[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a handle for an article of flatware, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a handle for an article of flatware showing my new design, the broken line showing of a spoon bowl being illustrative of environmental matter only and forming no part of the claimed design; FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 3 is a bottom plan view thereof; FIG. 4 is a cross sectional view thereof taken on line 4—4 of FIG. 1; and FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view thereof taken on line 5—5 of FIG. 1.
 The top and bottom surfaces of the handles are entirely smooth and the surface ornamentation represented by the stippled shading is due to different coloration rather than variation of surface.

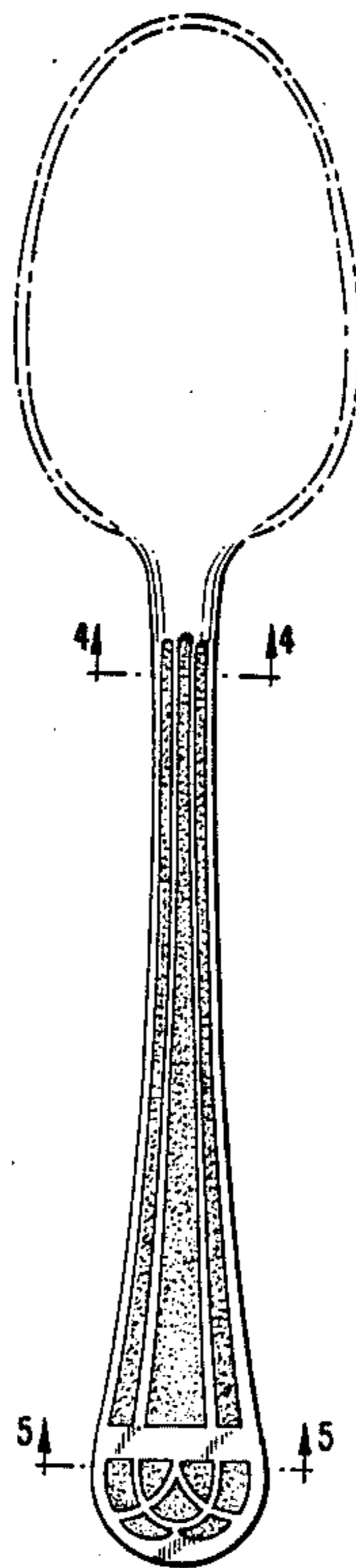
