[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for an eyestay element of a shoe upper, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a second embodiment of my new design, the second embodiment being a mirror image of the first;

FIG. 3 is a section taken on line 3—3 of FIG. 2;

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a third embodiment of my new design;

FIG. 5 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a fourth embodiment of my new design, the fourth embodiment being a mirror image of the third;

FIG. 6 is a section taken on line 6—6 of FIG. 5;

FIG. 7 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a fifth embodiment of my new design;


FIG. 8 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a sixth embodiment of my new design the sixth embodiment being a mirror image of the fifth;


FIG. 9 is a section taken on line 9-9 of FIG. 8;


FIG. 10 is a side elevational view of an eyestay element of a shoe upper showing a seventh embodiment of my new design;




