[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a housing for a key pad, carrier select and credit card bezel for coin telephones, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a left side, top and front perspective view showing my new design of a housing for a key pad, carrier select, and credit card bezel for coin telephones; FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof, the view of the side opposite being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof; and FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof.

The rear view of the front shown in FIGS. 2 and 1 is hidden from view in normal use and forms no part of the claimed design.

The side opposite the front shown in FIG. 2 is hidden from view, and does not constitute a part of my design.
