FIG. 2 is a bottom, rear and left side perspective view thereof.

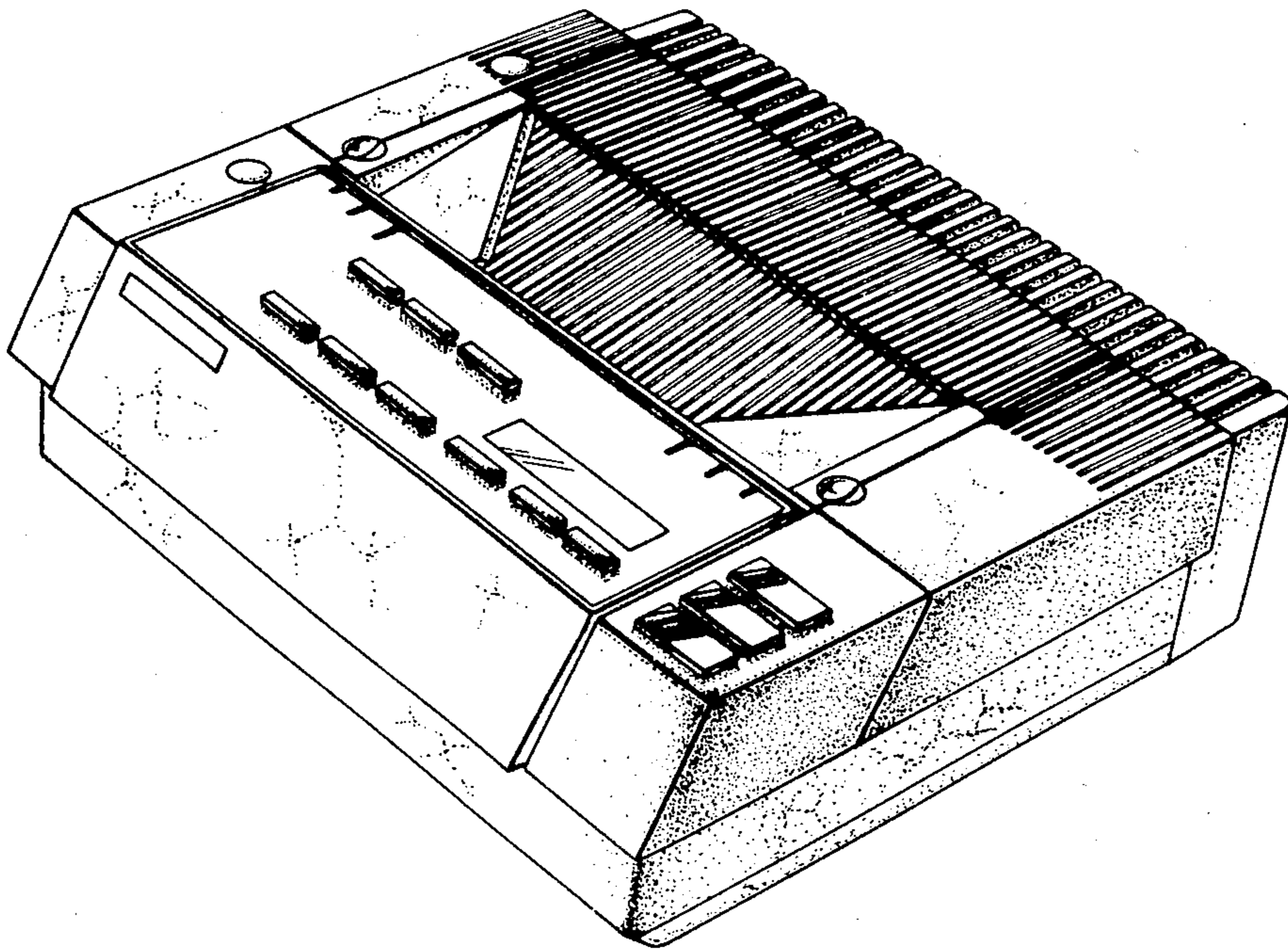

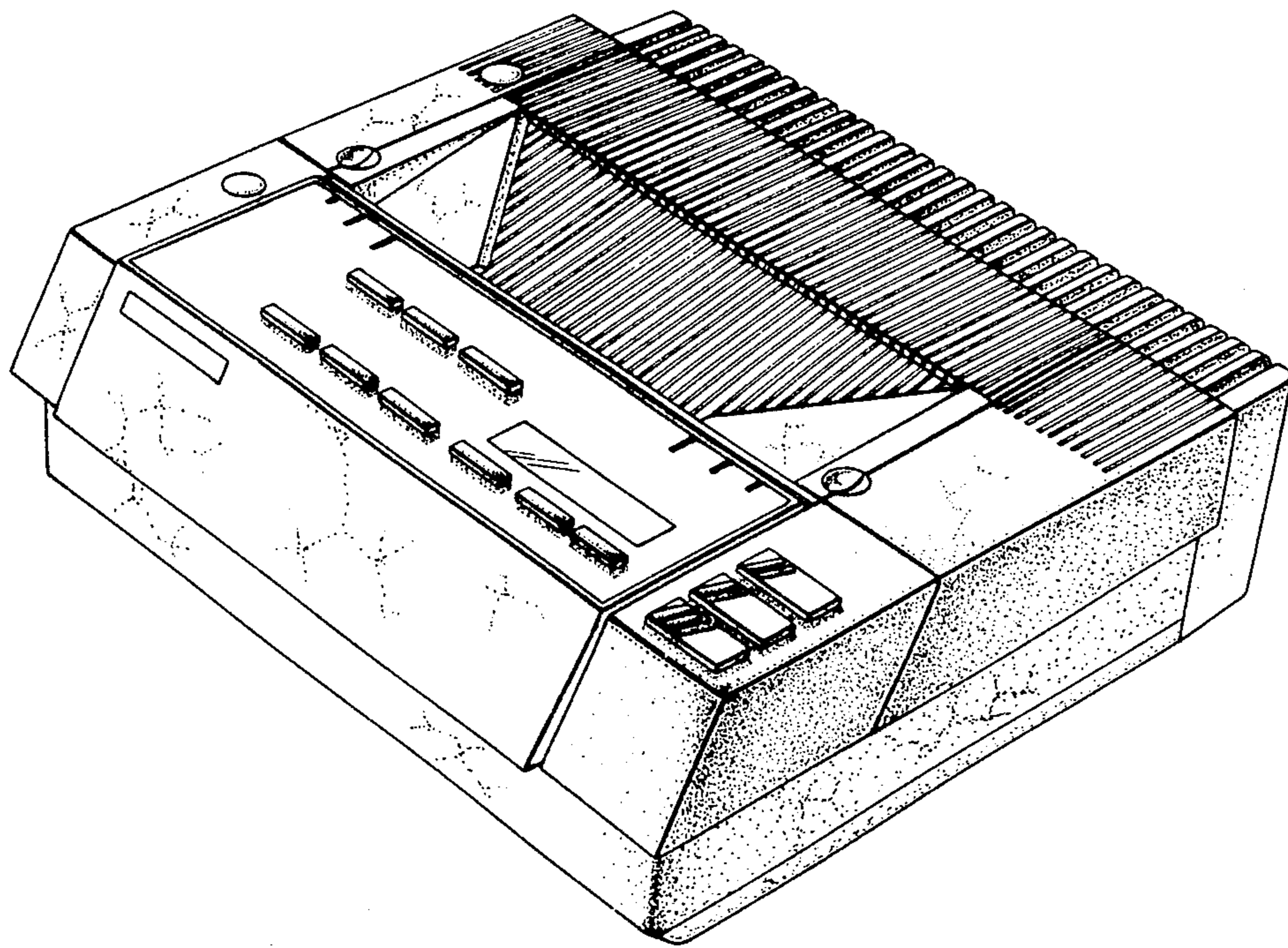
