The ornamental design for a reclinable chair, or similar article, as shown and described.

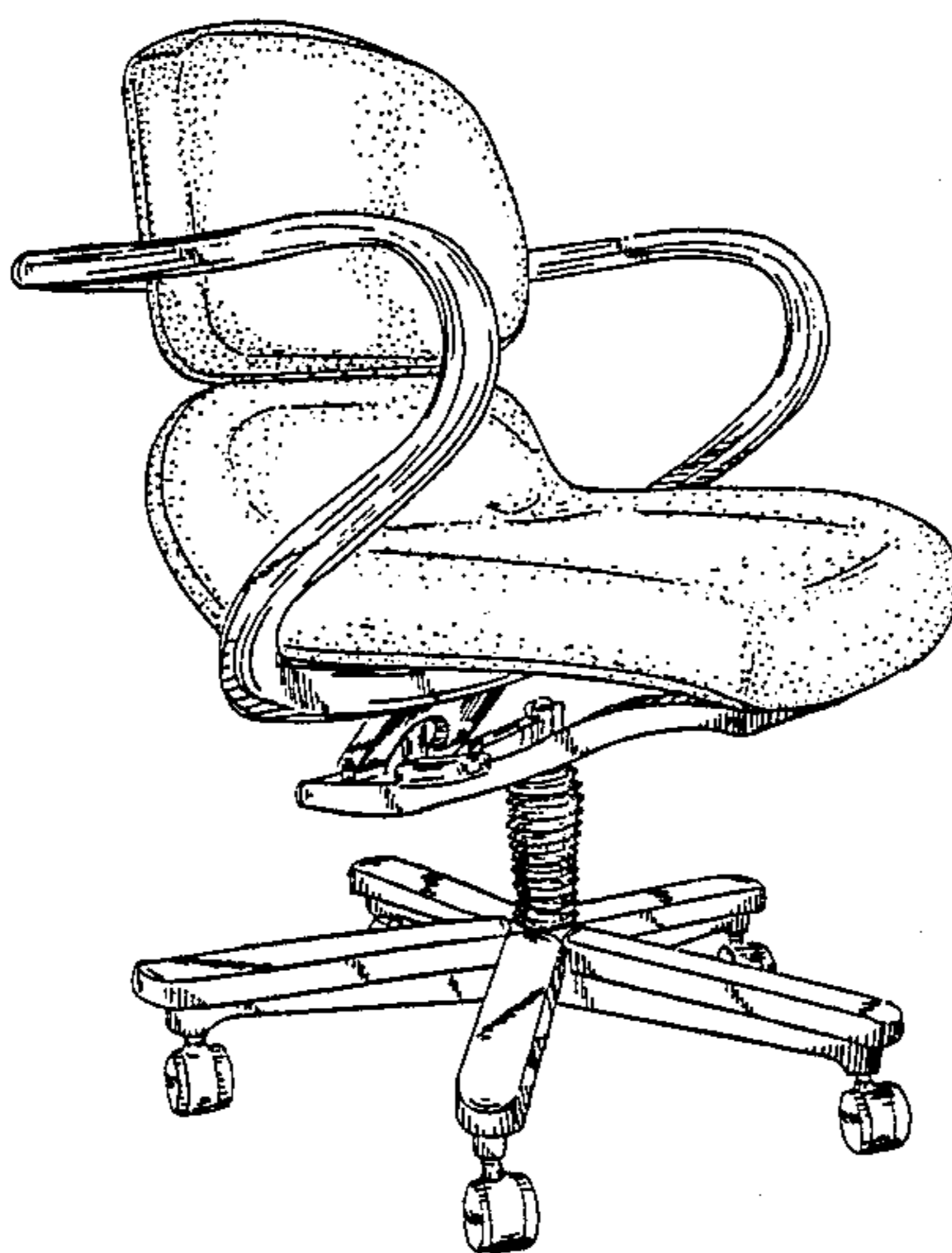
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 4 is a left side perspective view of the chair of FIG. 1.



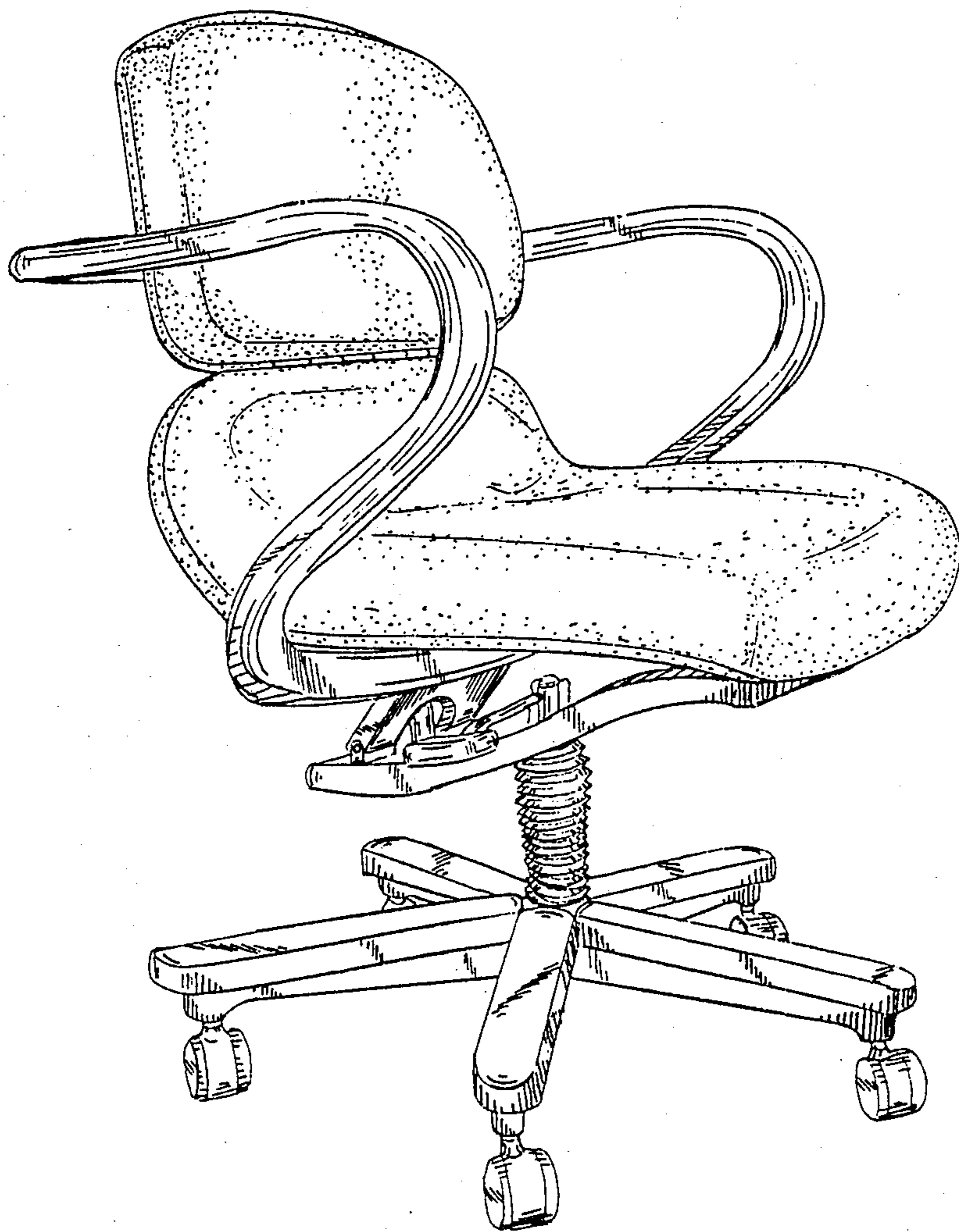

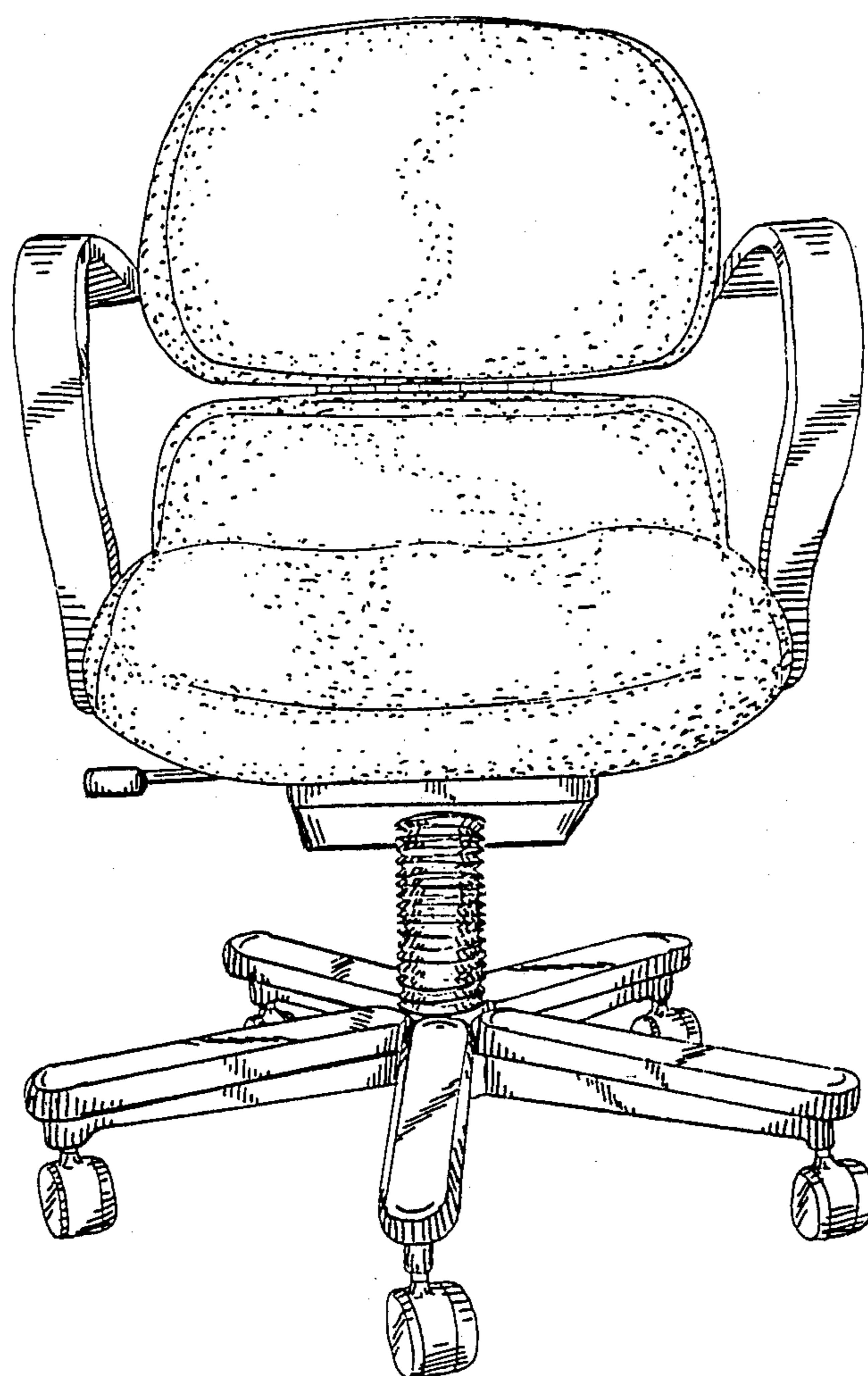

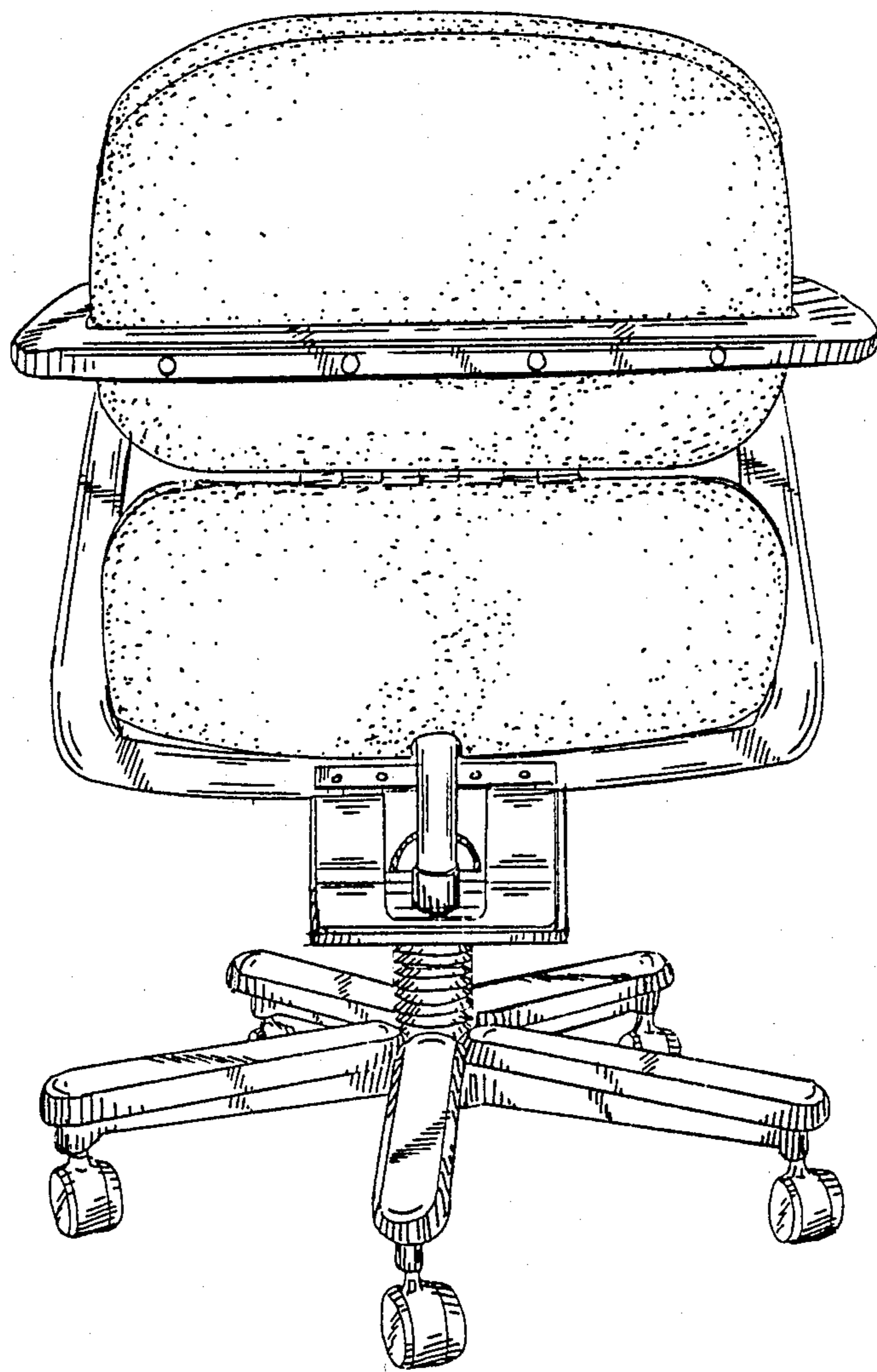
