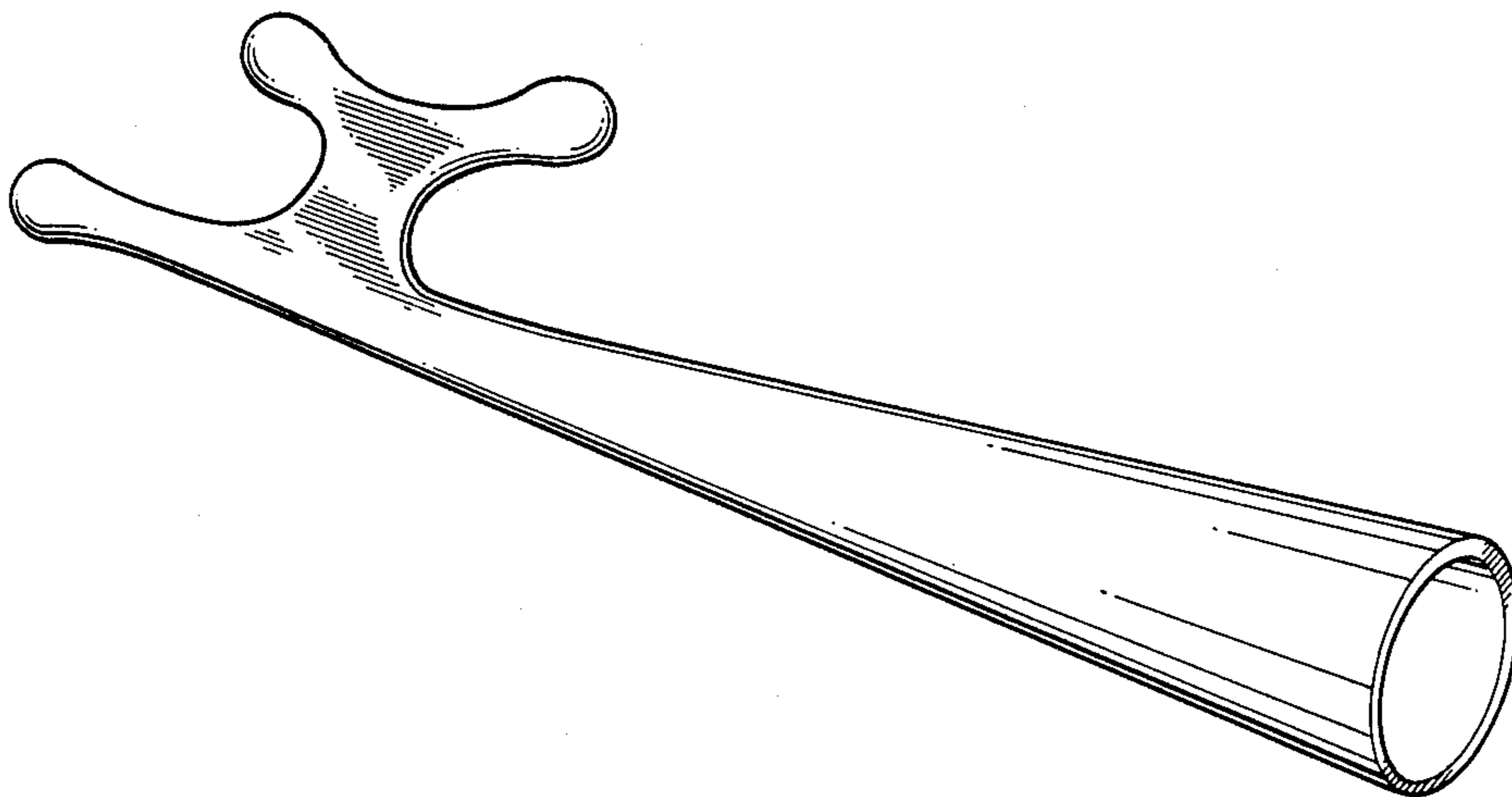

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a boat hook showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof, the right side being a mirror image;
FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof.
The broken line showing of the portion of a handle in FIGS. 2 and 3 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.



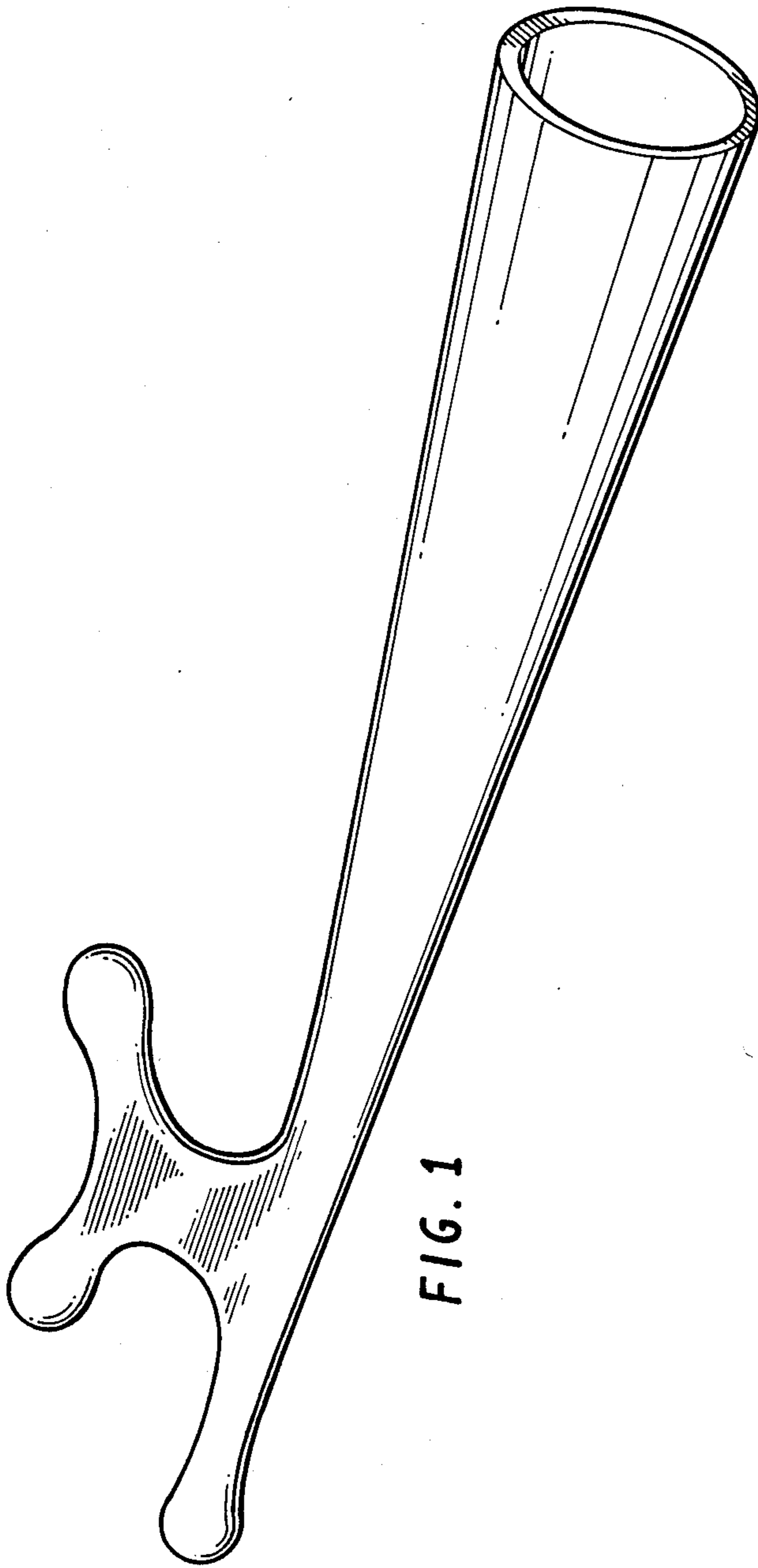

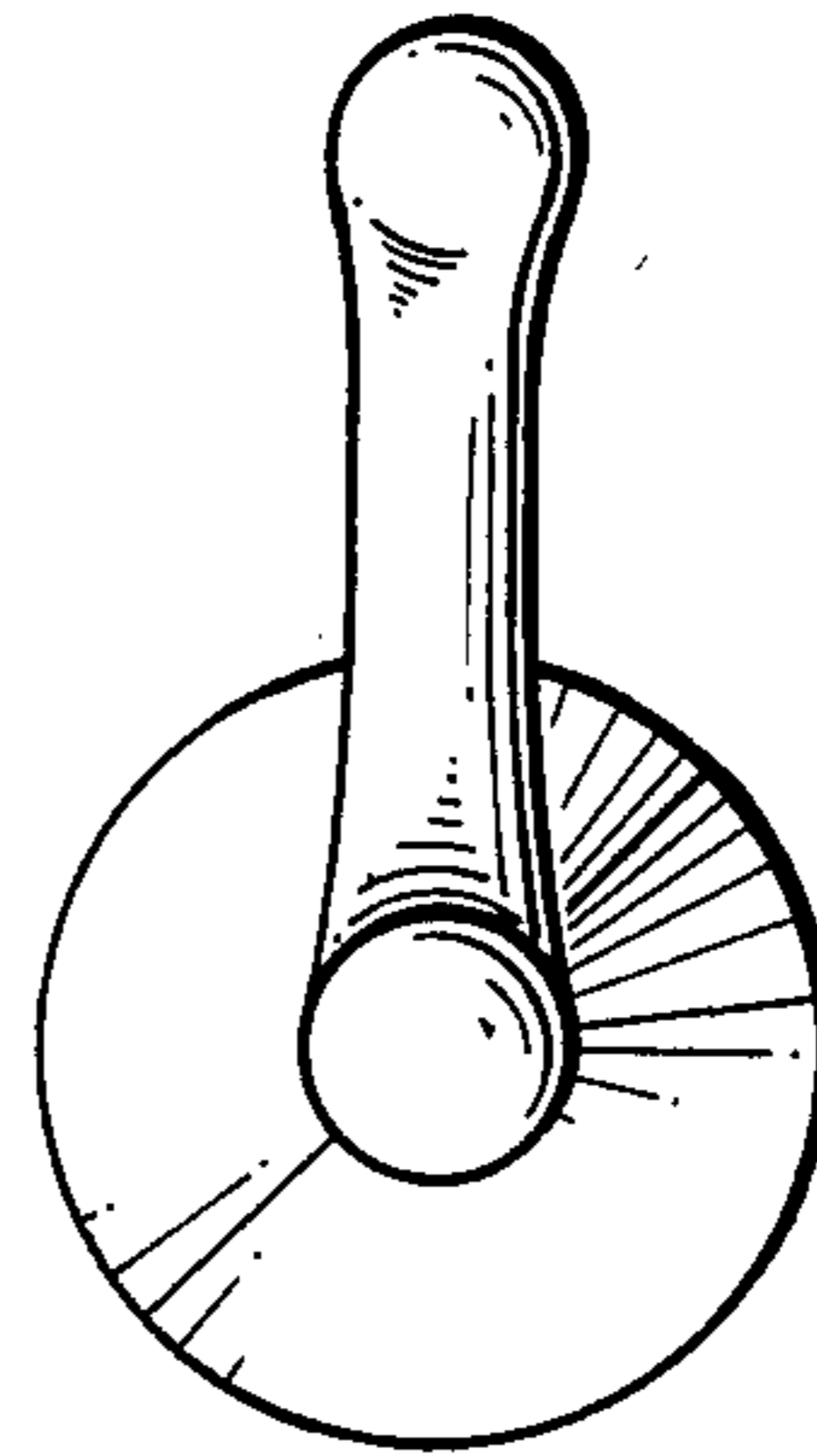
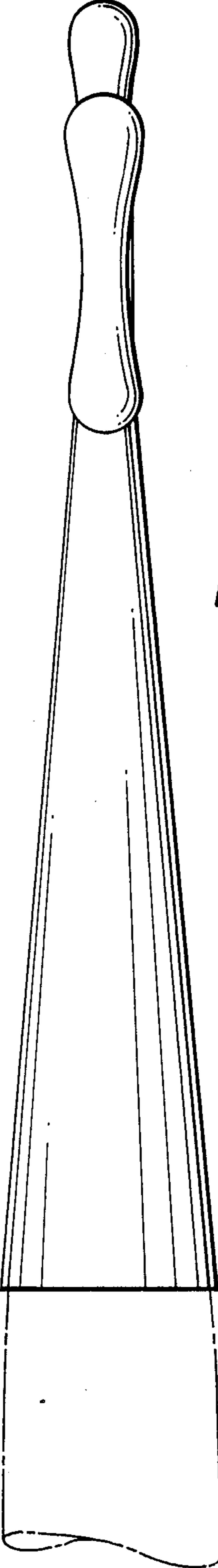
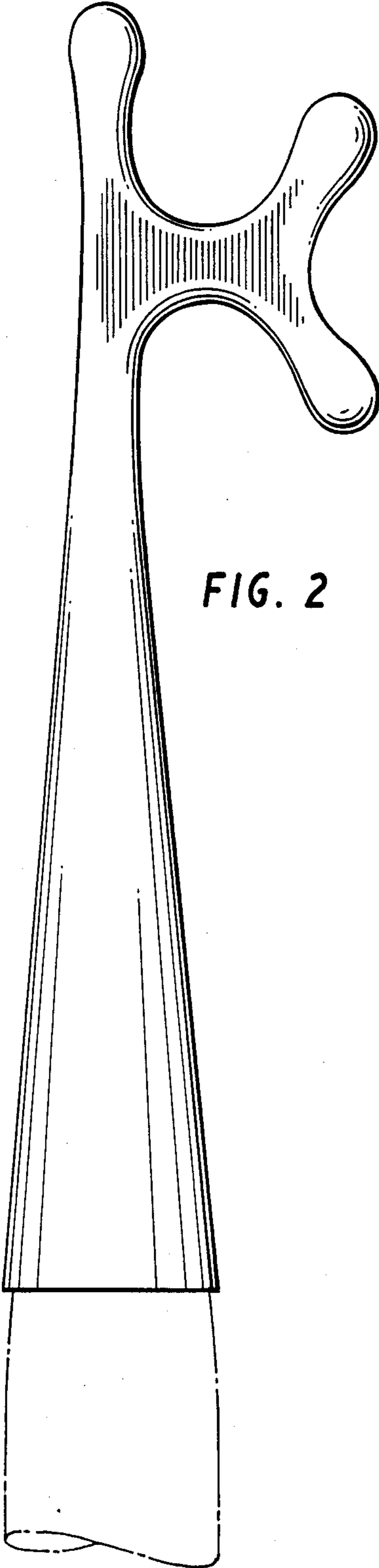

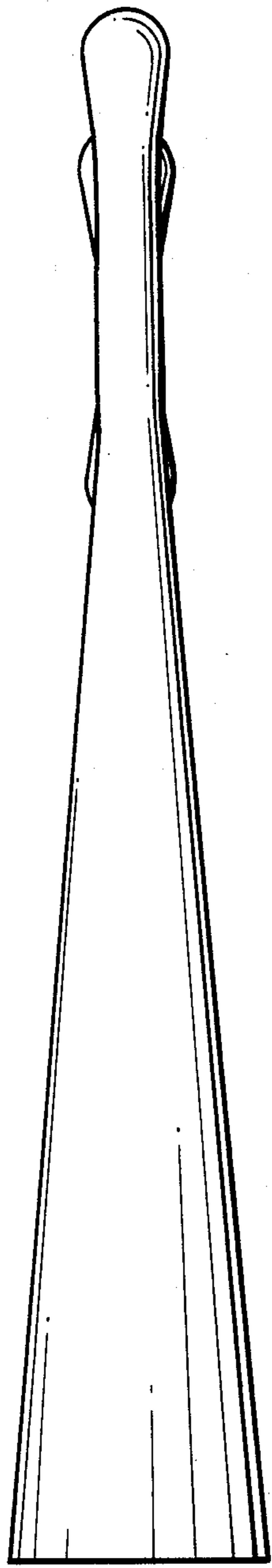

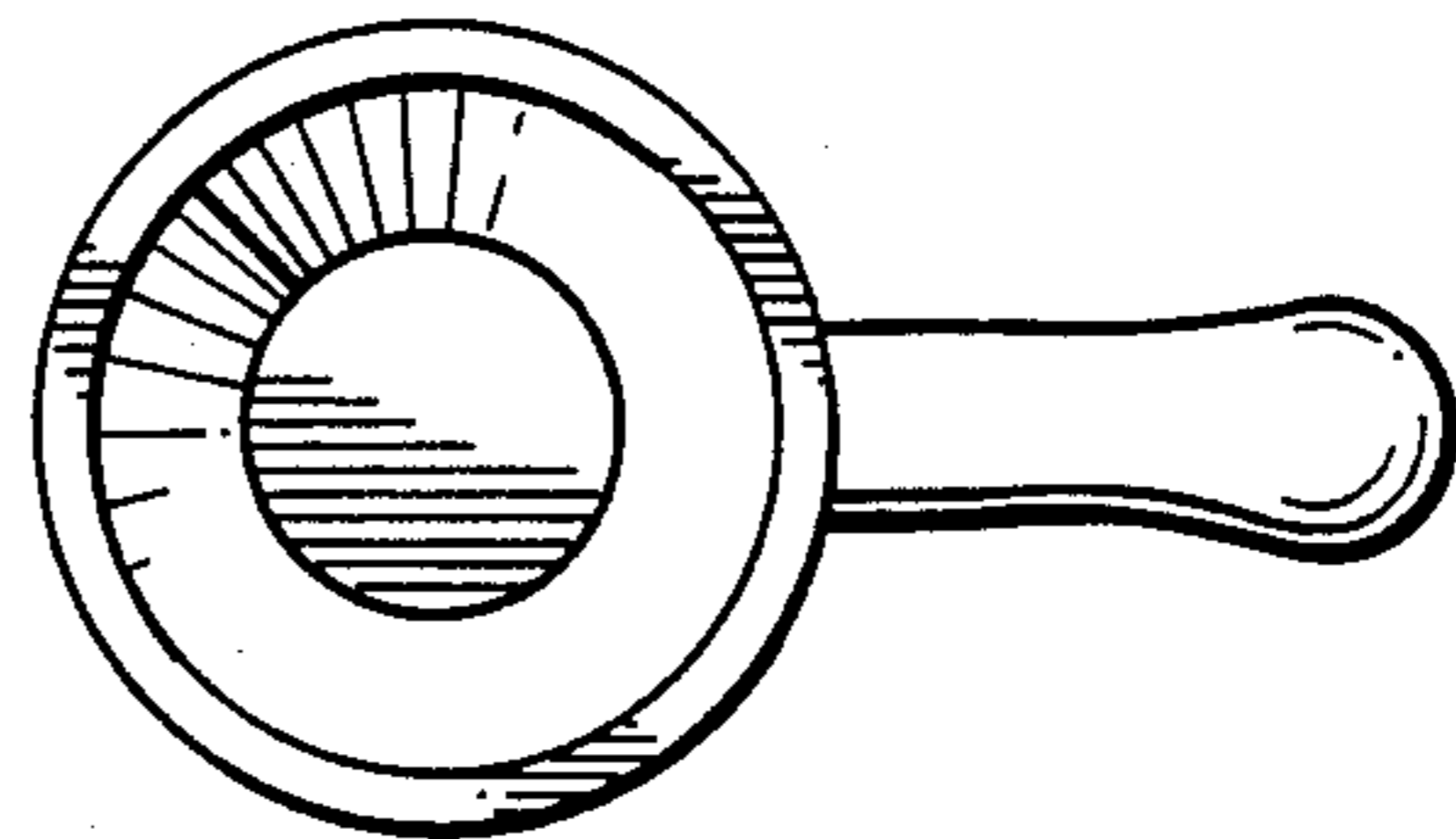
