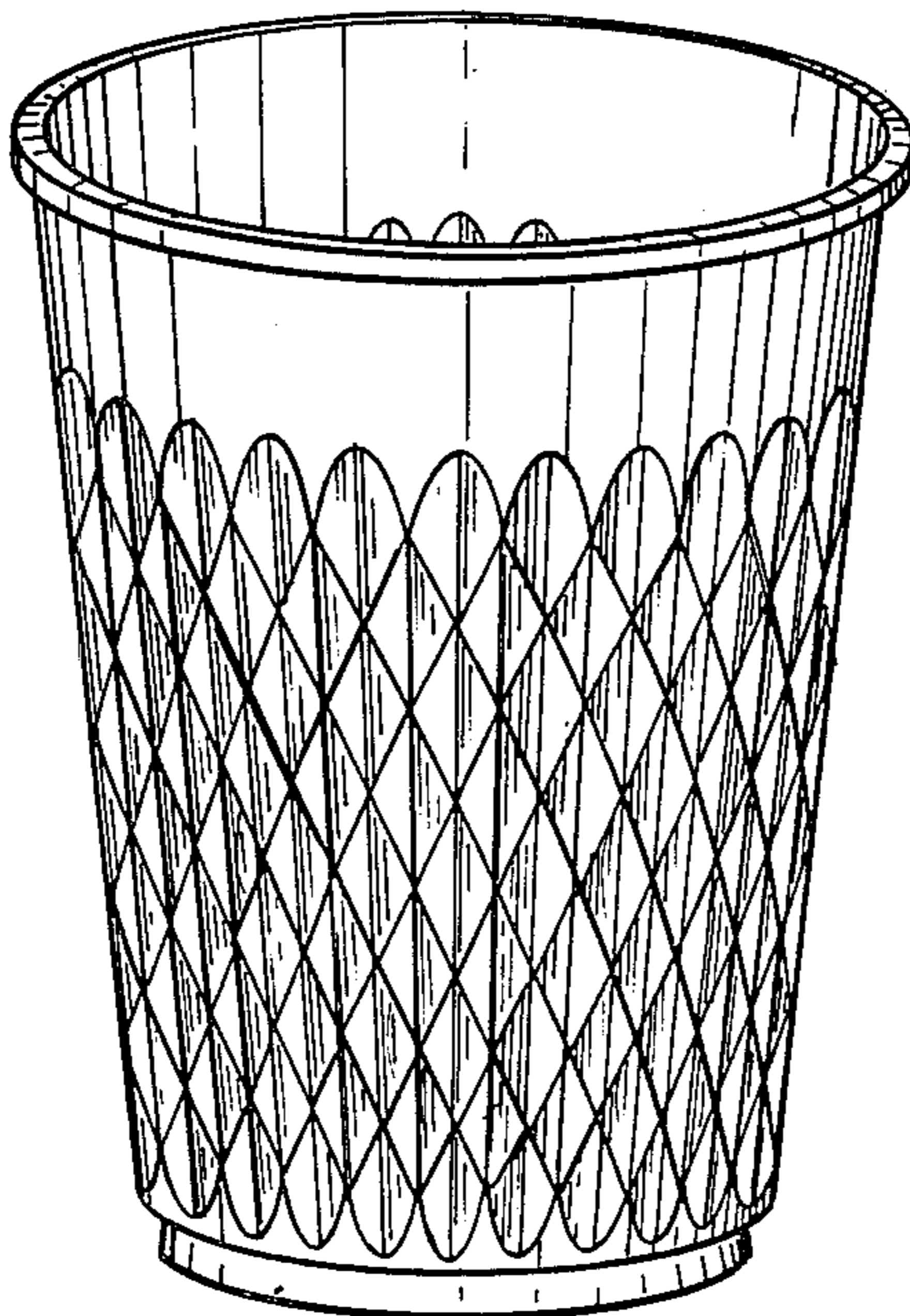
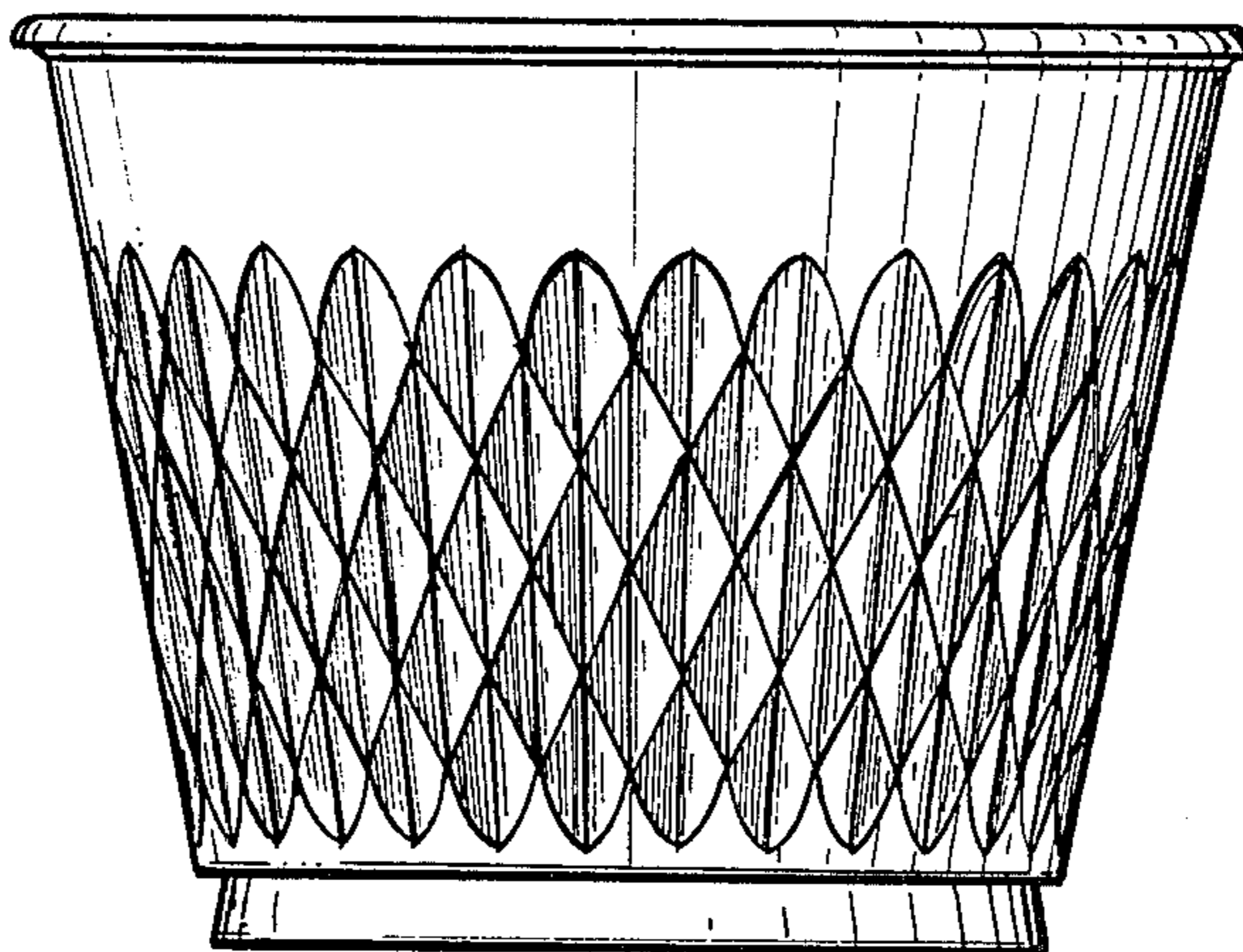

FIG. 4 is a side perspective view of a modification of my new design for a beverage tumbler.



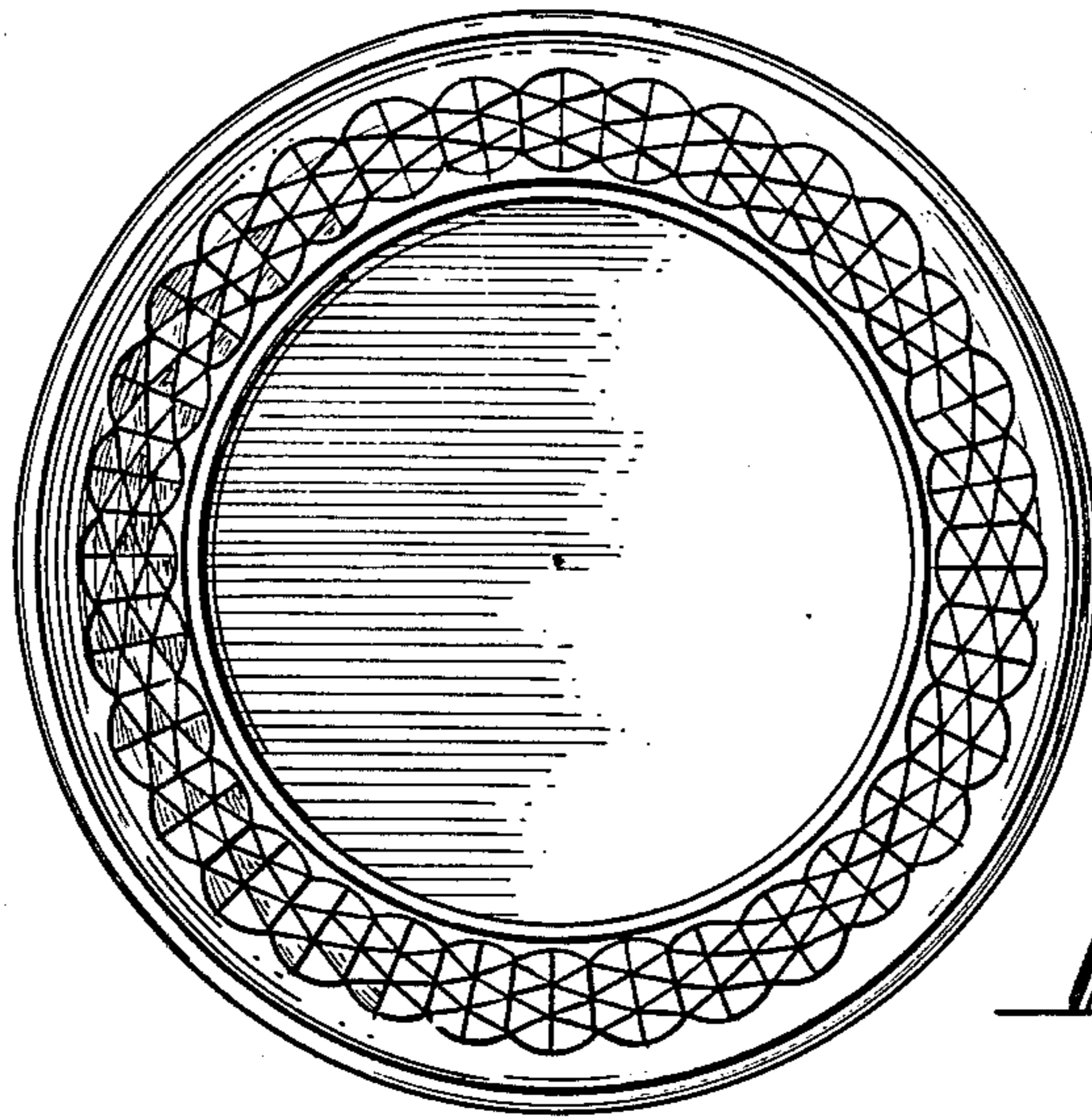

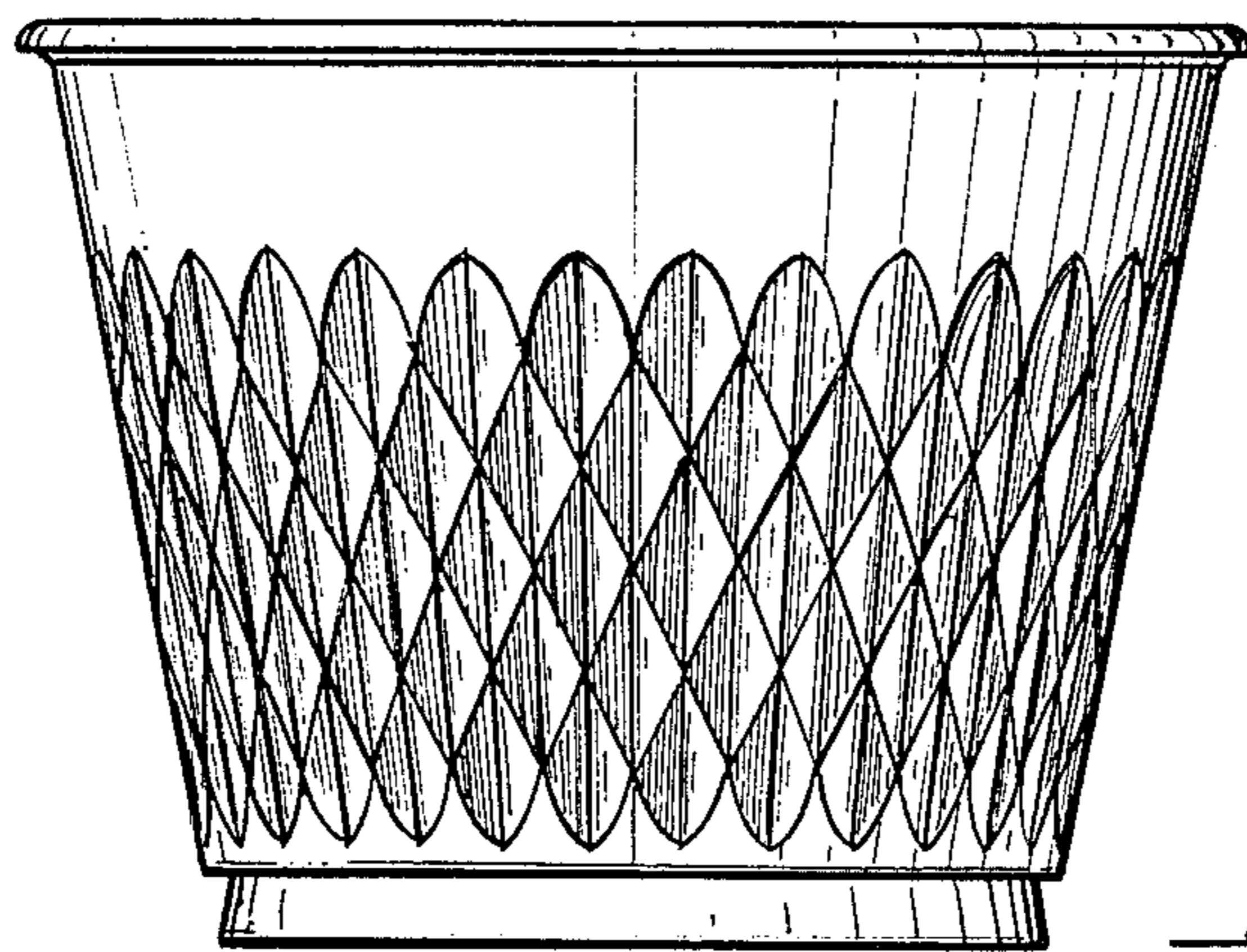

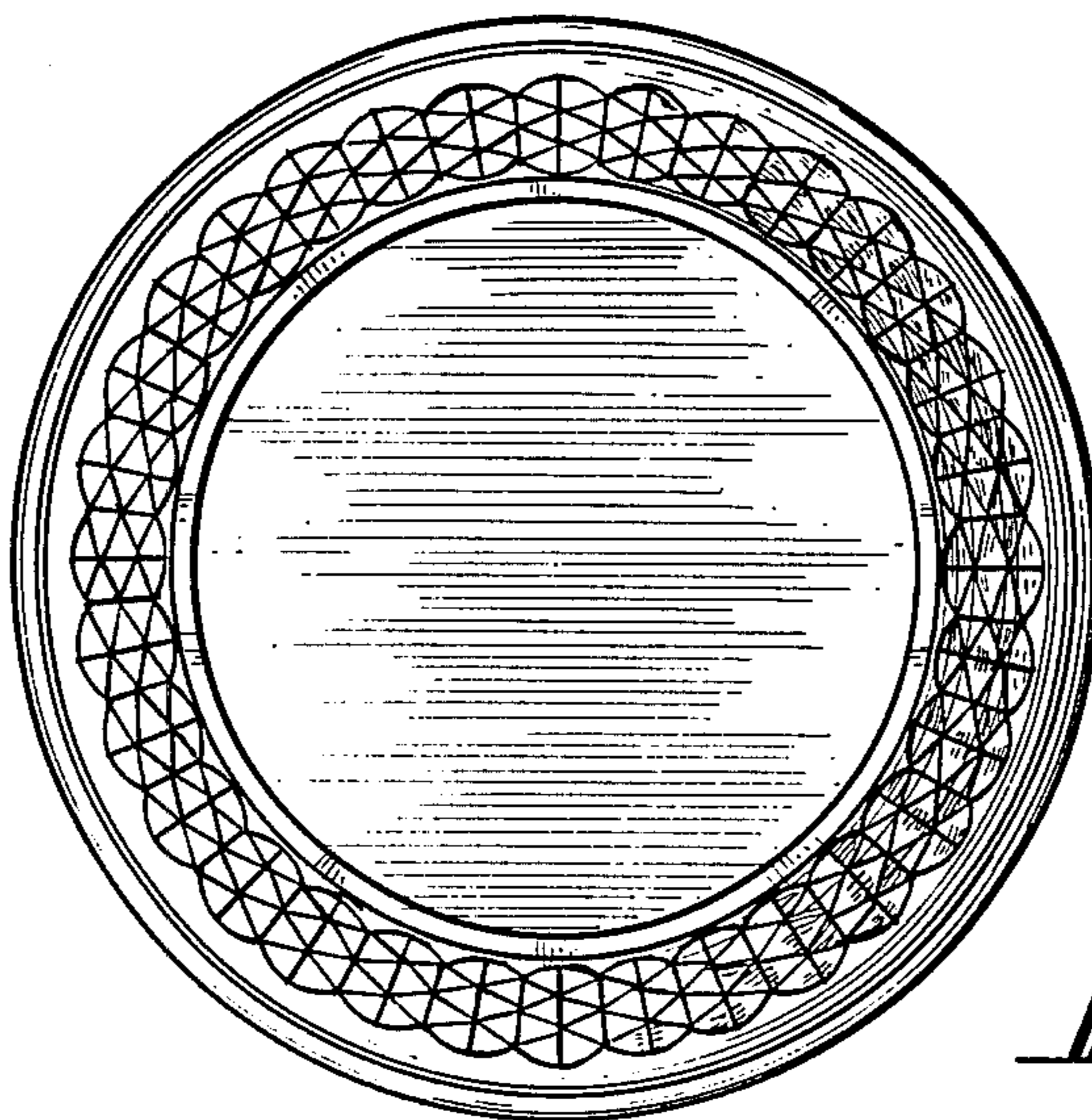

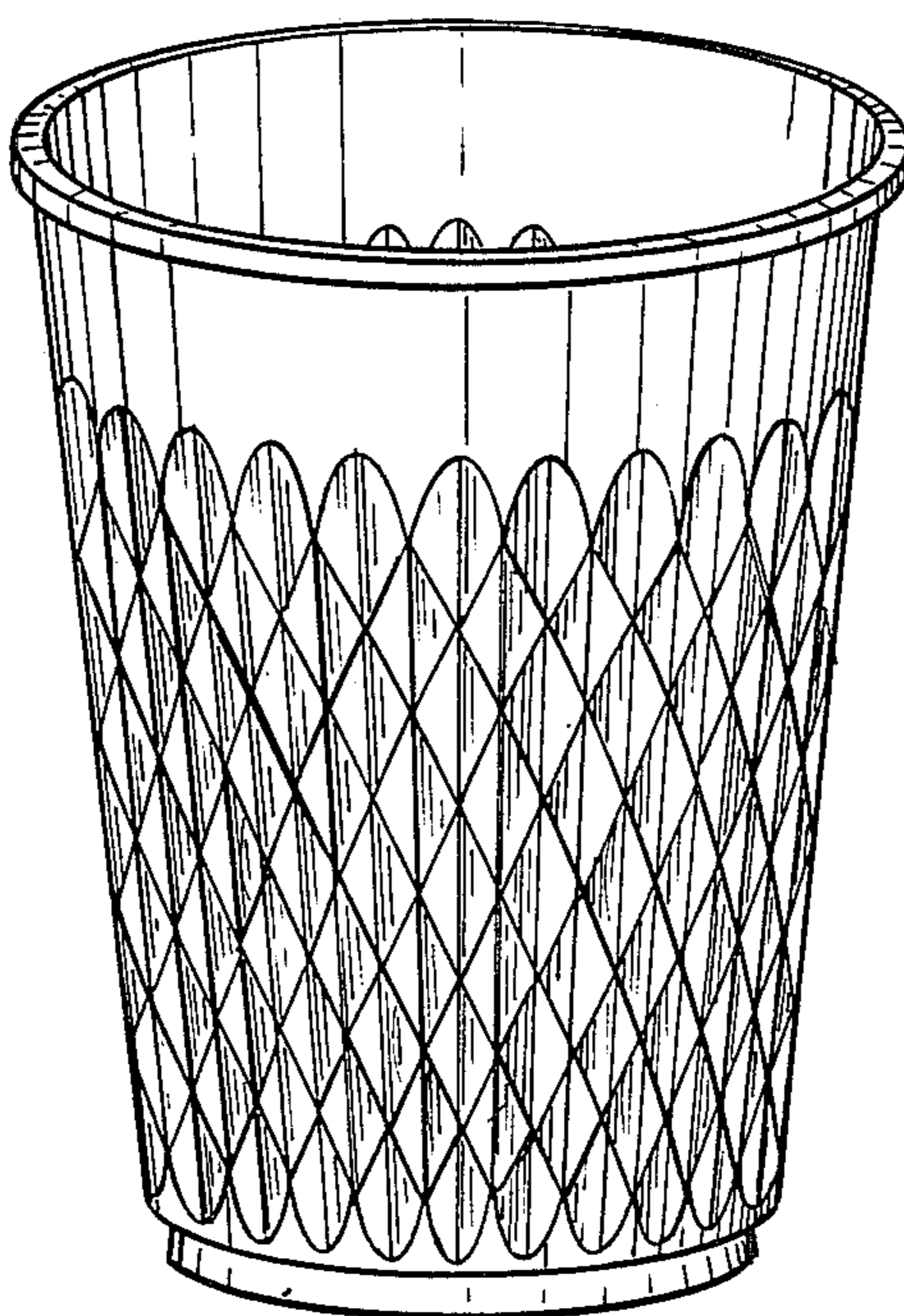
