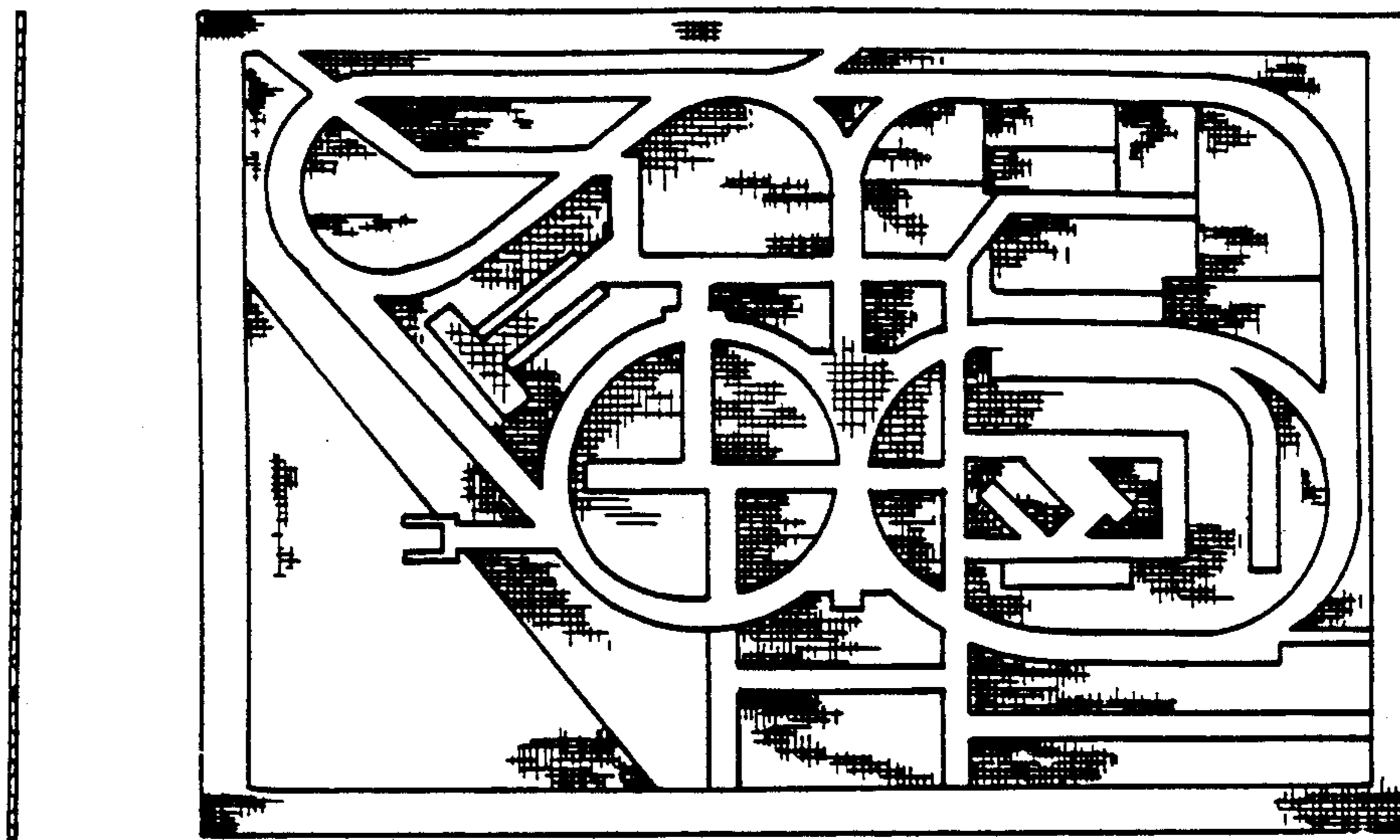

The ornamental design for the patterned mat for toy vehicles, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a patterned mat for toy vehicles showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a front side elevational view thereof, the rear being a mirror image of that shown; and
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof.



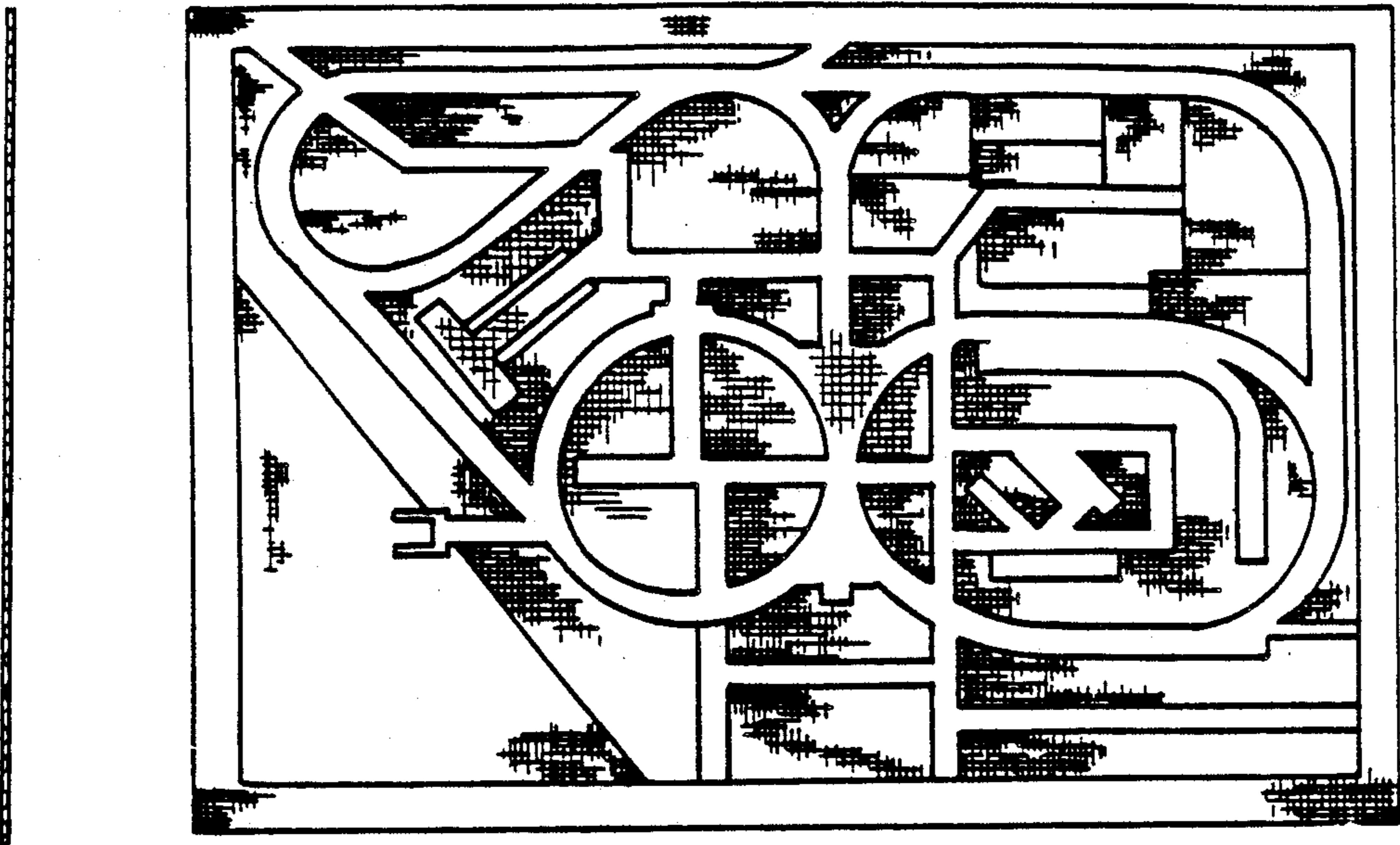

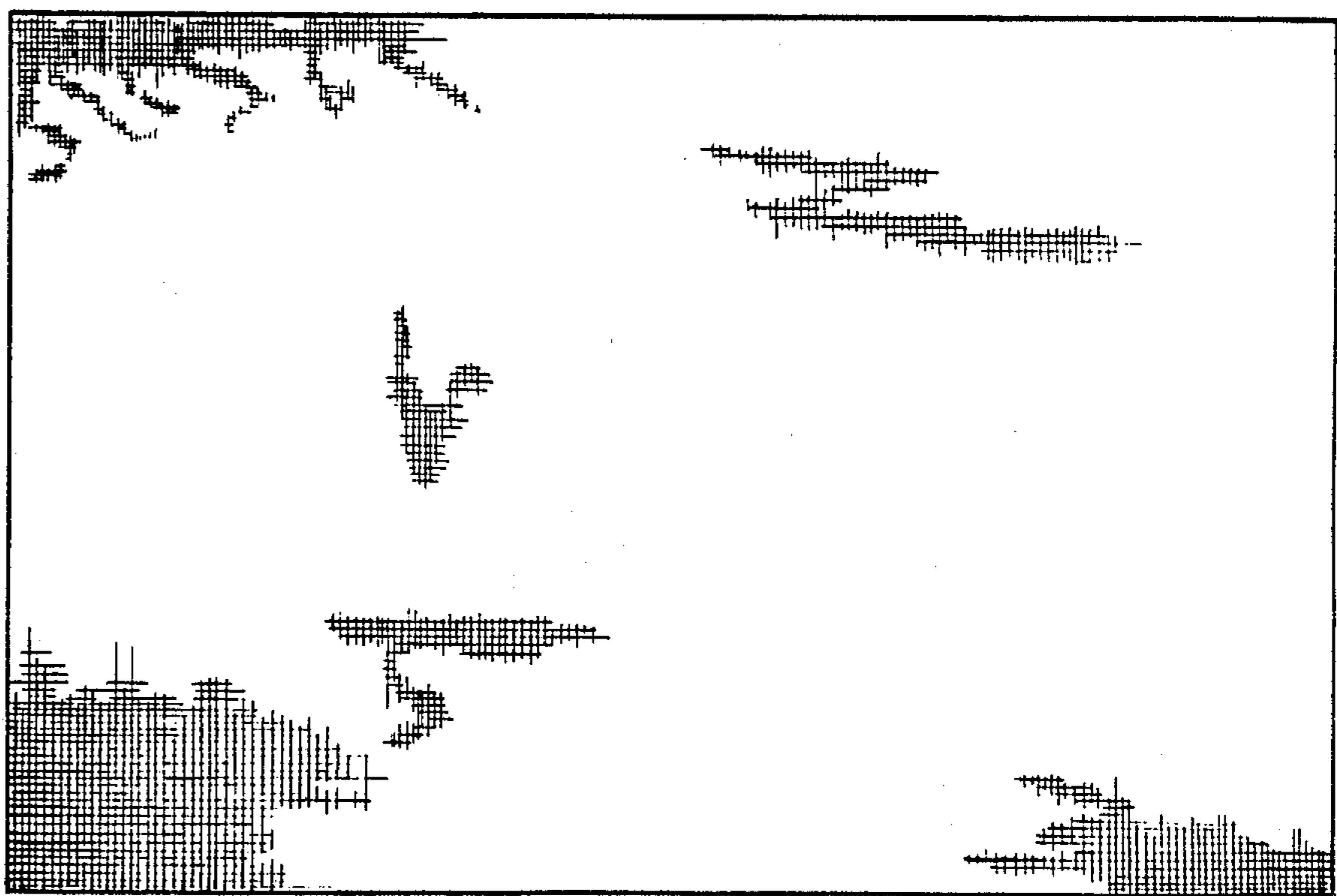
