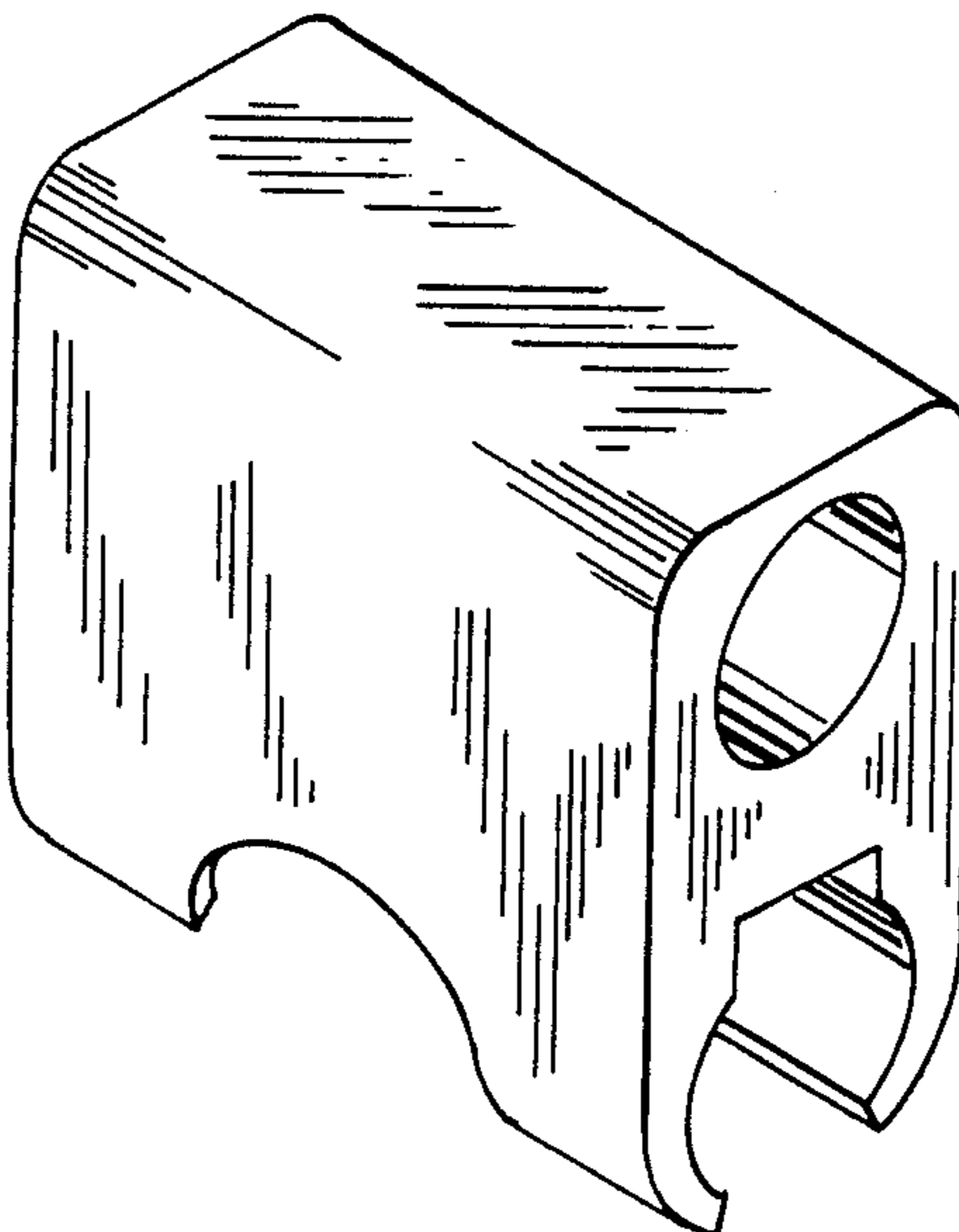

The flashlight and gun are shown in broken lines in FIG. 2 for illustrative purposes only.



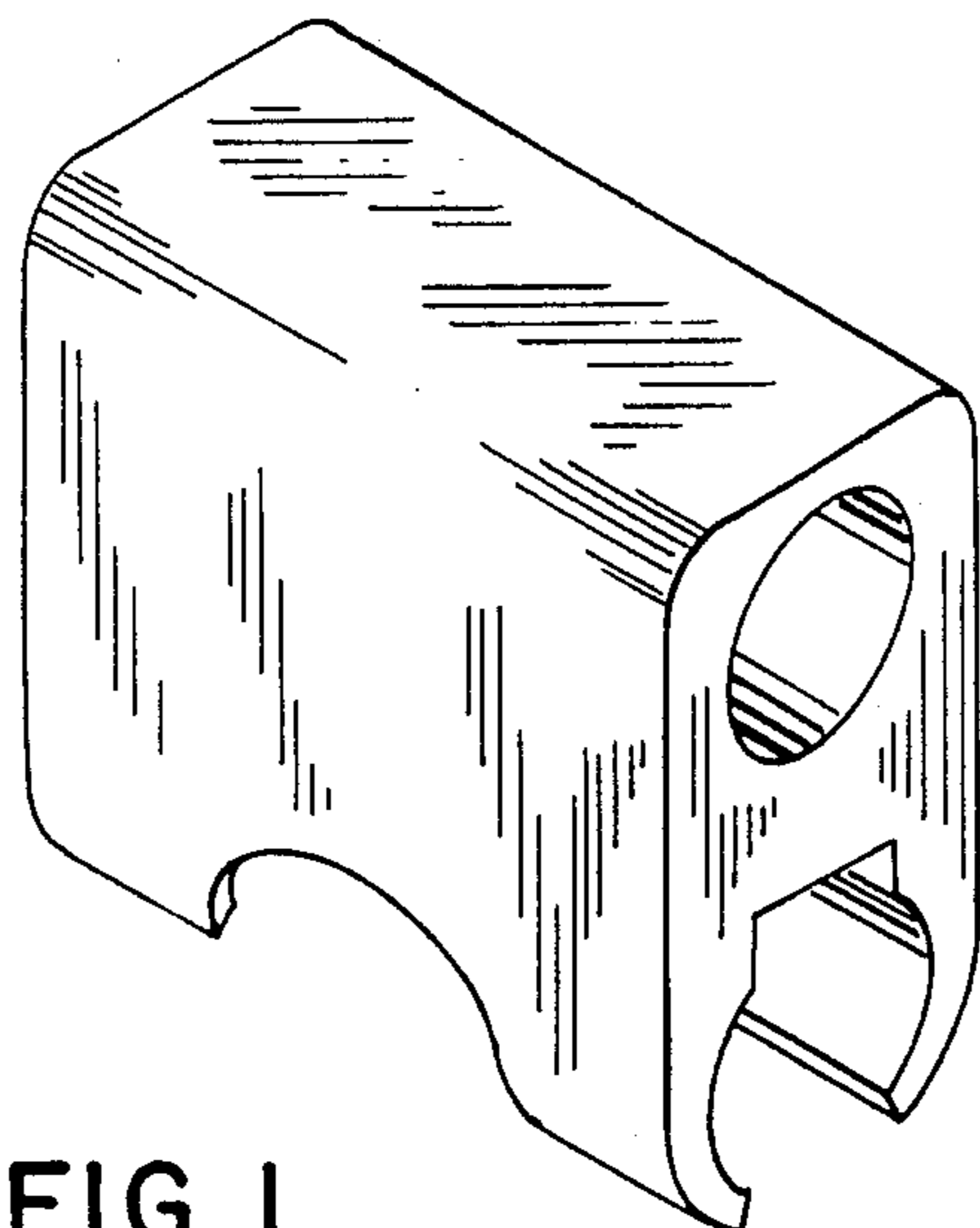

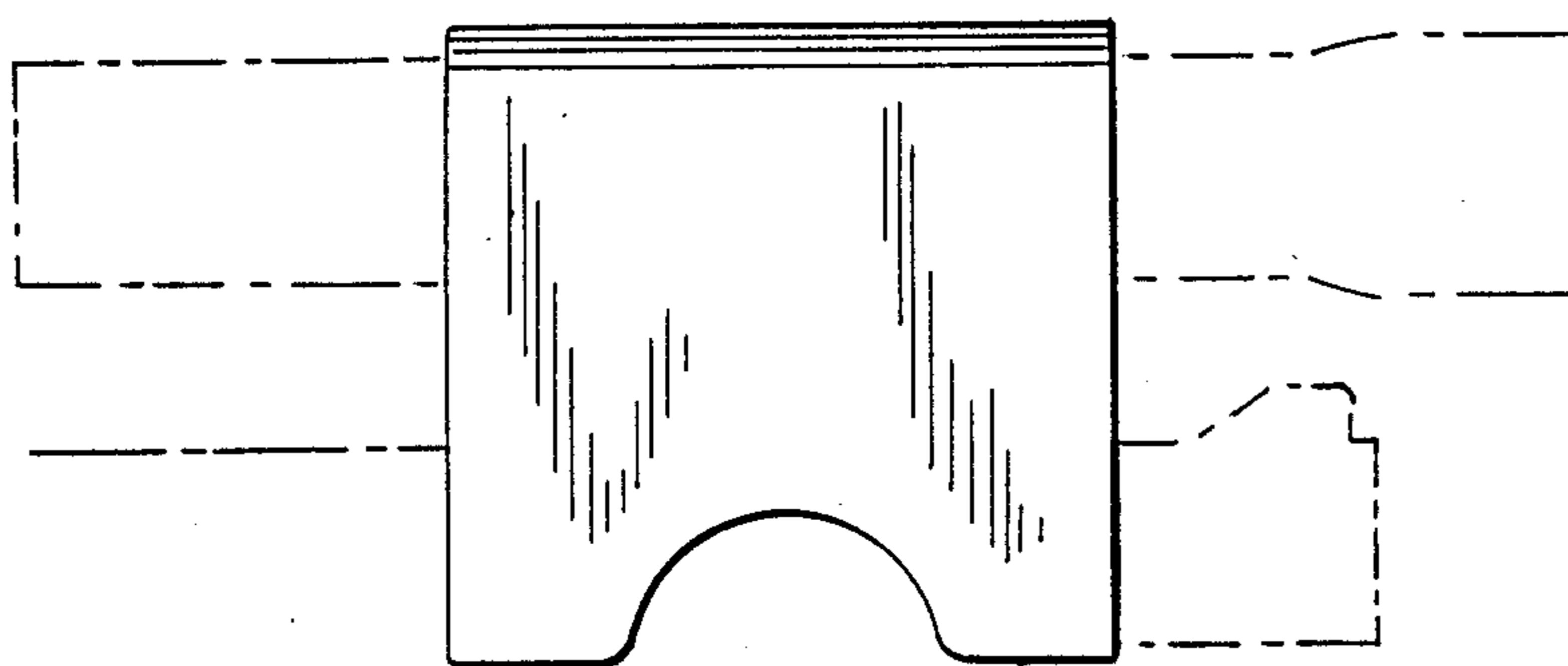

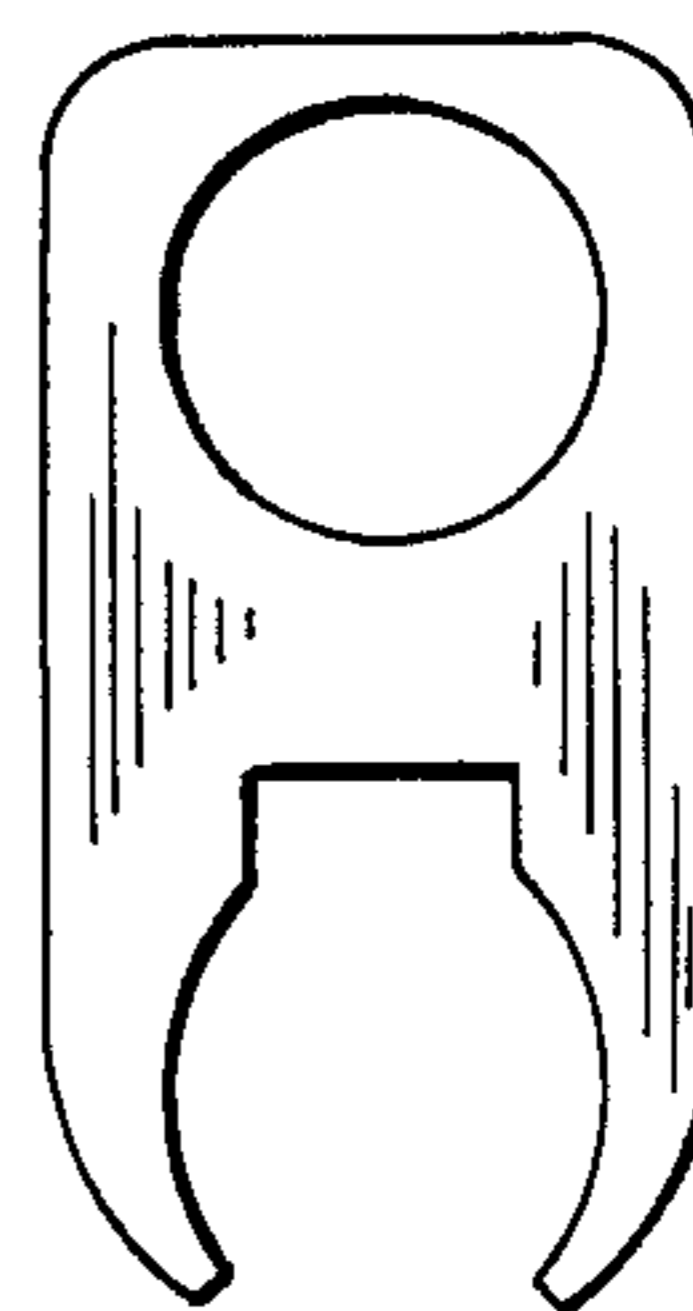

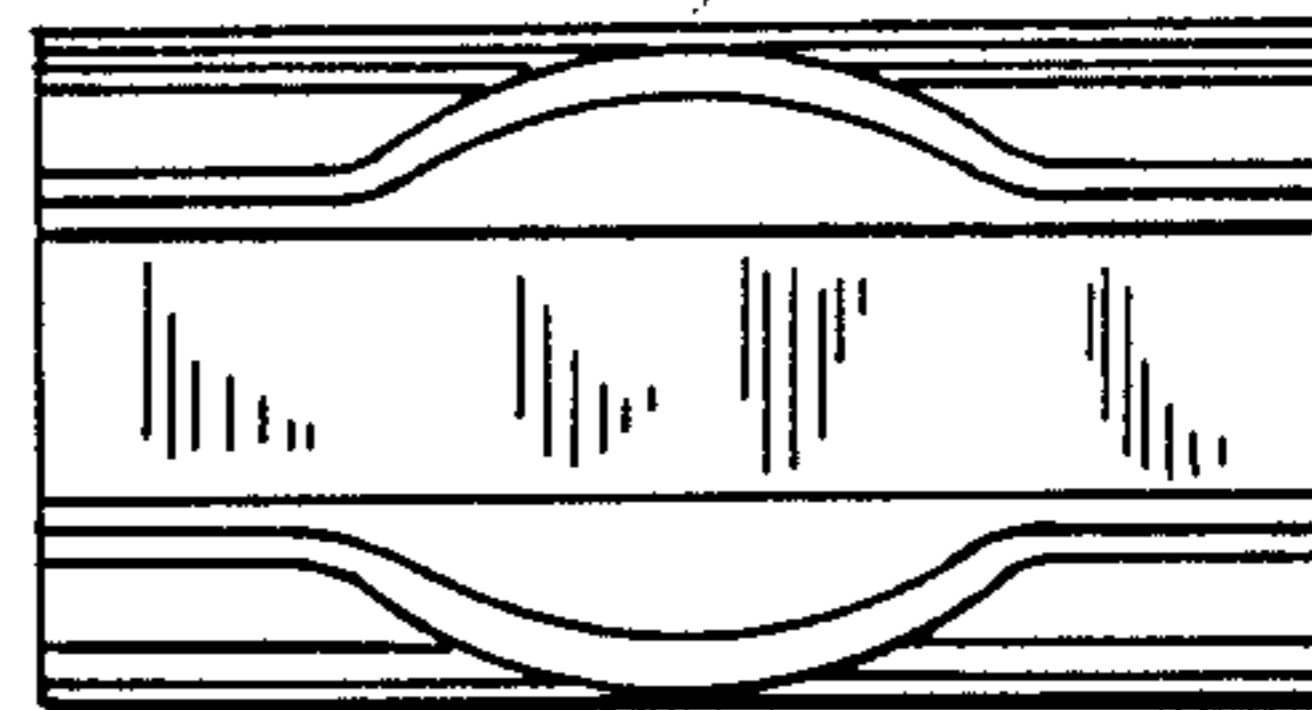
