knife showing my new design;

FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view of the knife of FIG. 1.

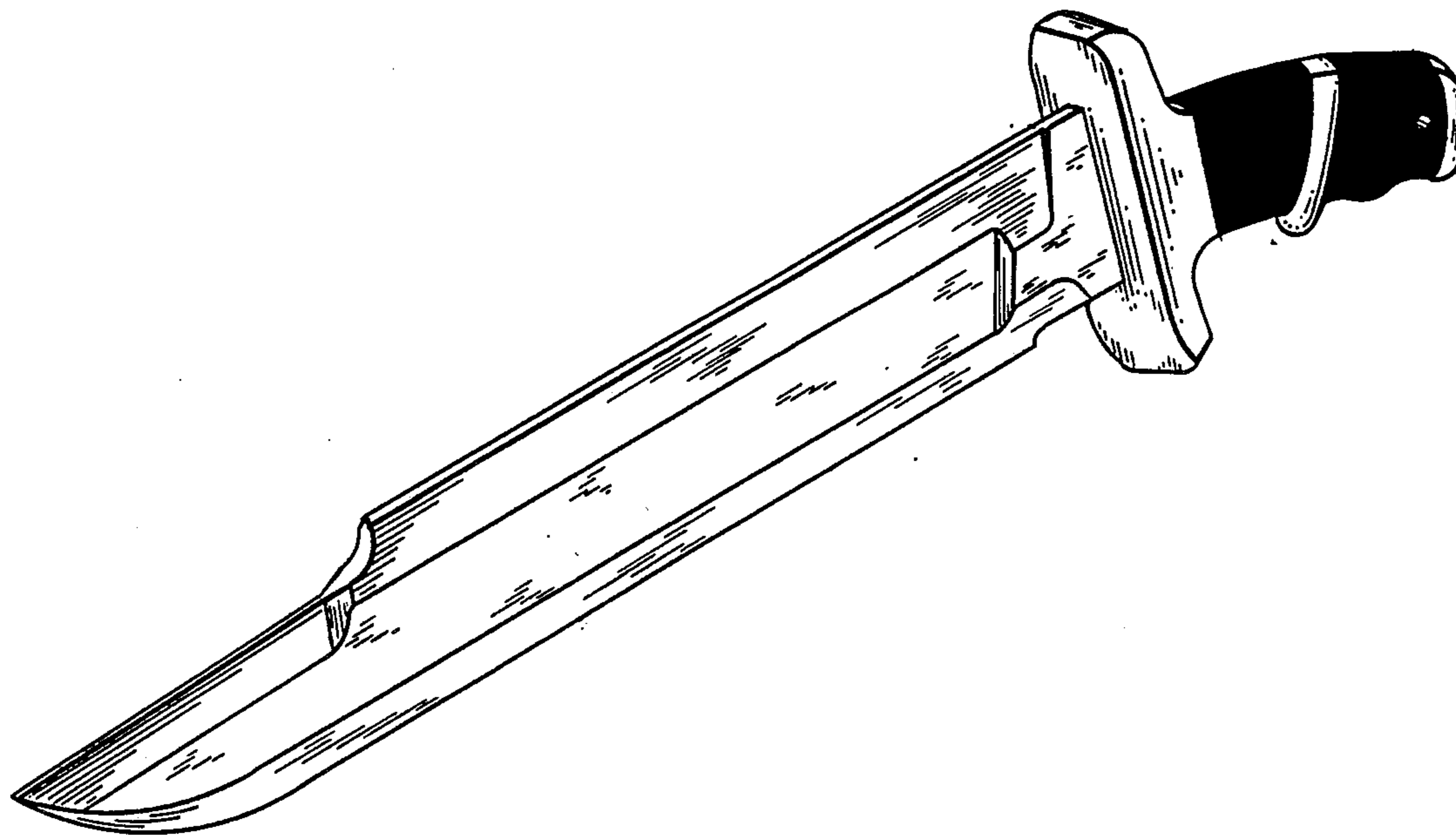

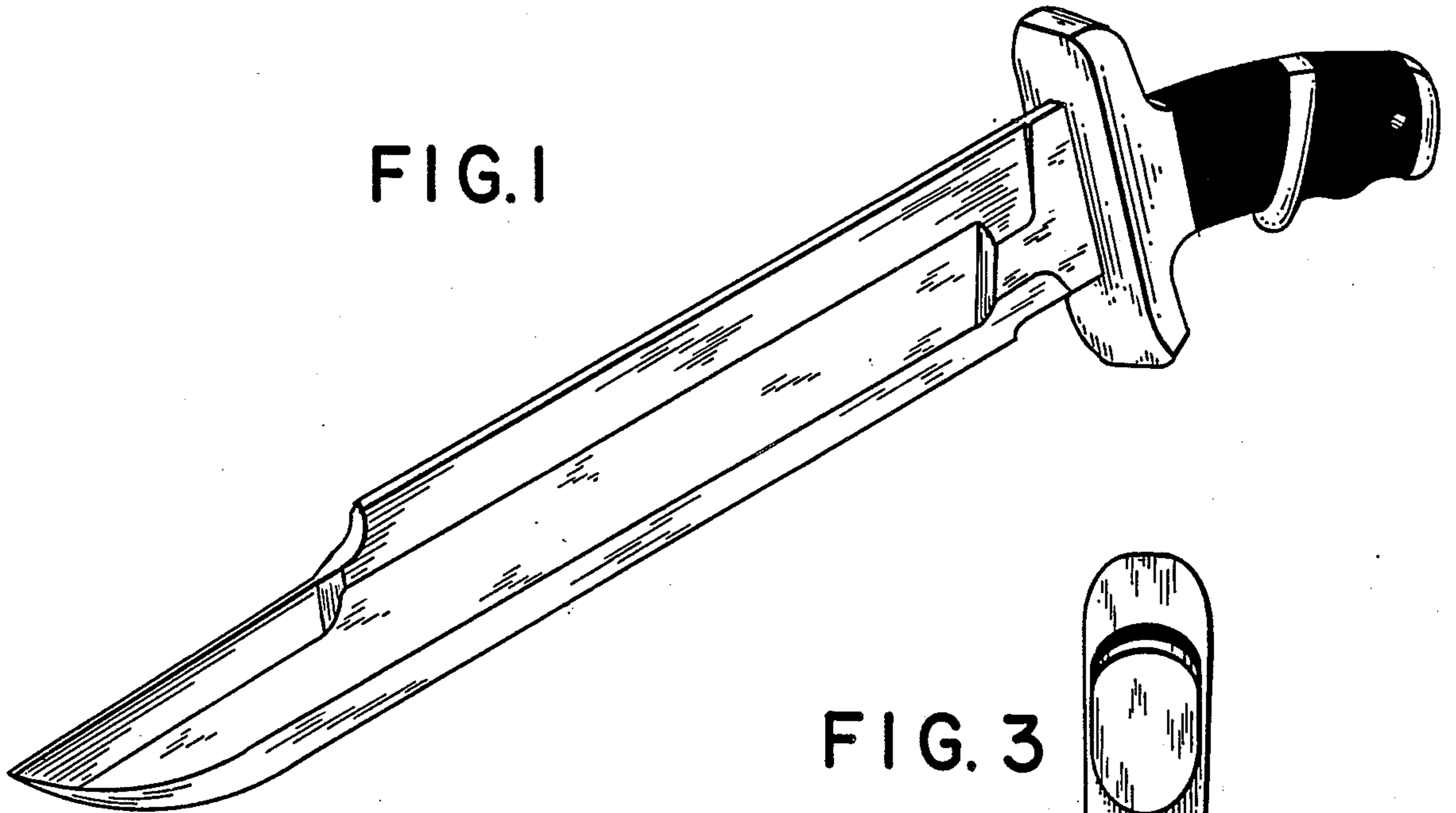

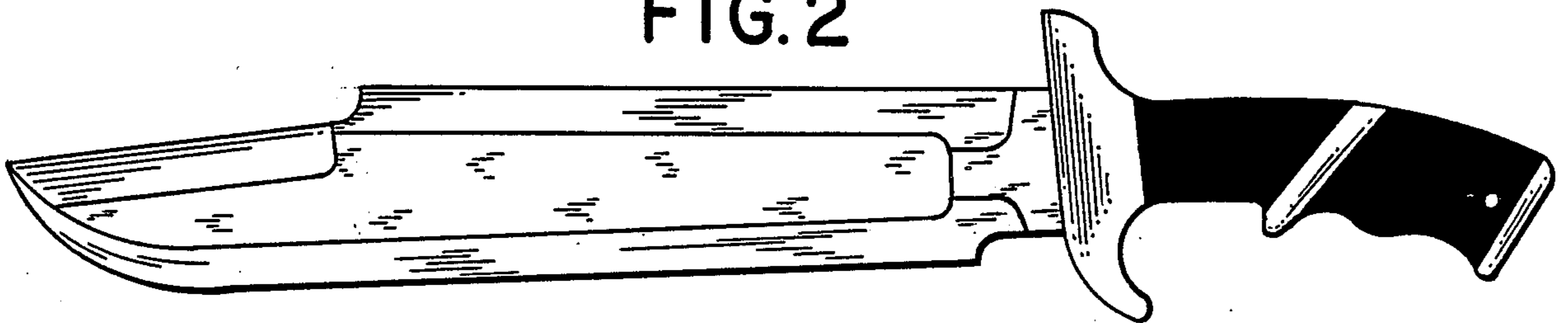

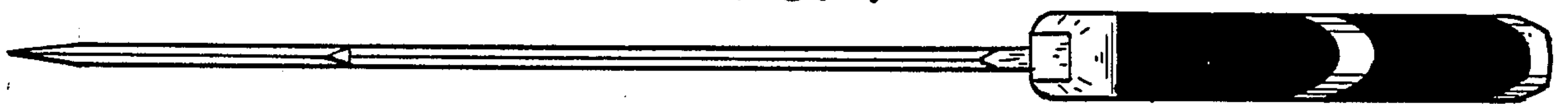
