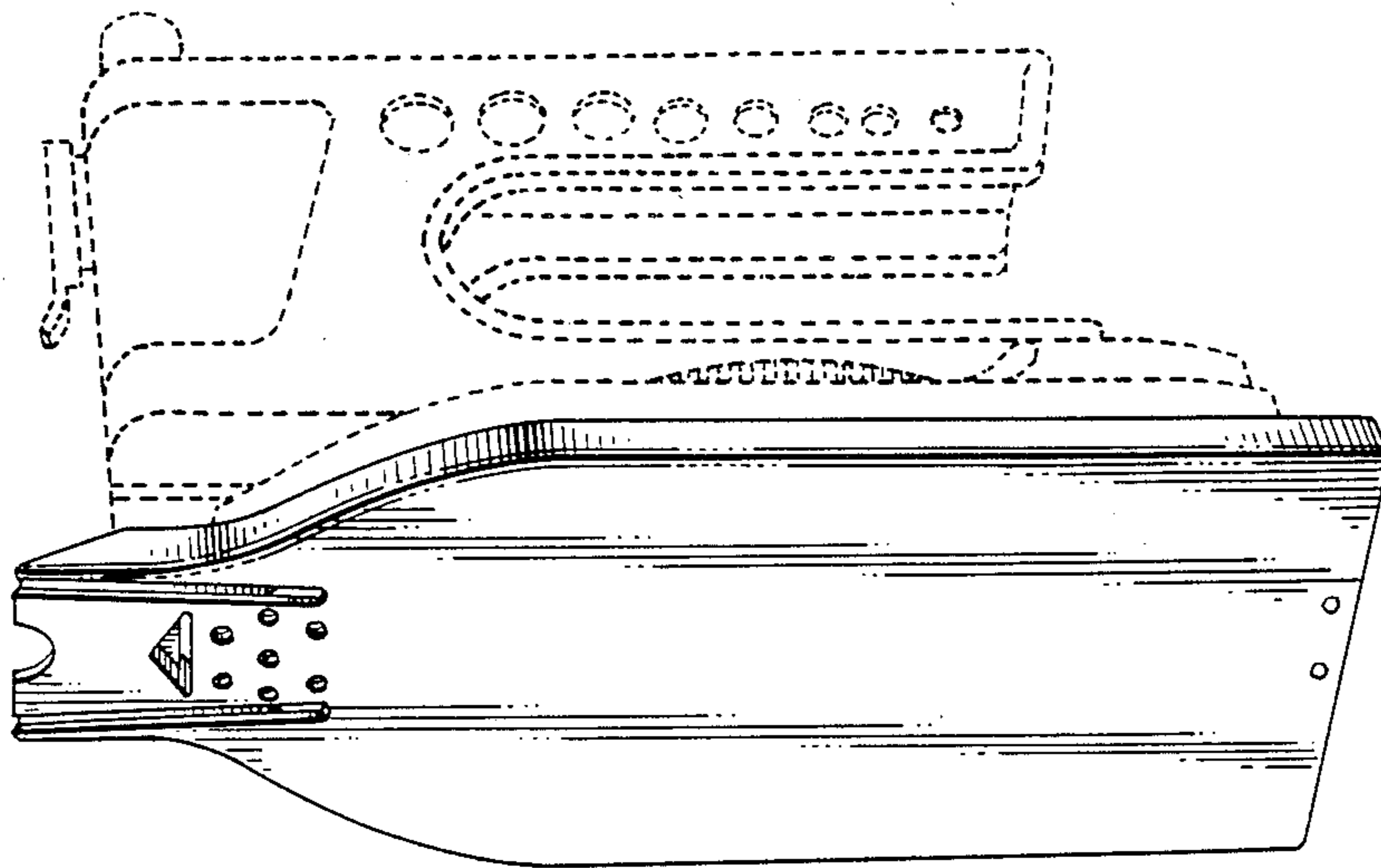
FIG. 1 is a bottom perspective view of a steam iron sole plate for accommodating buttons and pleats or similar article showing our new design;

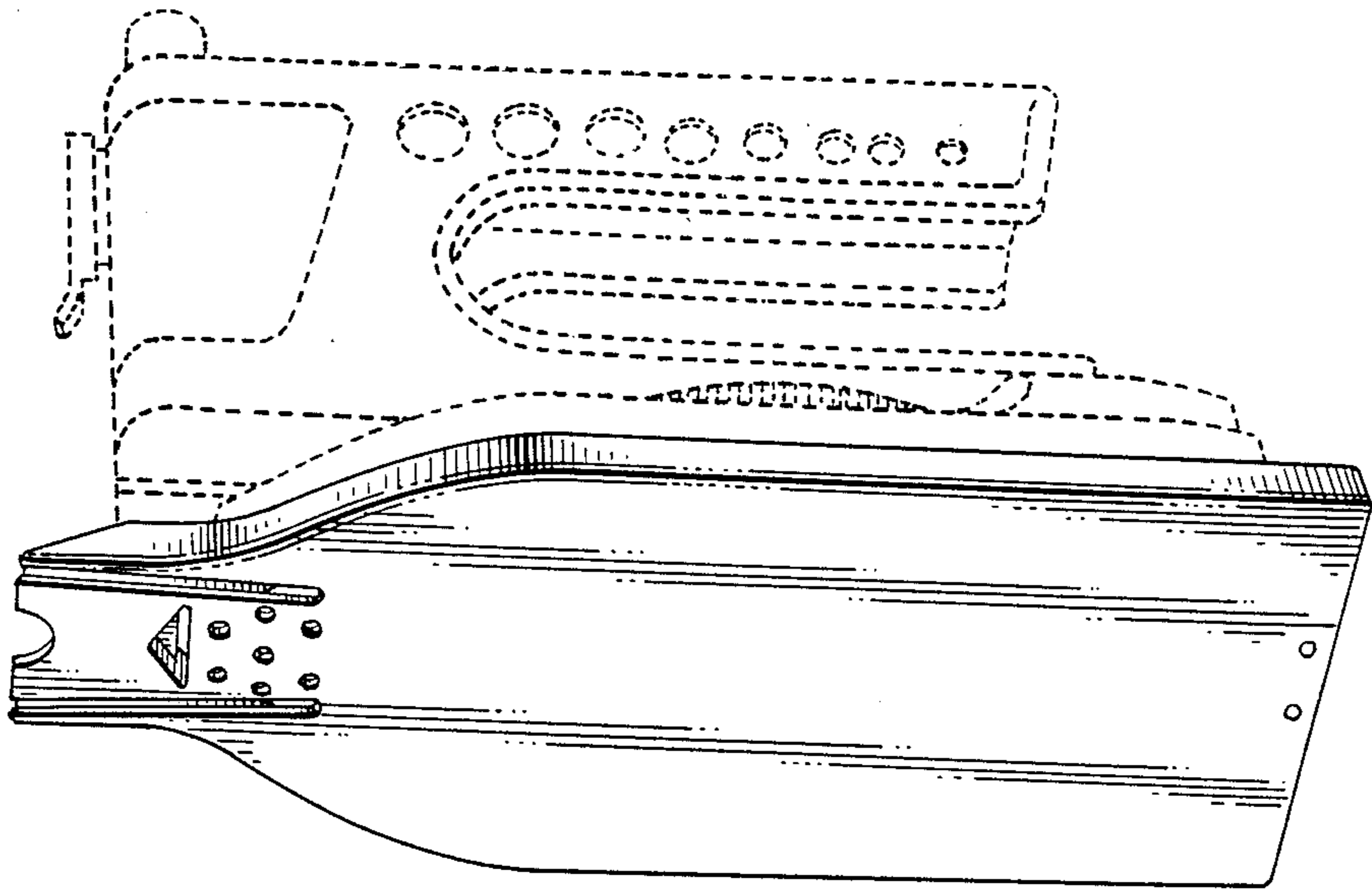

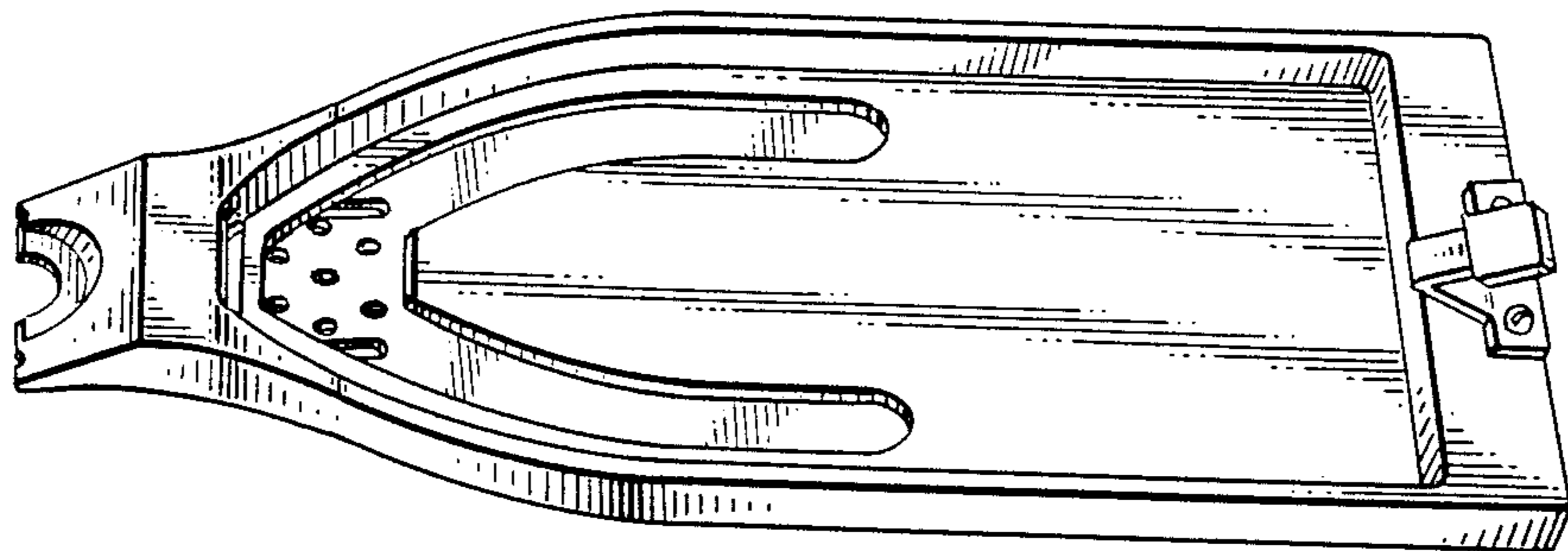

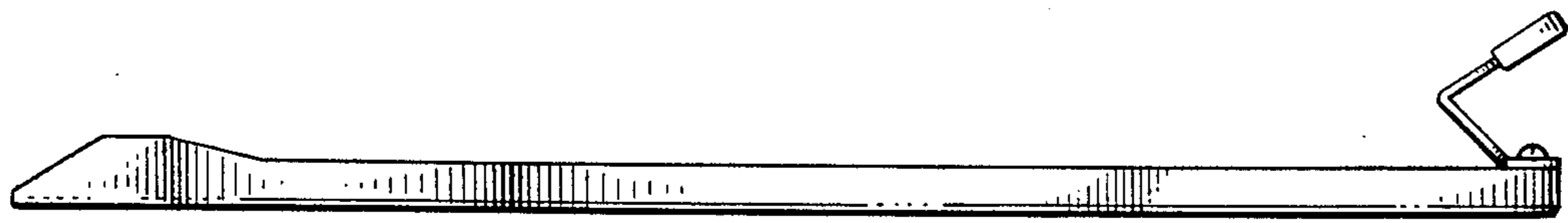
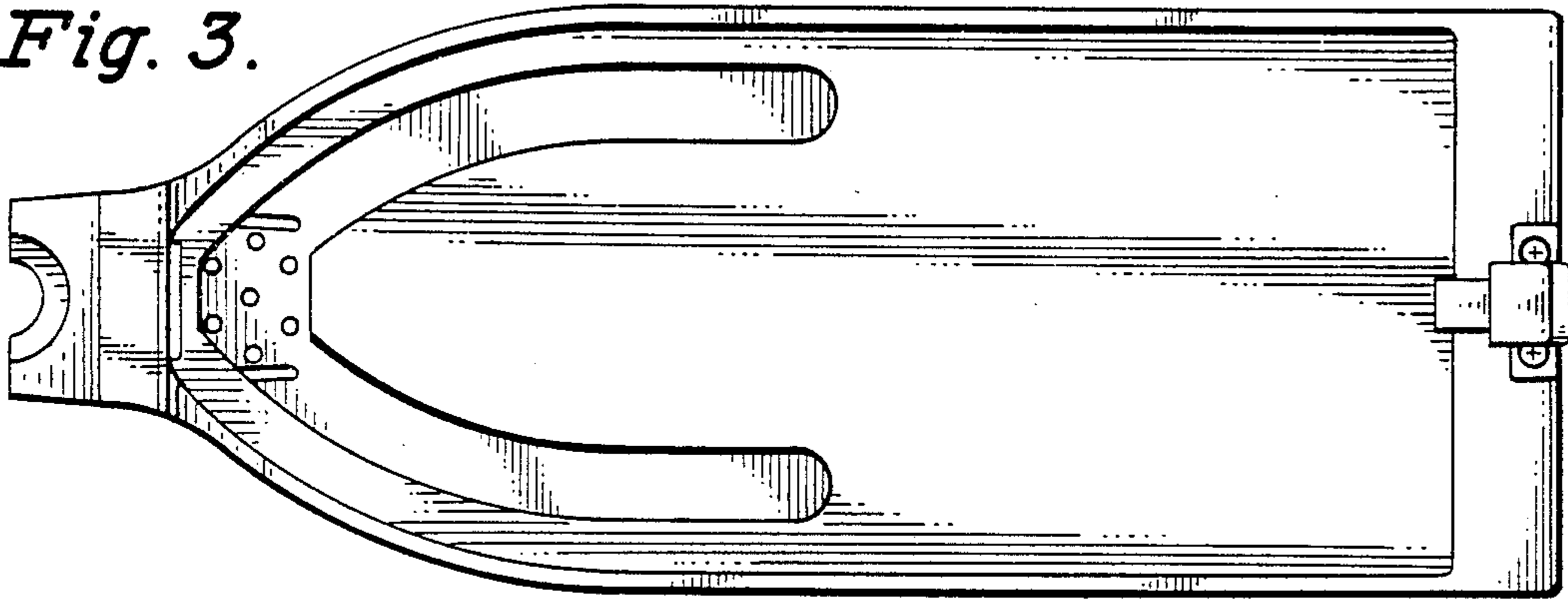

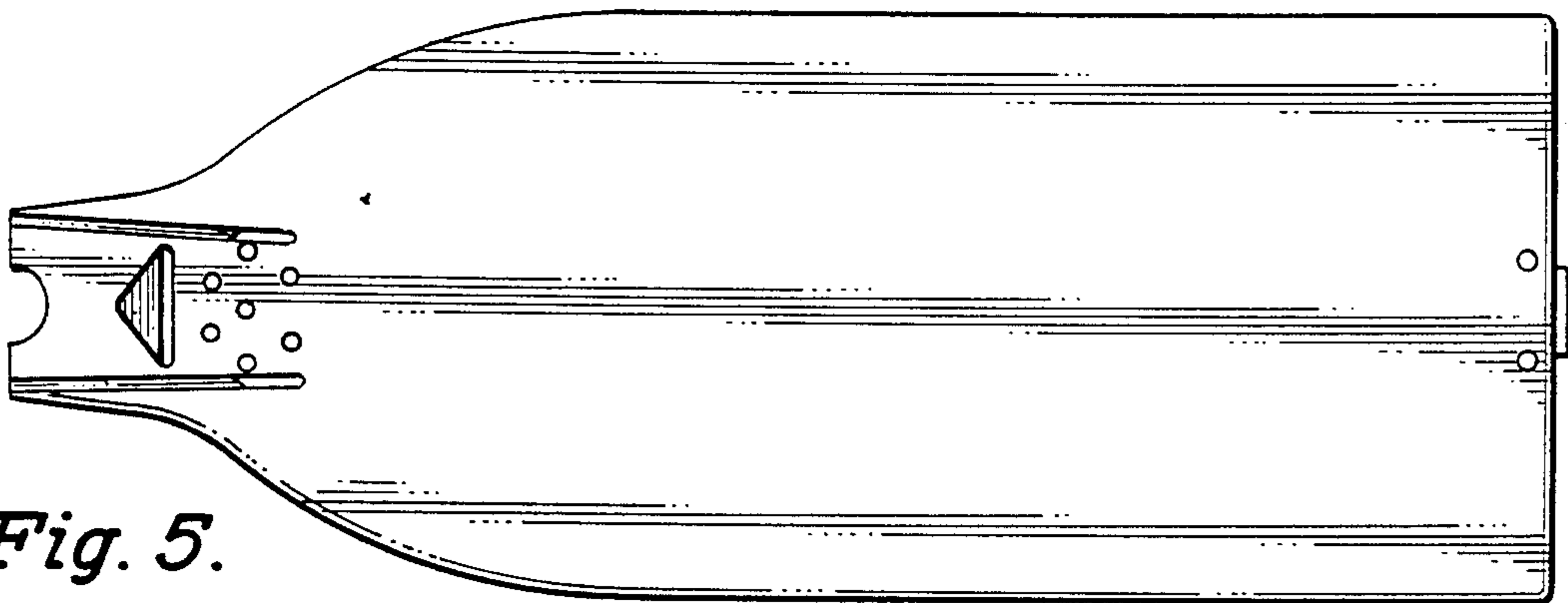

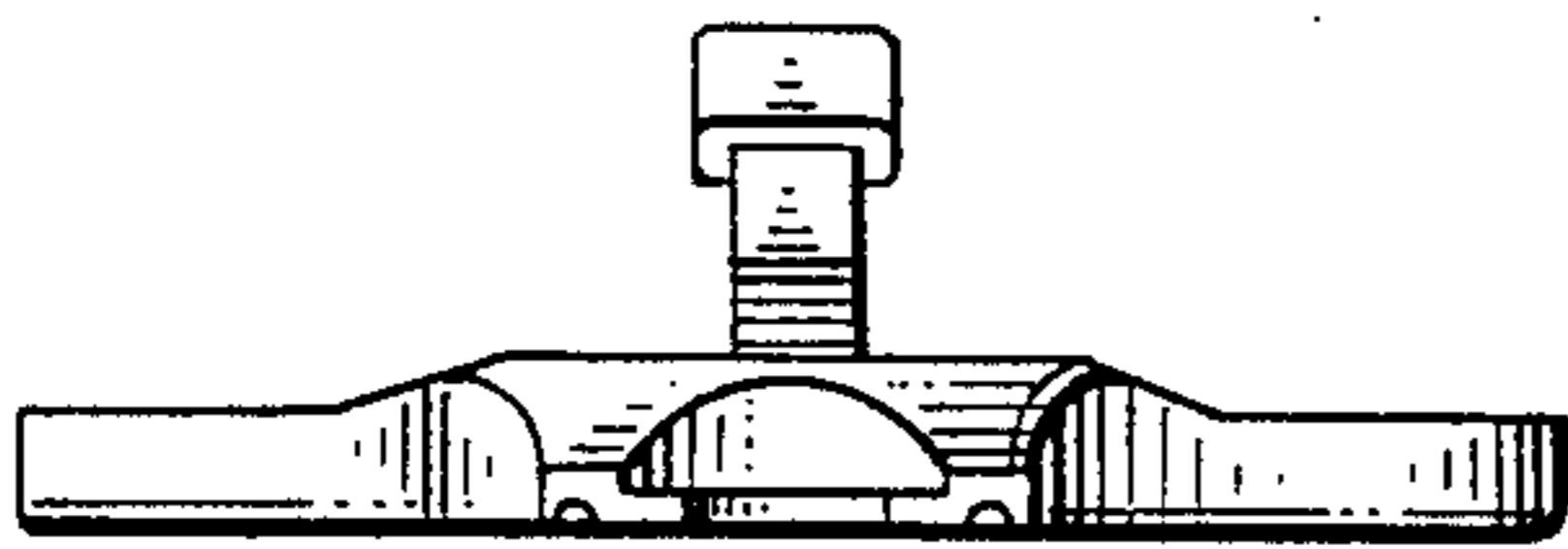

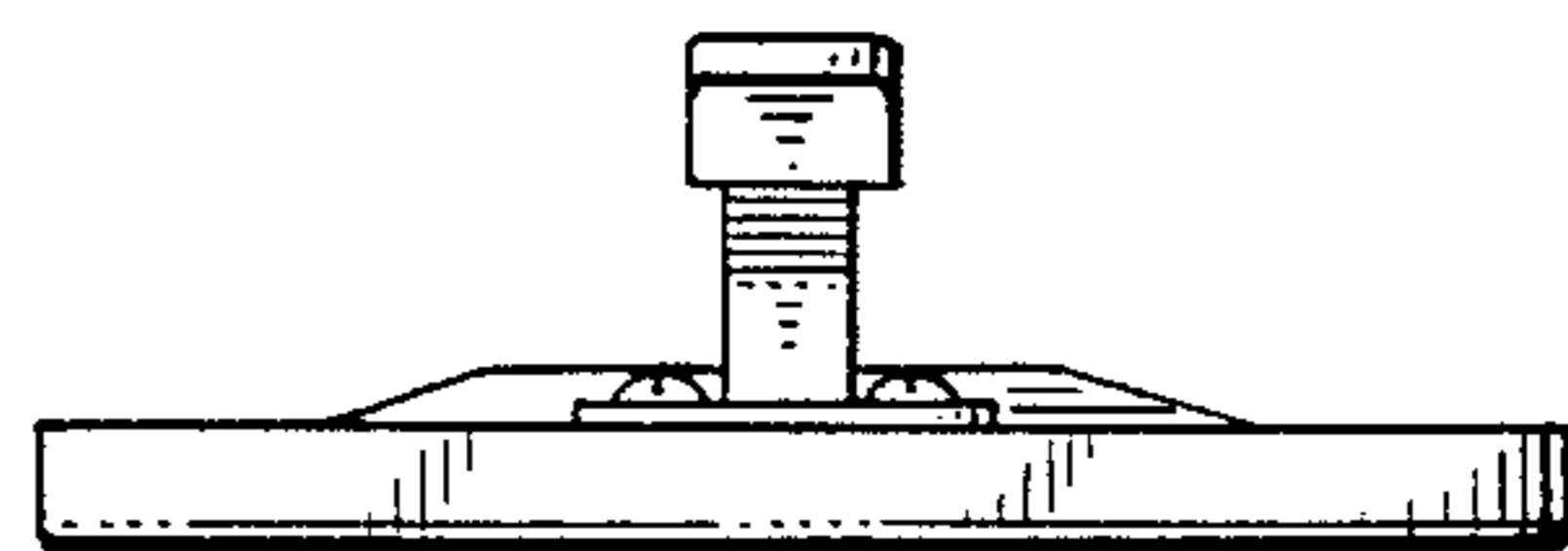
