[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a goblet, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a goblet showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a sectional view thereof on an enlarged scale taken on line 4—4 of FIG. 2 in the direction of the arrows with the base of the goblet having been omitted for convenience of illustration.

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view of an alternate embodiment of a goblet showing my new design; and,

FIG. 6 is a front elevational view of a further alternate embodiment of a goblet showing my new design;

The rear elevational view opposite that disclosed in FIG. 1 and the left side elevational view opposite that disclosed in FIG. 2 are respectively identical to those views shown. The base of the stem visible through the bottom of the goblet is identical to the top of the stem shown in FIG. 3.

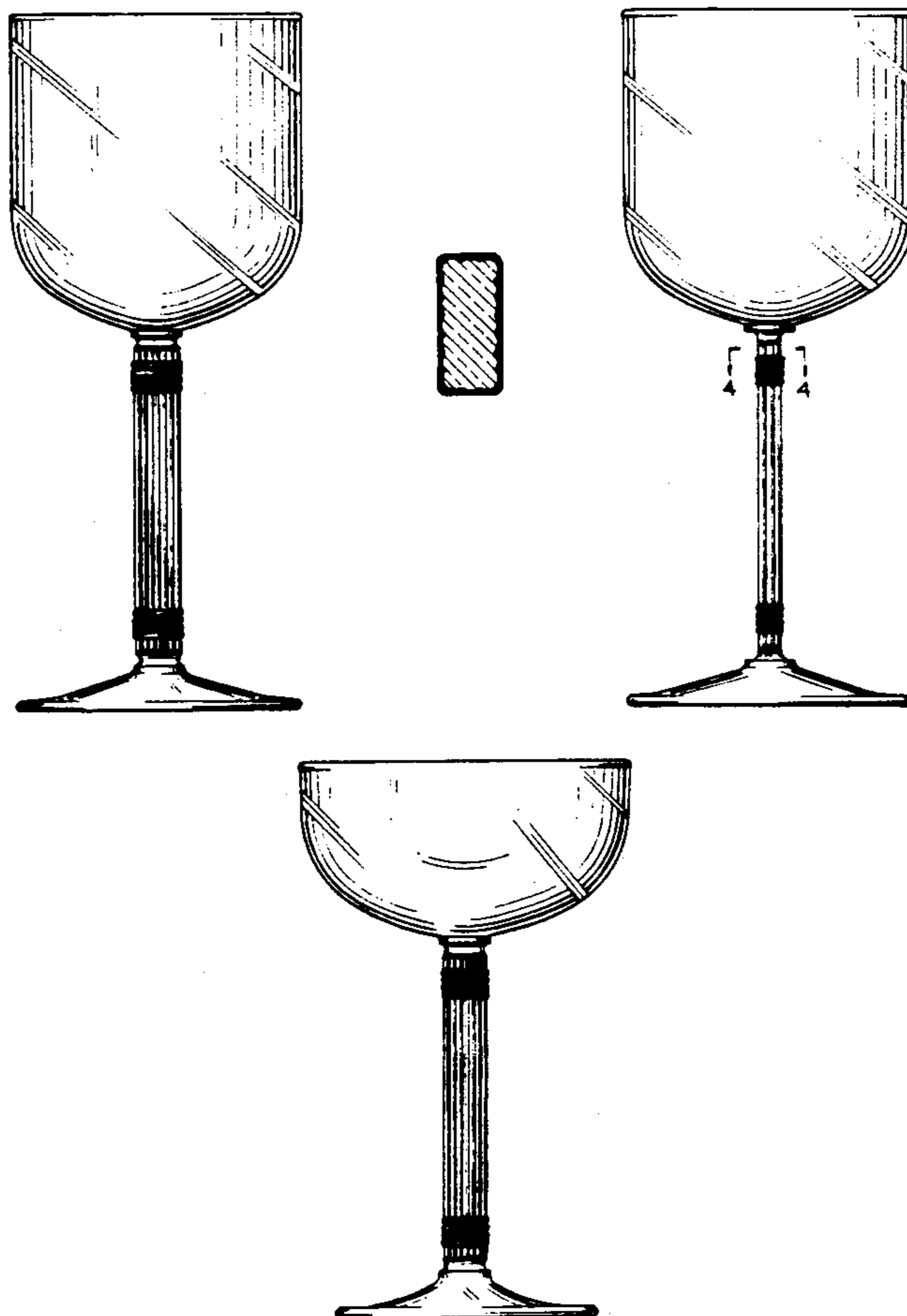

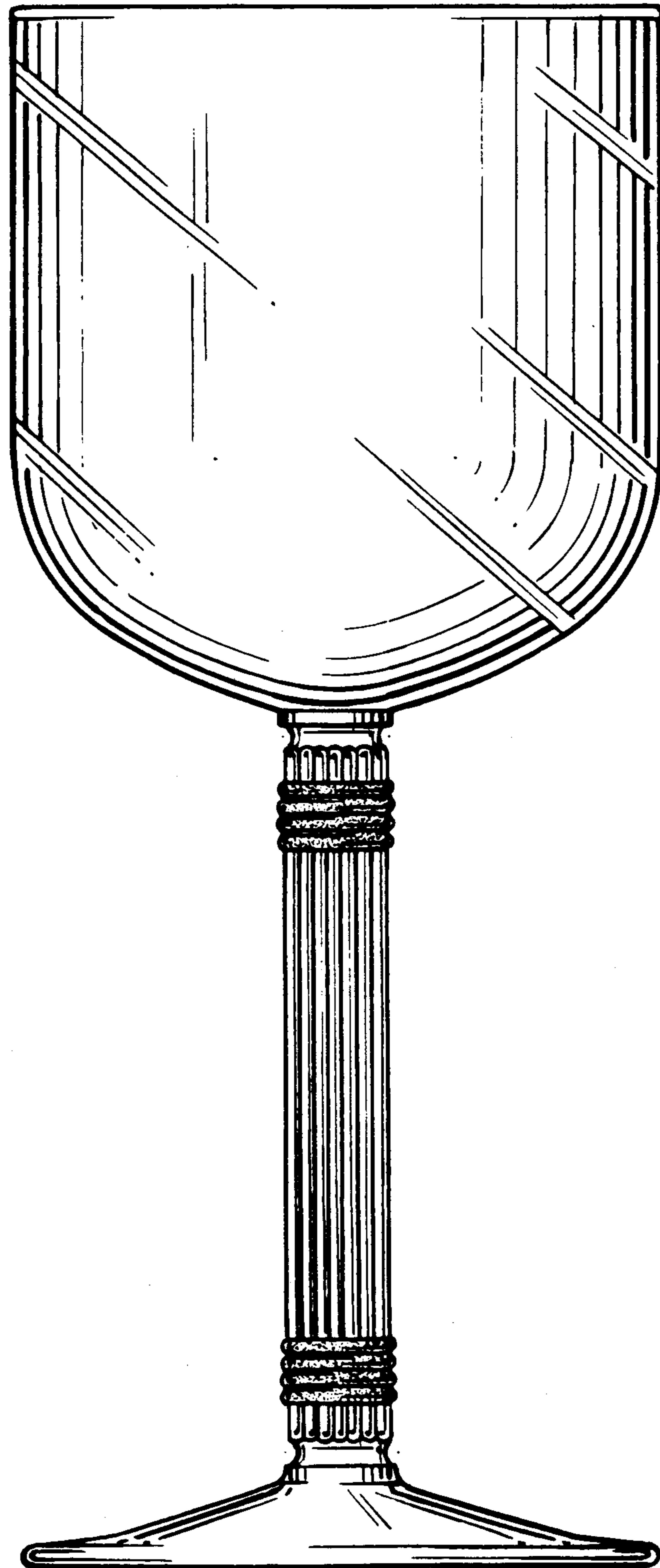

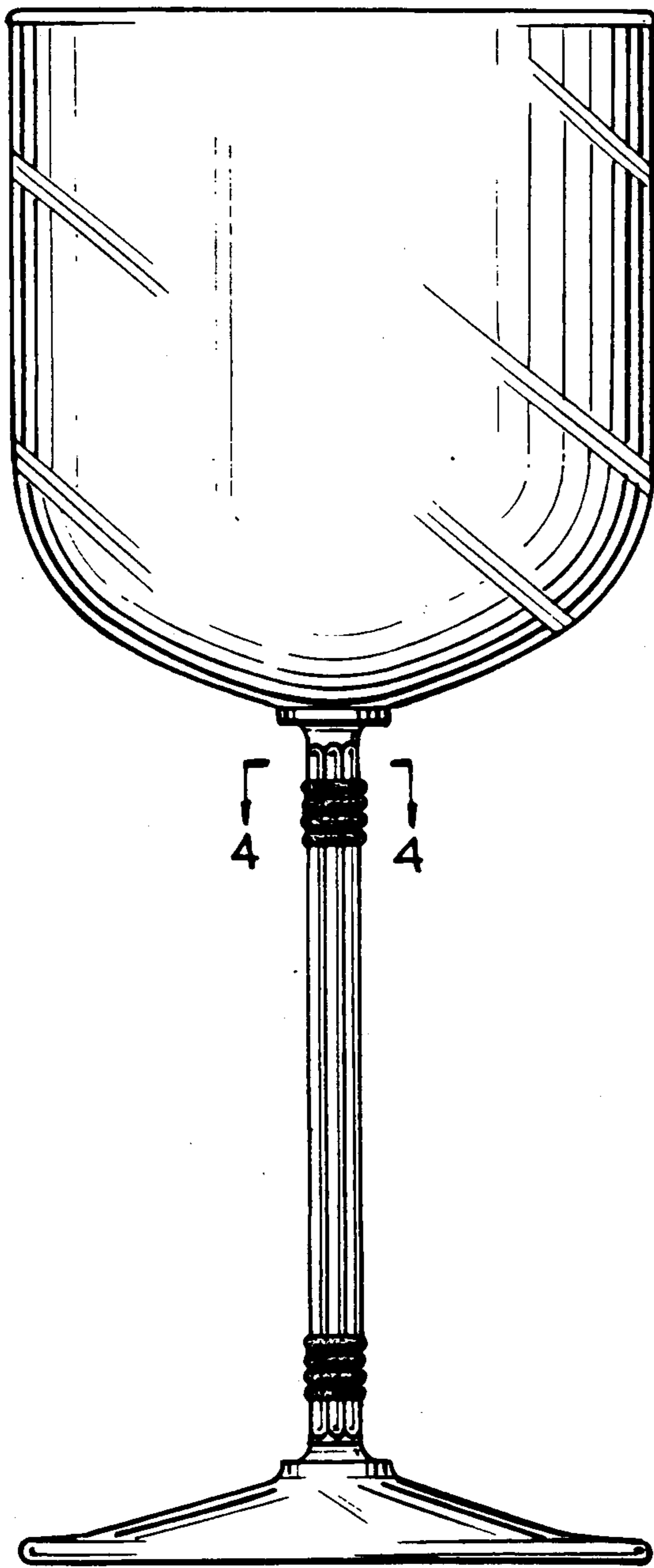

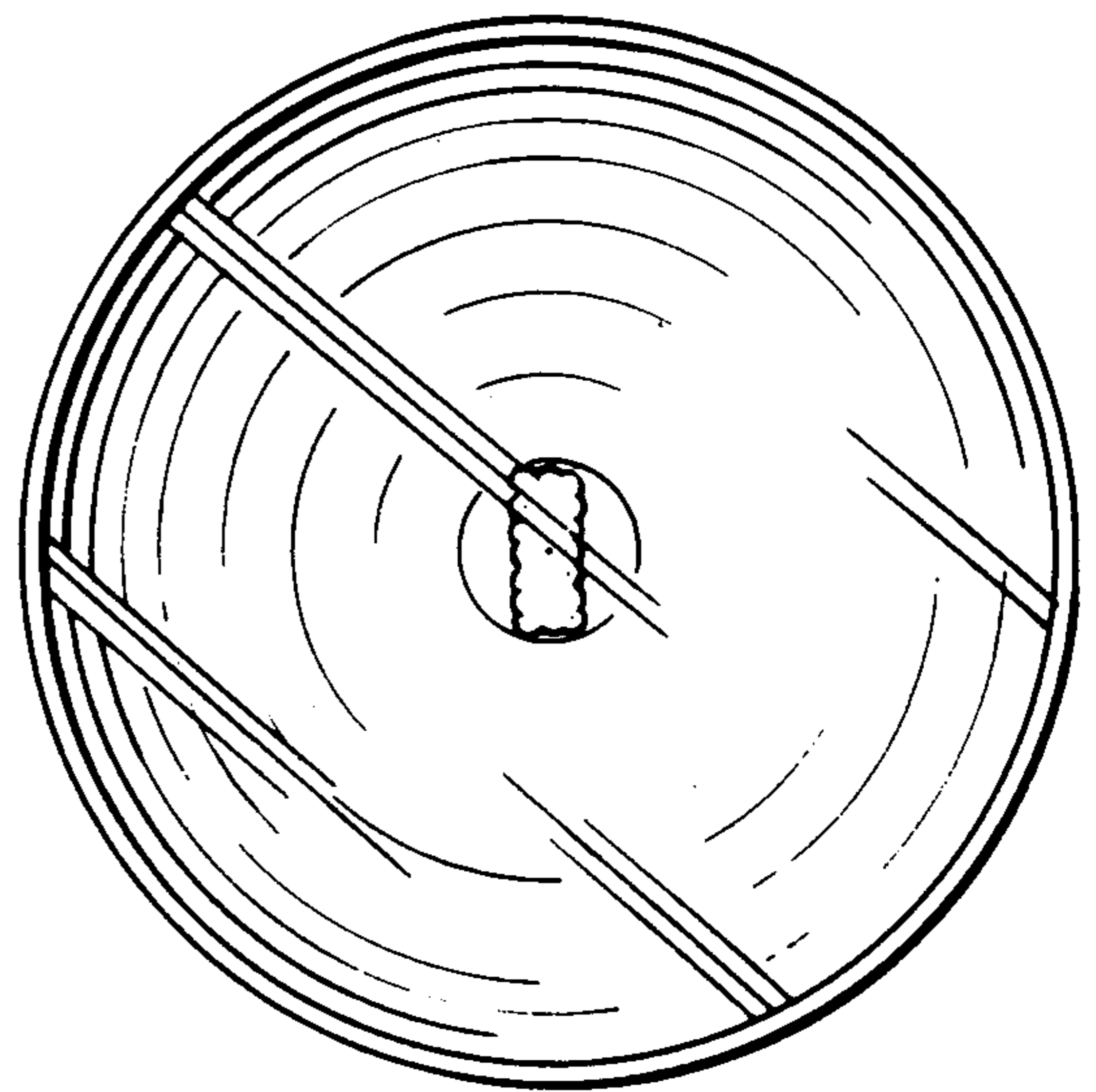

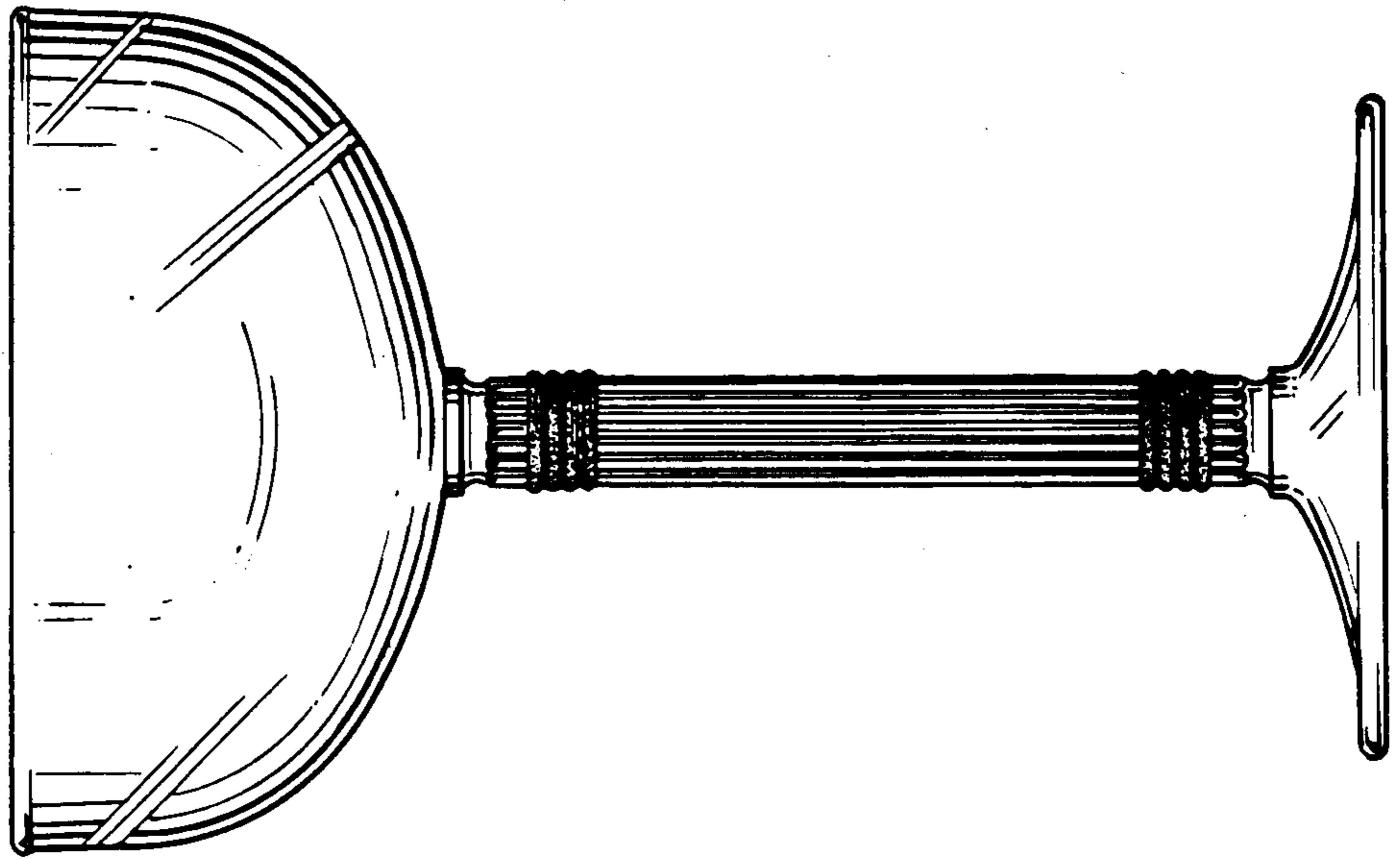
