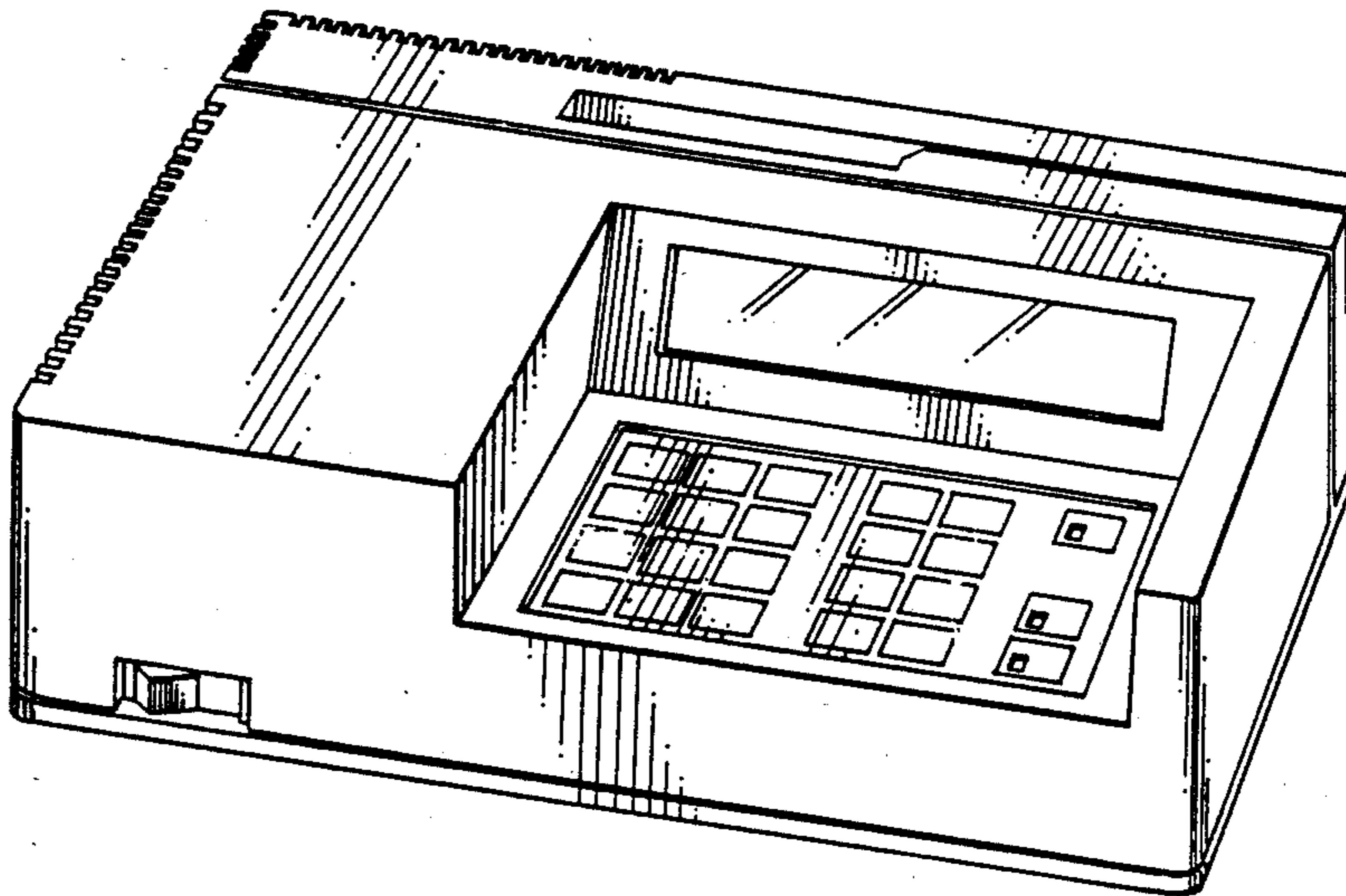

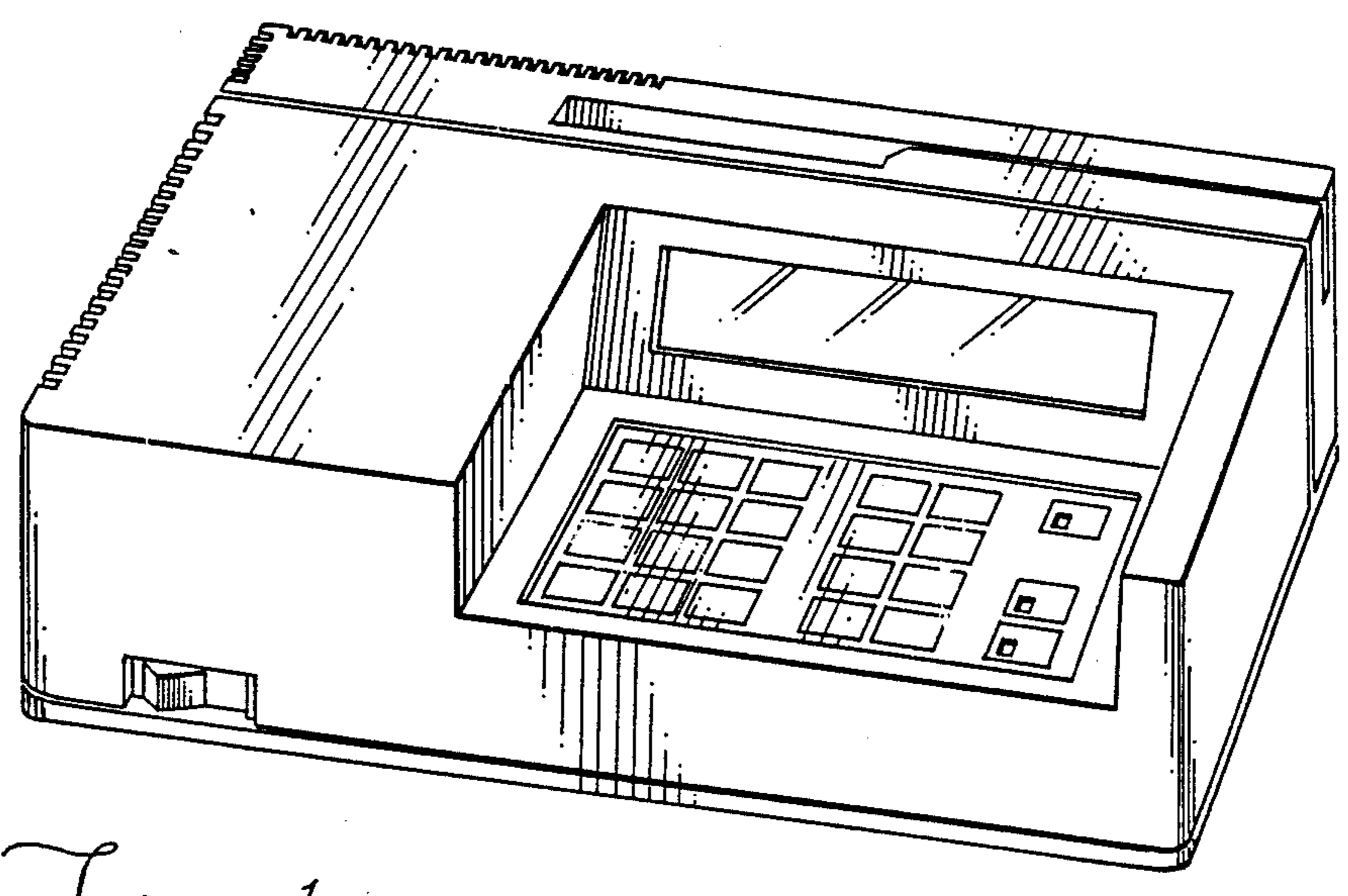
[57] **CLAIM**

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a top front and right side perspective view of an electronic fund transfer unit showing our new design;

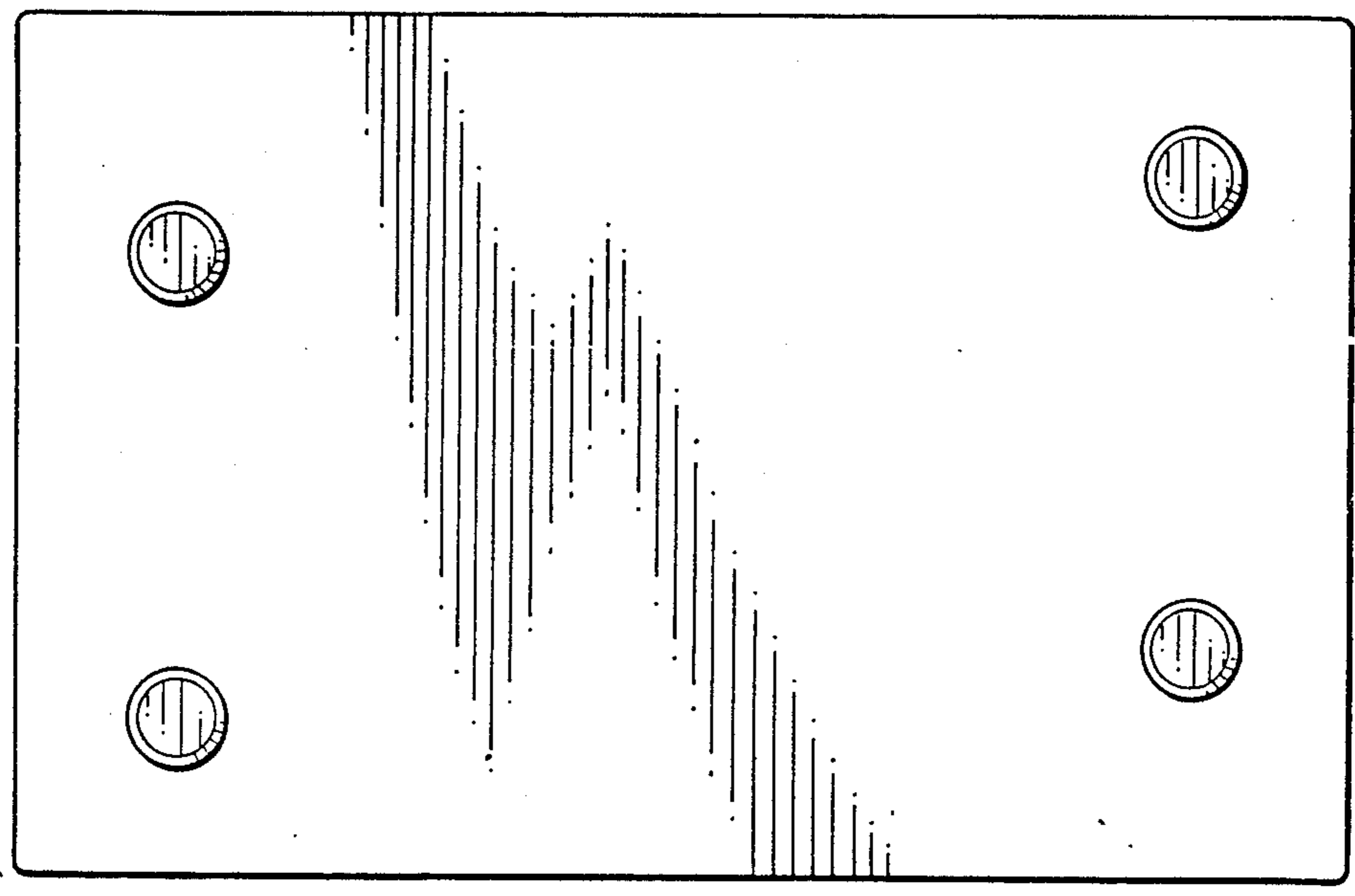

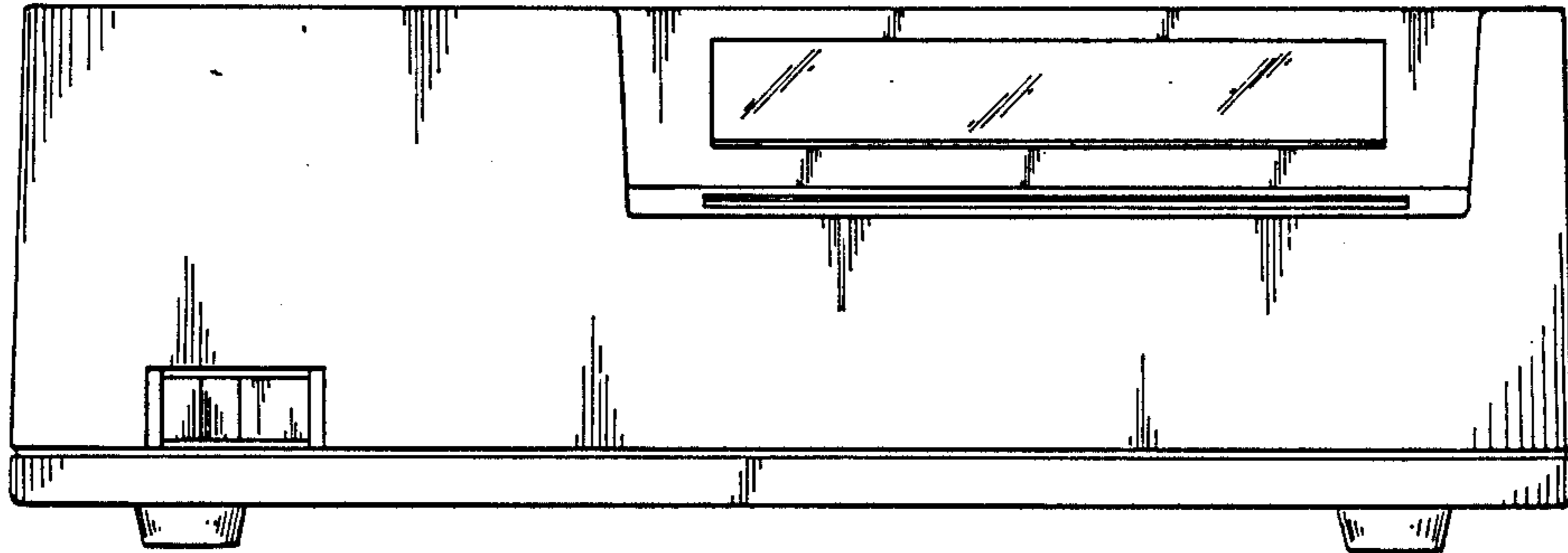

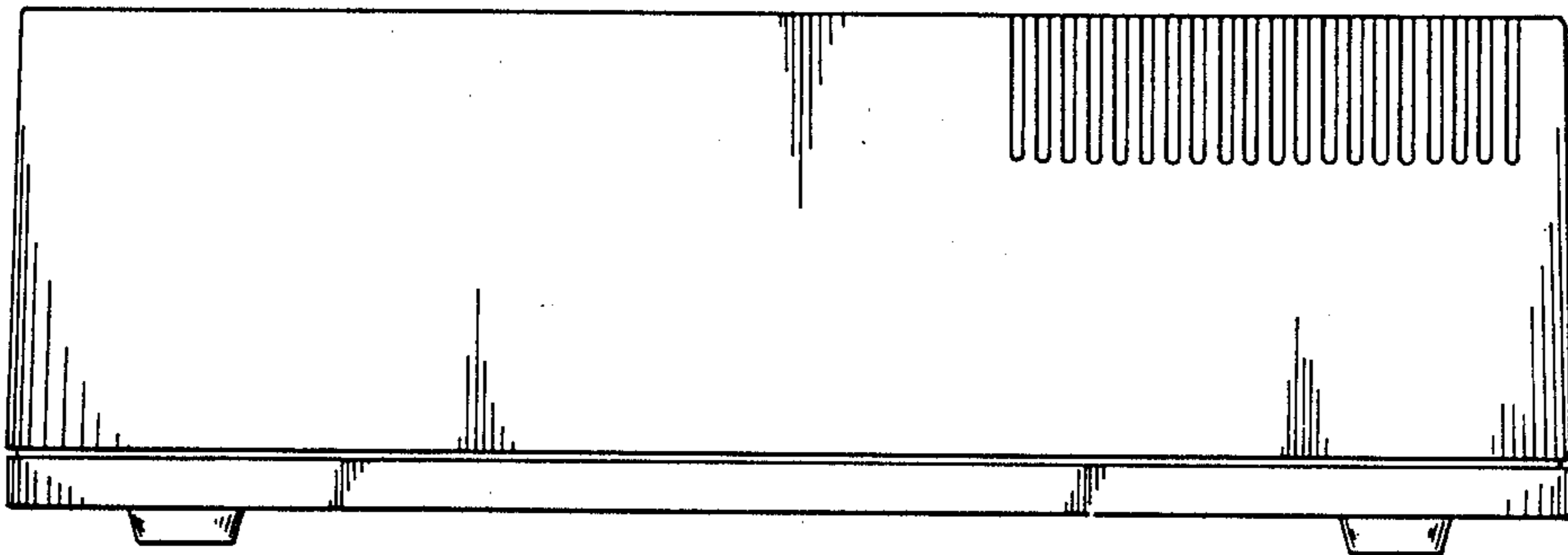

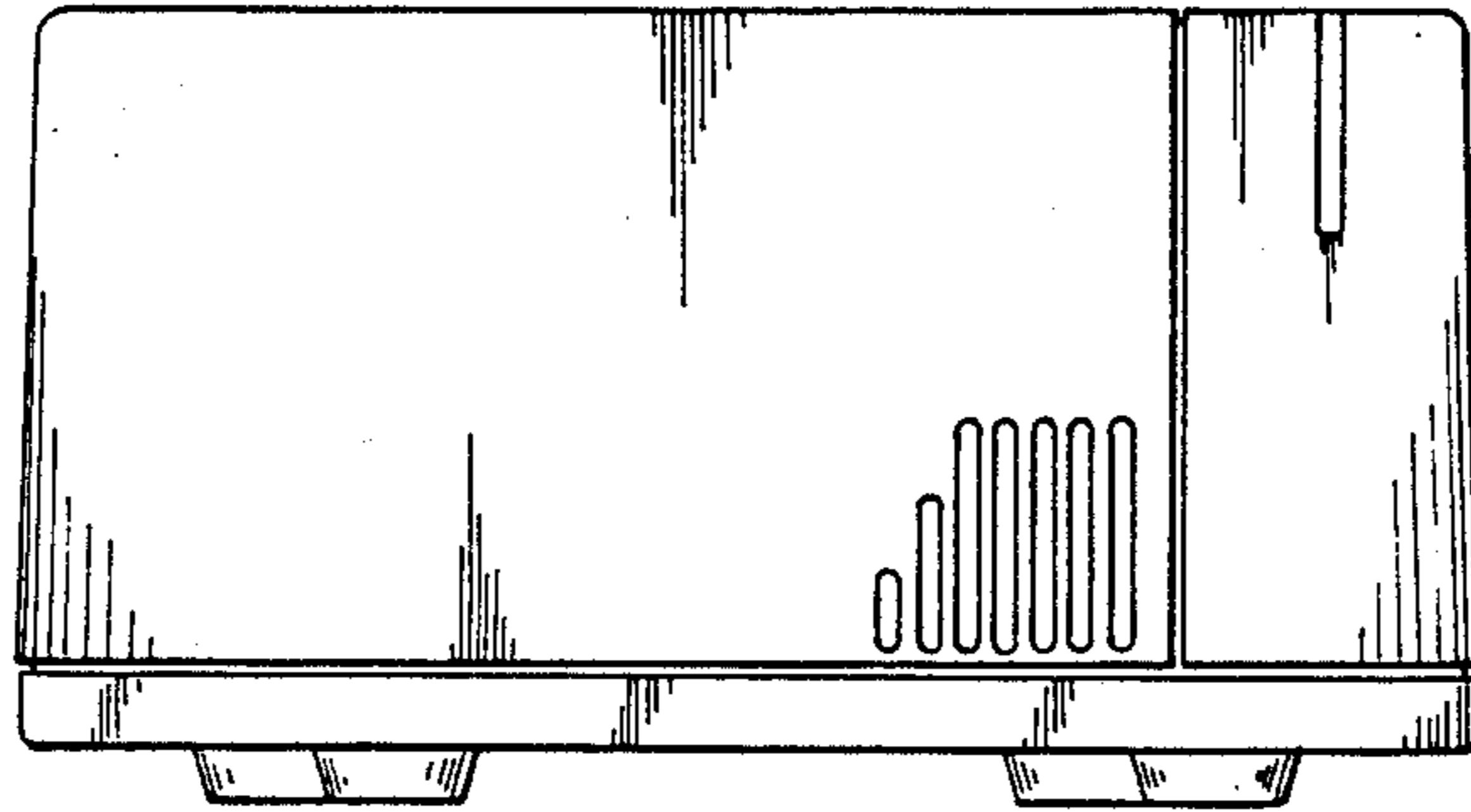
