use primarily in an office, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

panel for use primarily in an office showing our new

design, the dotted lines depicting additional wall surface
are used for illustrative purposes only;

FIG. 19 is a right side elevational view;

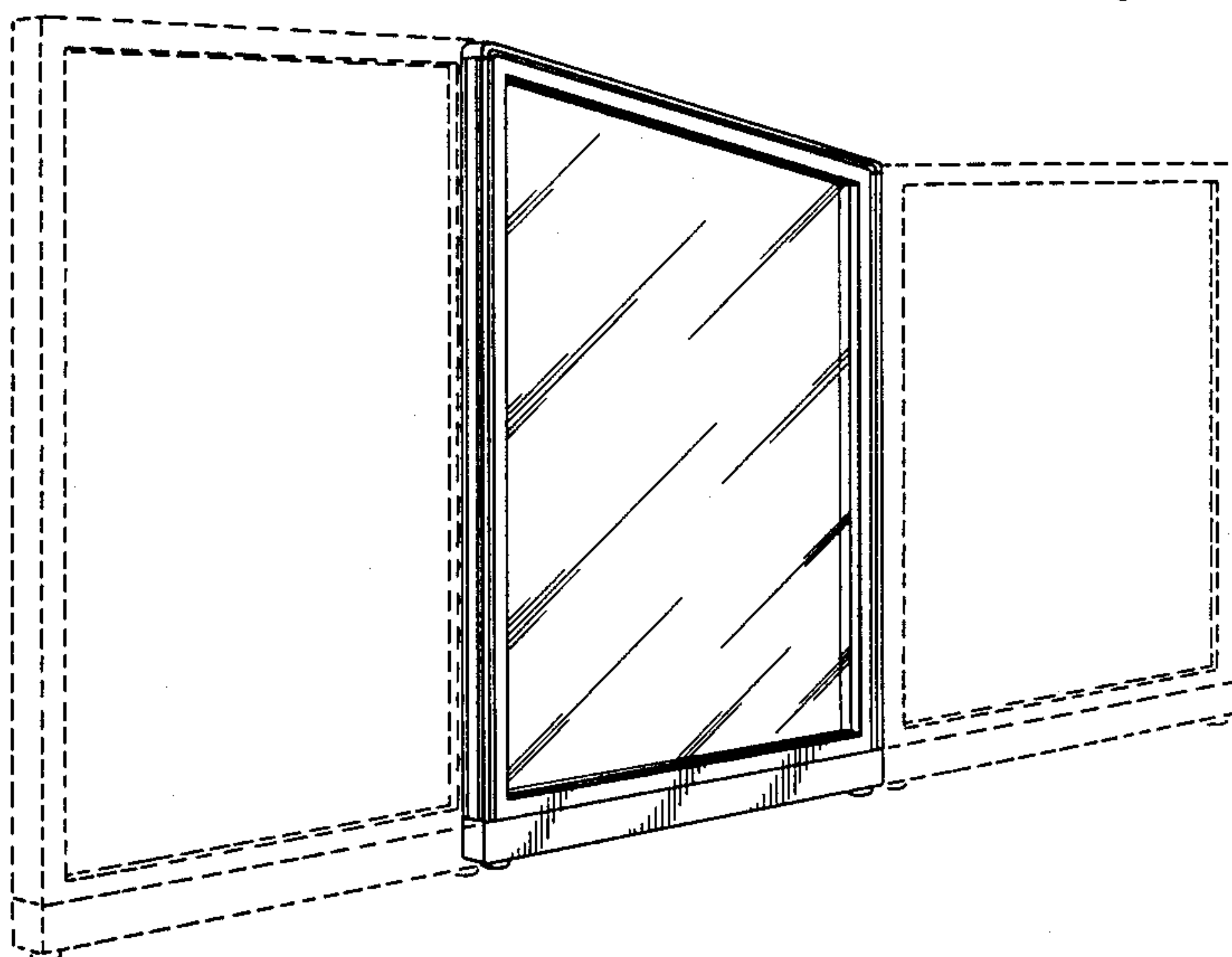
FIG. 20 is a top plan view;

bodiment thereof.



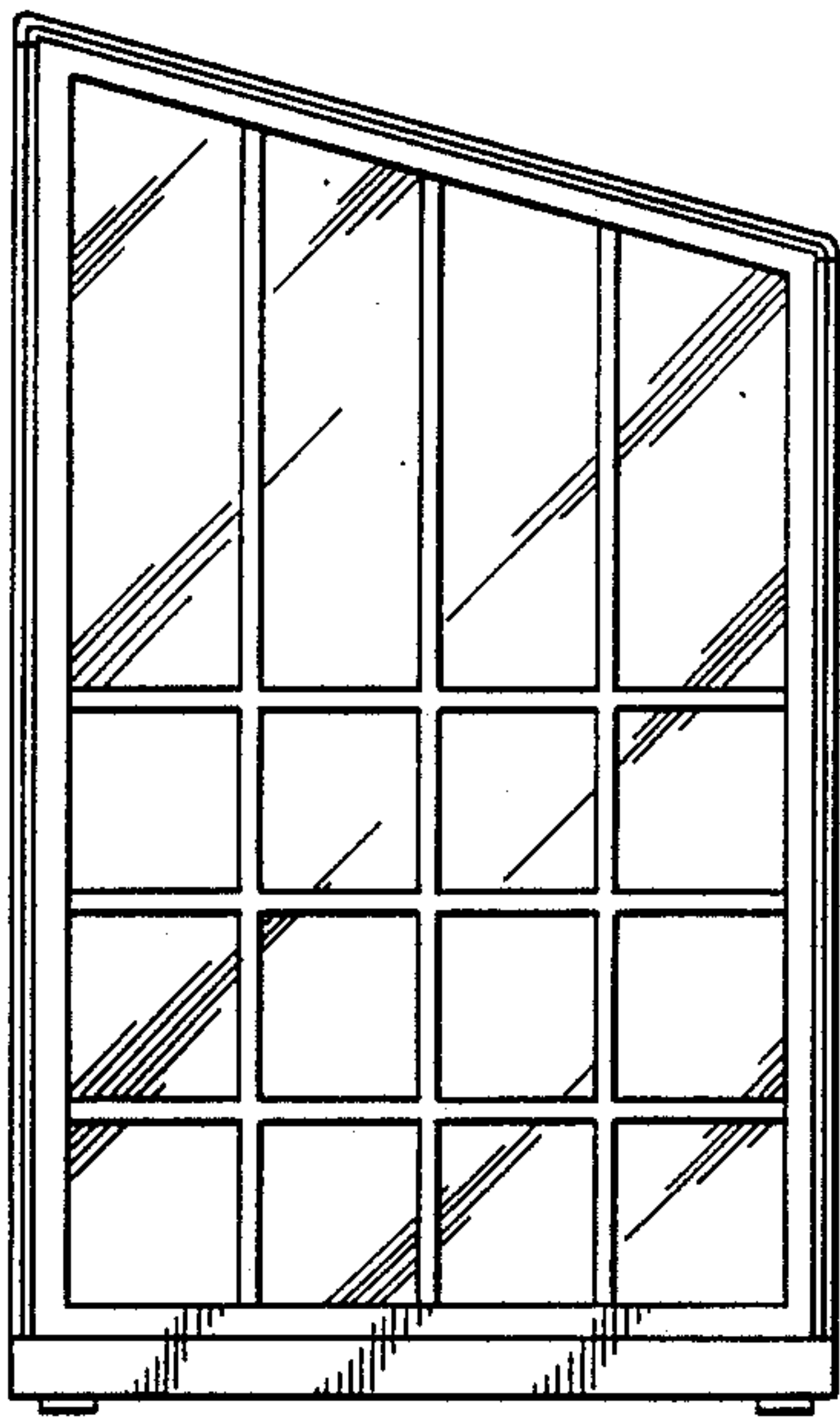

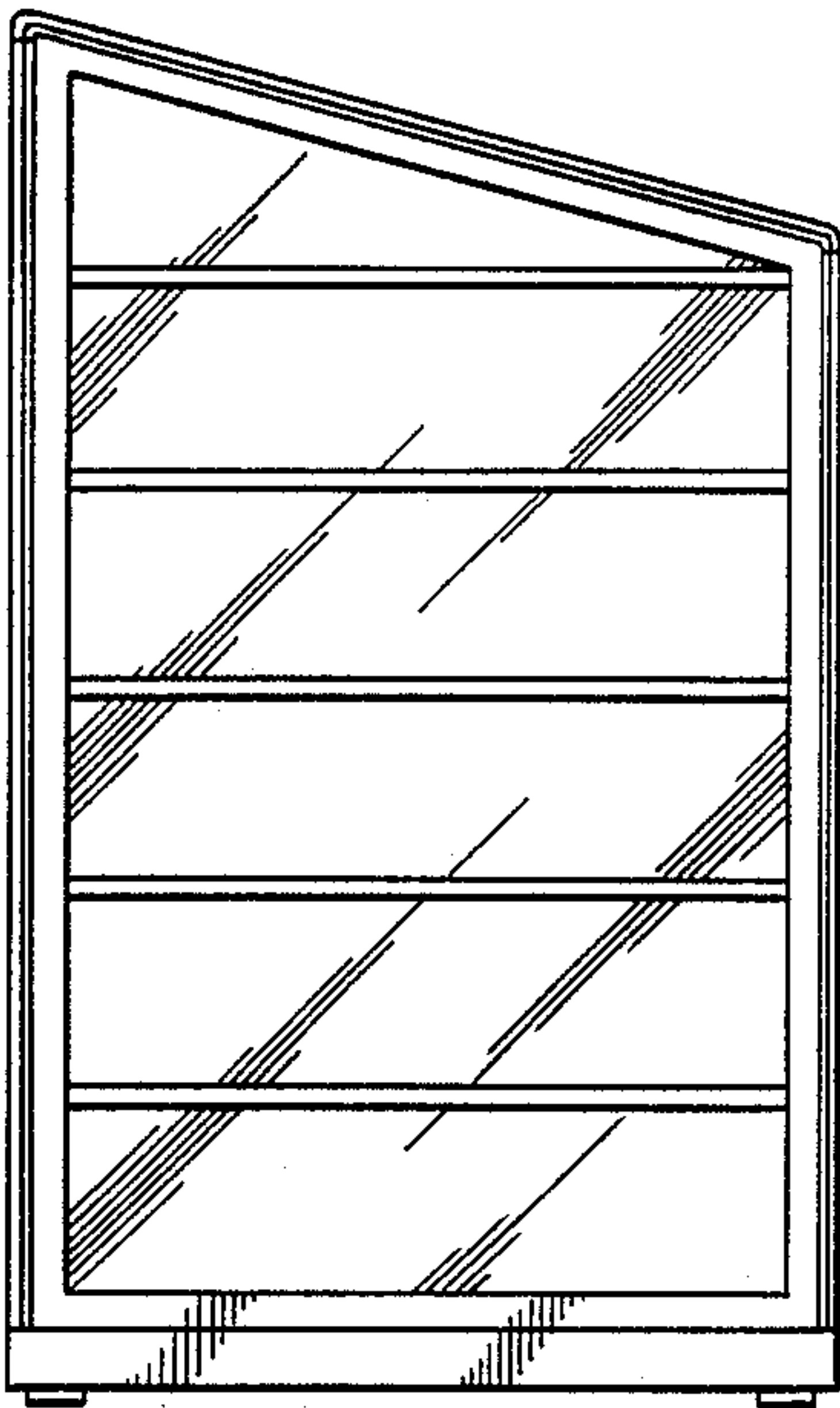

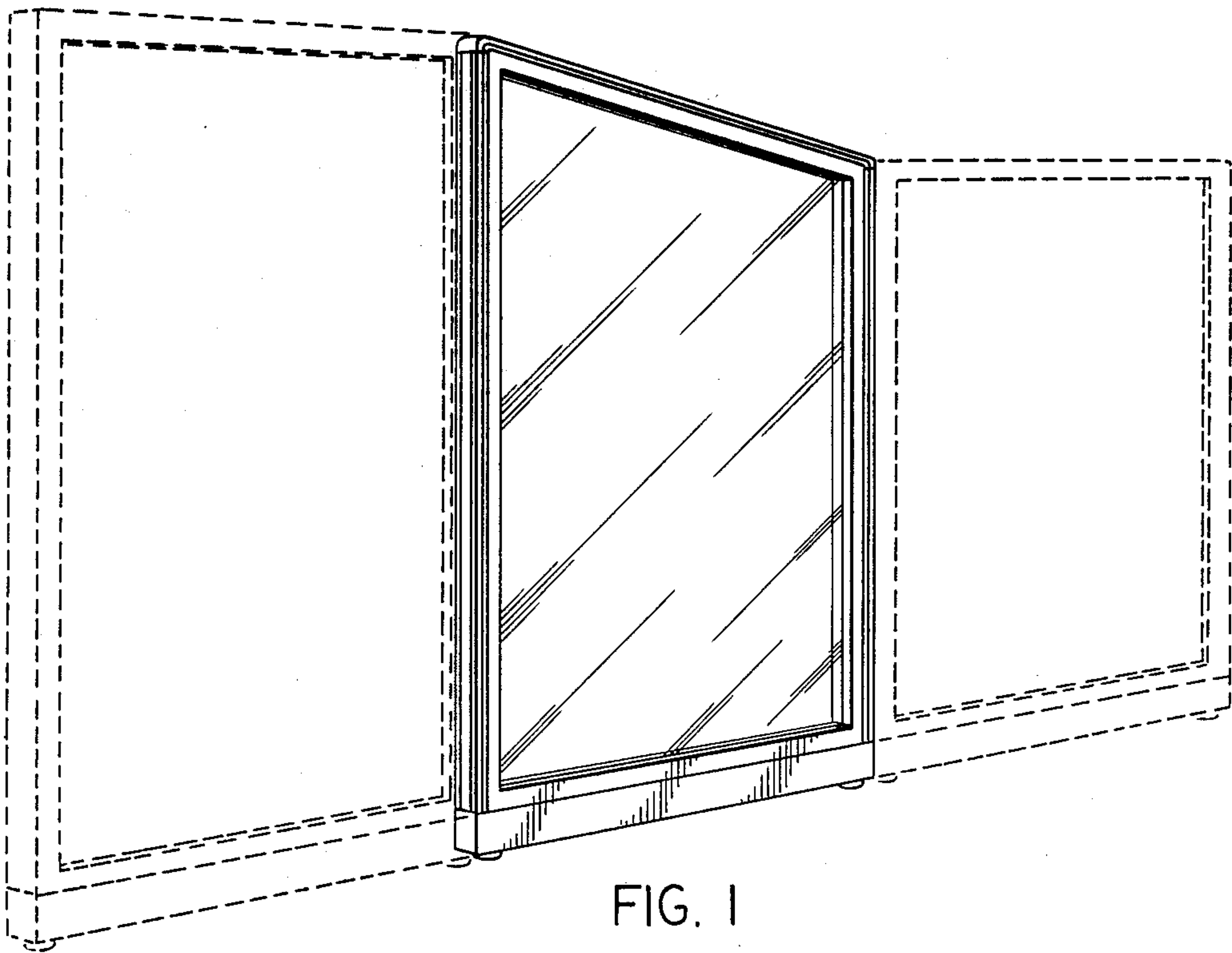
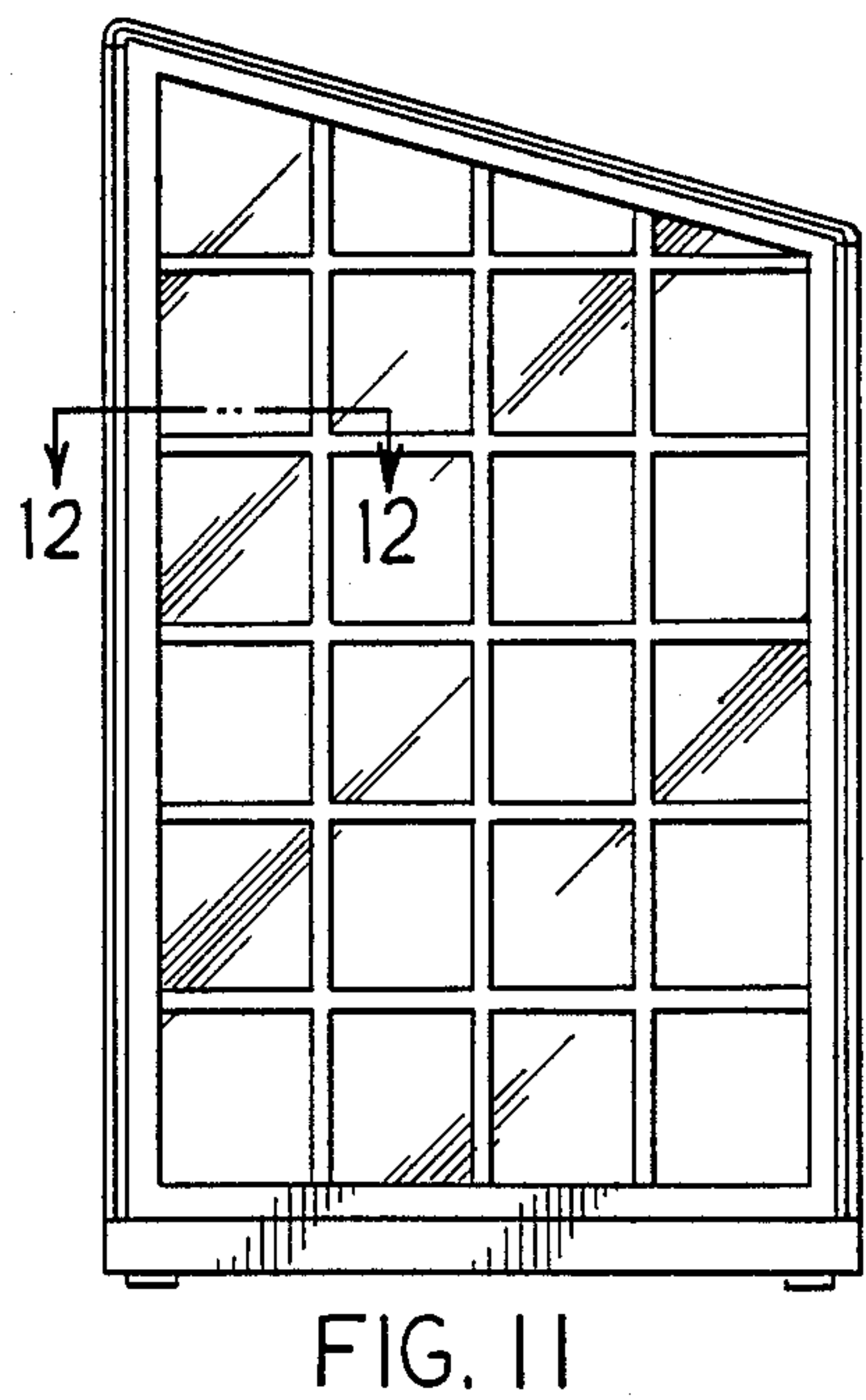
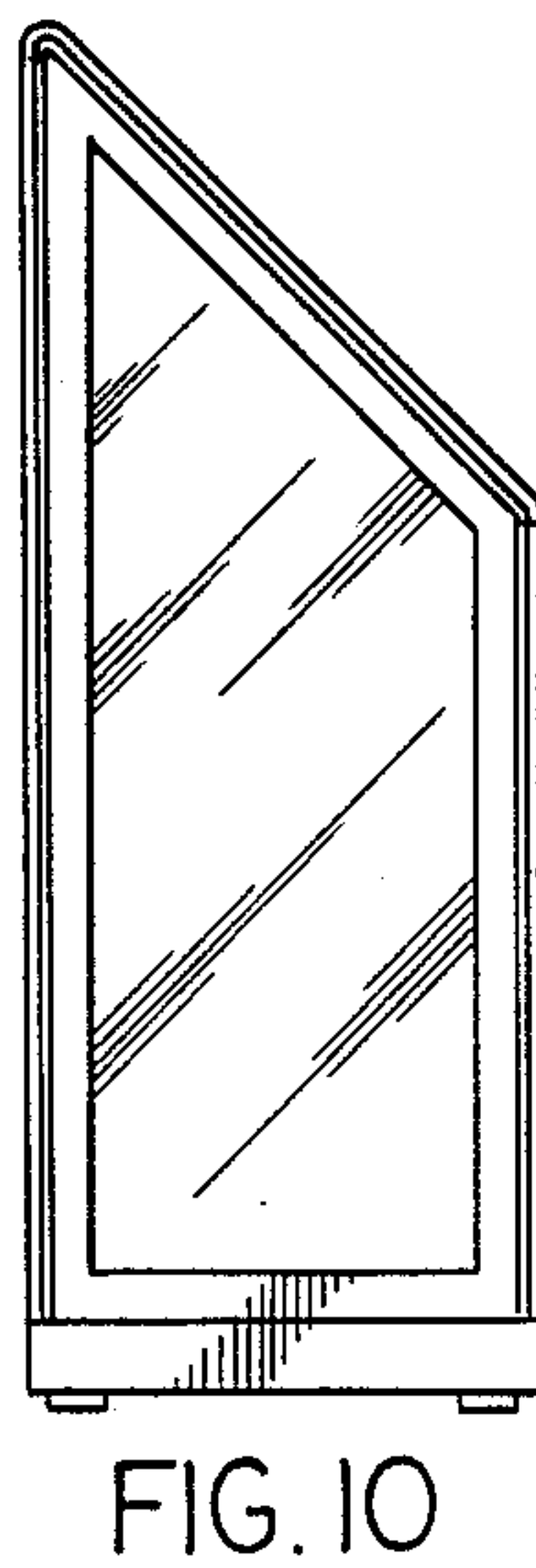
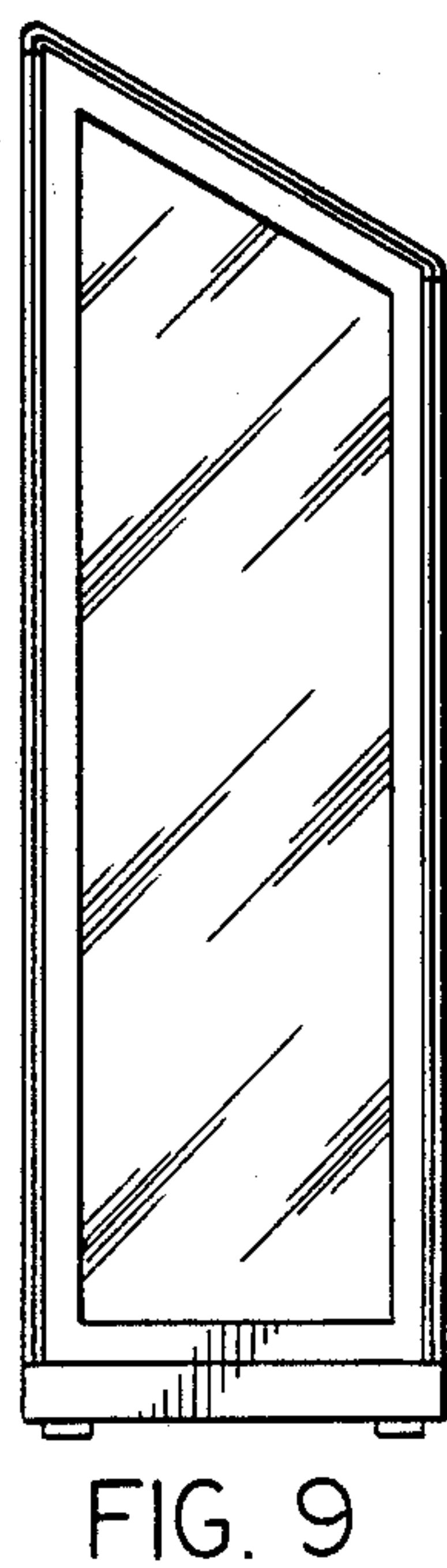
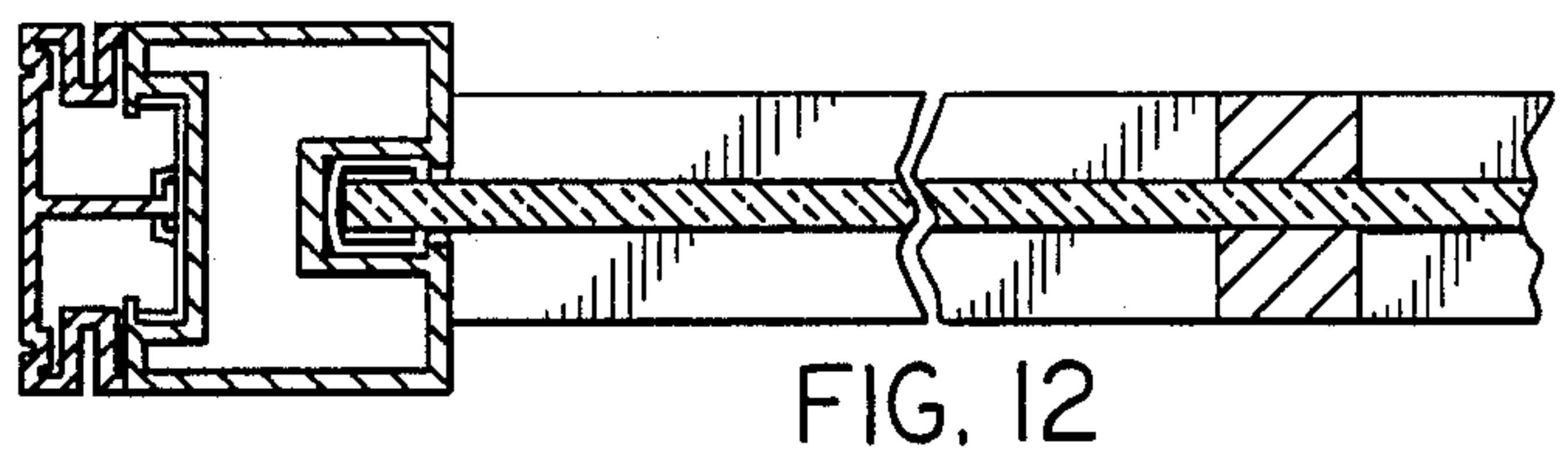
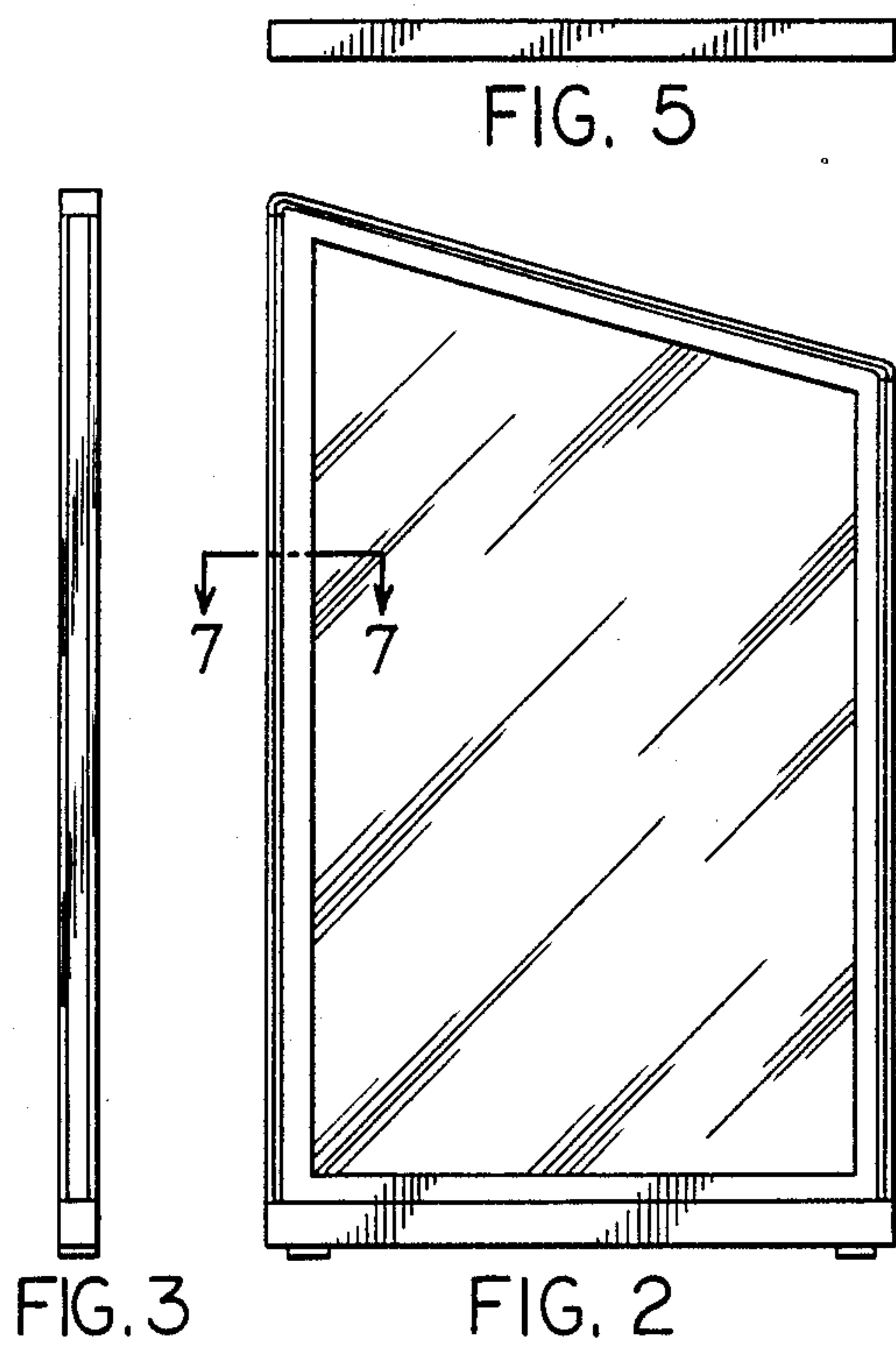

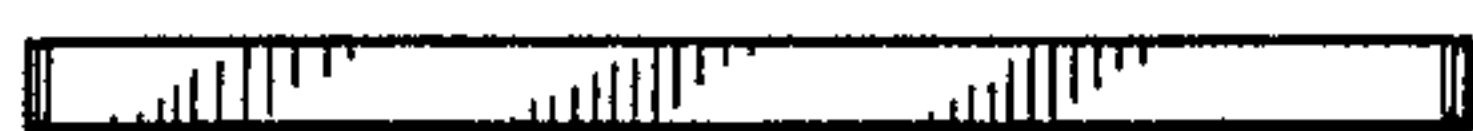

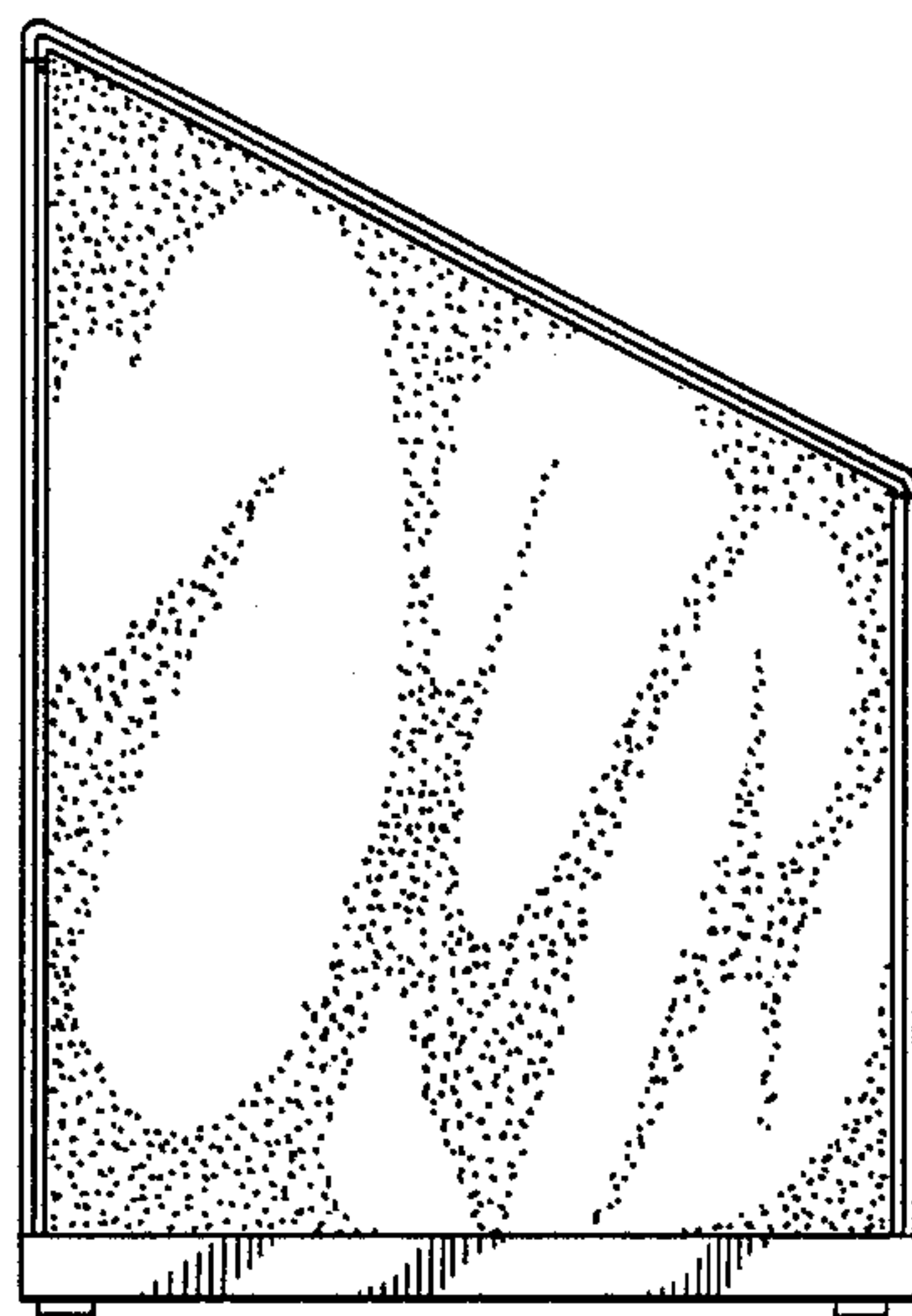

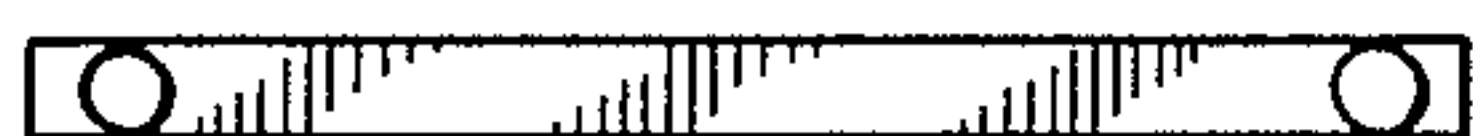

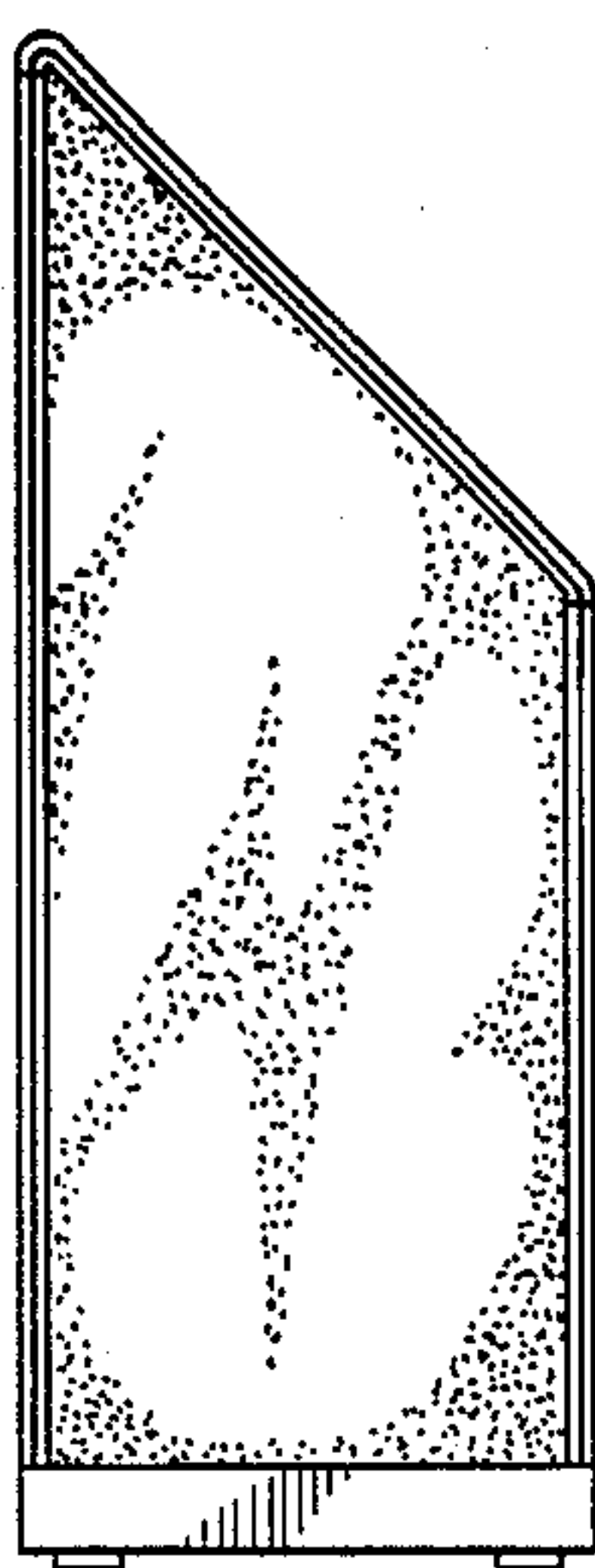

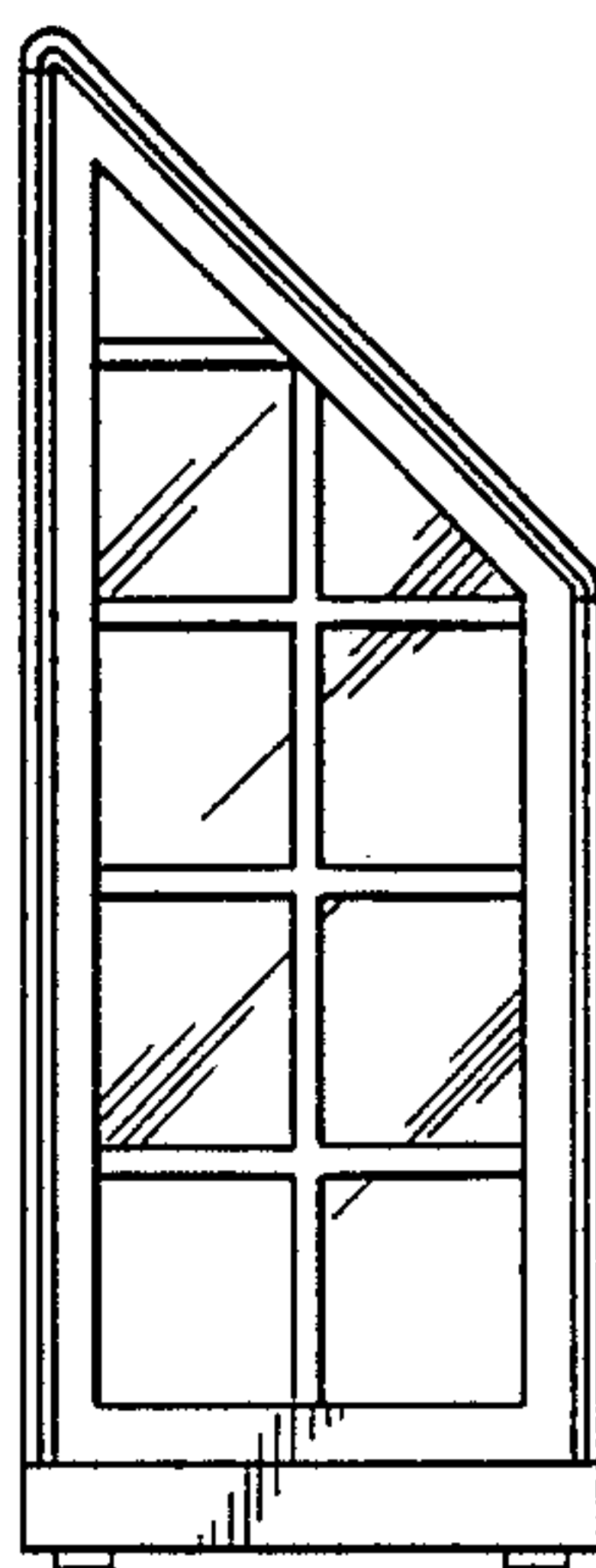

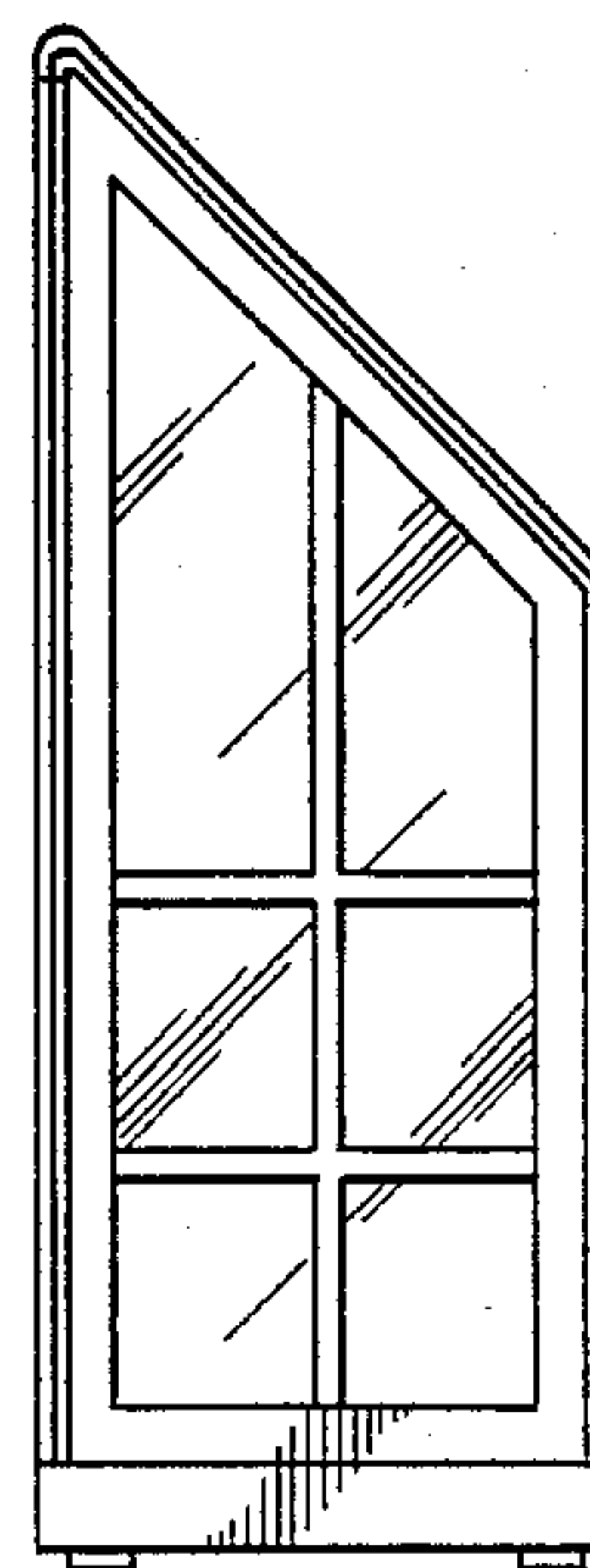
