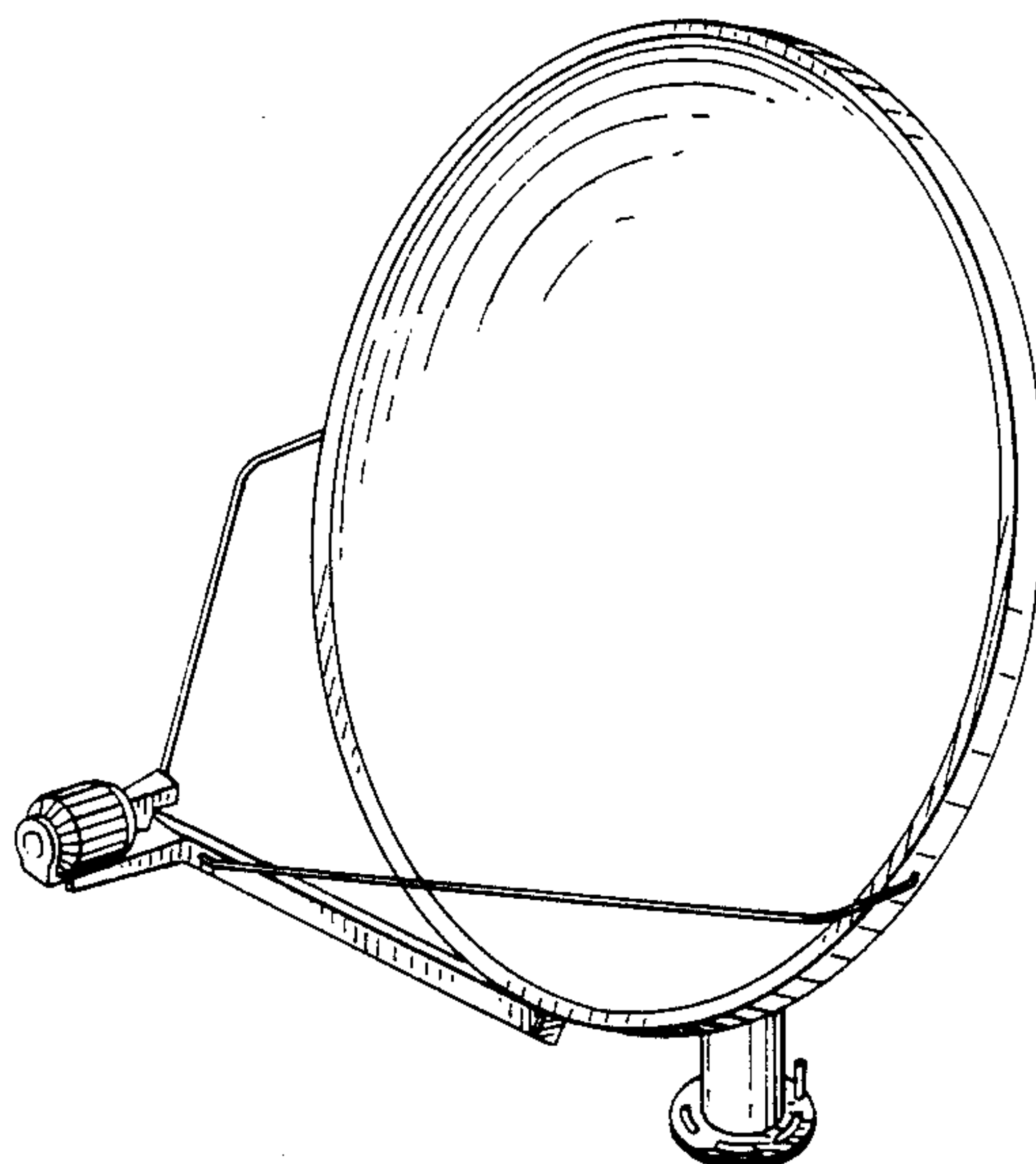

The ornamental design for an antenna for a mini satellite earth station, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of an antenna for a mini satellite earth station showing our new design; FIG. 2 is a rear elevational view thereof; FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof; FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof; and FIG. 6 is a front and right side perspective view thereof.



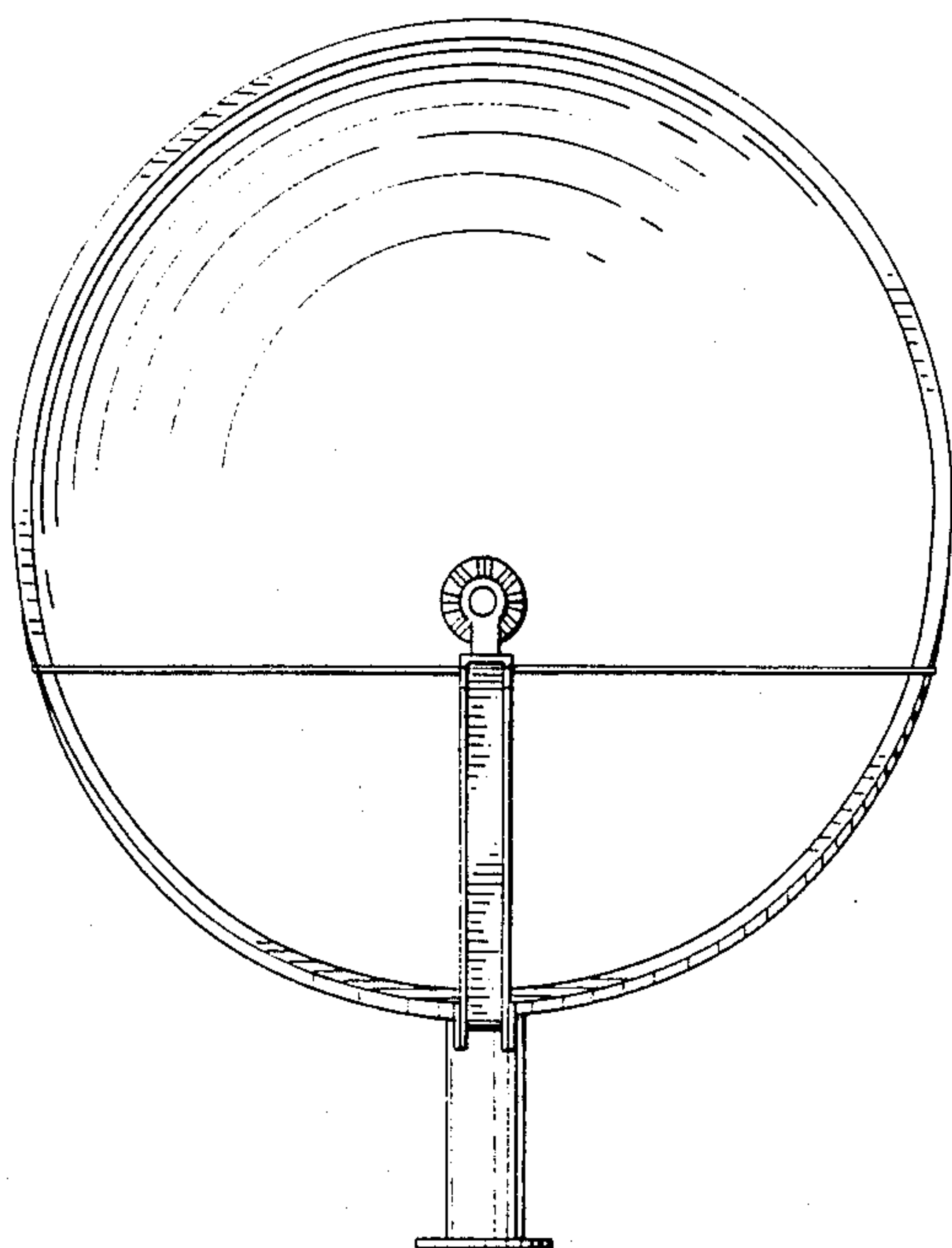

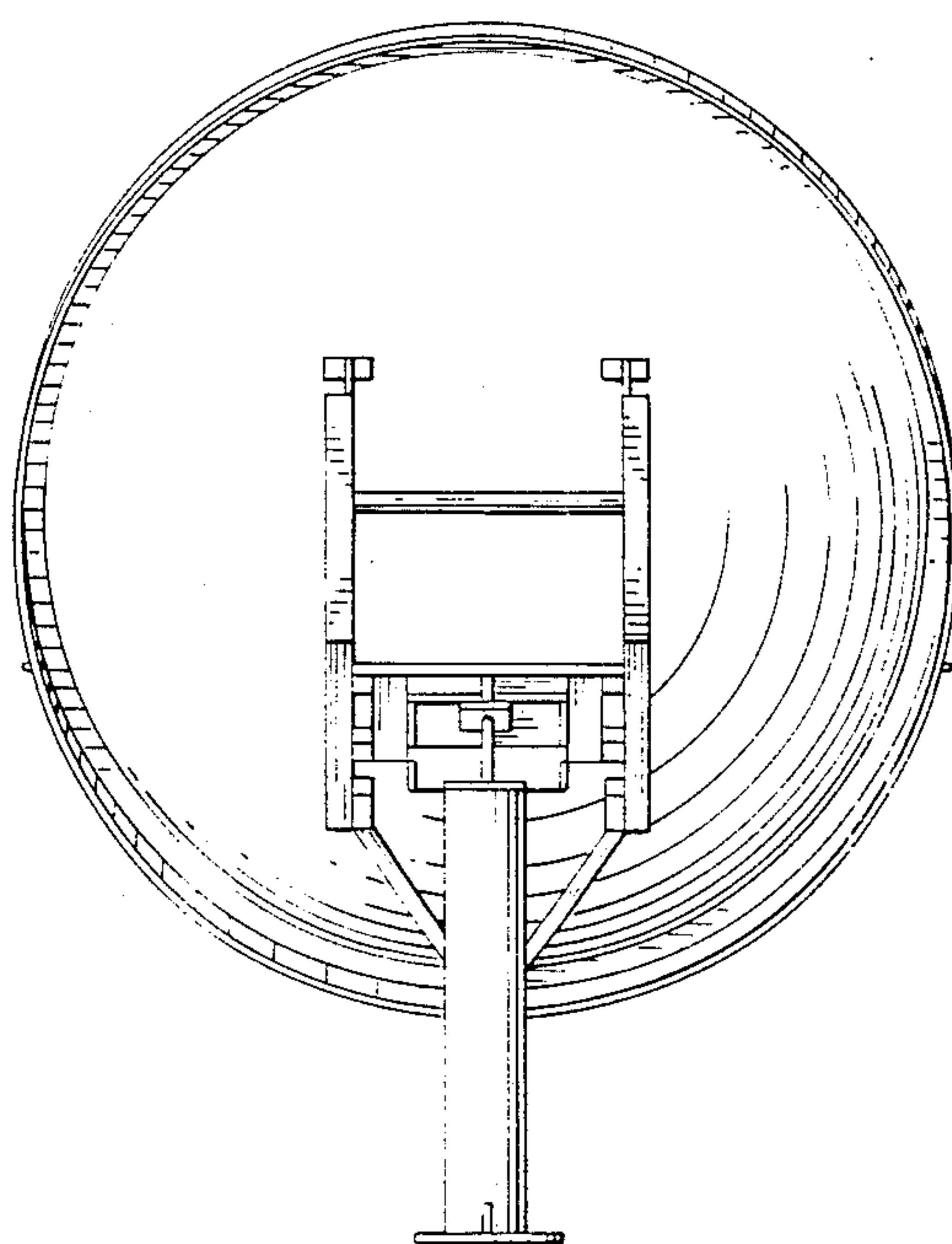

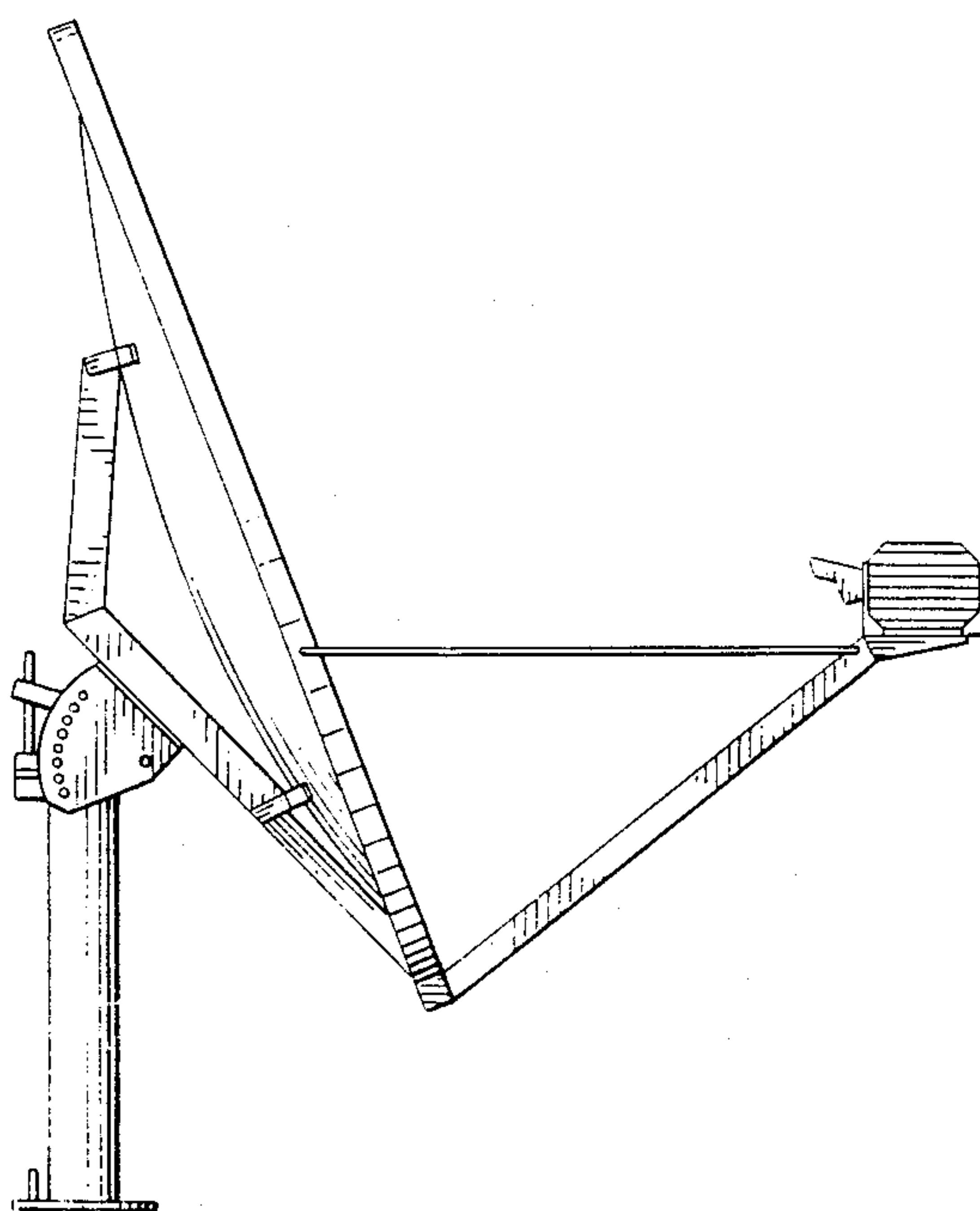

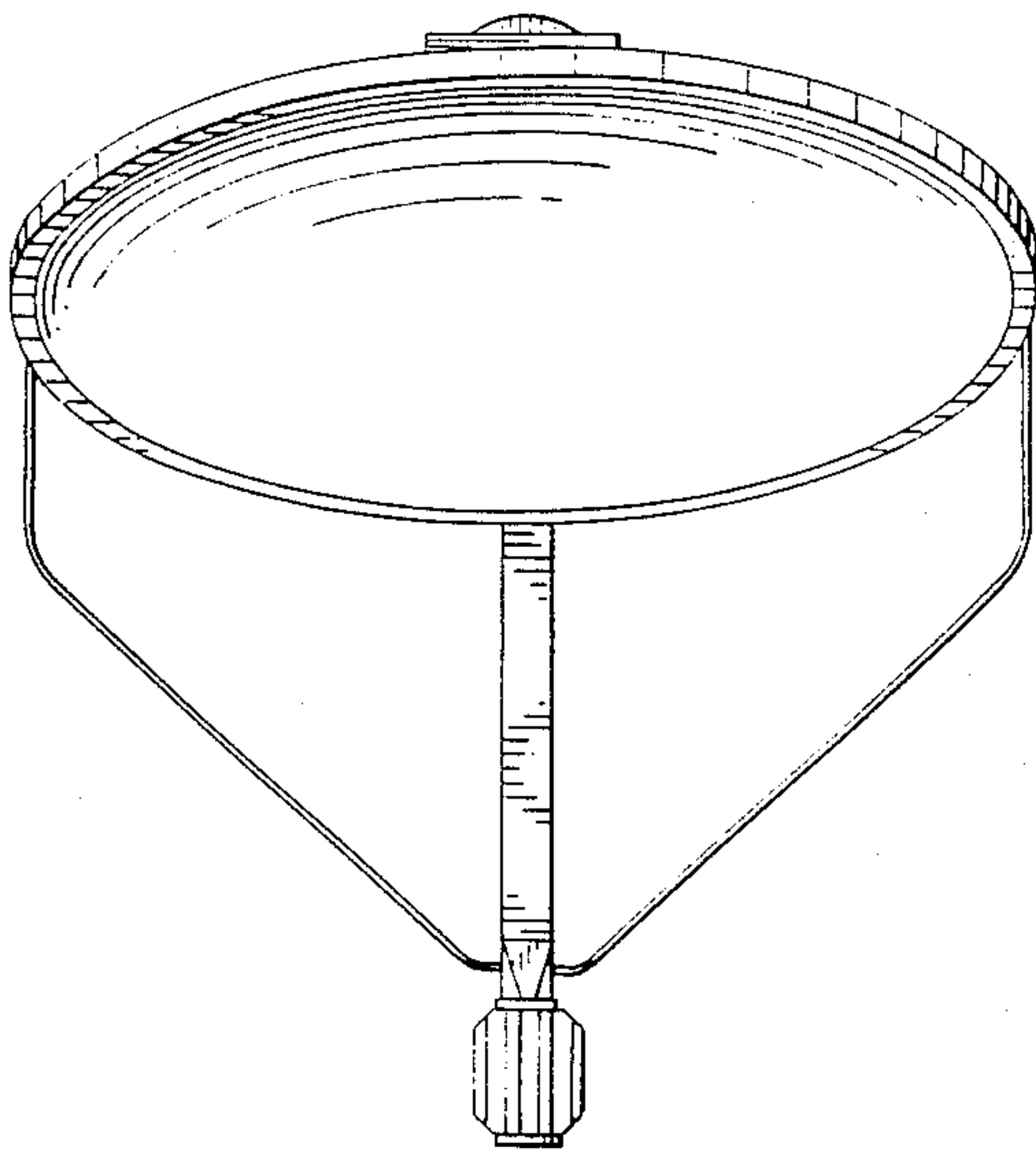

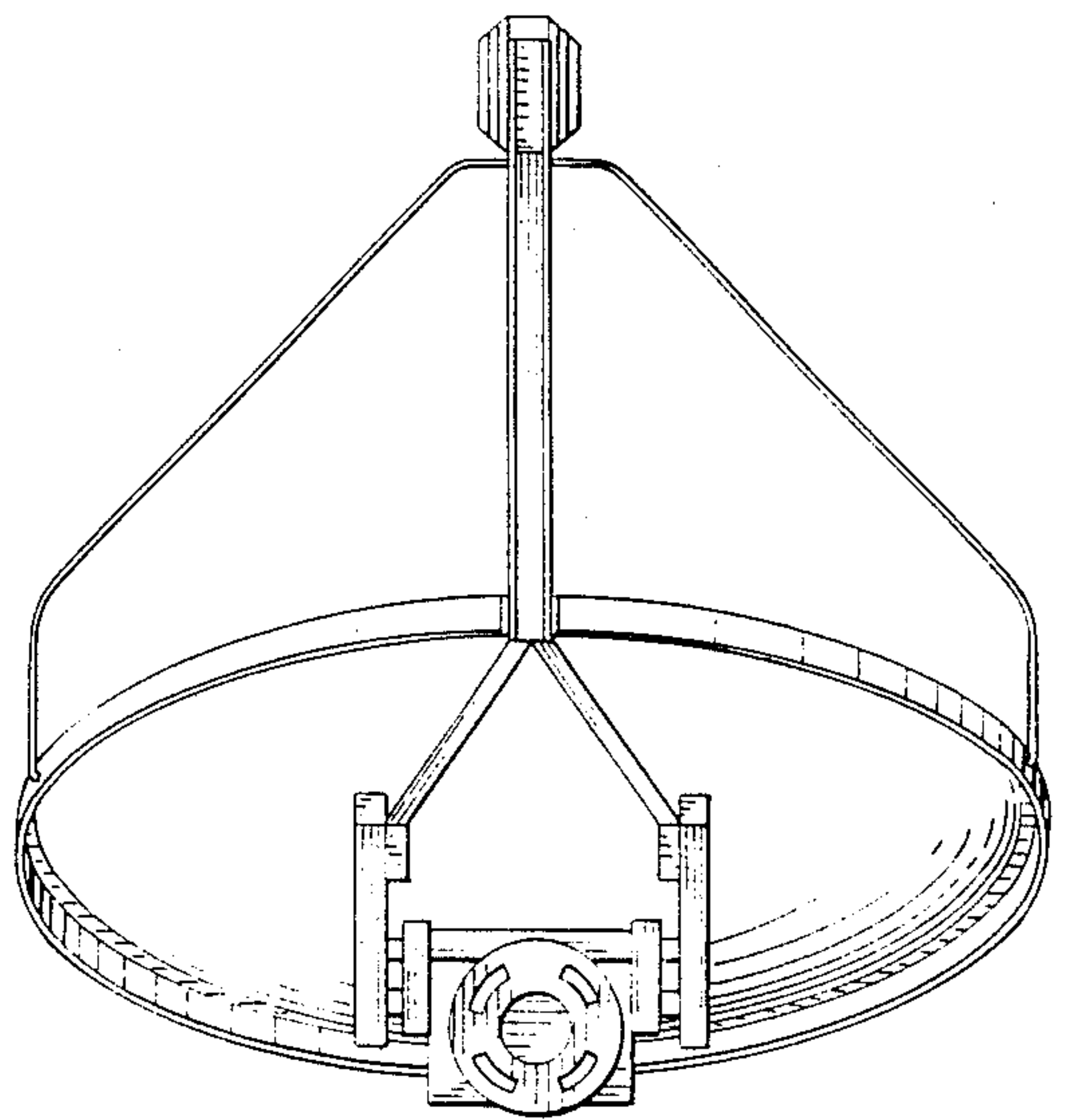

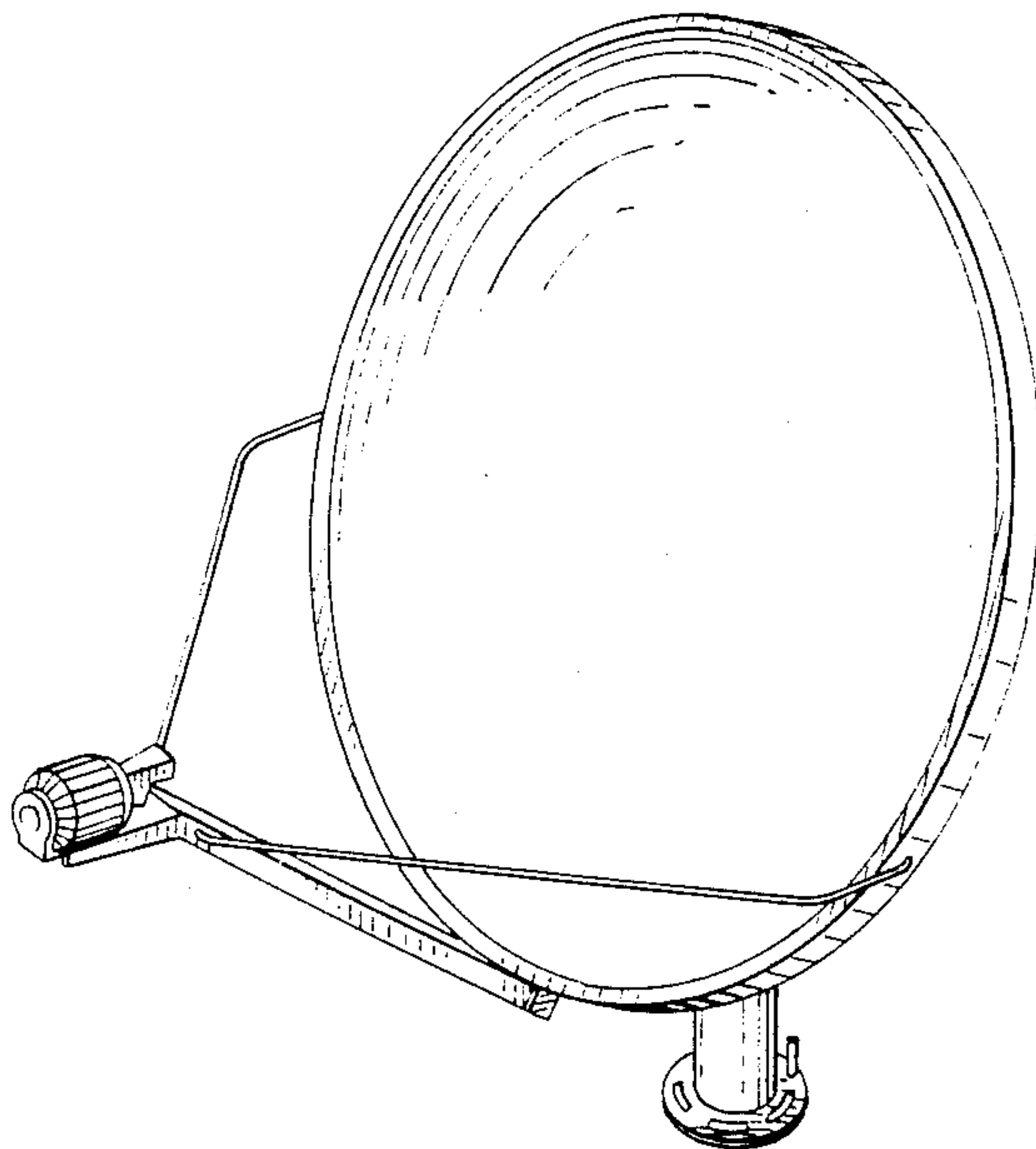
