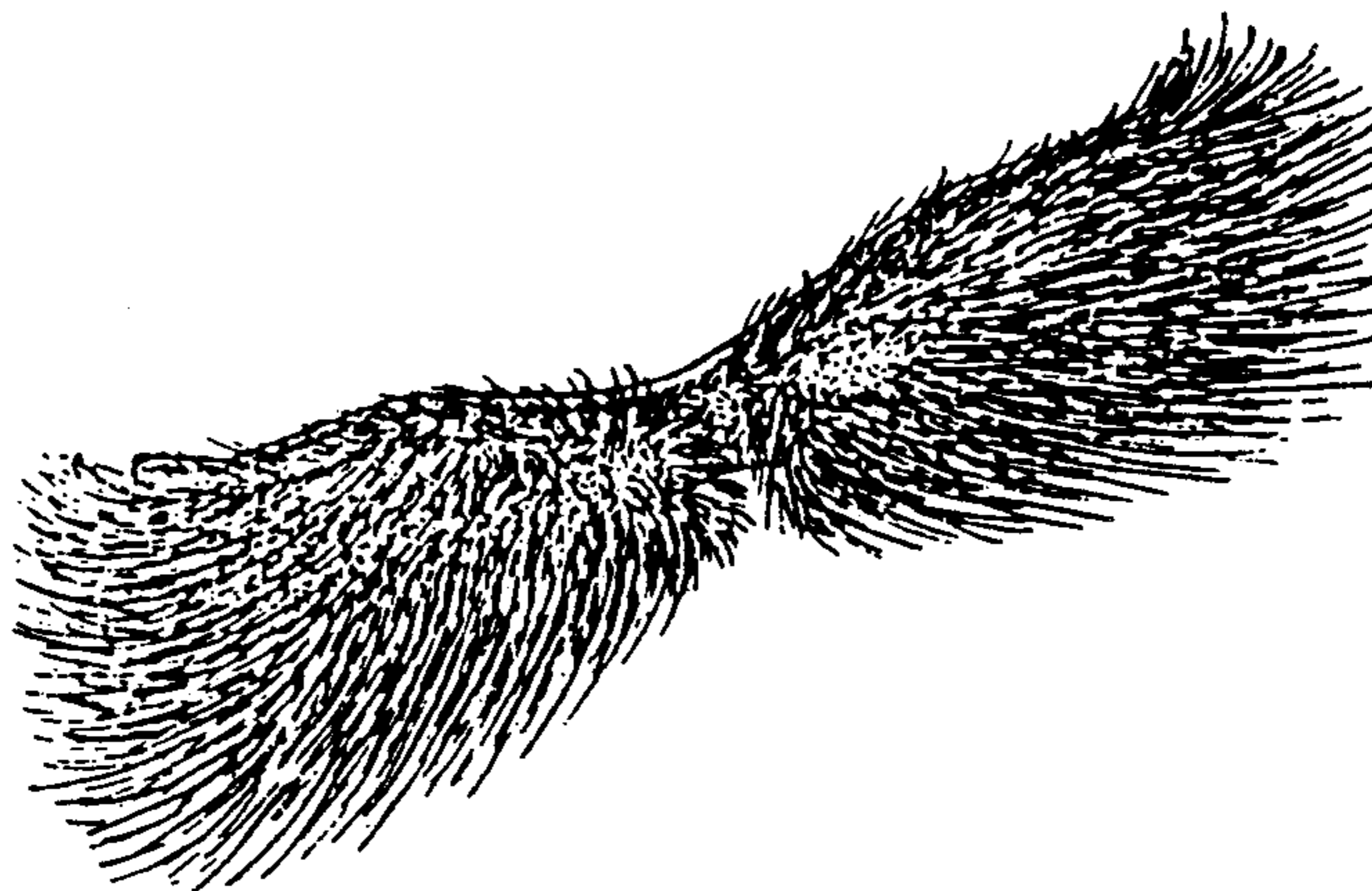

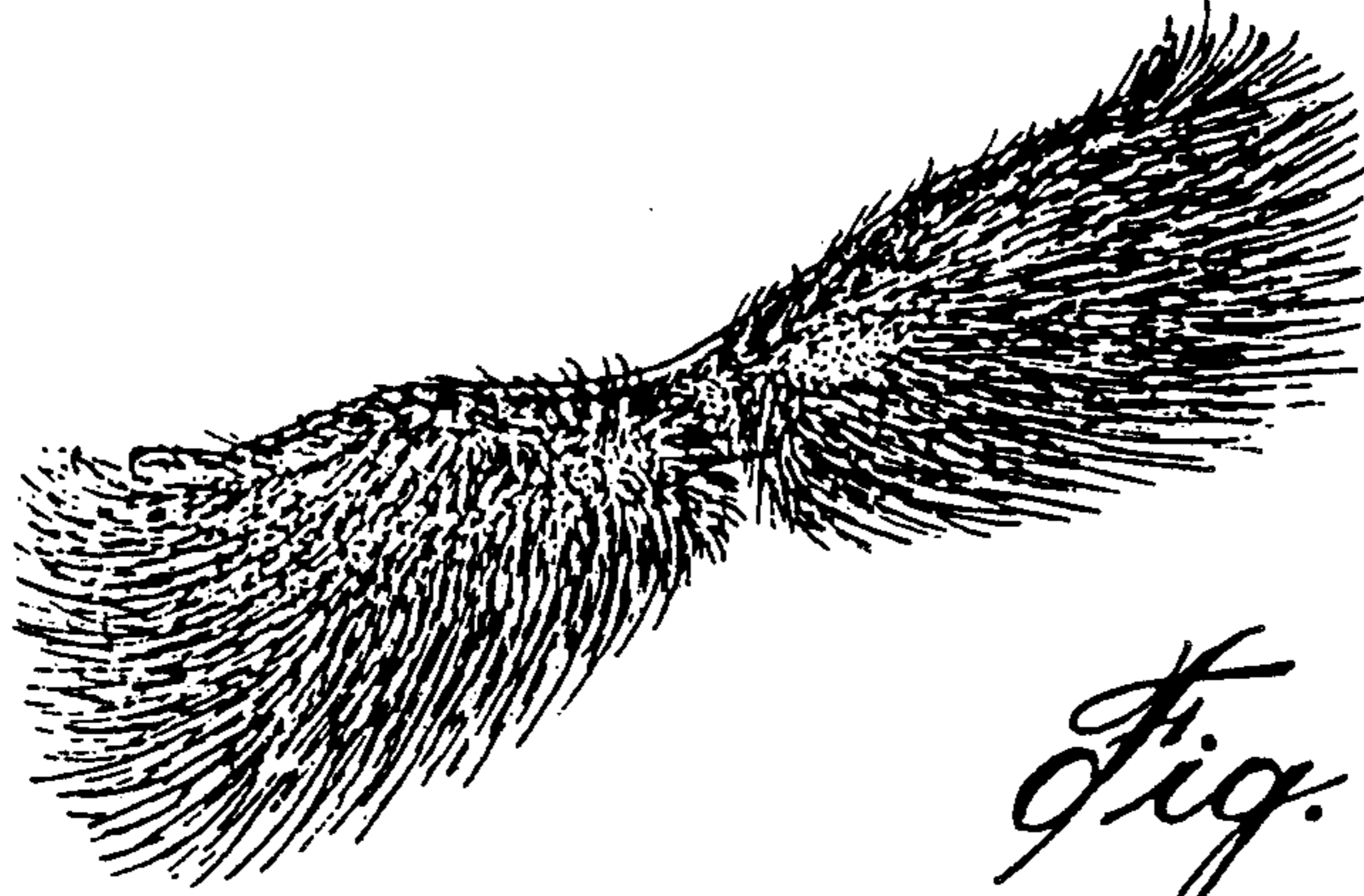
[57] **CLAIM**

An ornamental design for a bow tie, as shown and described.

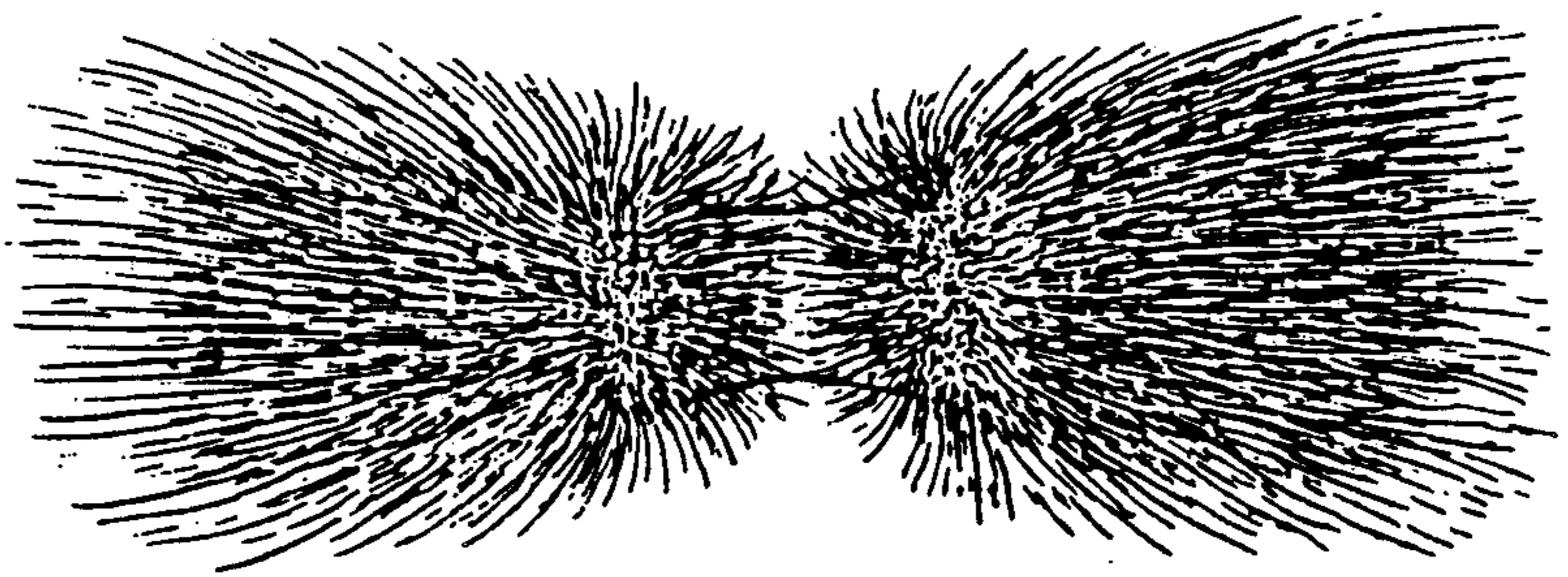
**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 4 is an end elevational view thereof.

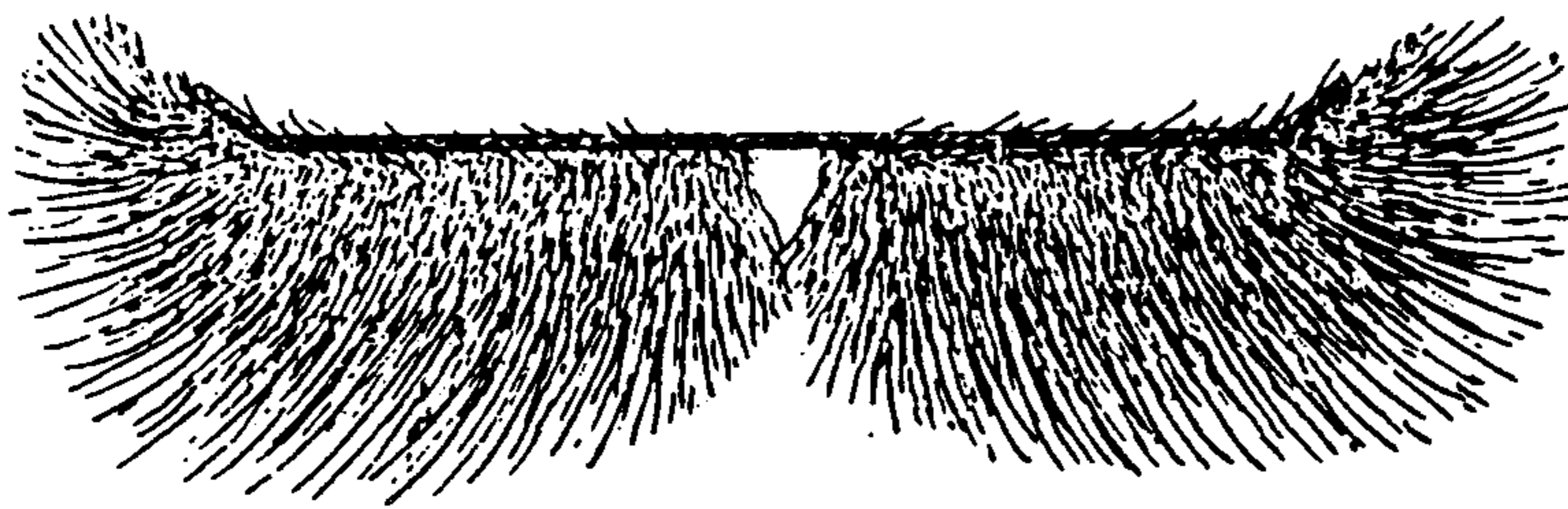




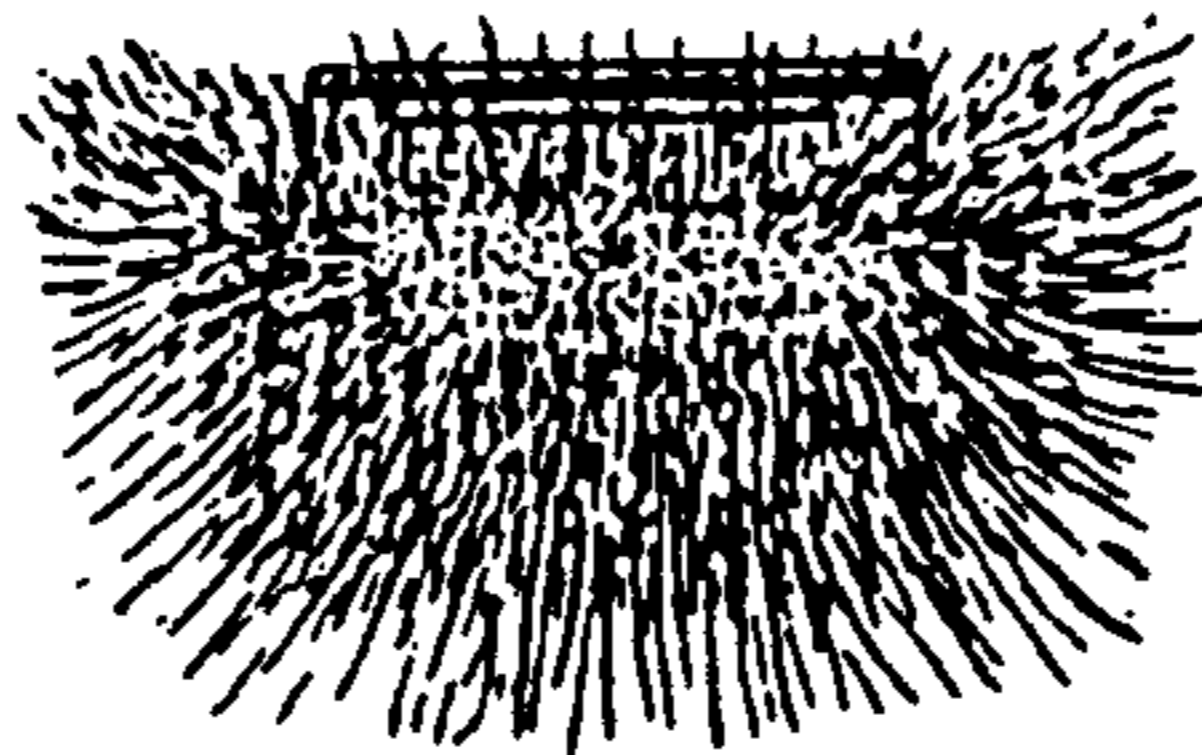
