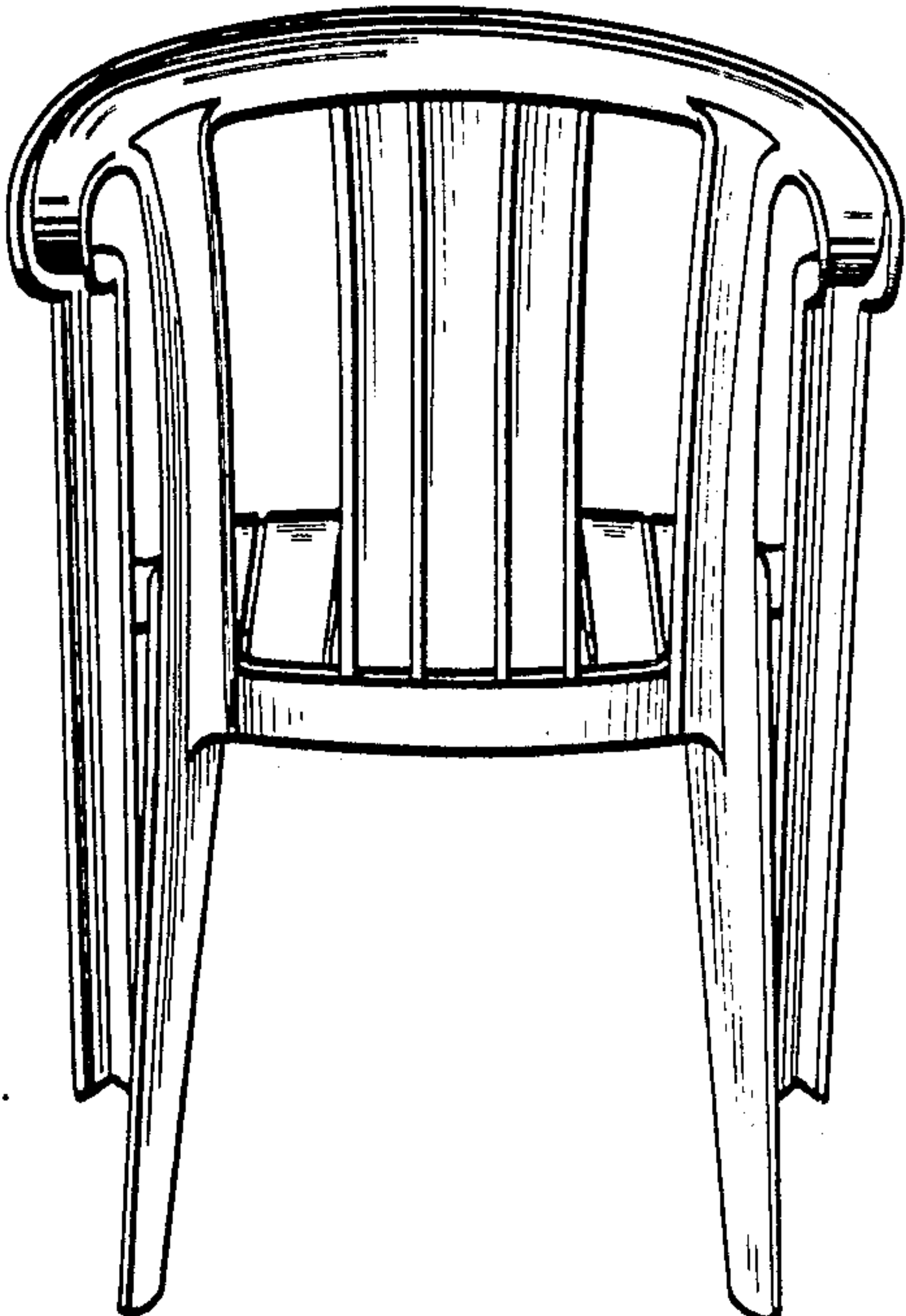
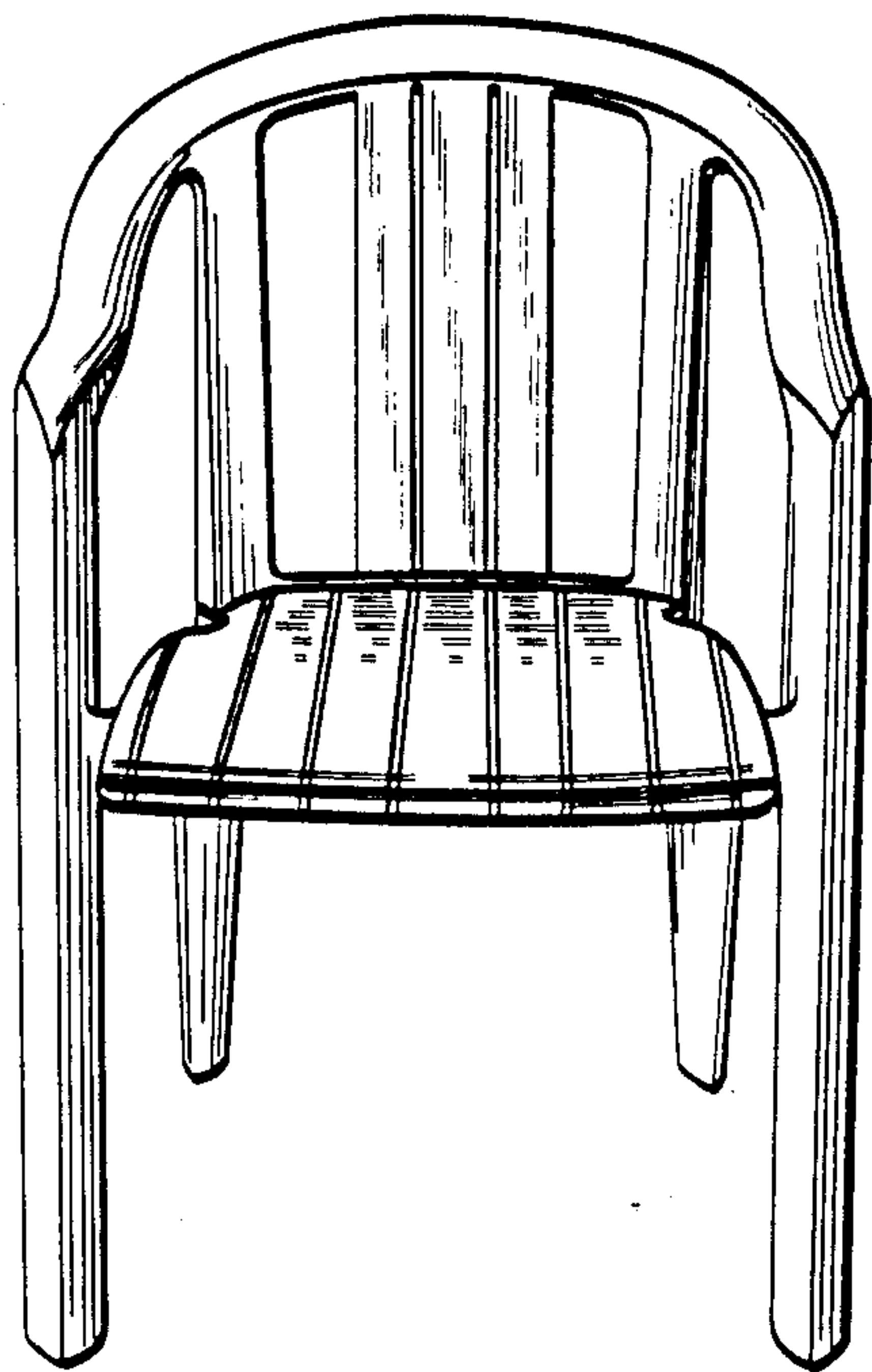
[57] CLAIM

described.

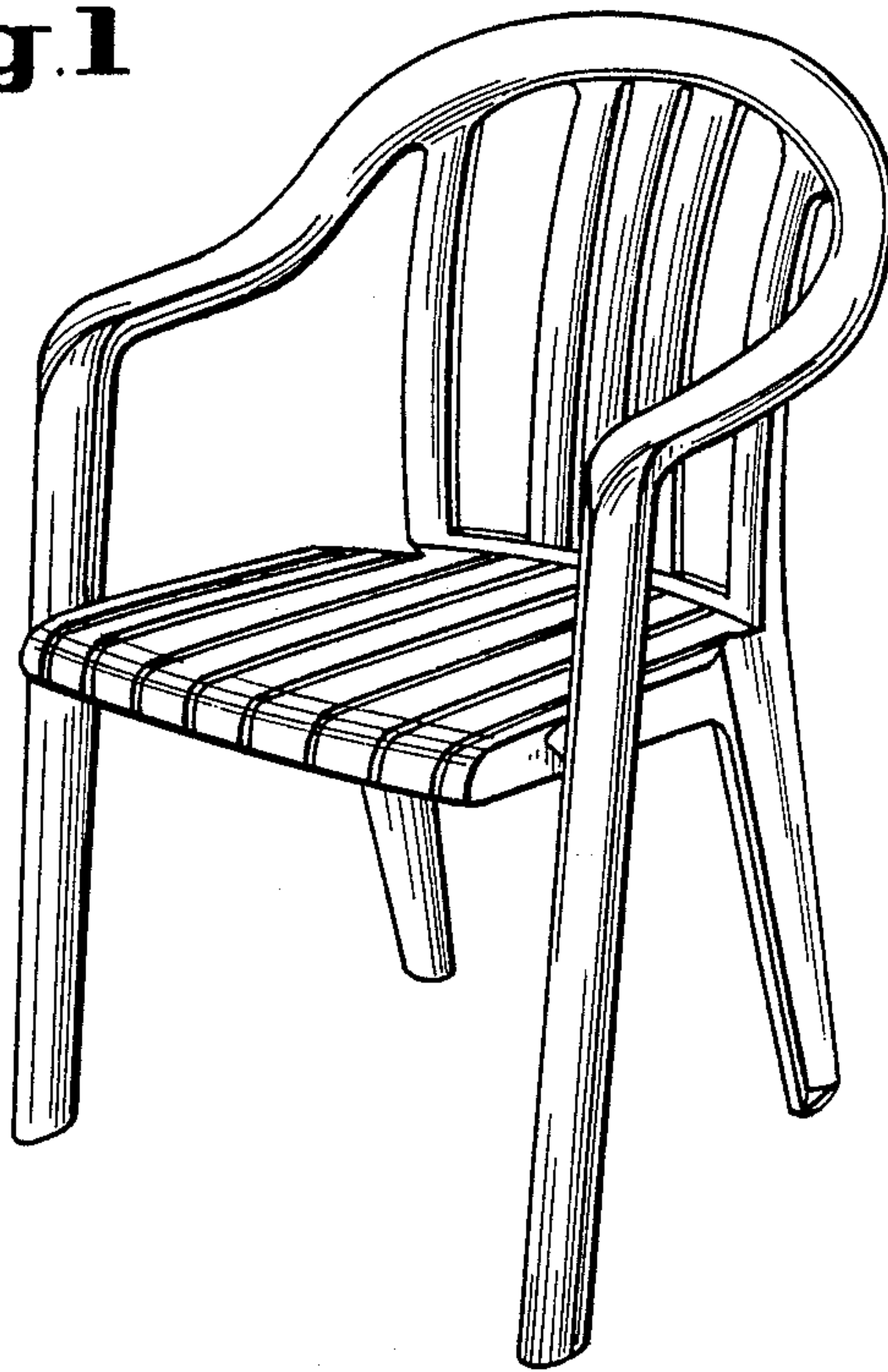
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a side perspective view of an armchair show-  
ing my design;  
FIG. 2 is a front perspective view;  
FIG. 3 is a rear perspective view; and  
FIG. 4 is a top view thereof.

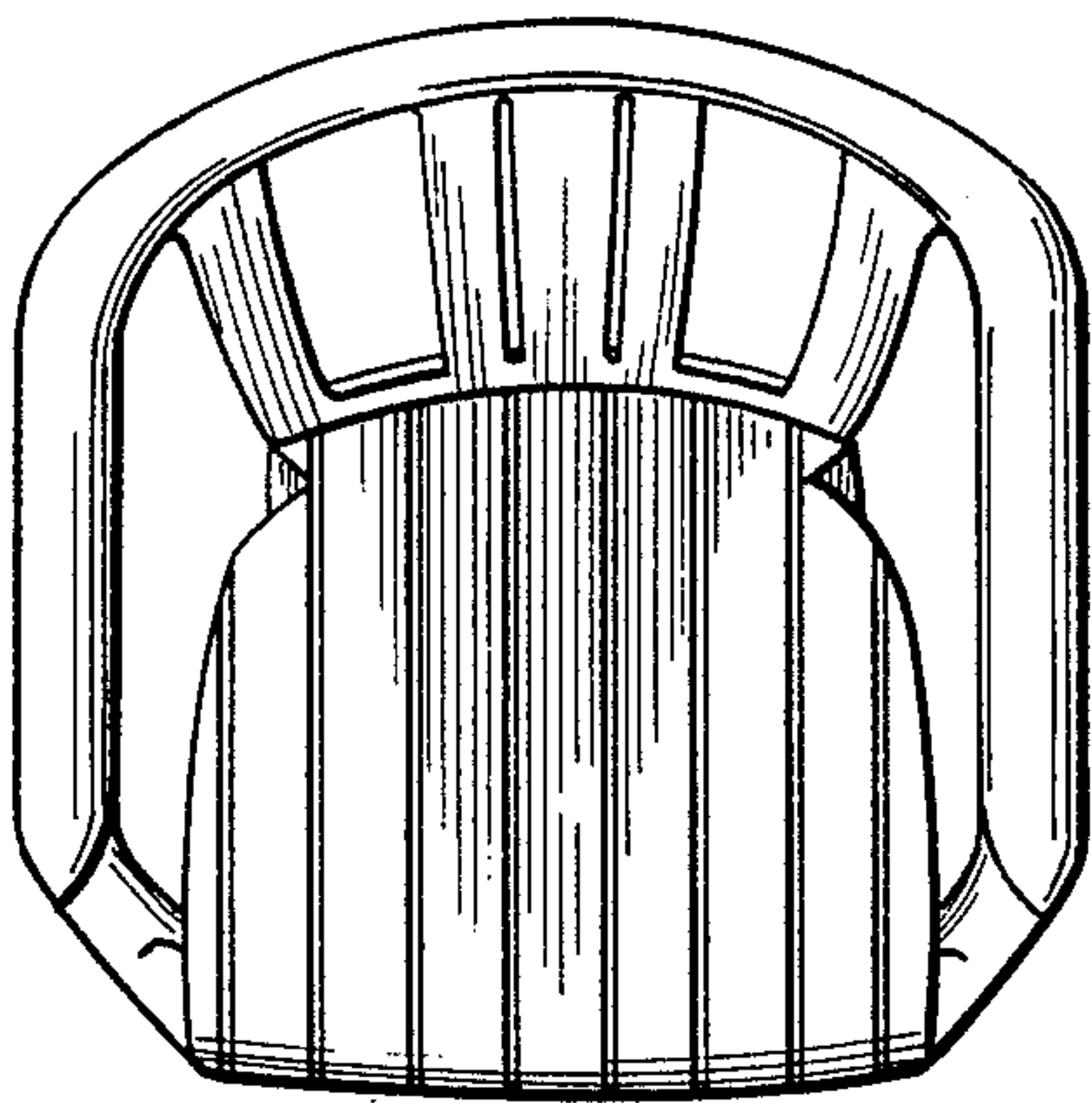
The chair is characterized by the backrest including a  
vertical central scored panel spaced from vertical end  
bars in combination with the laterally extending V-  
shaped rear leg members and the scored seat portion all  
as best illustrated in FIGS. 1, 3, and 4.



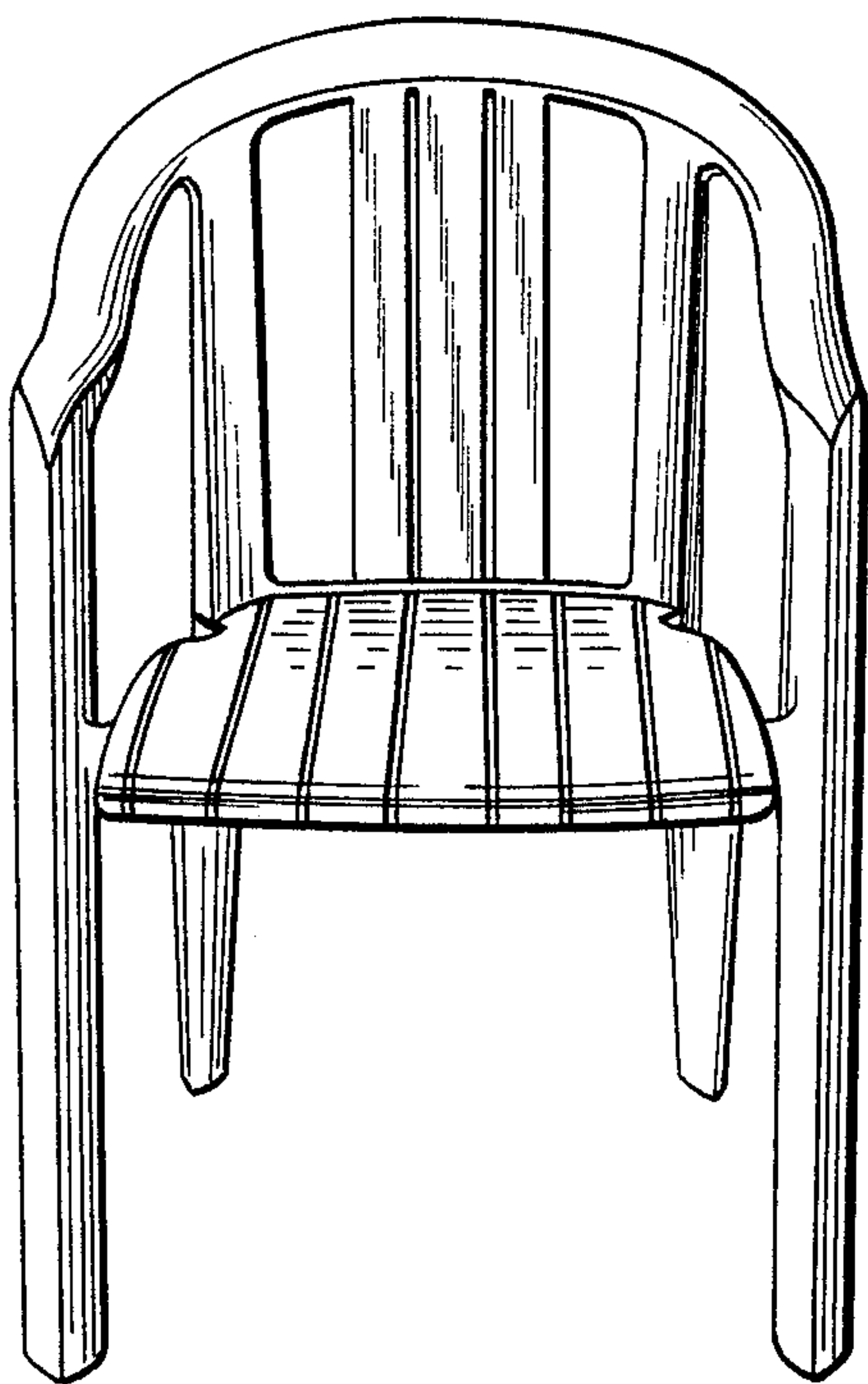
