FIG. 7 is a rear perspective thereof.



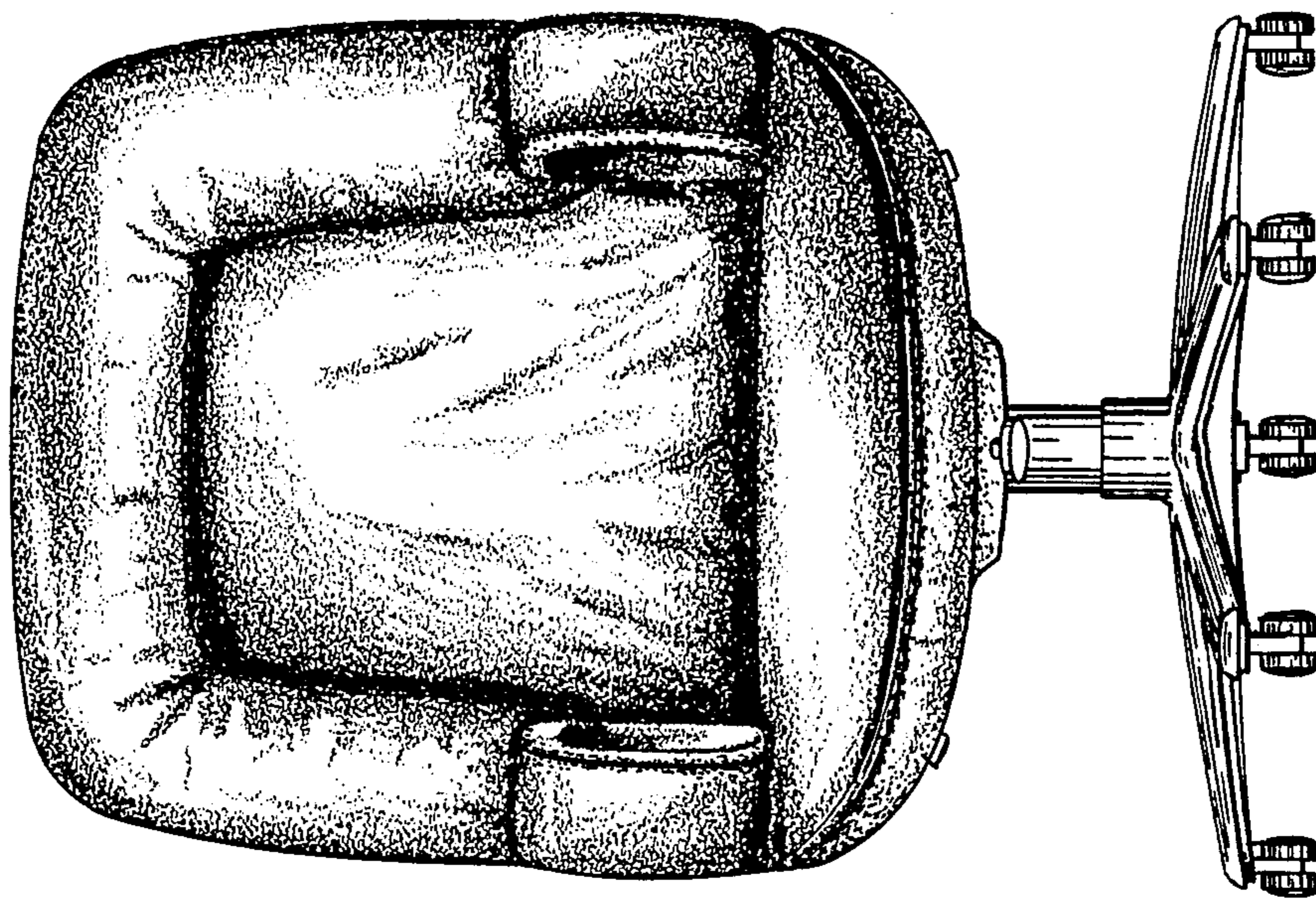

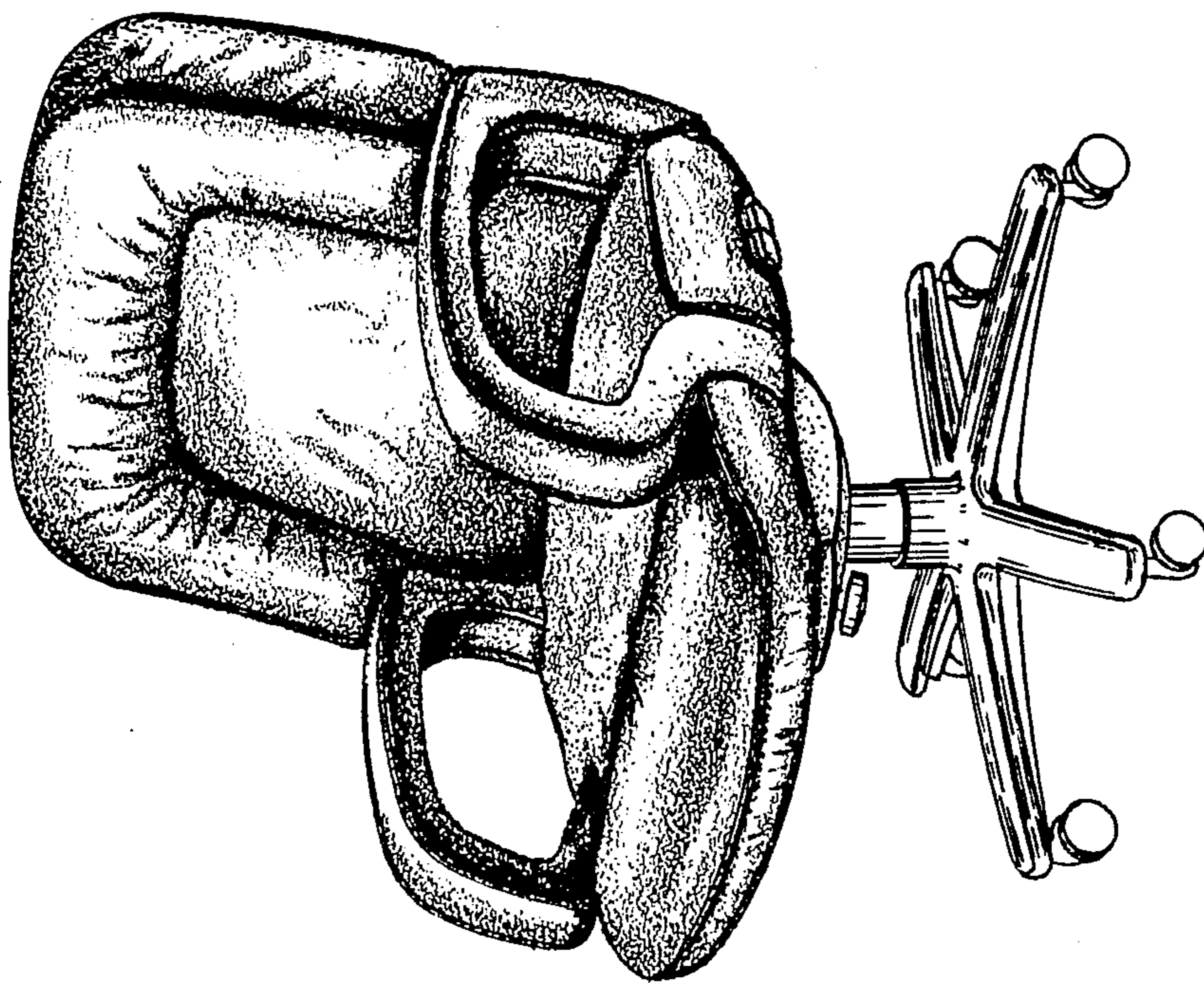

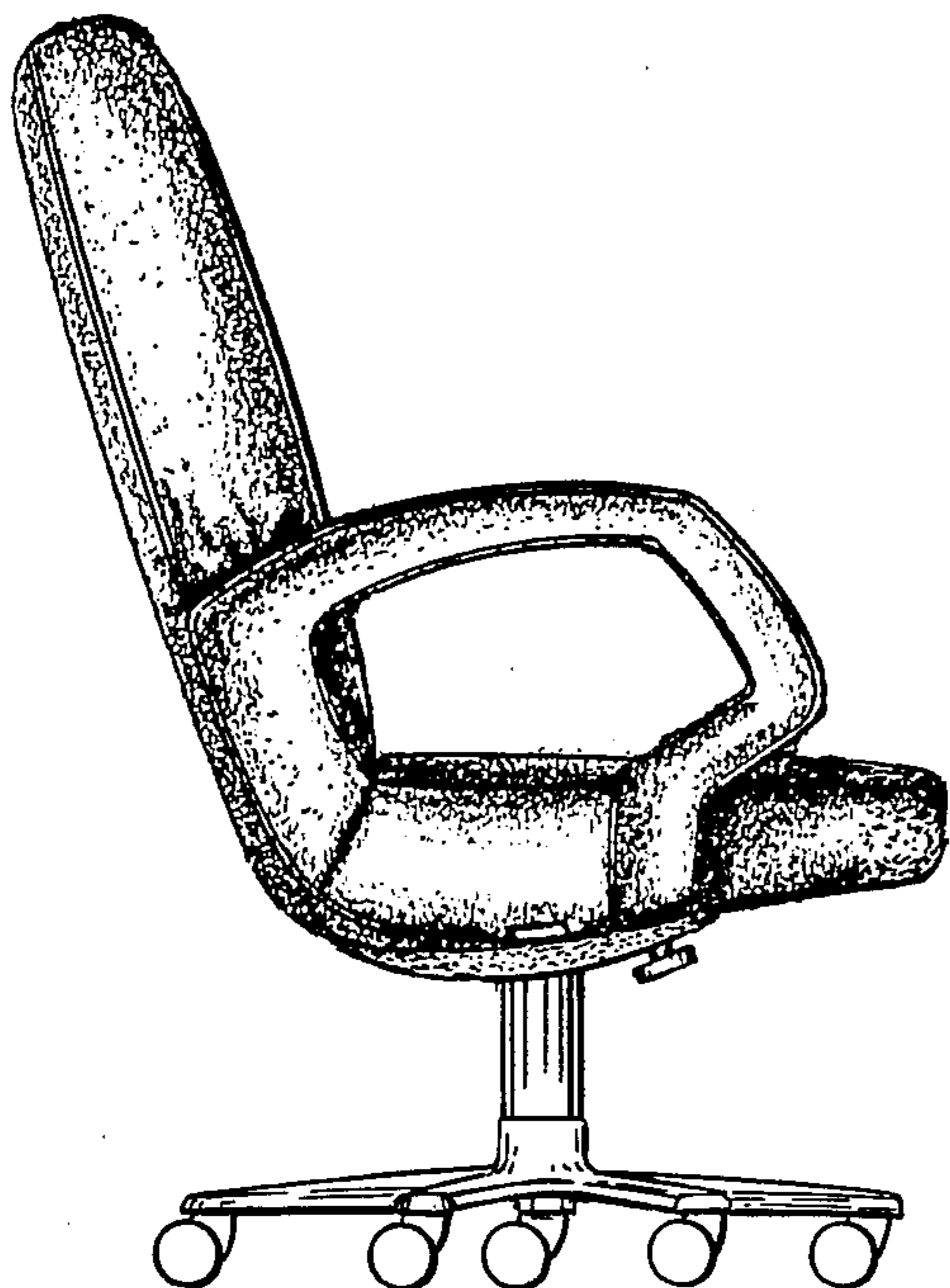

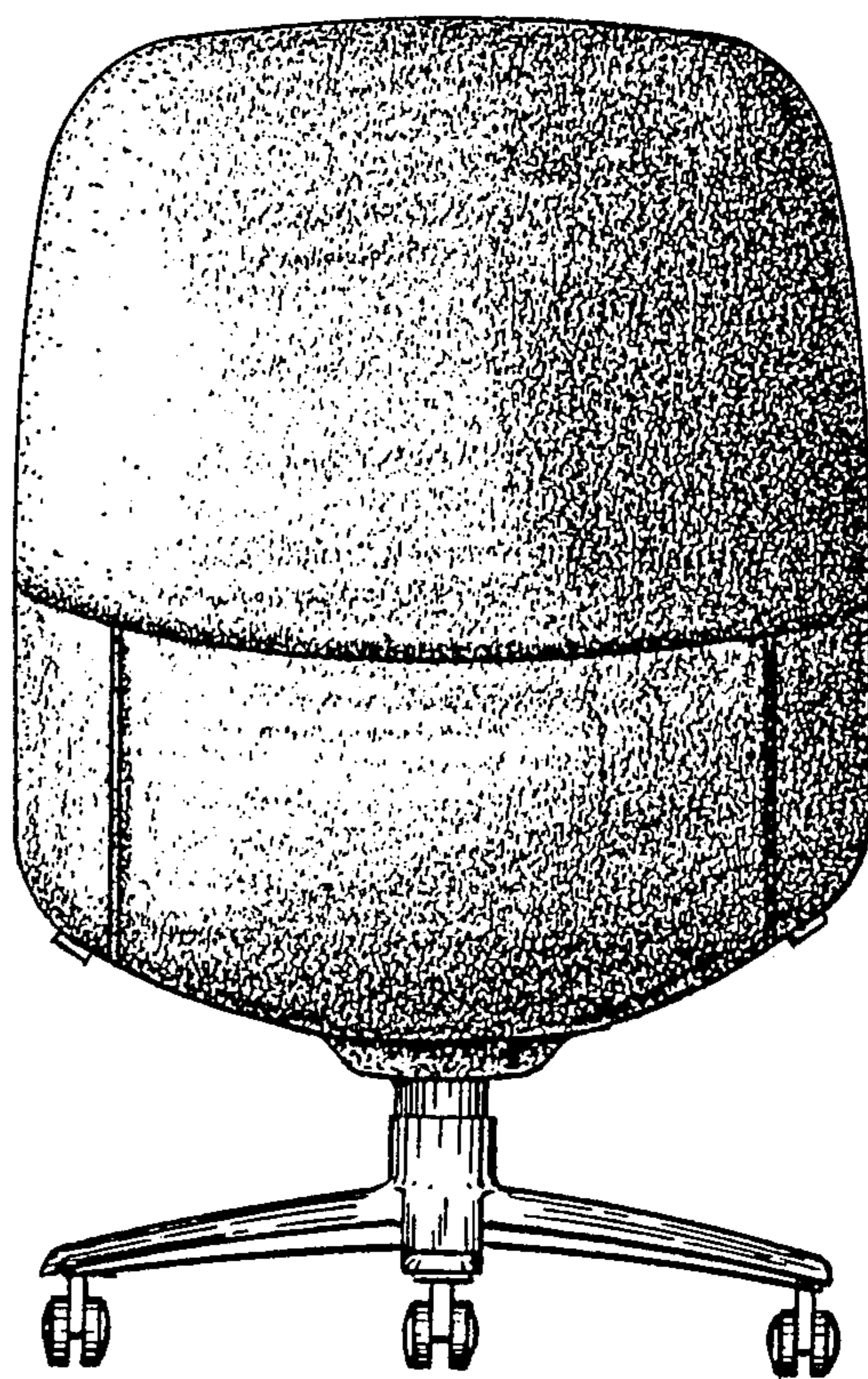

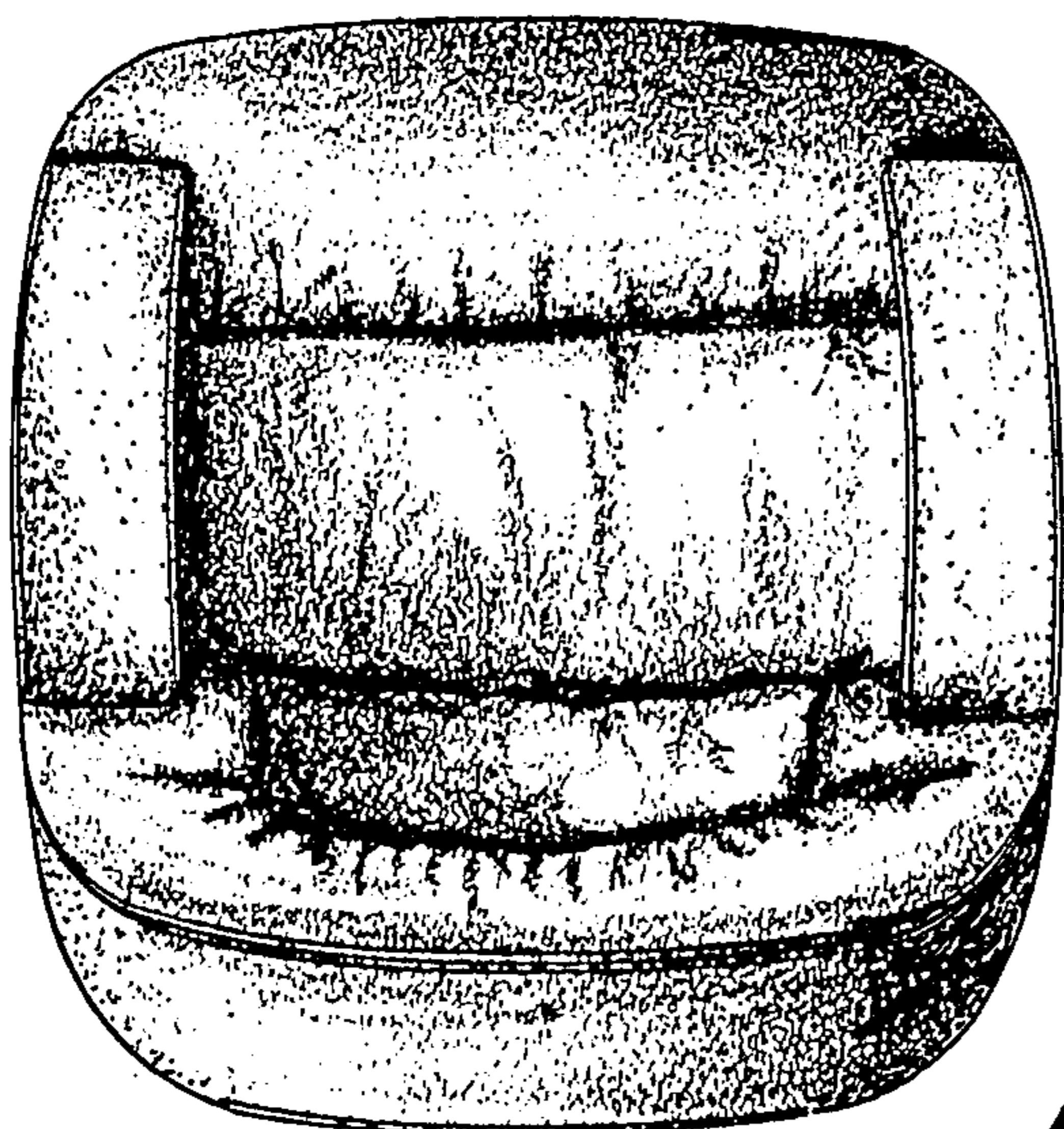

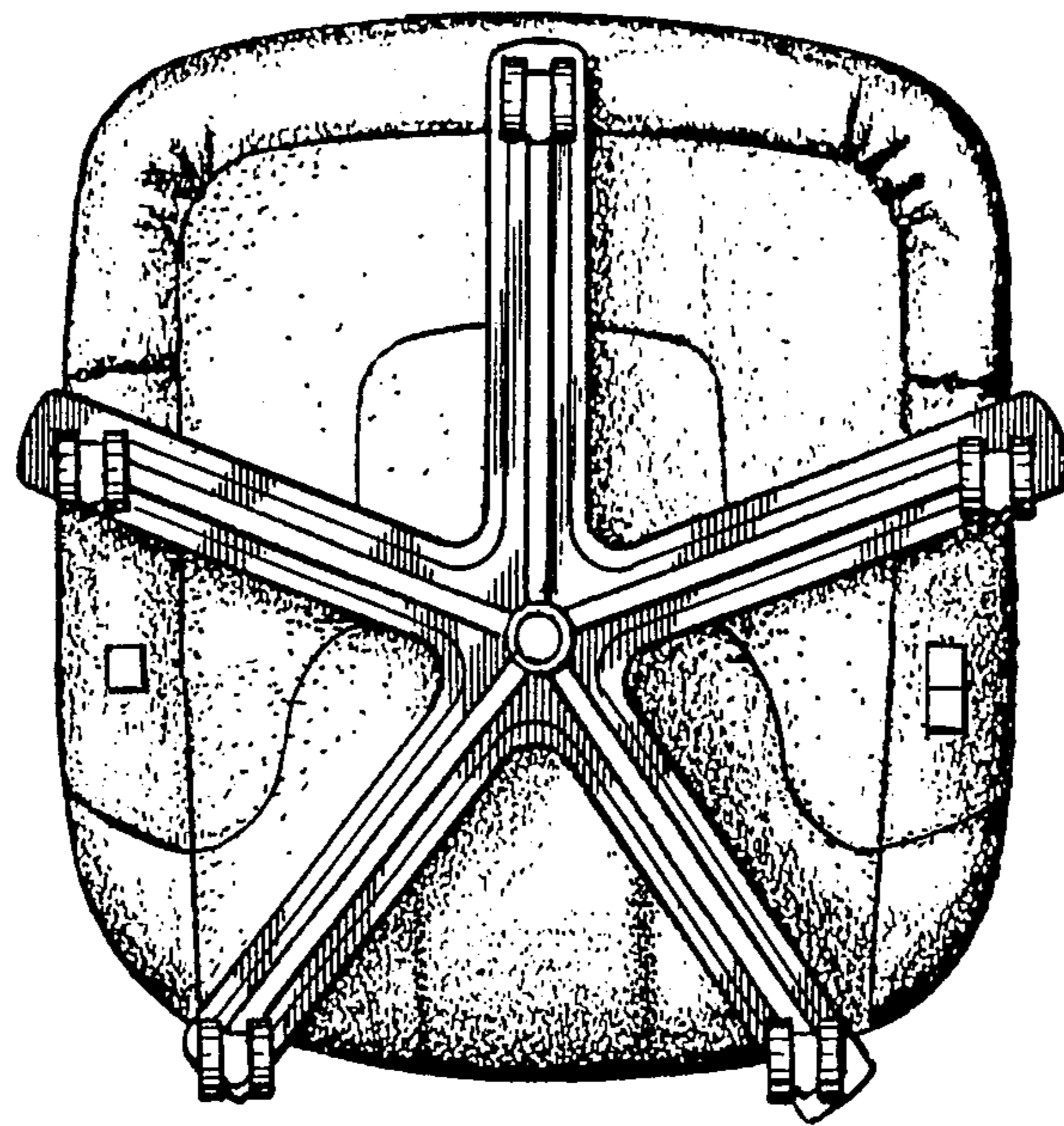

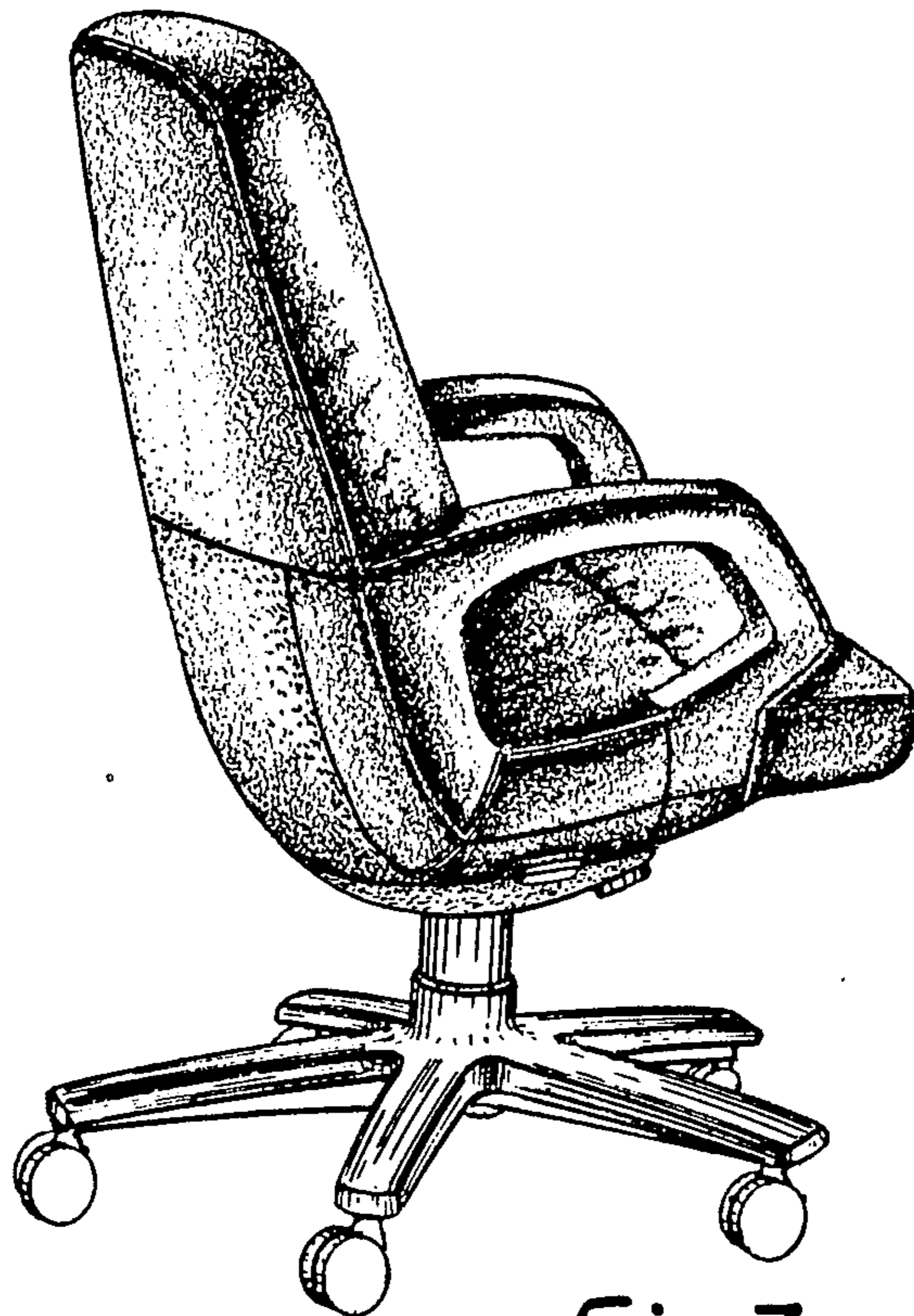
