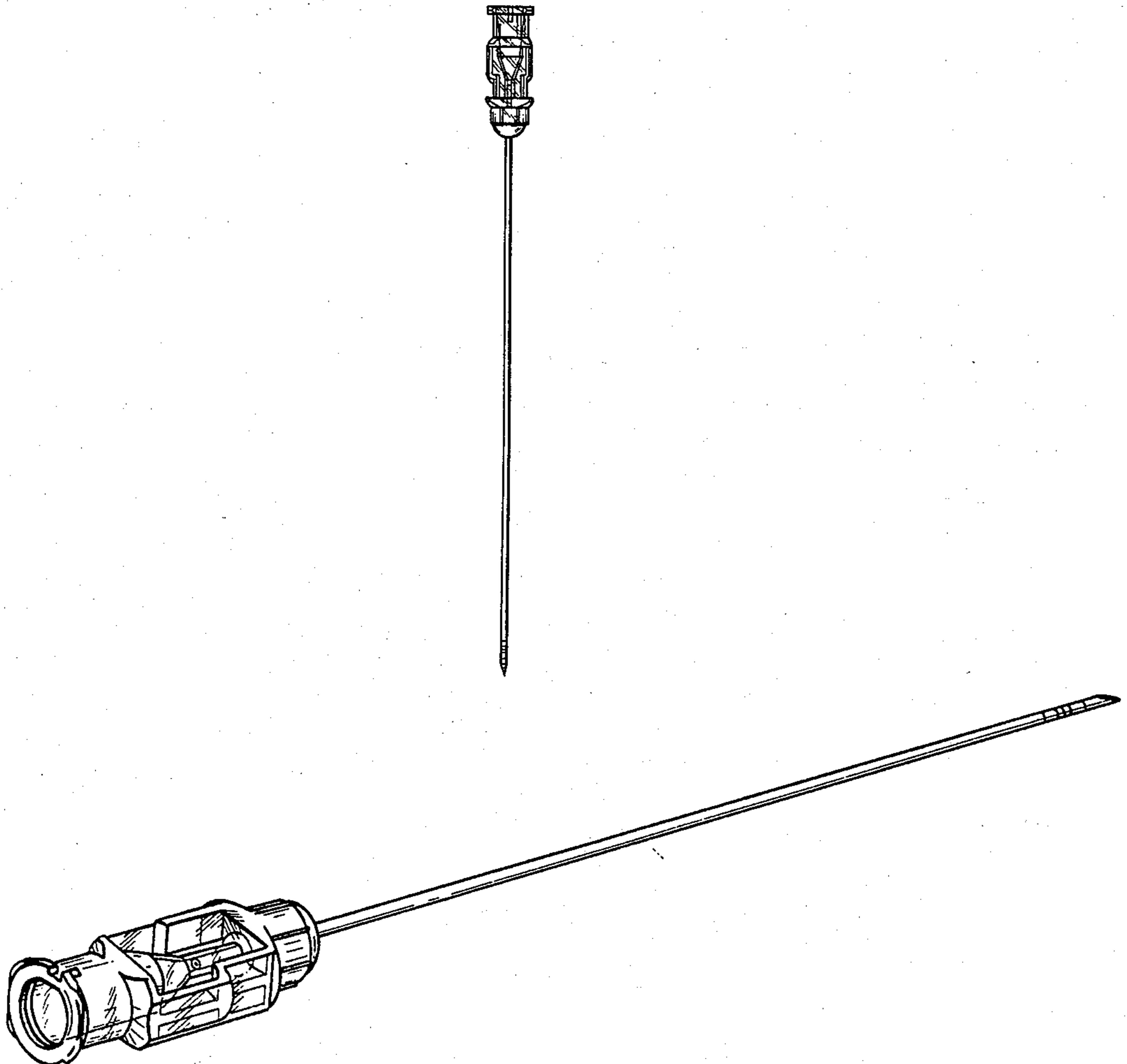

[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a spinal needle or the like, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

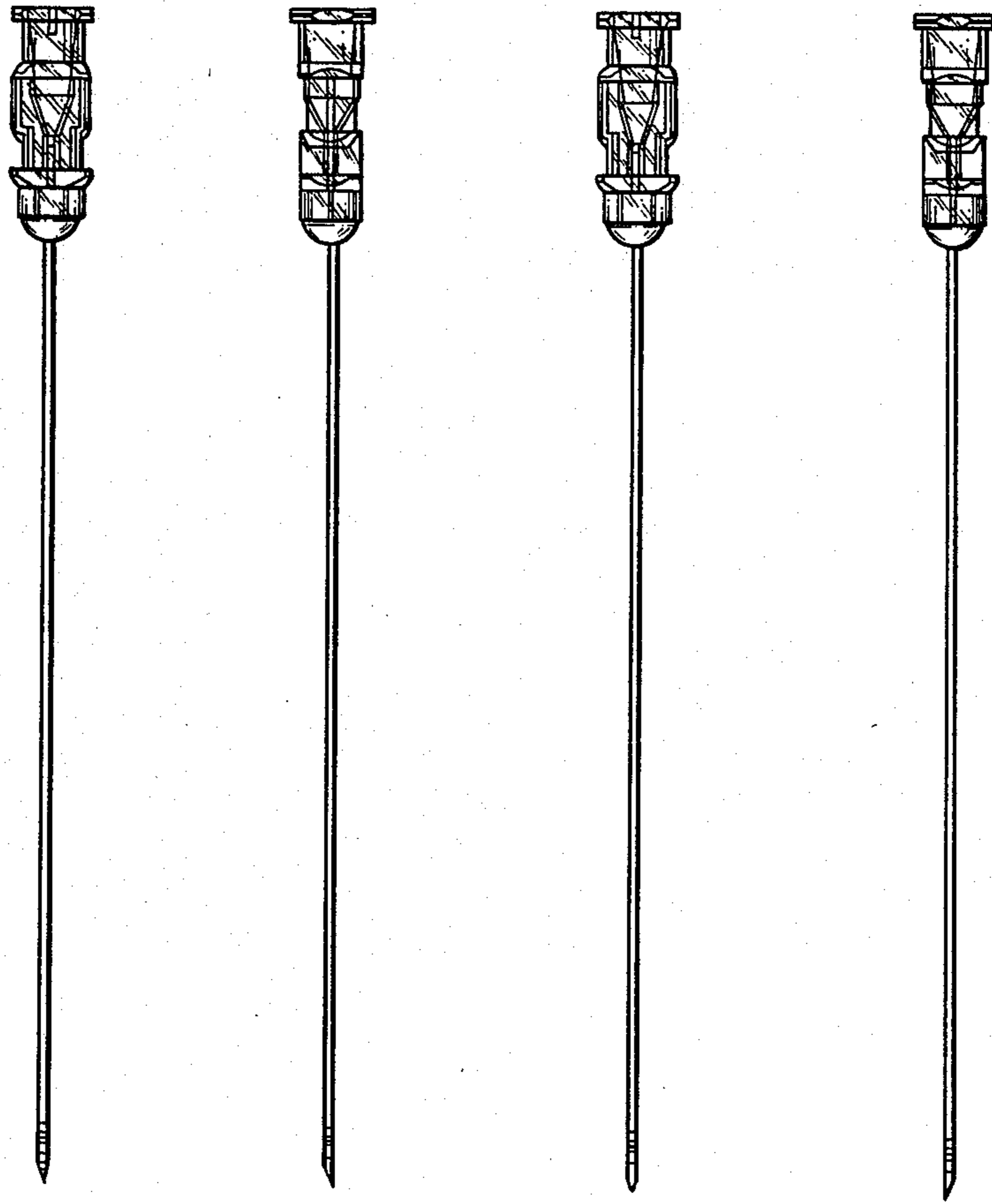


FIG. 1 FIG. 2 FIG. 3 FIG. 4

FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of a spinal needle or the like, showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a side elevational view of the needle as viewed from the right side in FIG. 1;
FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the needle as viewed from the rear in FIG. 1;
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view of the needle as viewed from the left side in FIG. 1;
FIG. 5 is an enlarged bottom plan view of the needle of FIG. 1;
FIG. 6 is an enlarged top plan view of the needle in FIG. 1;
FIG. 7 is an enlarged, fragmentary side elevational view of the tip portion of the needle;
FIG. 8 is an enlarged, fragmentary side elevational view, showing an alternate embodiment of the tip portion;
FIG. 9 is an enlarged, fragmentary side elevational view, showing another alternate embodiment of the tip portion; and
FIG. 10 is a perspective view of the needle in FIG. 1.

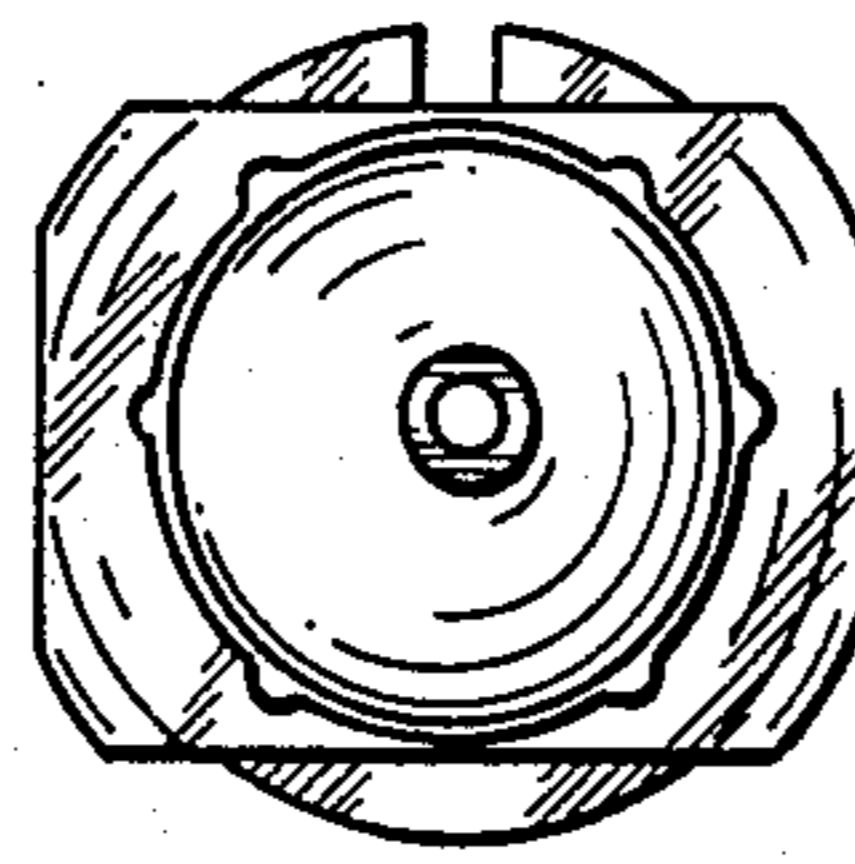

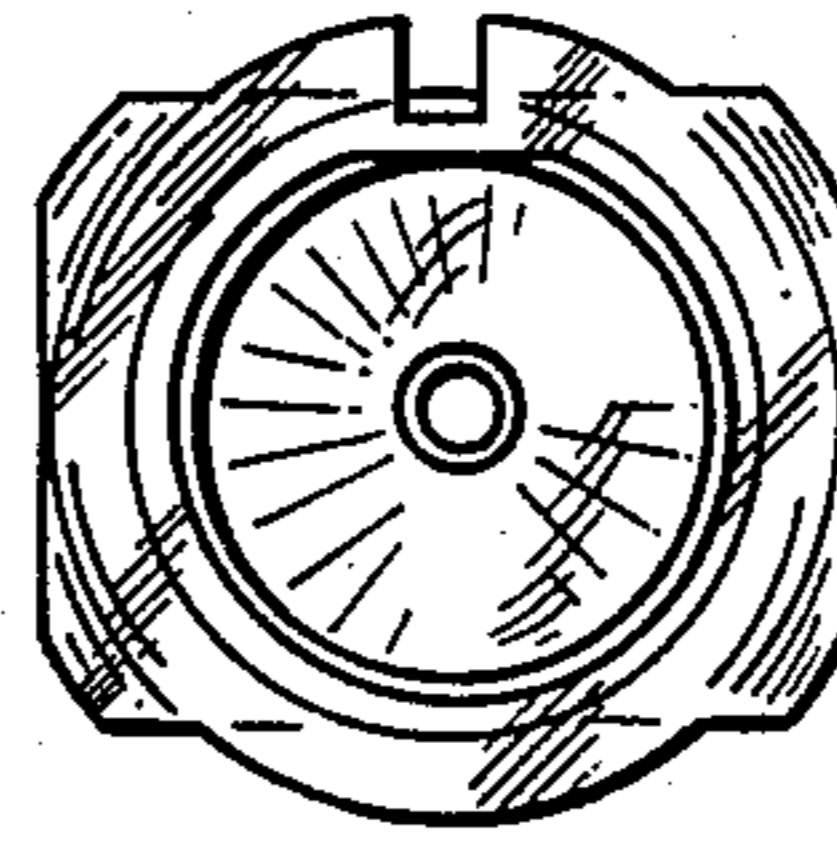
