The ornamental design for a case for a hand-held scanner for personnel identification through retinal blood vessel patterns, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of a hand-held scanner for personnel identification through retinal blood vessel patterns showing my new design;

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof.

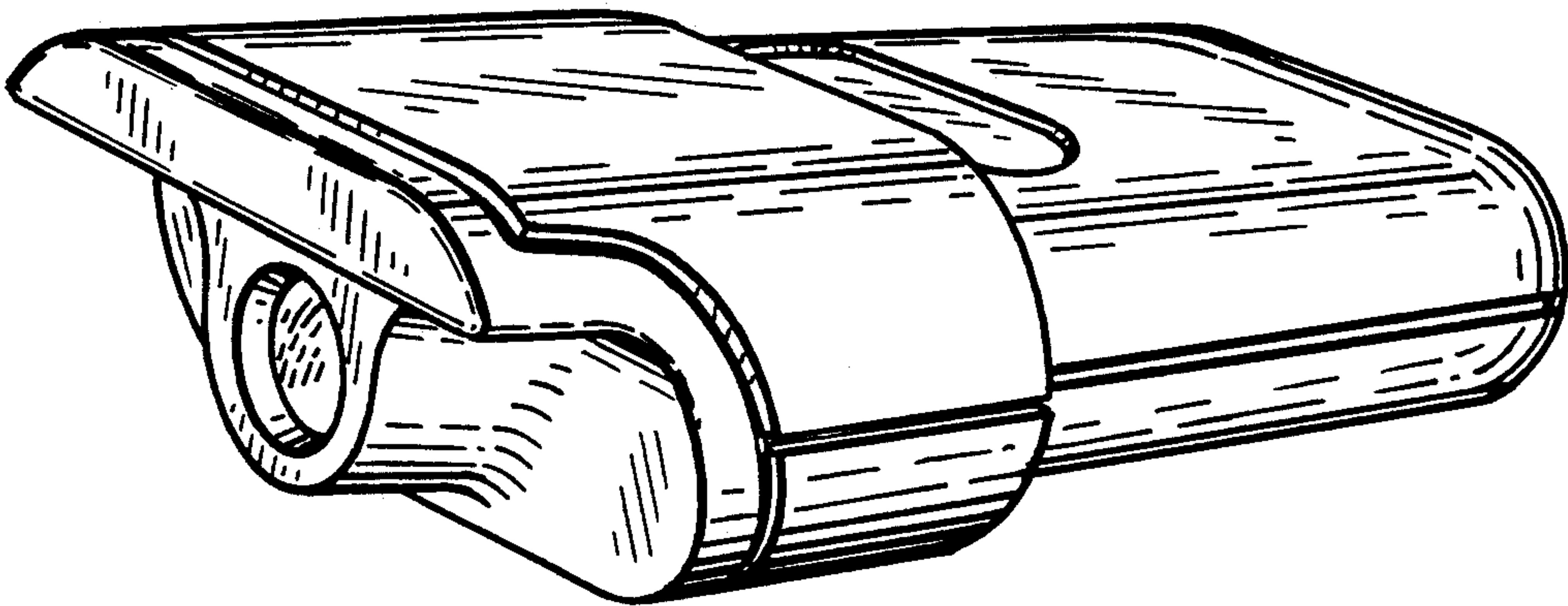

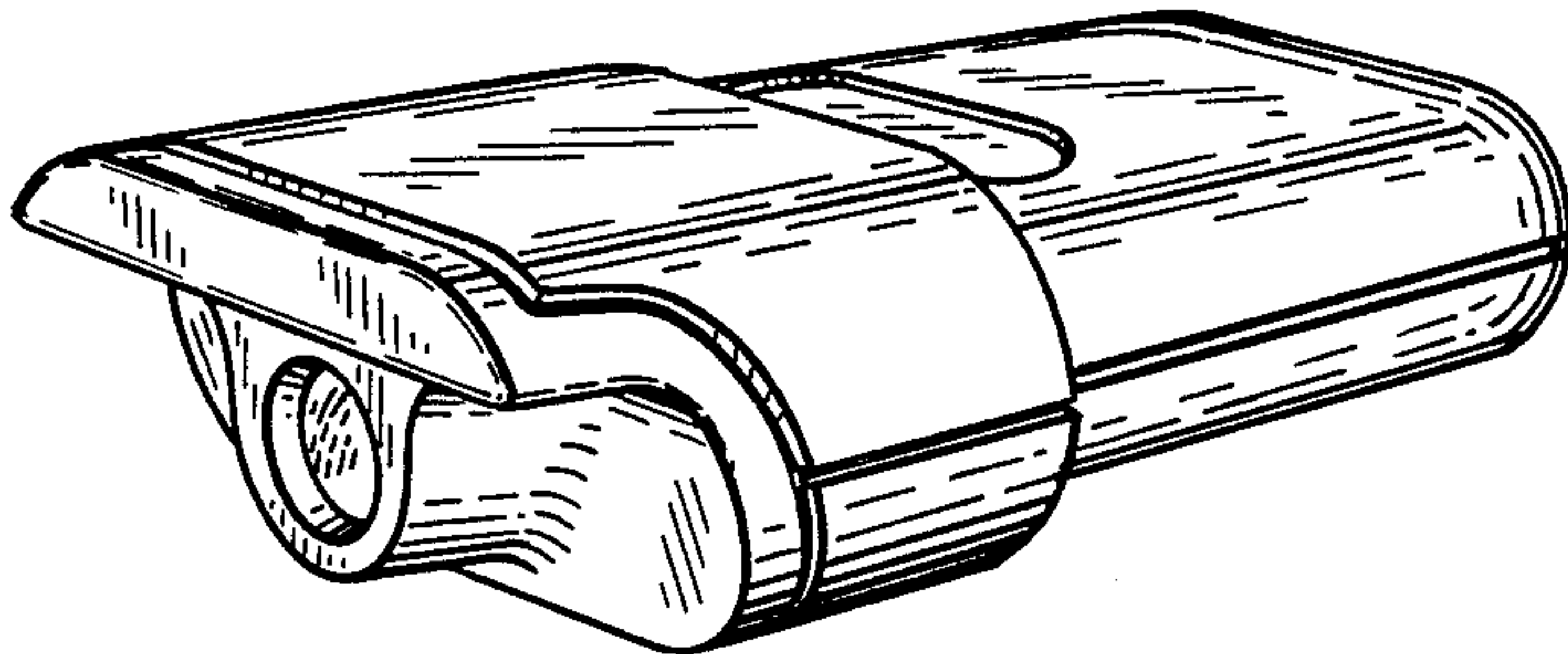

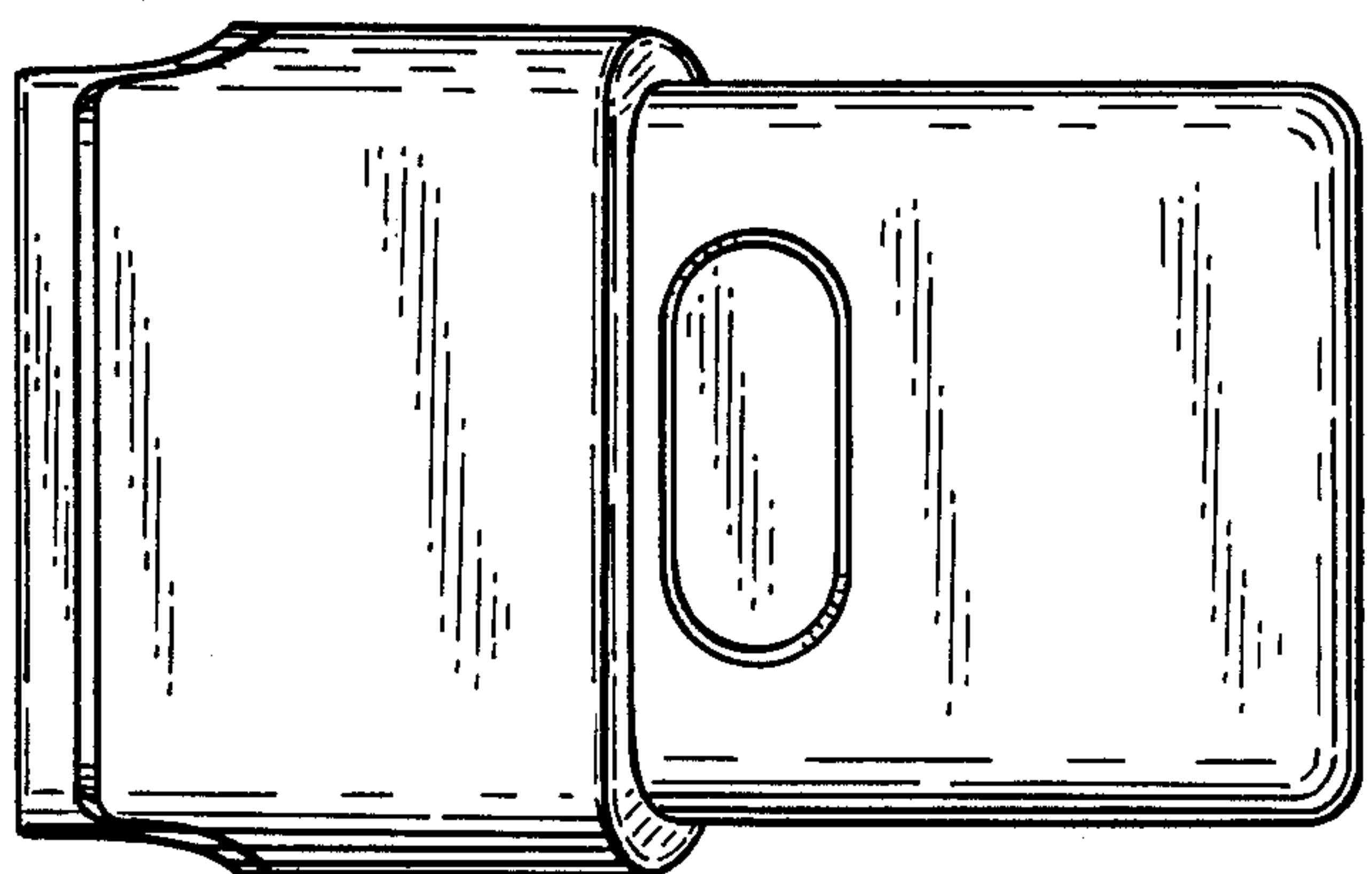

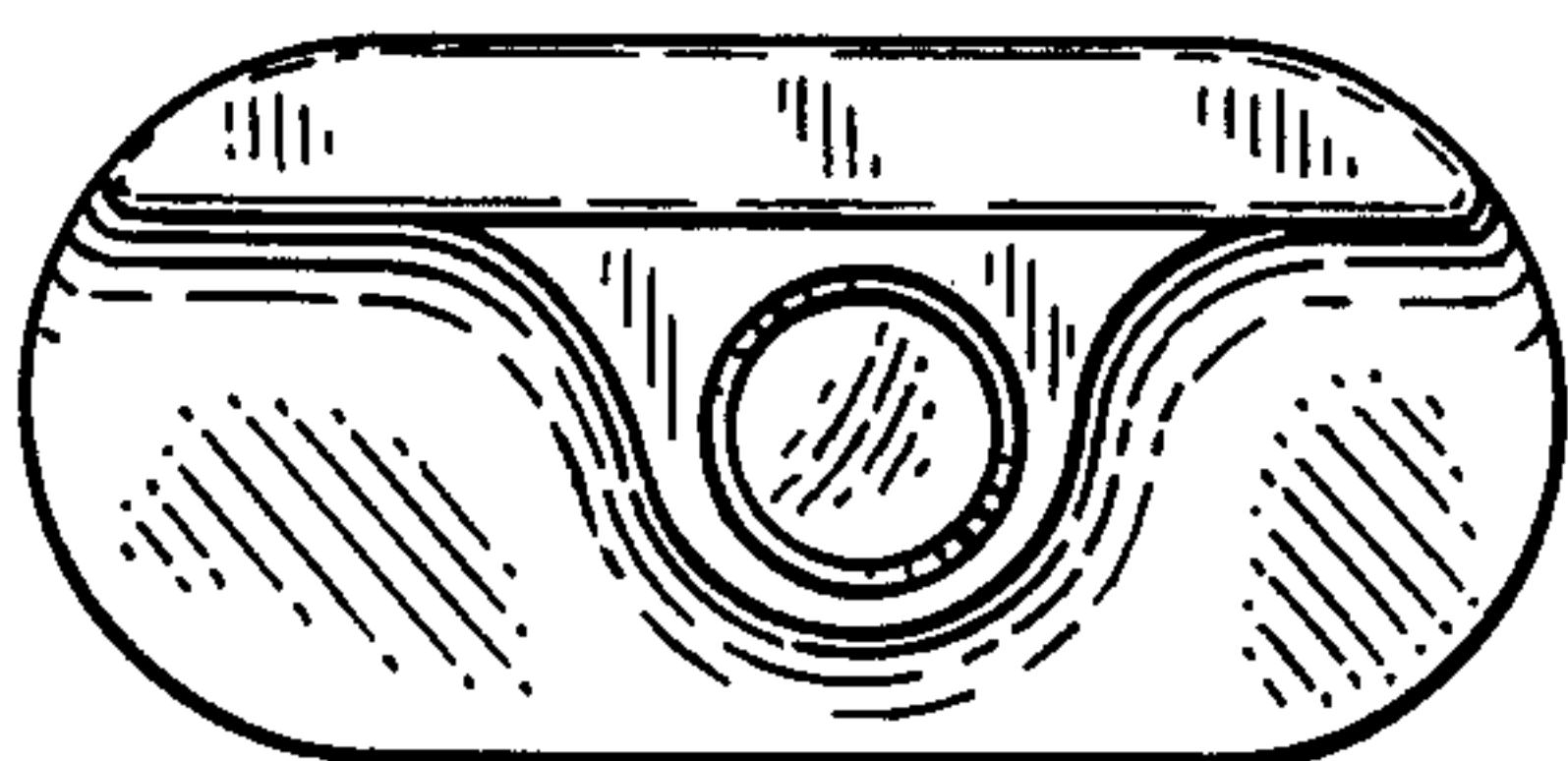

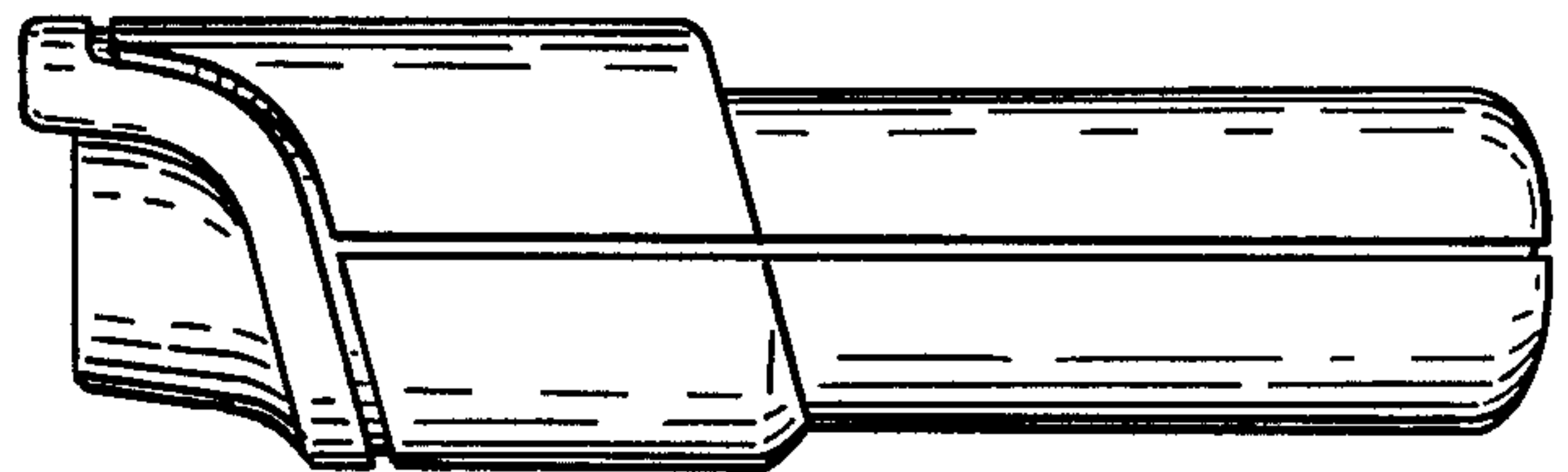
