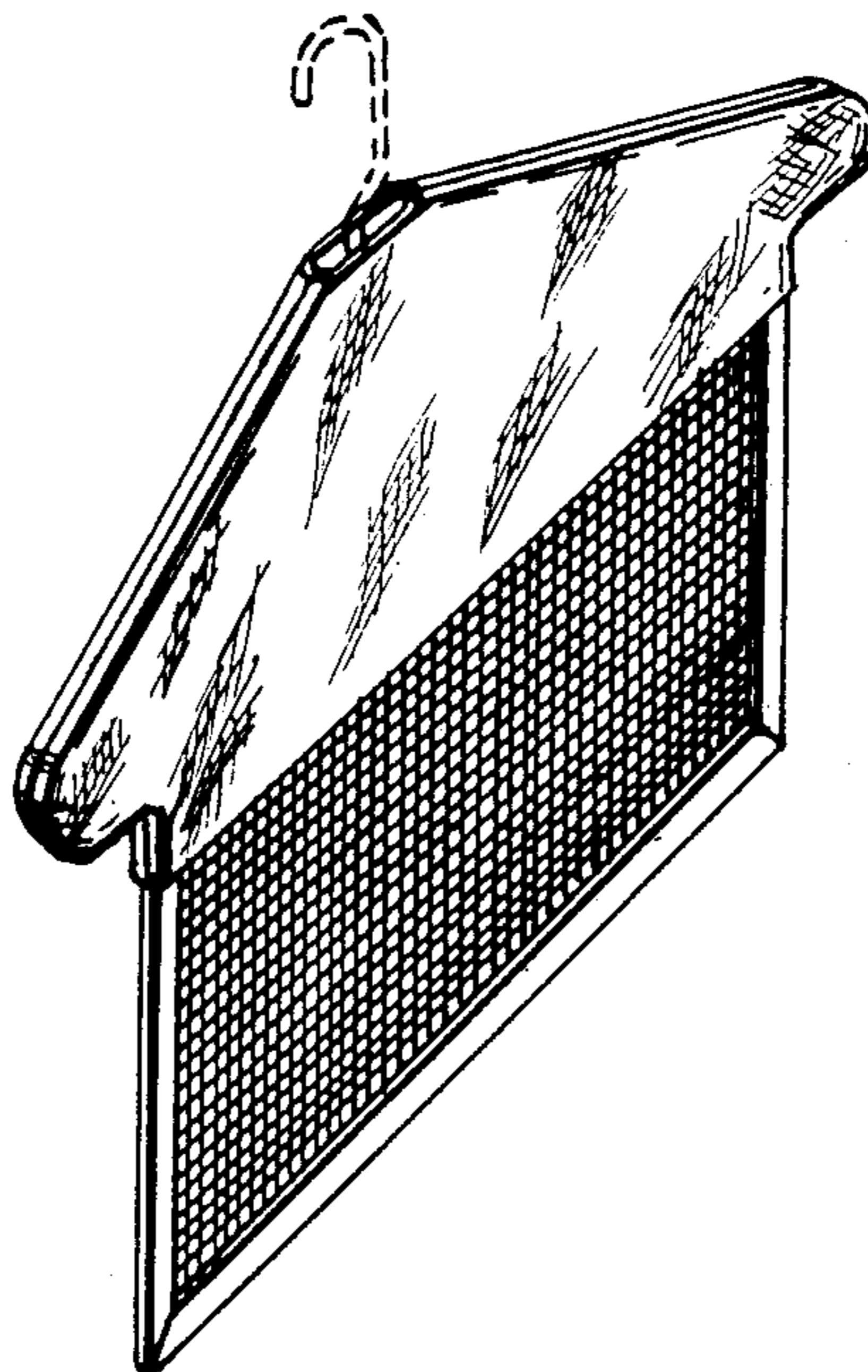

[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a holder for mounting and storing earrings, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a holder for mounting and storing earrings showing my new design; FIG. 2 is a side elevational view on an enlarged scale, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 3 is an end elevational view of the article as shown in FIG. 2, the opposite end being a mirror image thereof; FIG. 4 is an enlarged fragmentary view showing the mesh panel in greater detail; FIG. 5 is a perspective view showing a second embodiment of my holder for mounting and storing earrings; FIG. 6 is a side elevational view on an enlarged scale, the opposite side being a mirror thereof; and FIG. 7 is an end elevational view of the article shown in FIG. 6, the opposite end being a mirror image thereof. The hanger shown by broken lines is of illustrative purposes only.



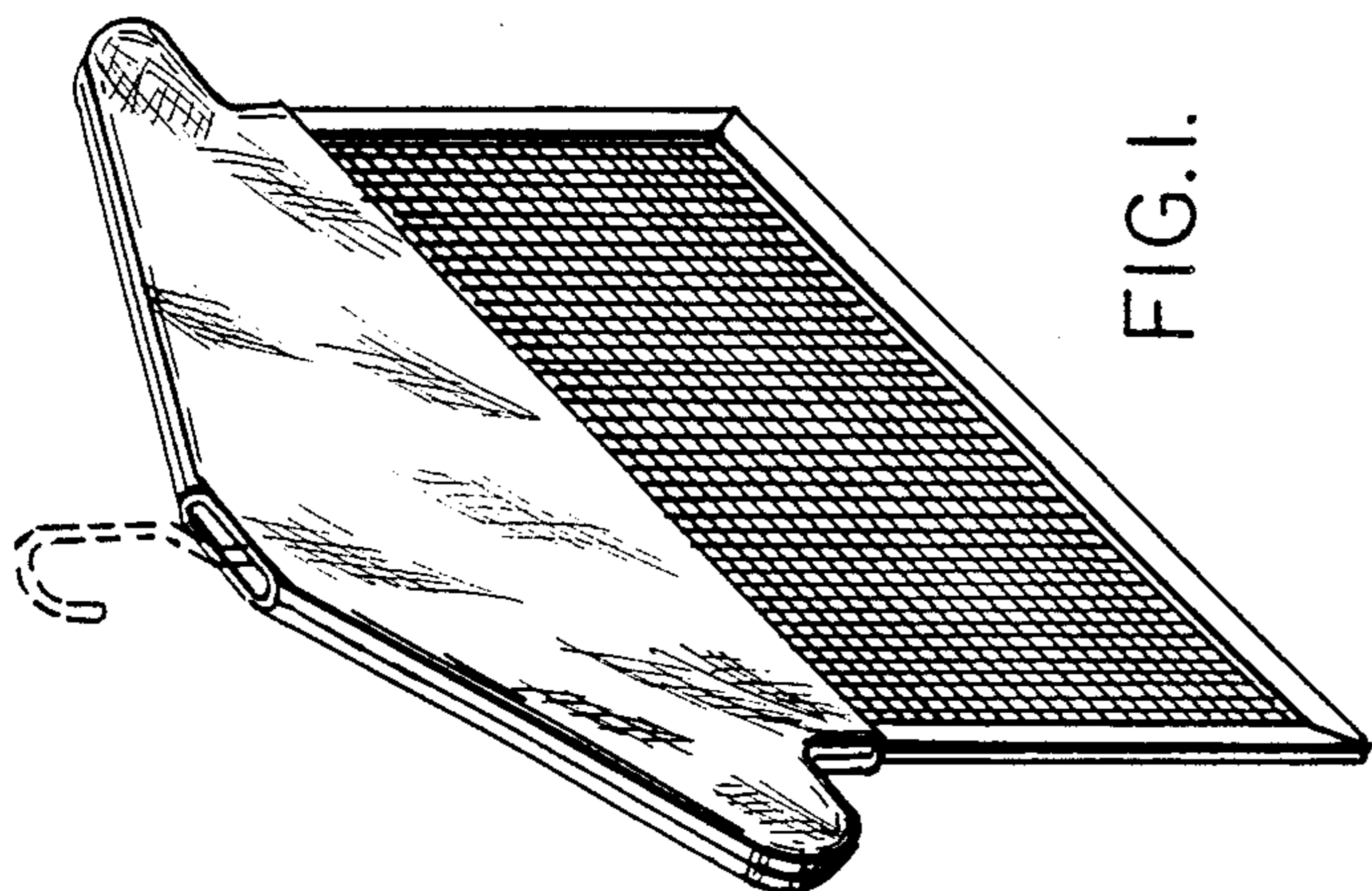

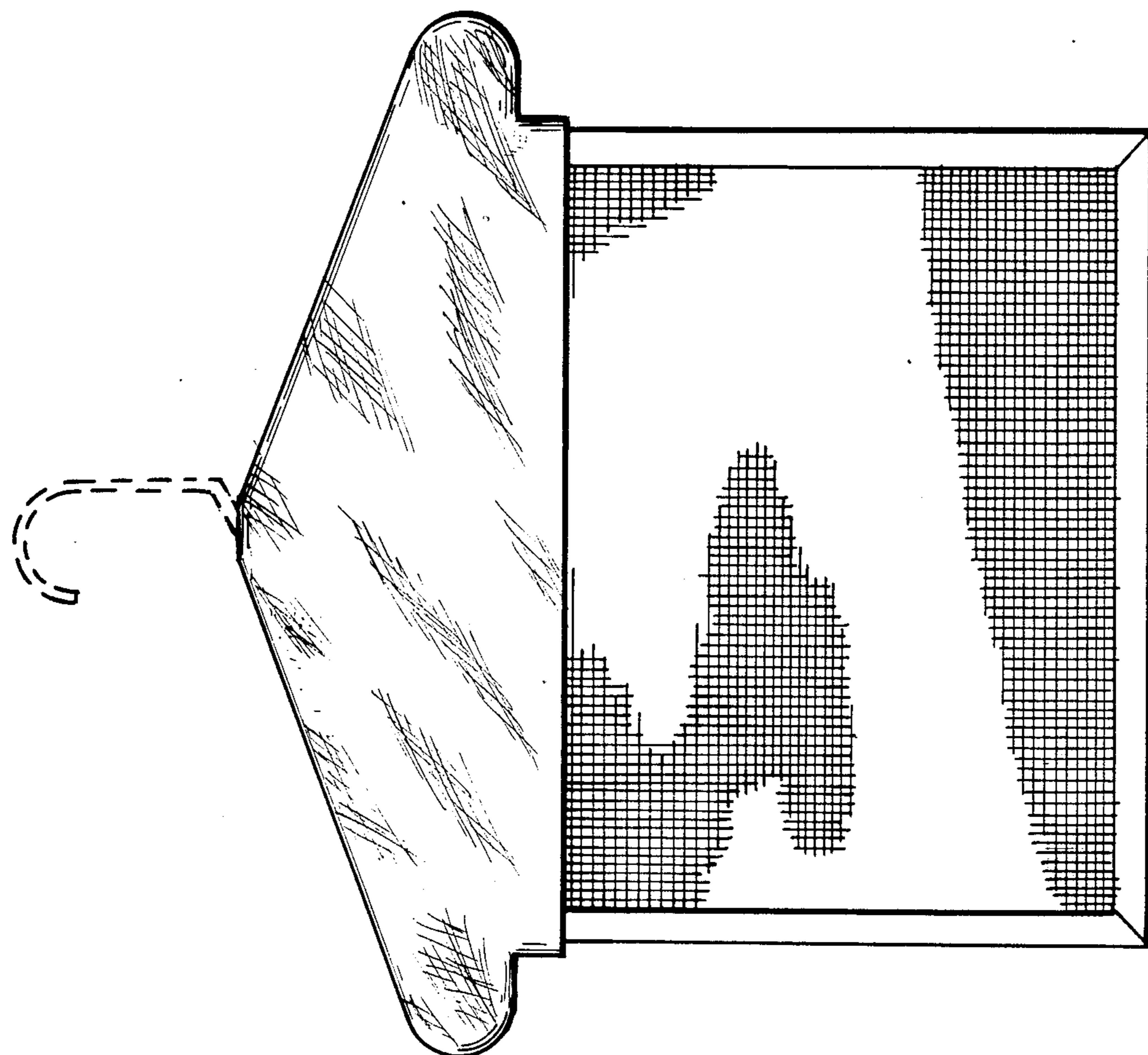

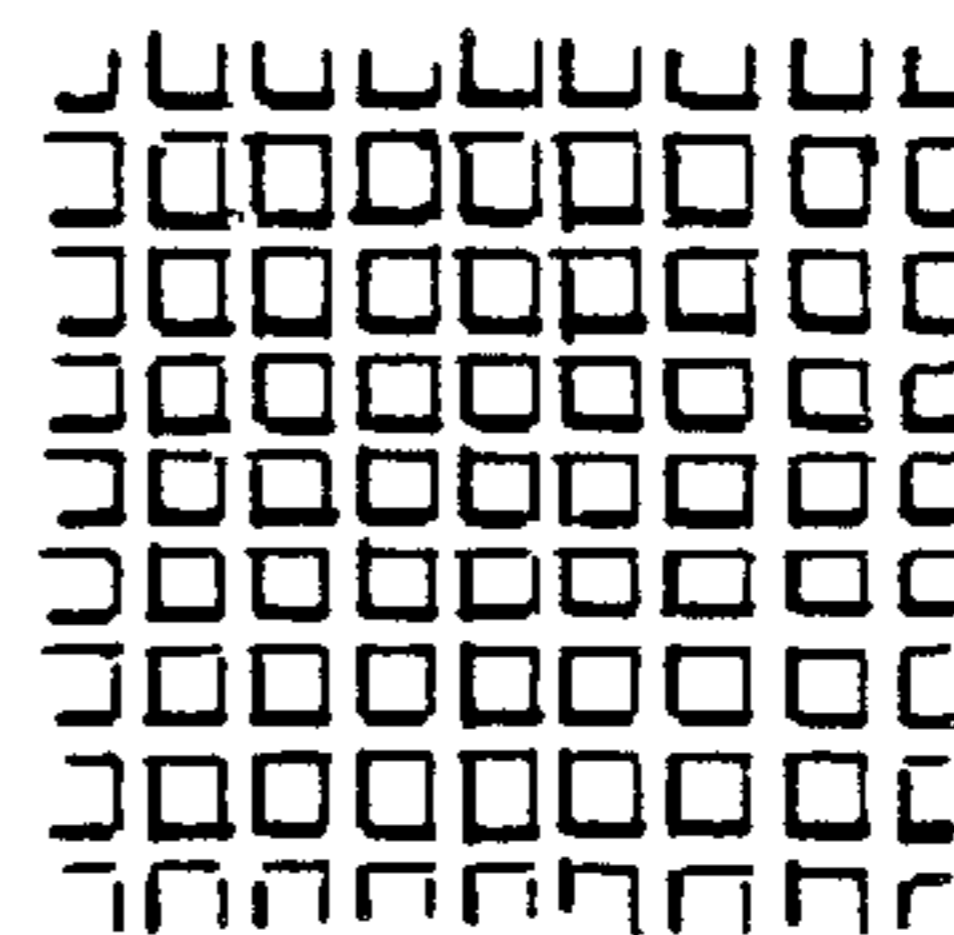

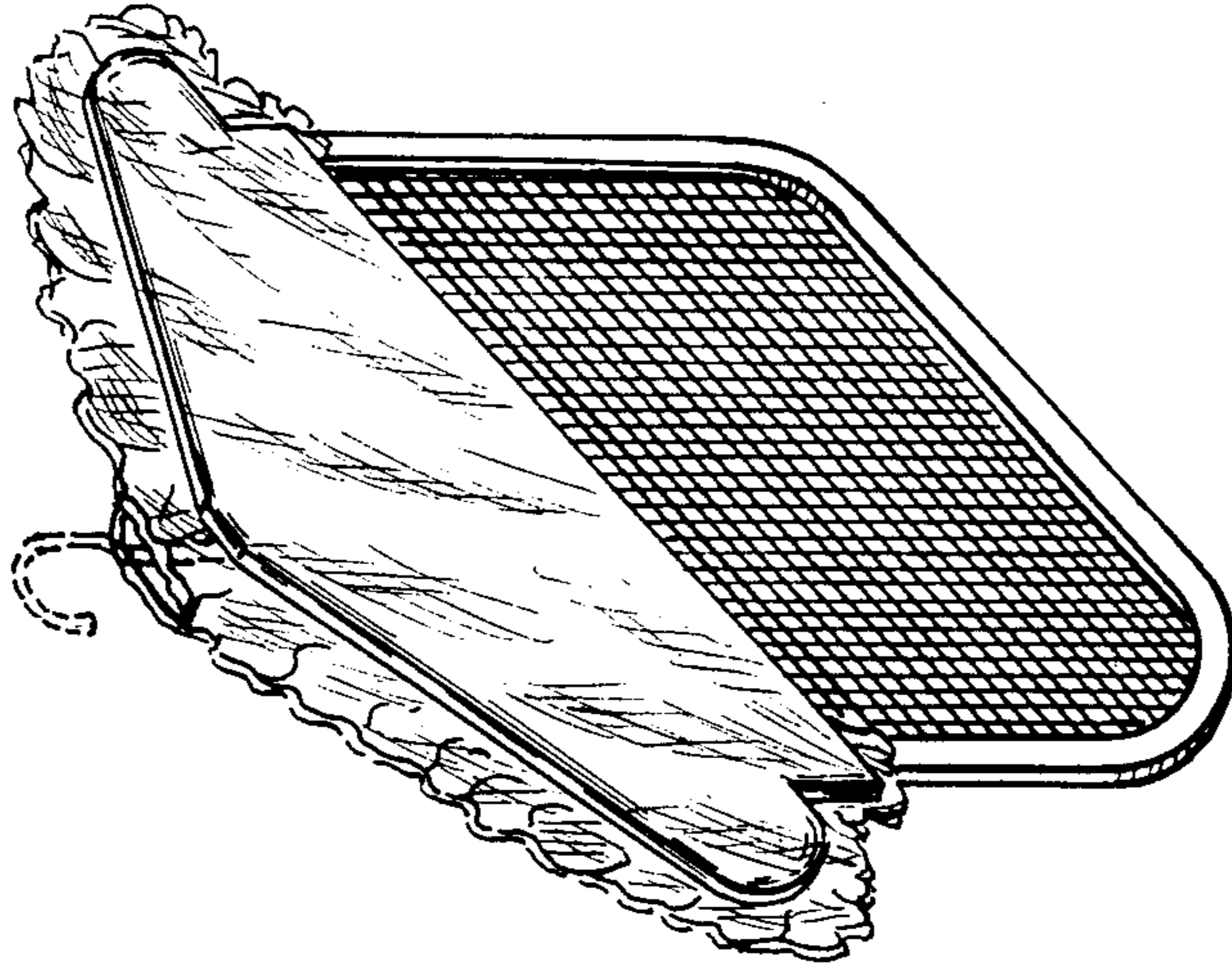

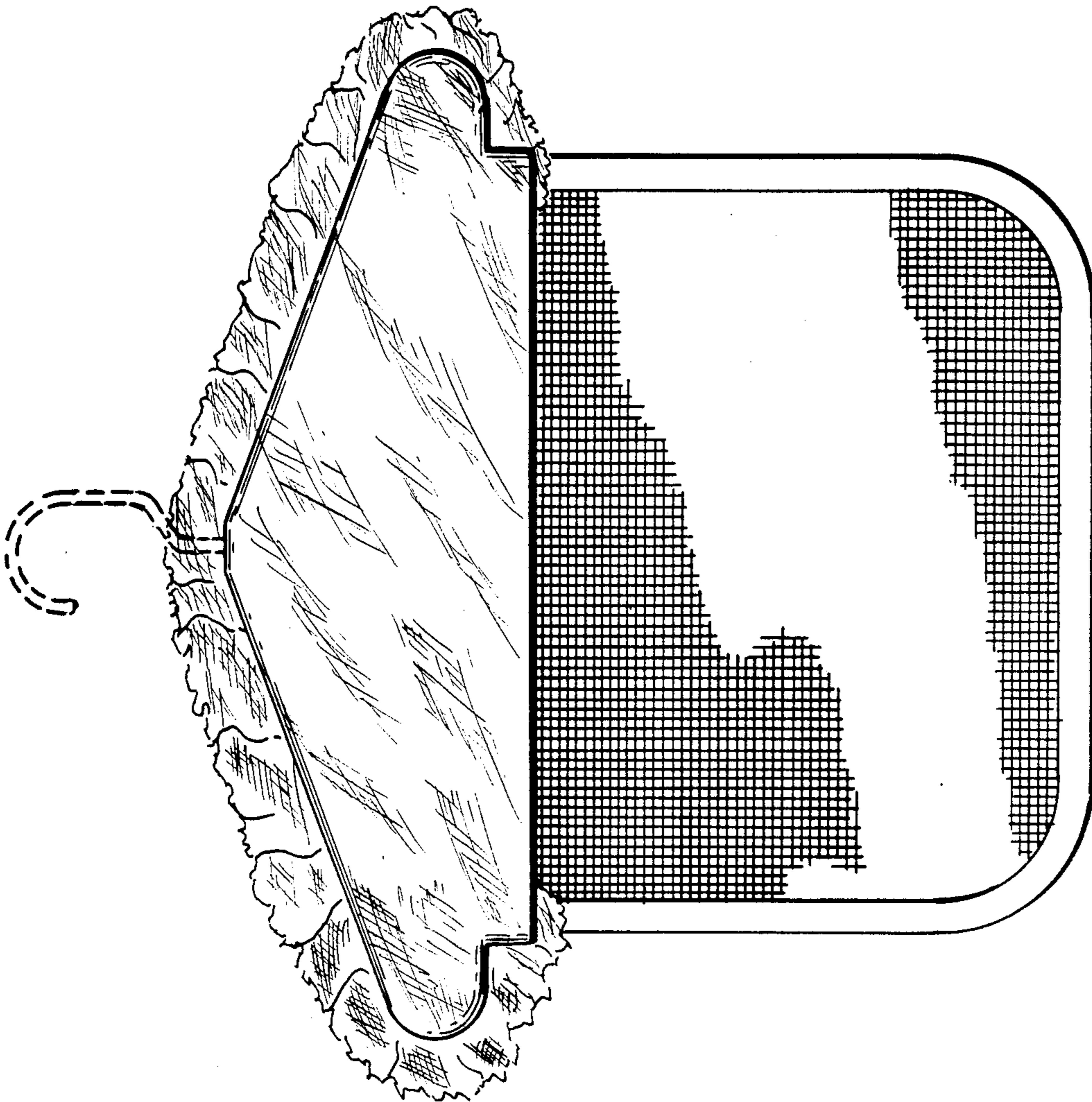
