The ornamental design for an all-weather covering for cable television equipment, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top perspective view of an all-weather covering for cable television equipment showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view thereof, the opposite side elevational view being a mirror image;

FIG. 3 is an end elevational view thereof, the opposite end elevational view being a mirror image;

FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof.

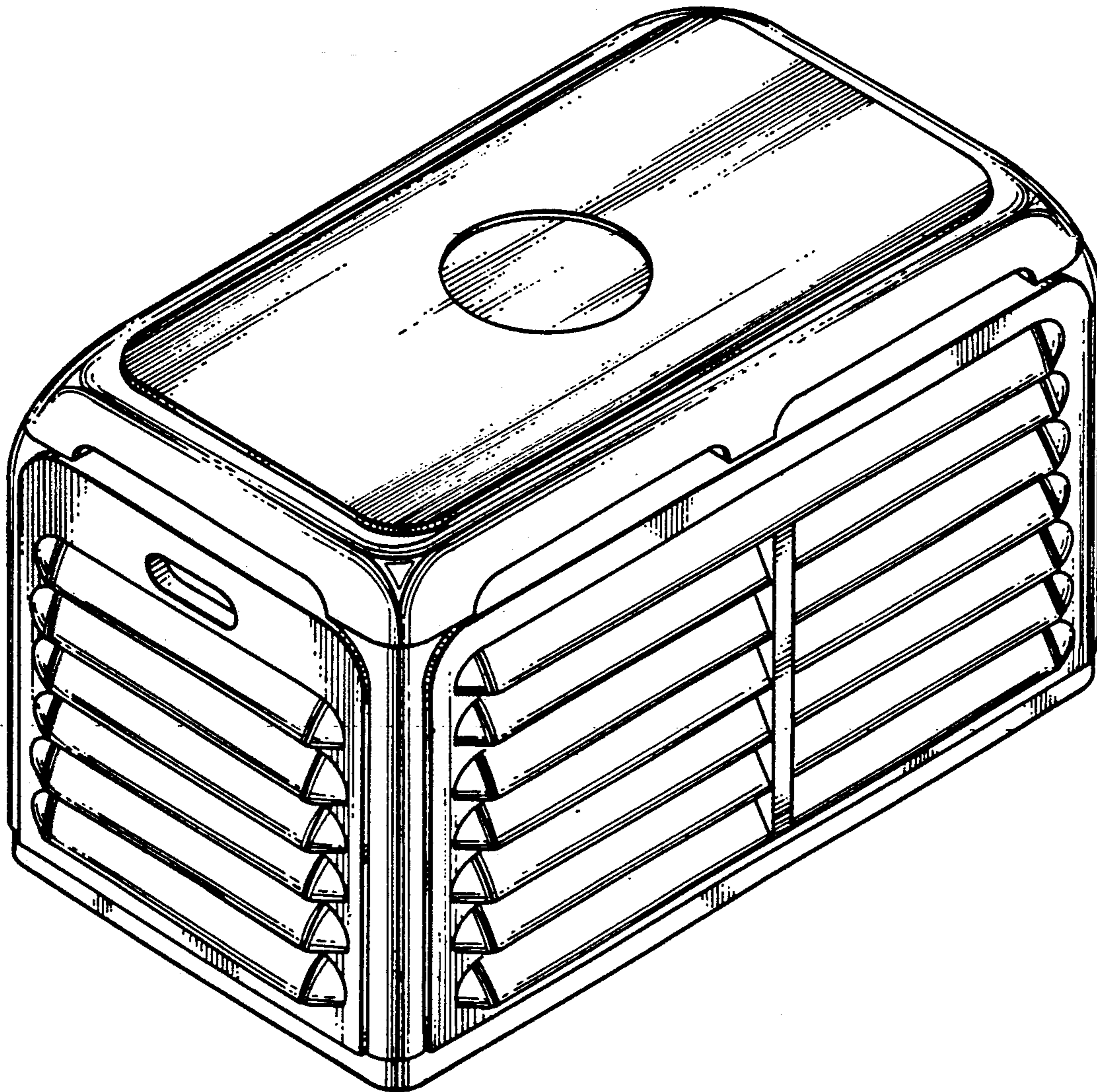

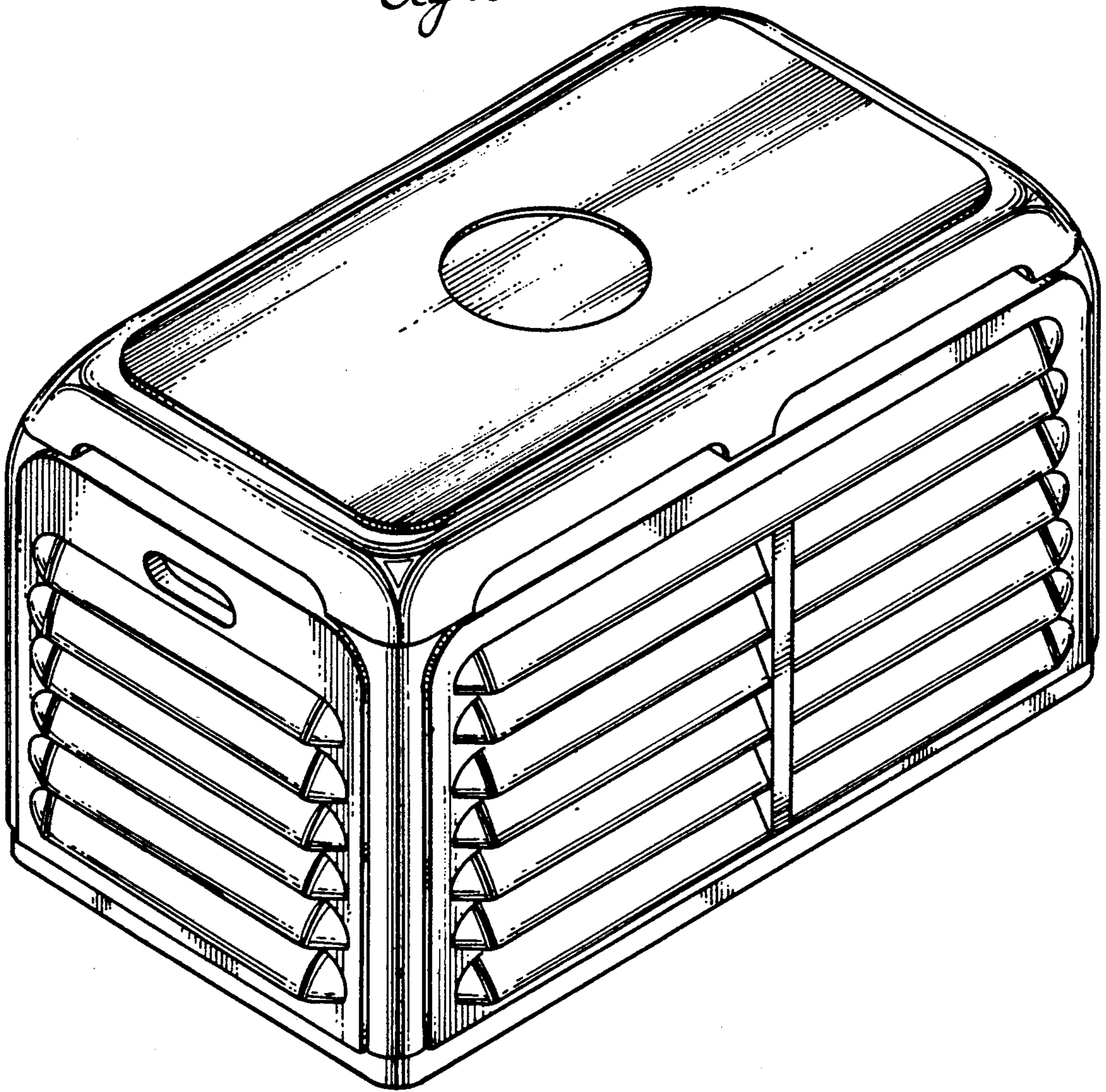

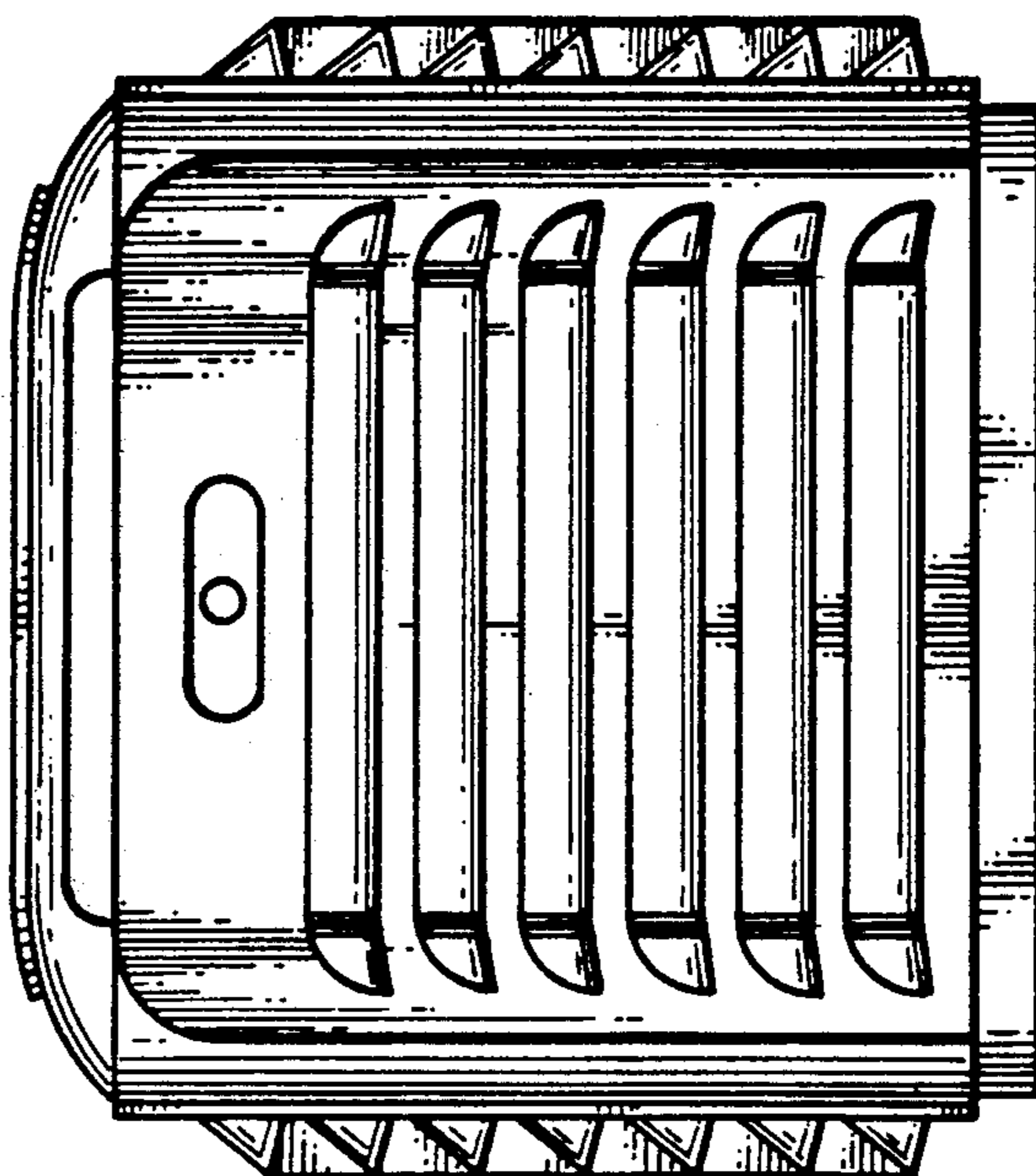

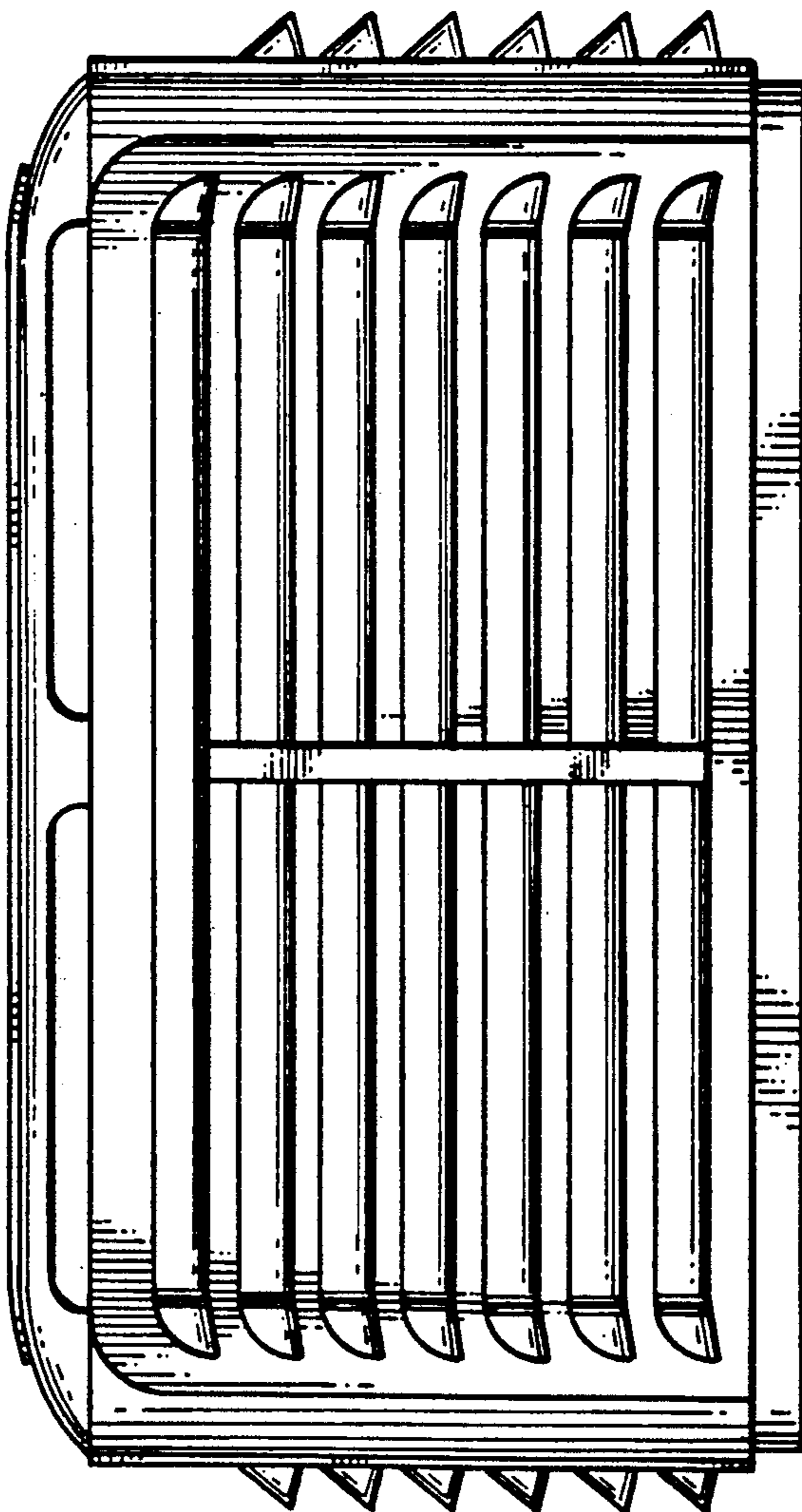
