[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a heat-insulated jug, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of a heat-insulated jug showing my new design; the side opposite is a mirror image;

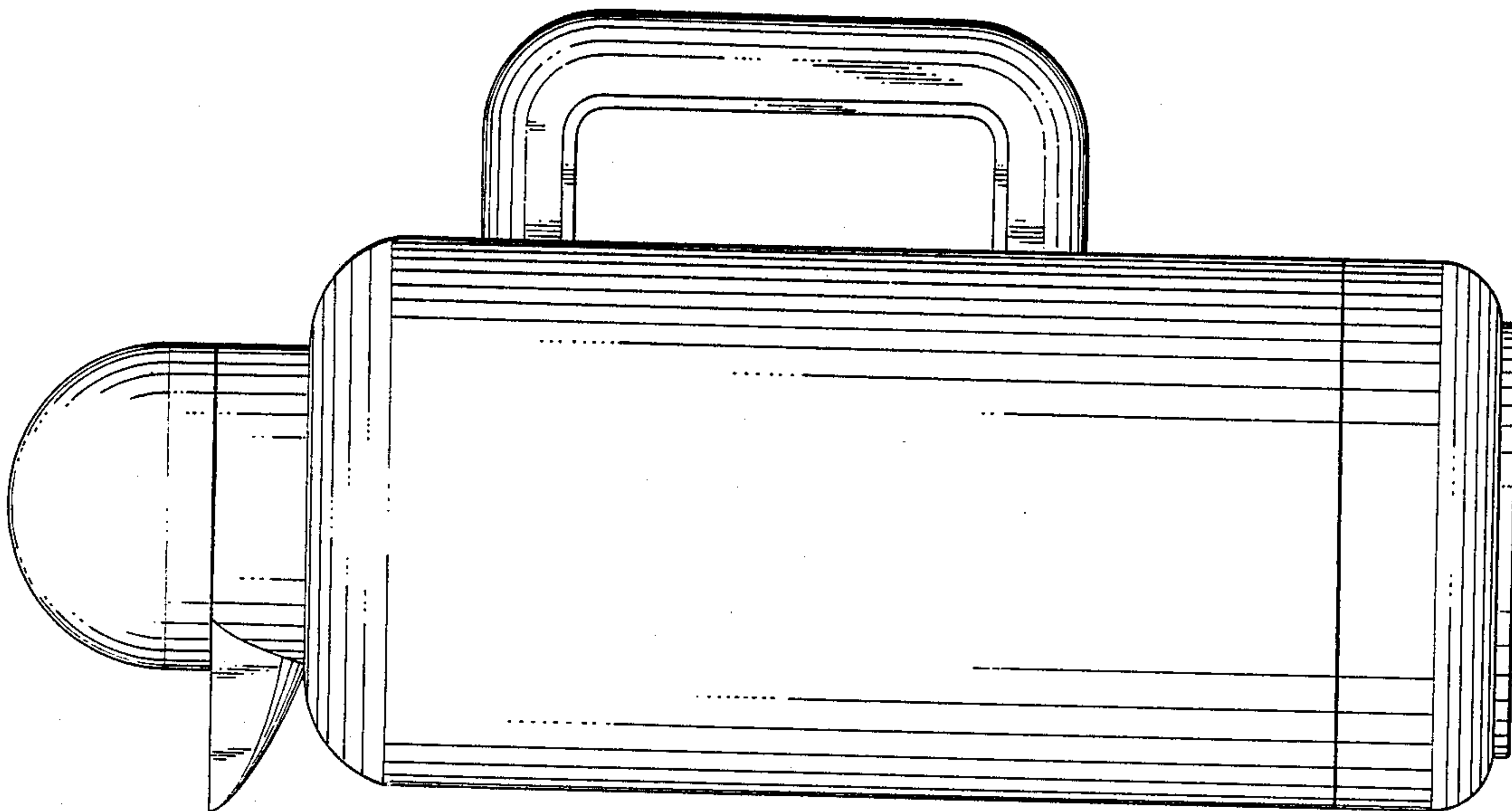
FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

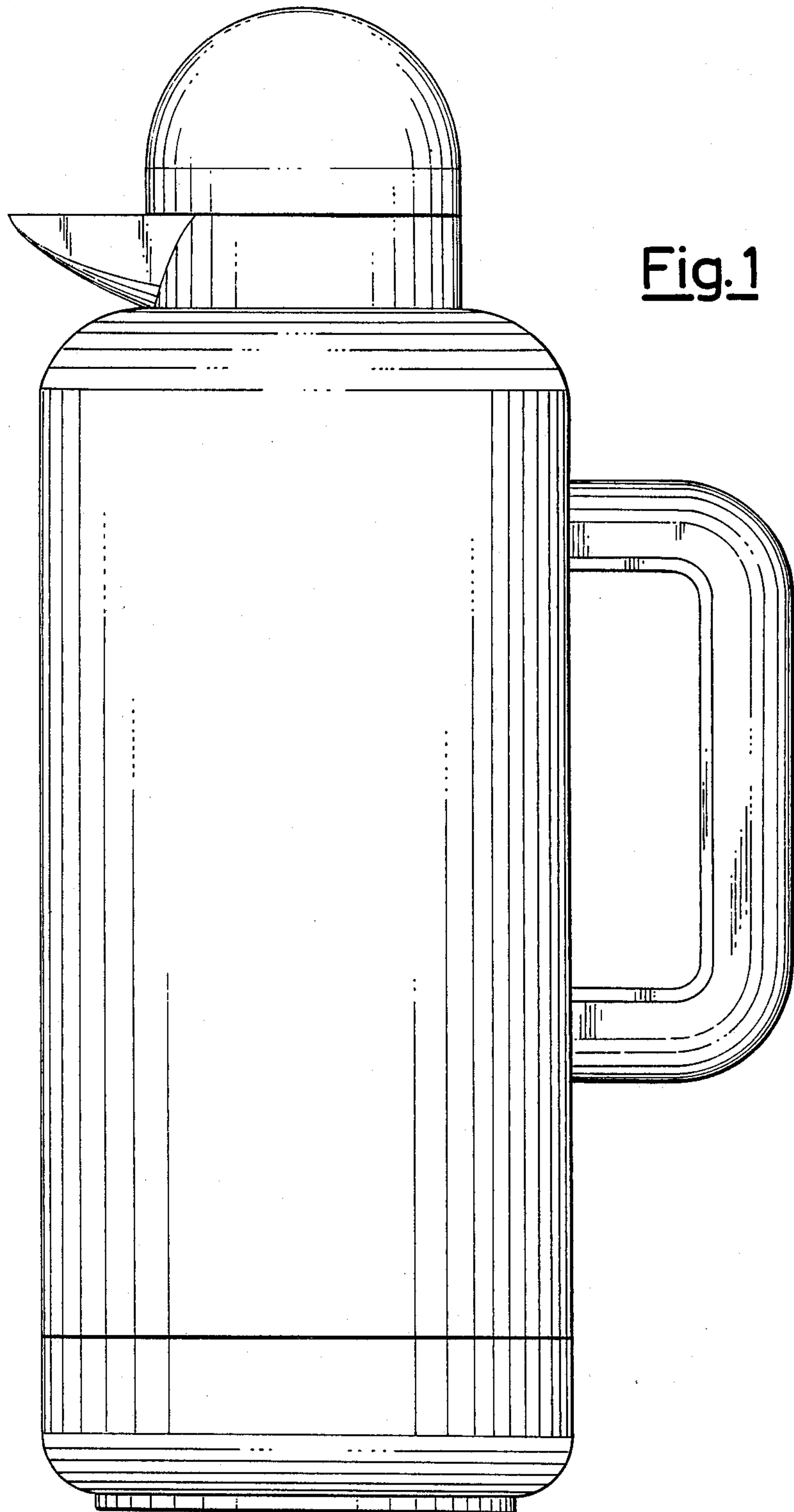
FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a longitudinal section thereof taken on the line 6—6 in FIG. 2.





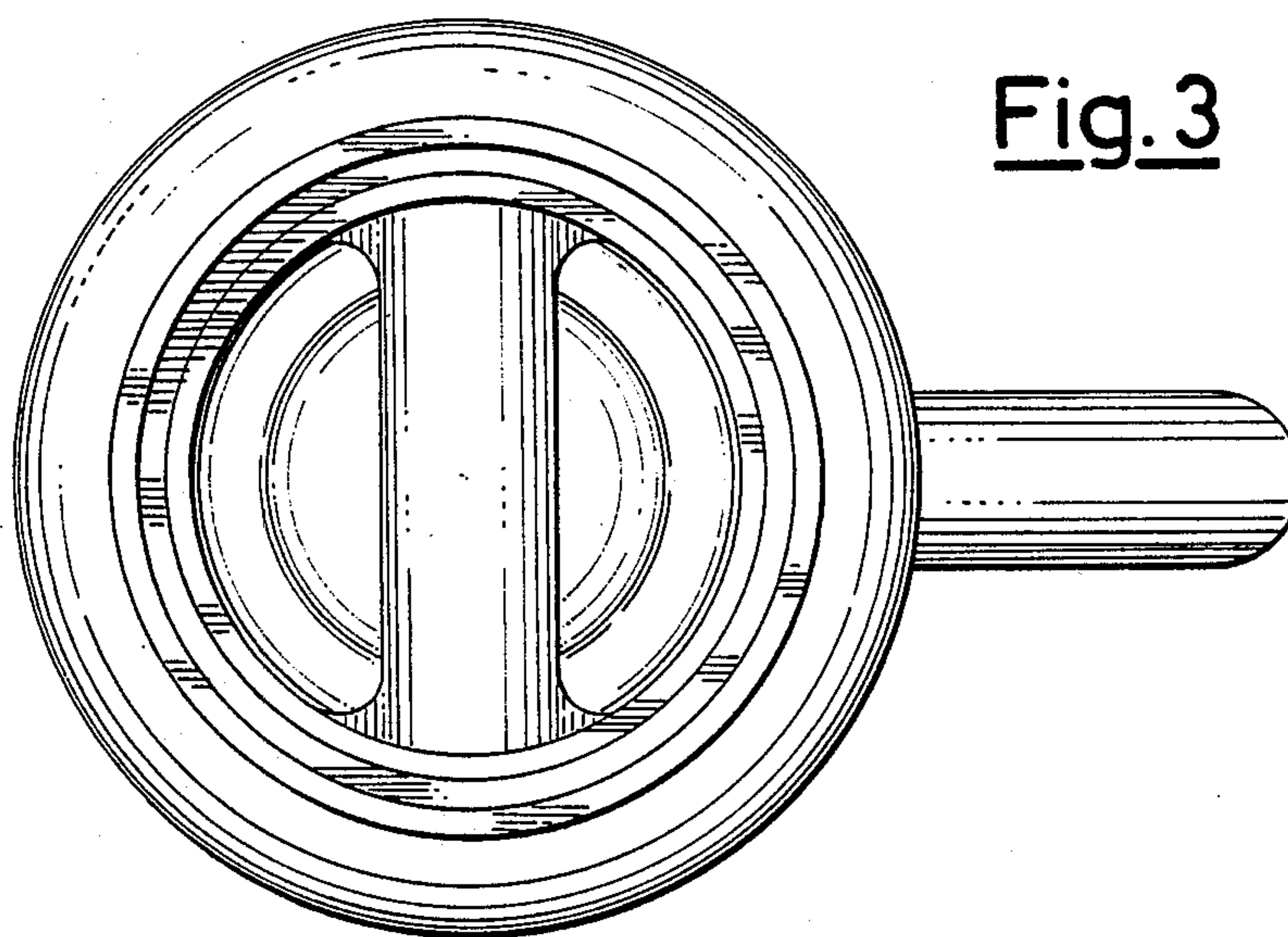
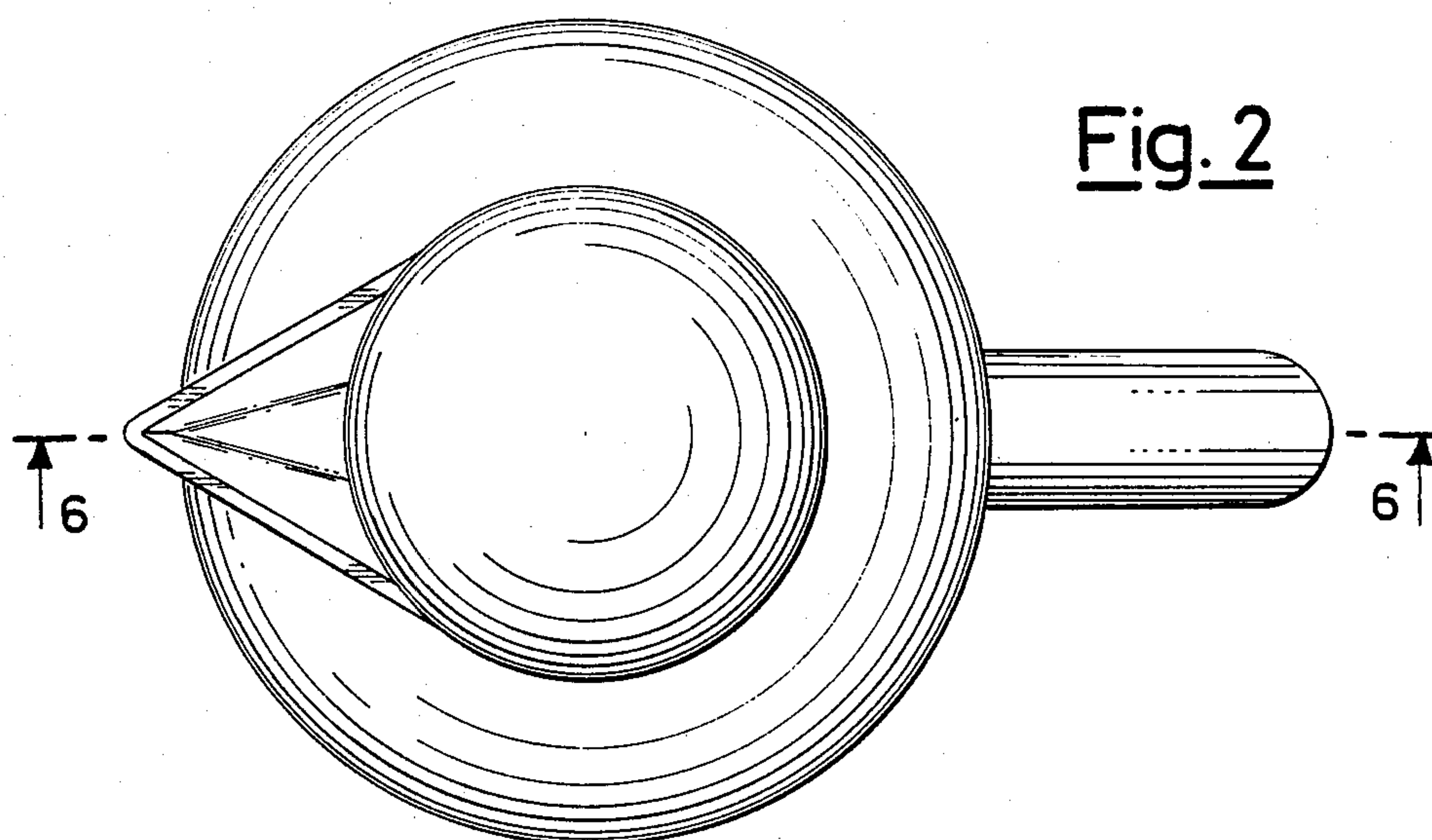

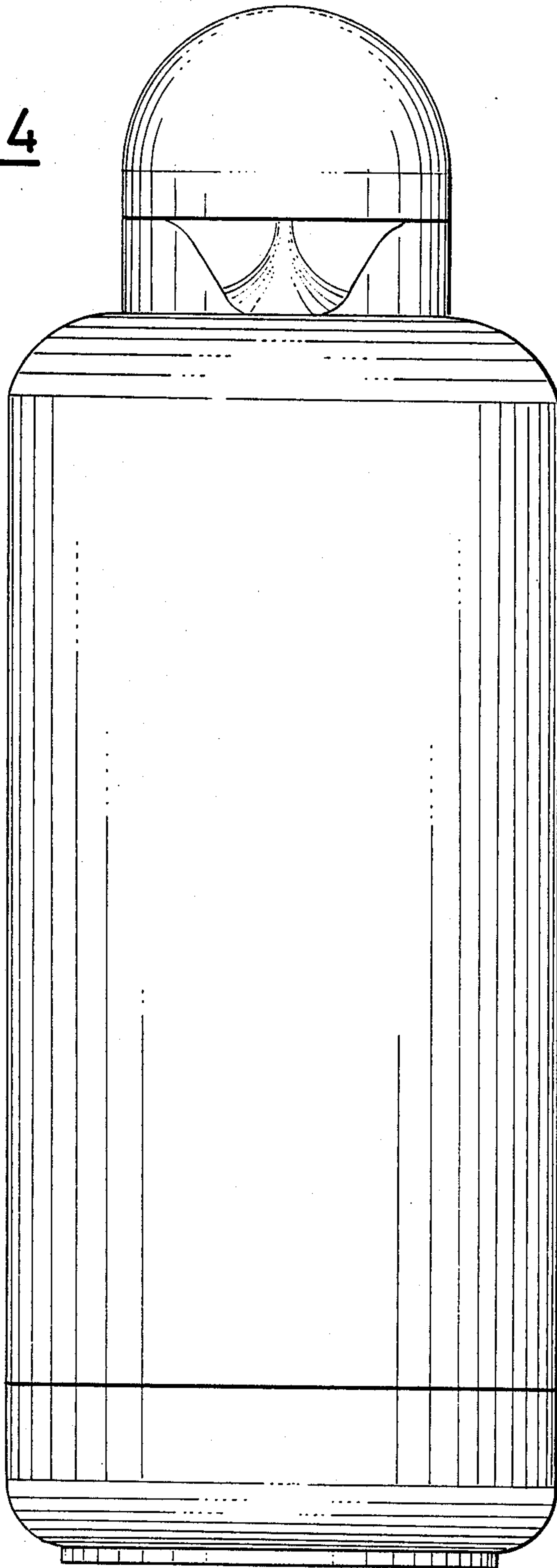
