The ornamental design for a chop stick fork, as shown and described.

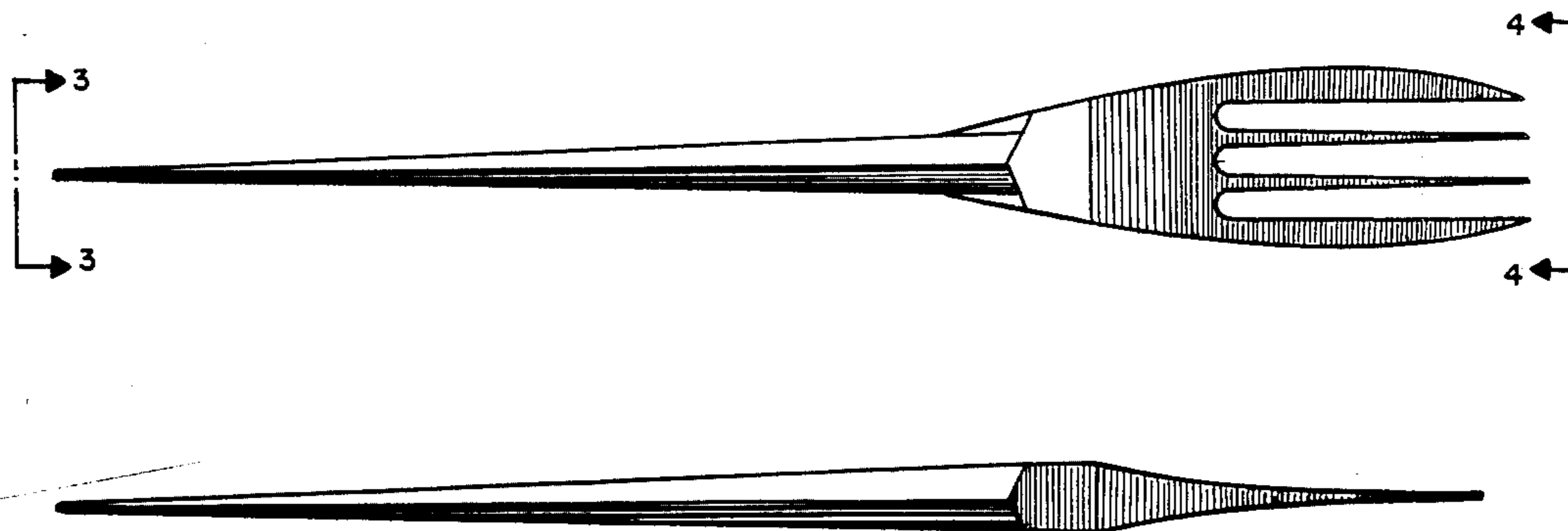
DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top or bottom plan view of a chop stick fork showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view;

FIG. 3 is an end elevational view taken along line 3—3 of FIG. 1; and

FIG. 4 is an end elevational view thereof, taken along line 4—4 of FIG. 1.



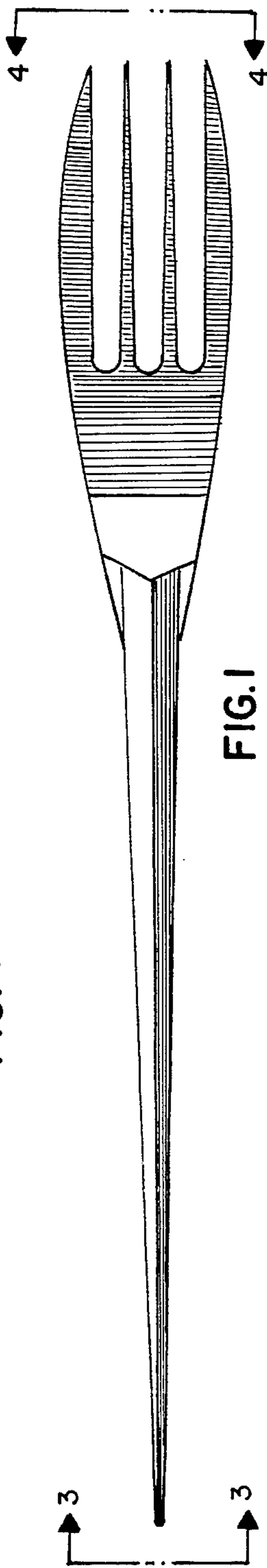

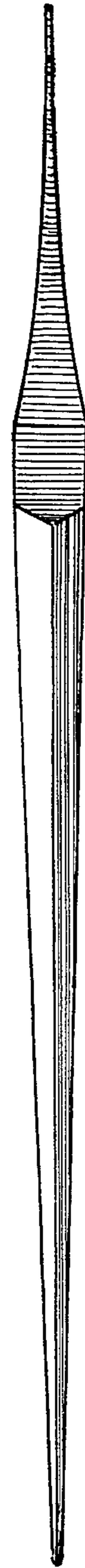
