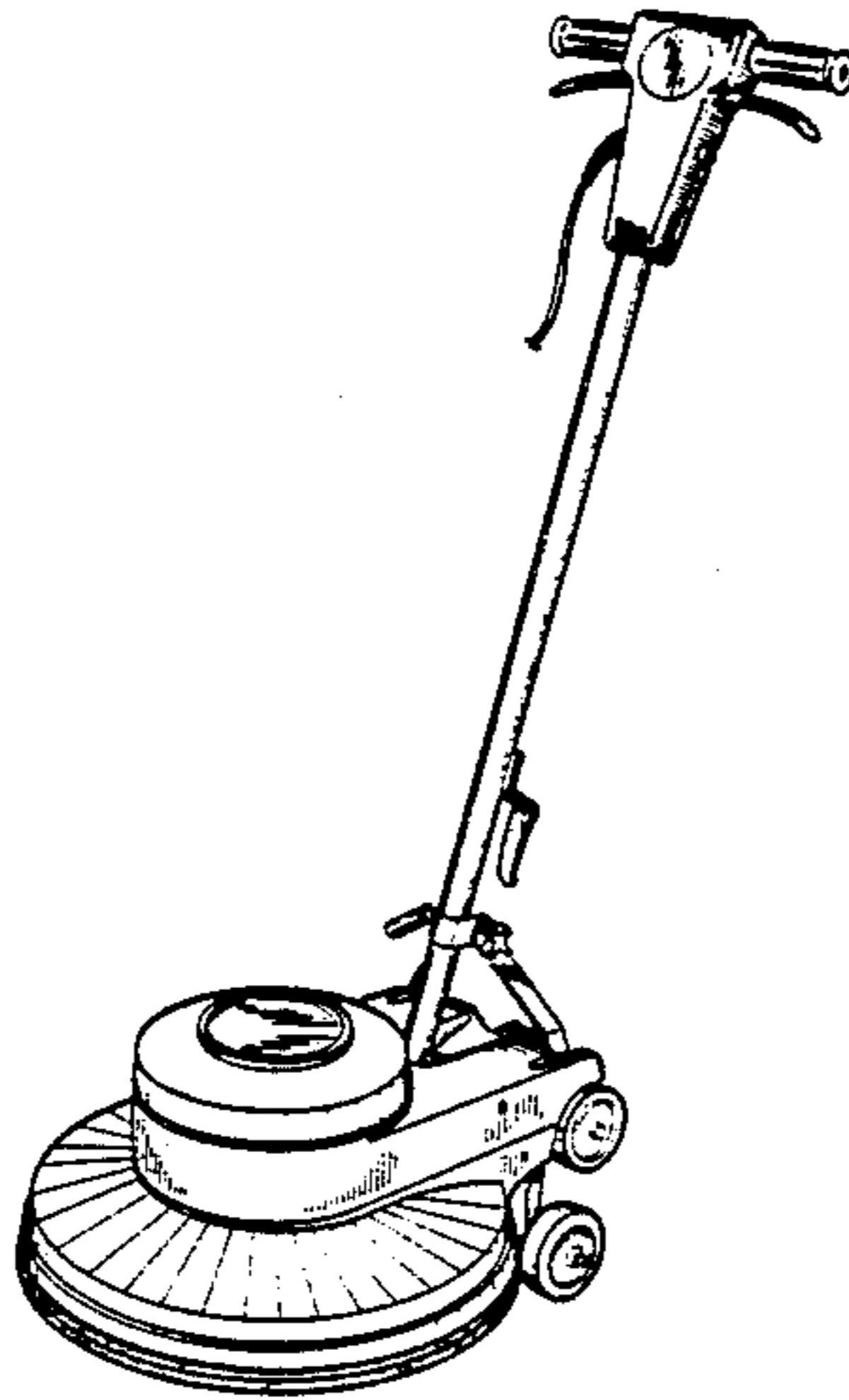

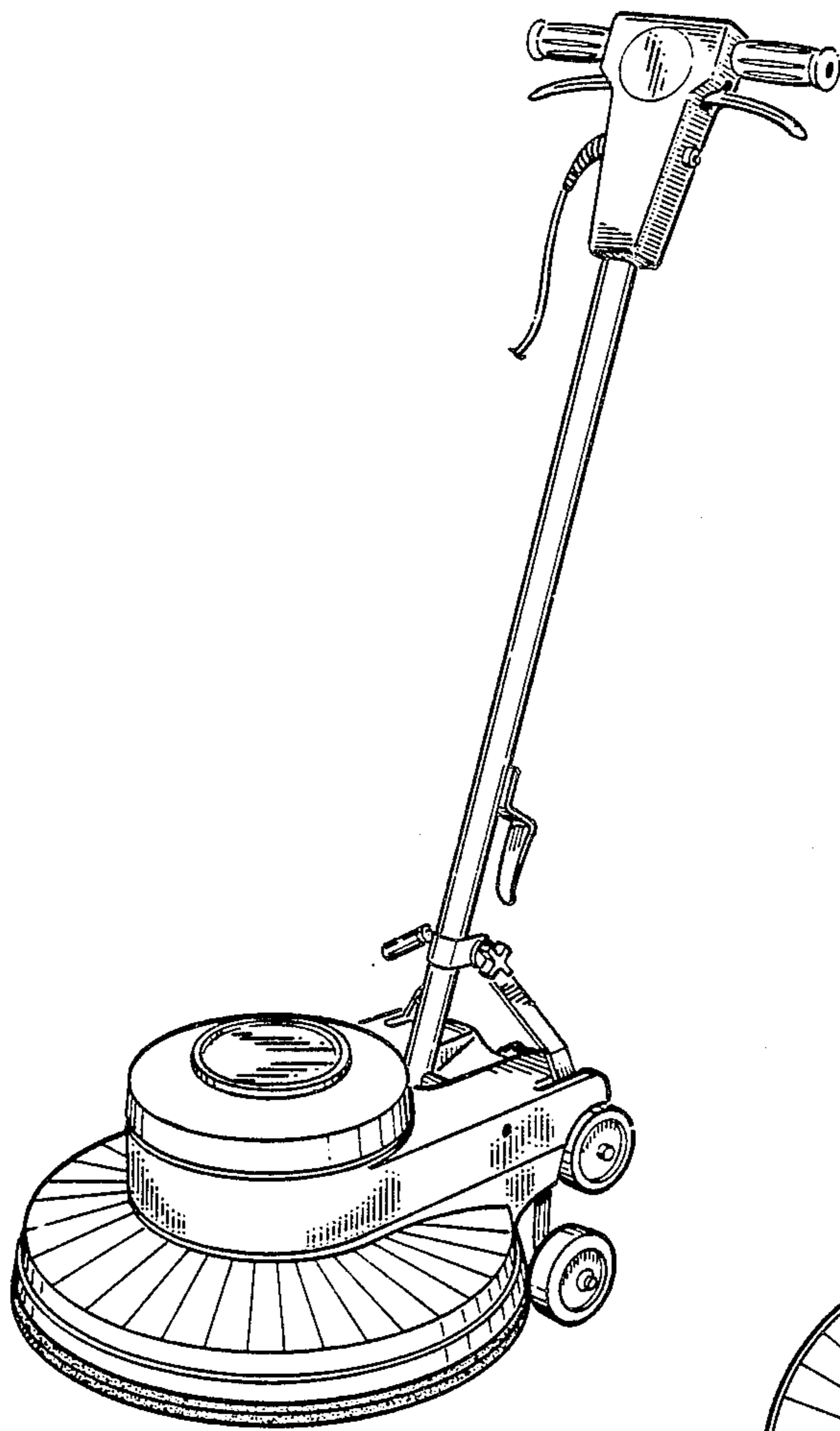

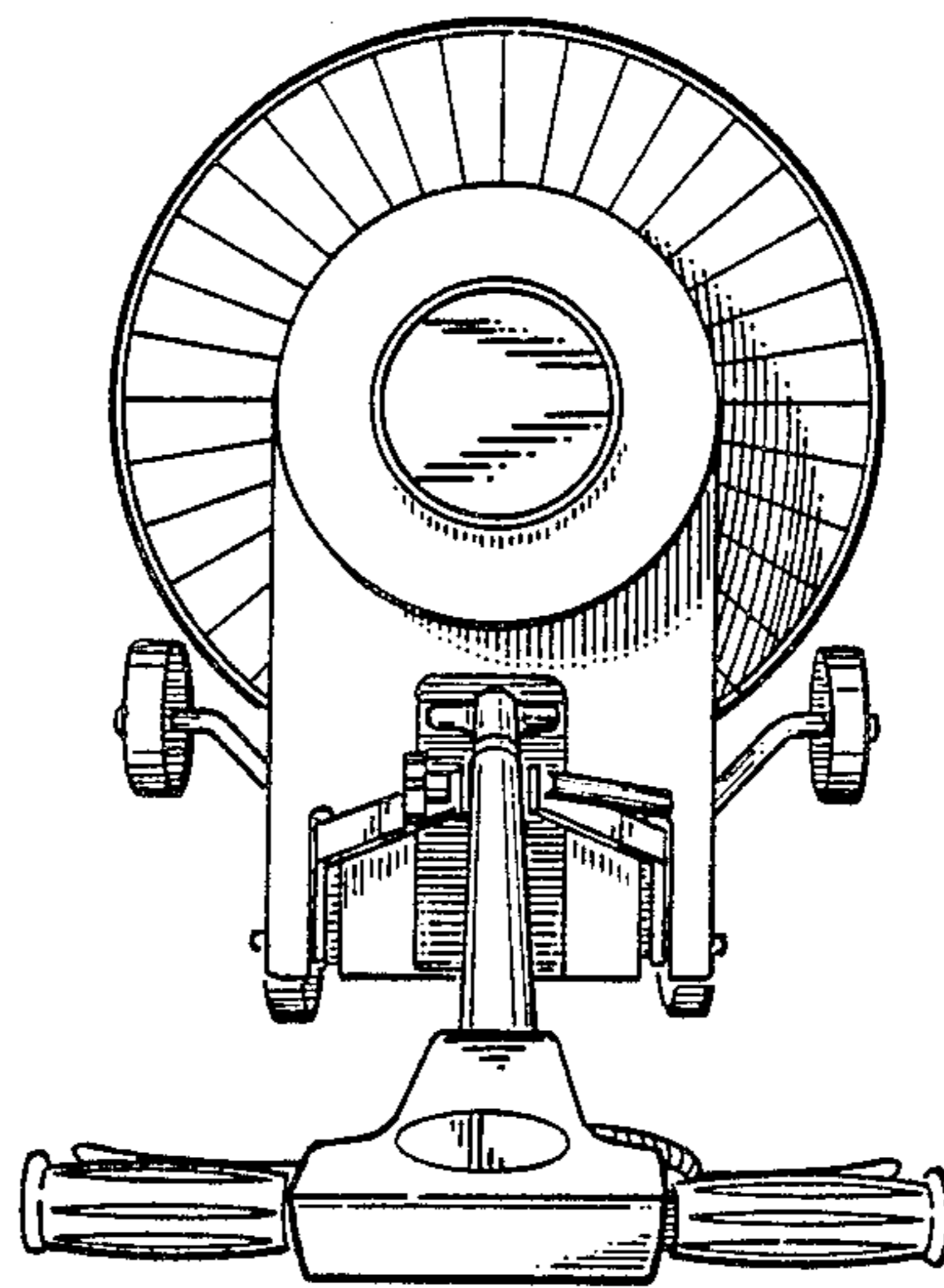

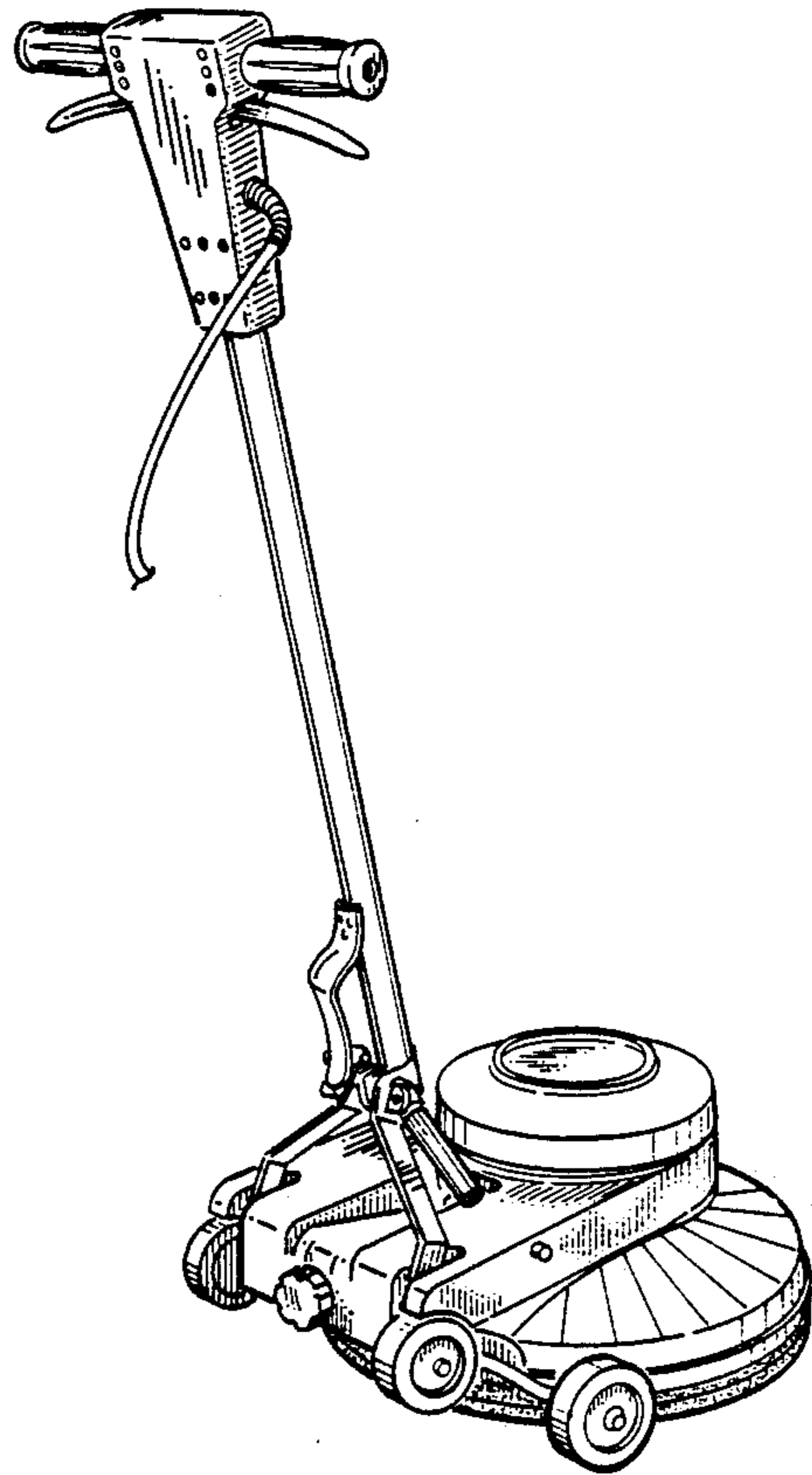
