[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a programmable hairsetter or similar article, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a programmable hair setter showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 7 is a top plan view shown in an open position;

FIG. 8 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 9 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 10 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 11 is a bottom plan view thereof; and

FIG. 12 is a rear elevational view thereof.

The broken line showing of hair rollers in FIGS. 3 and 8 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.

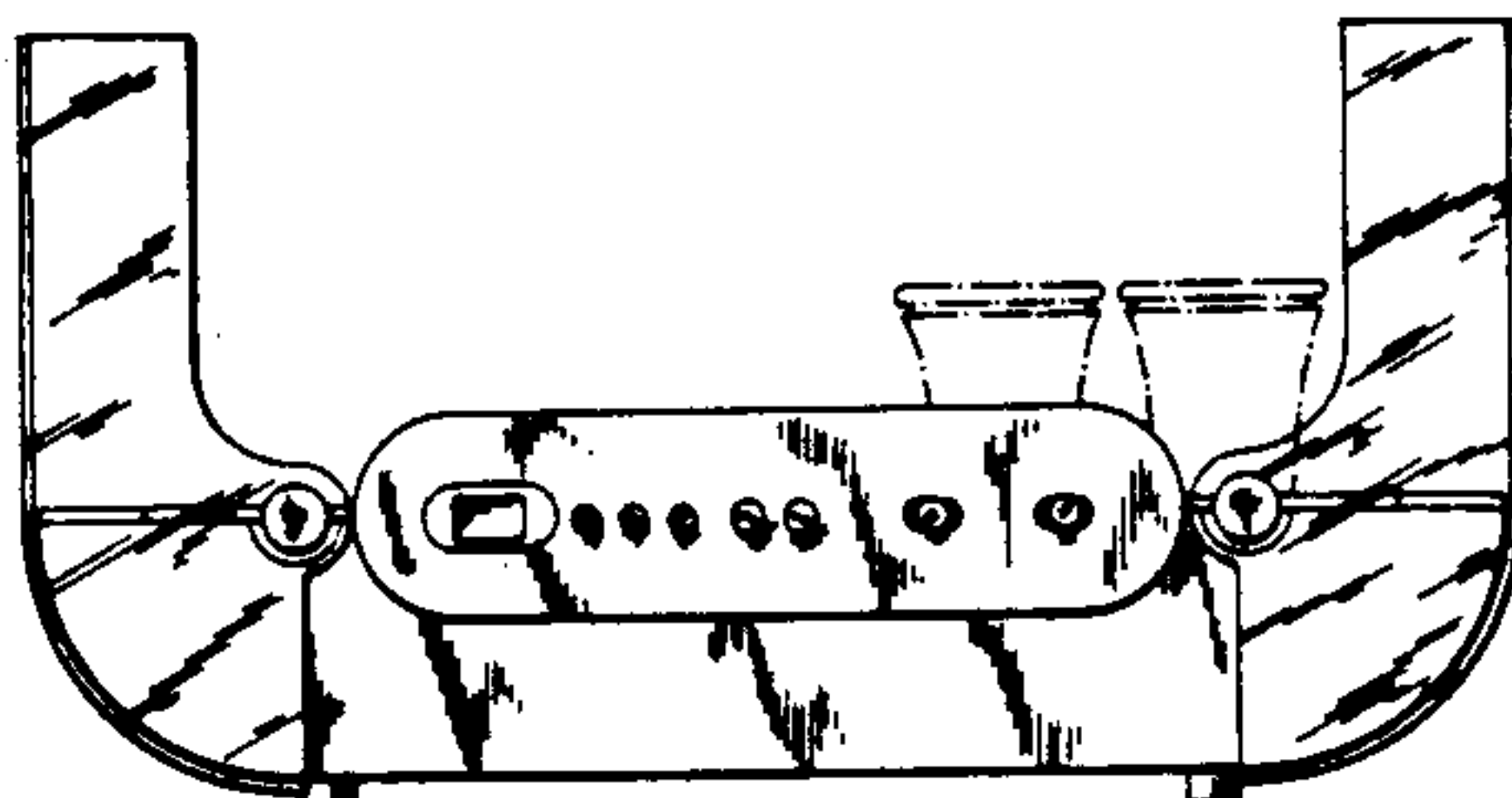
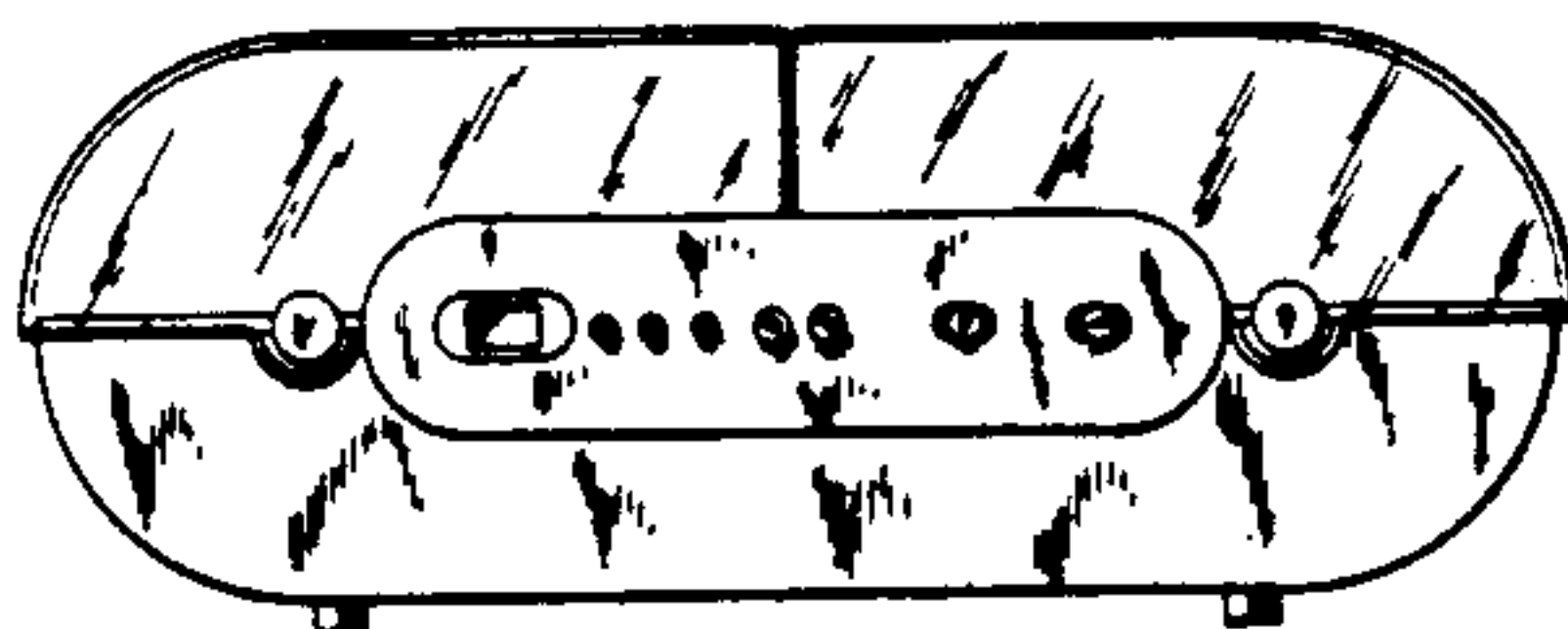
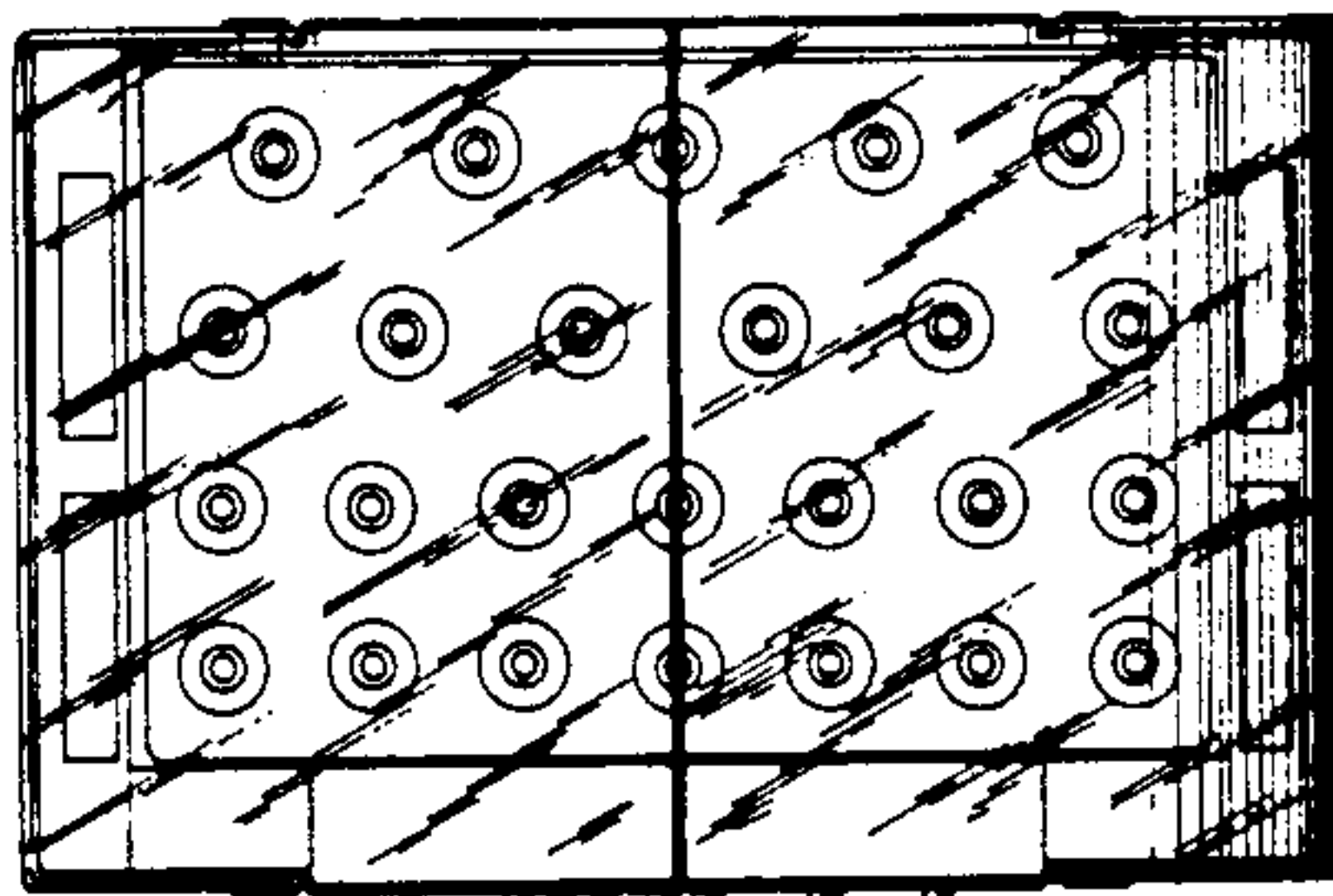

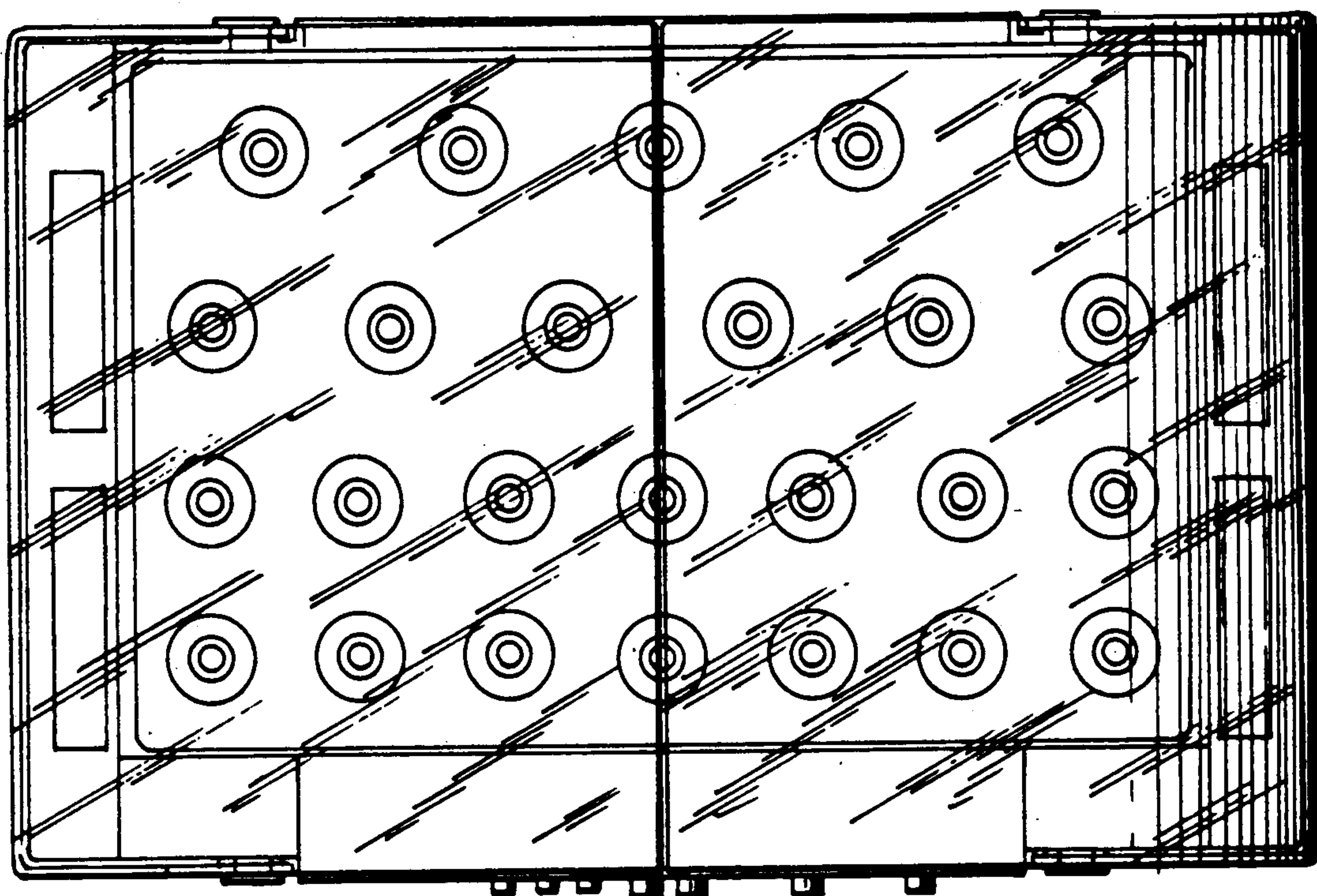

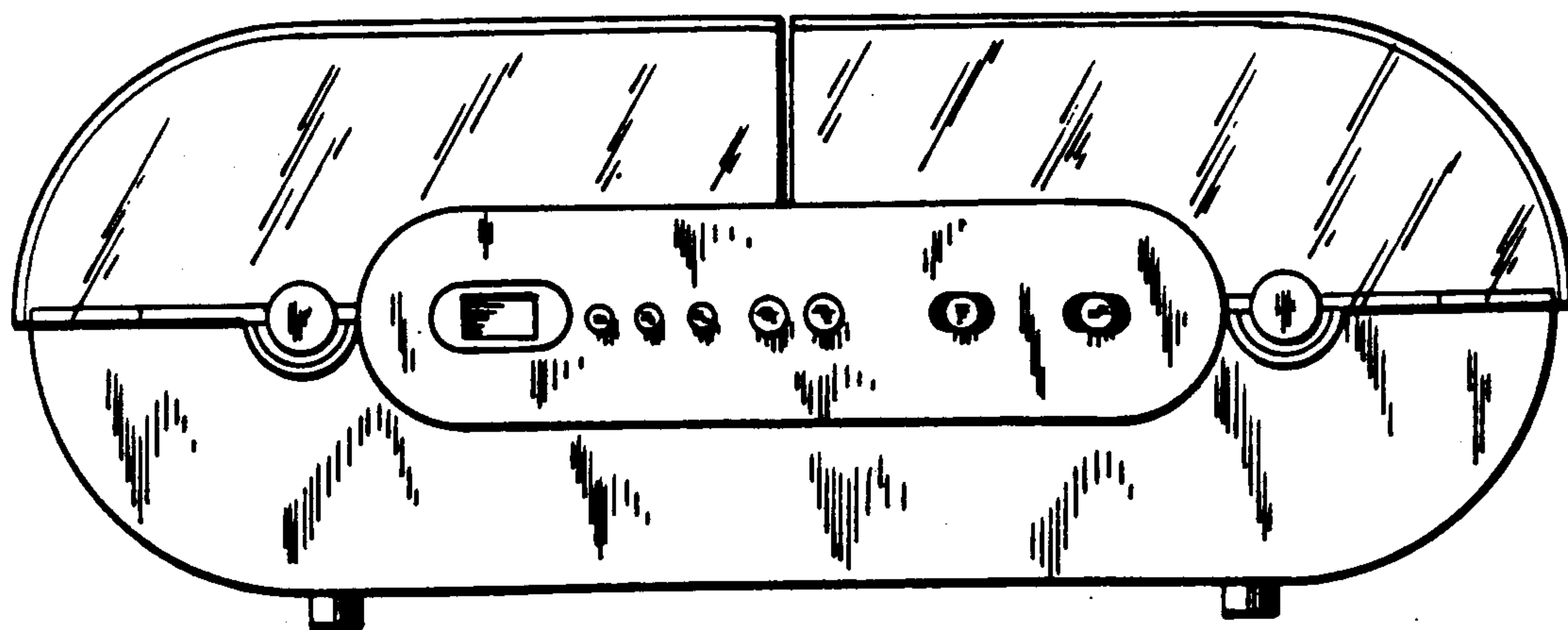

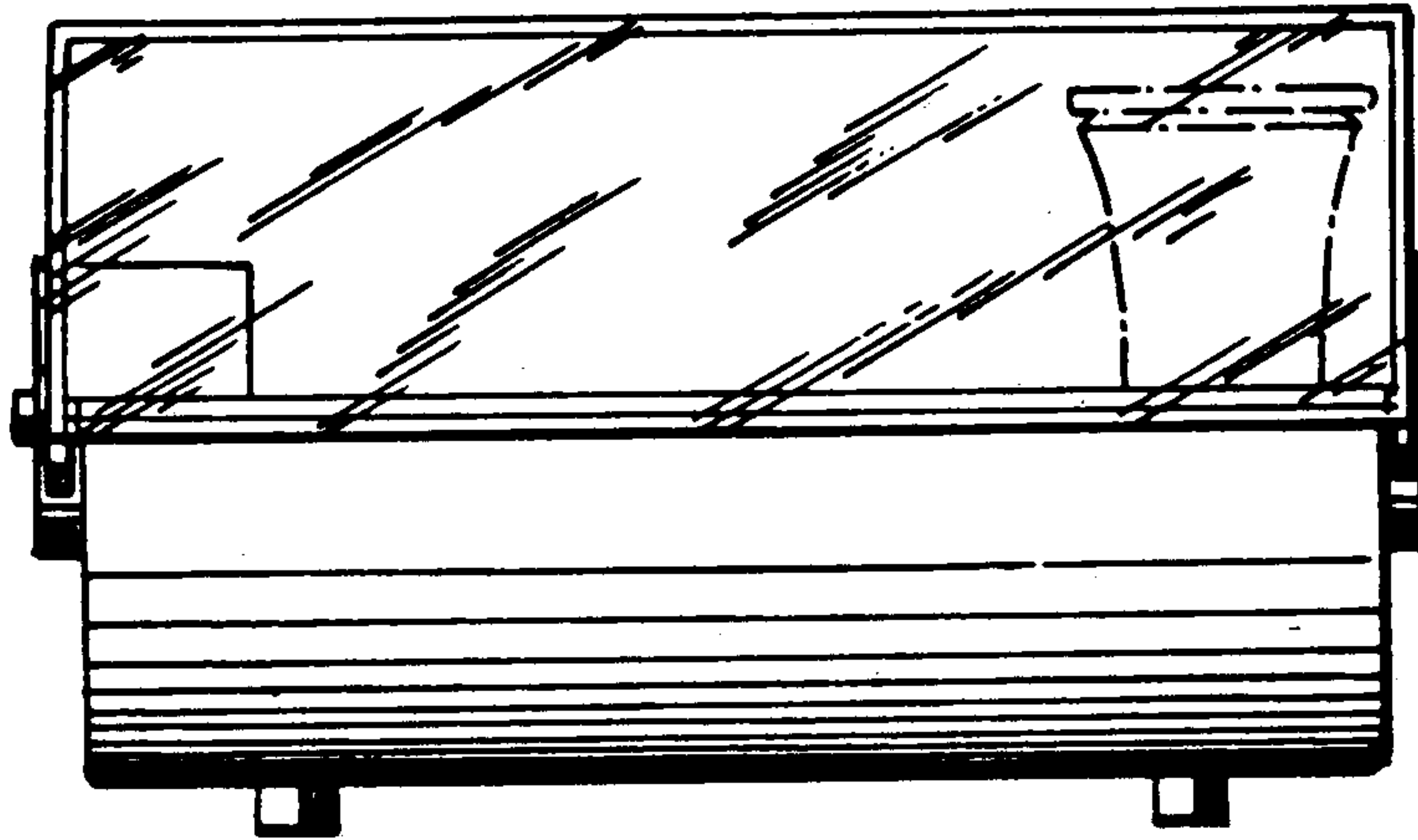

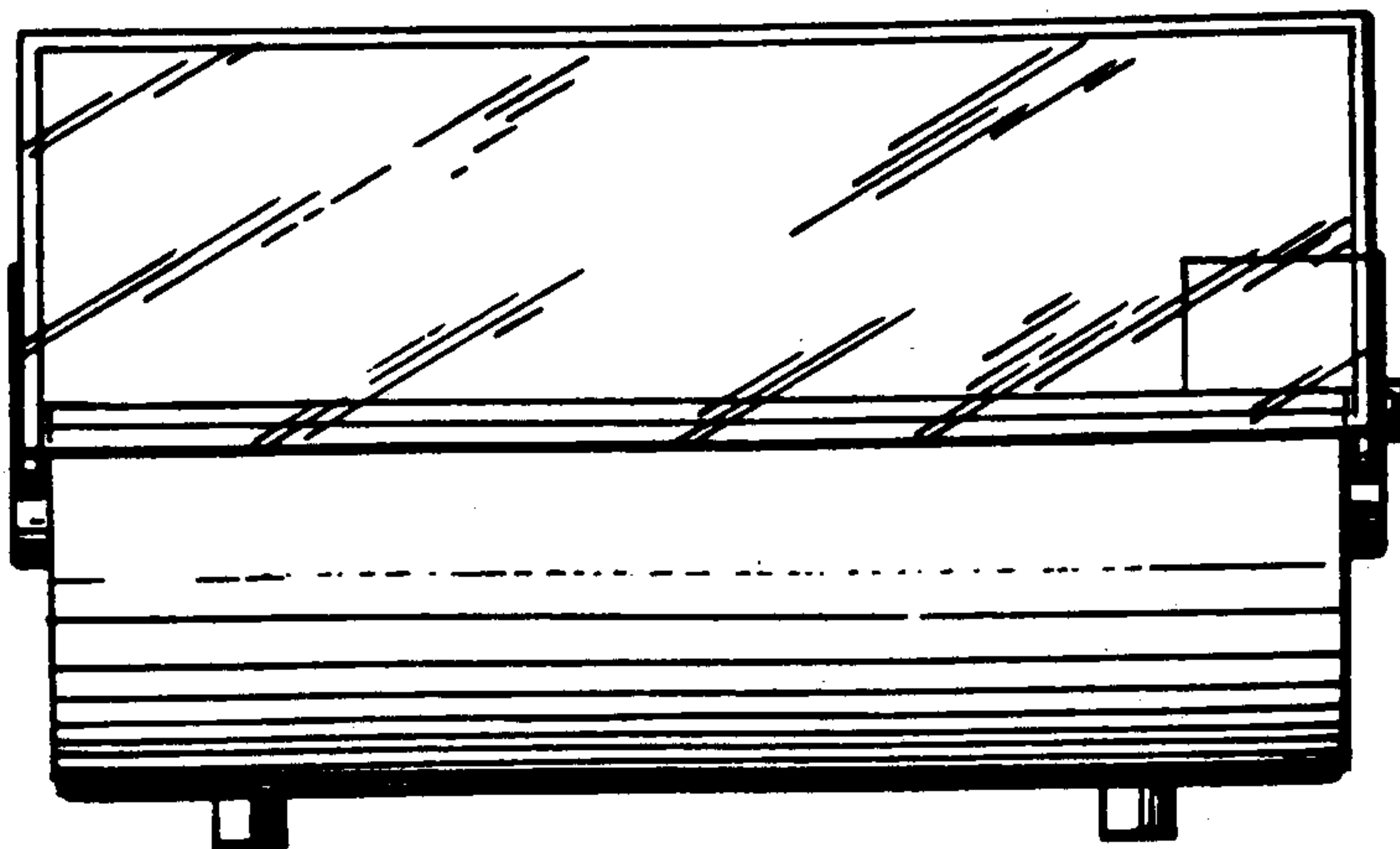

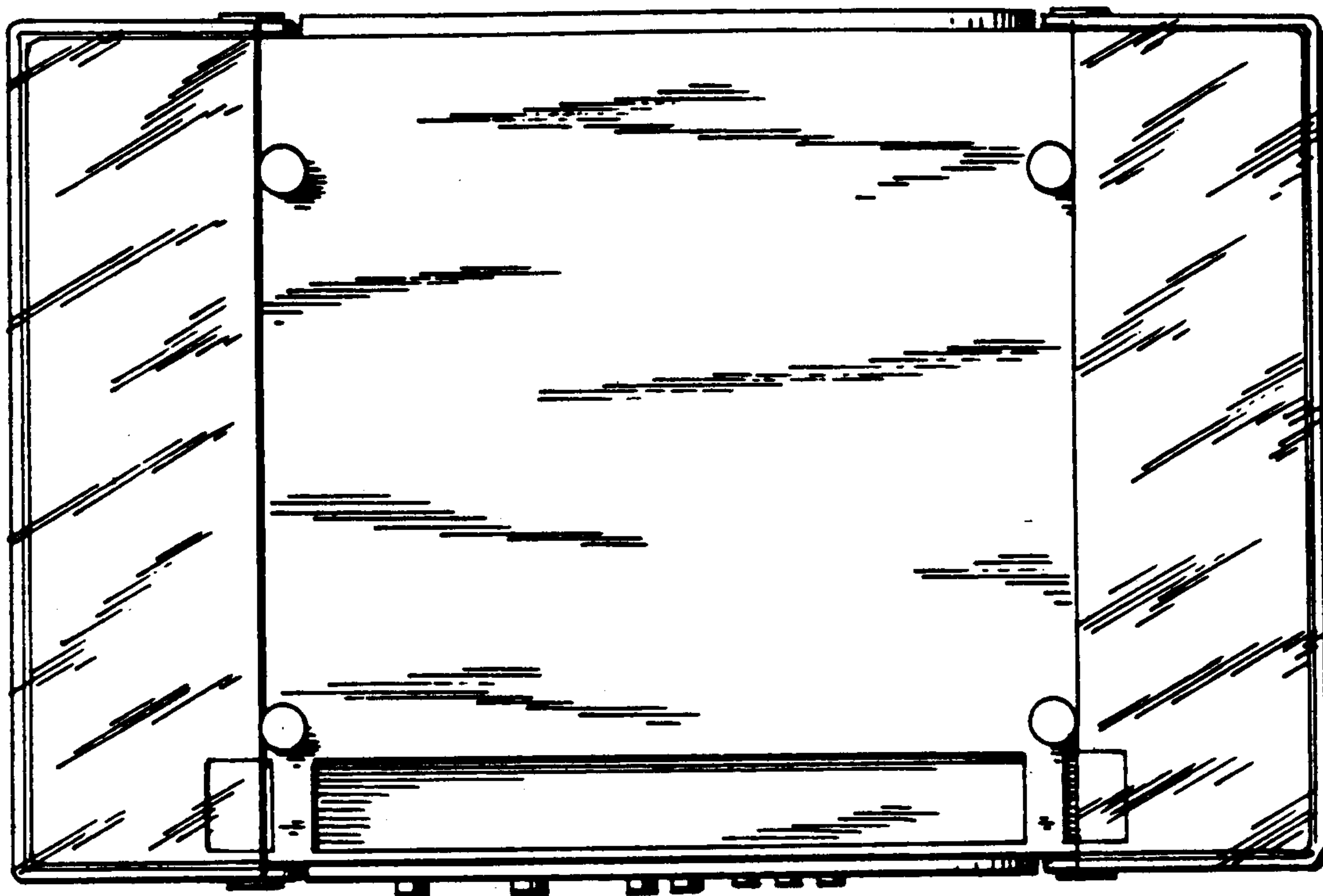

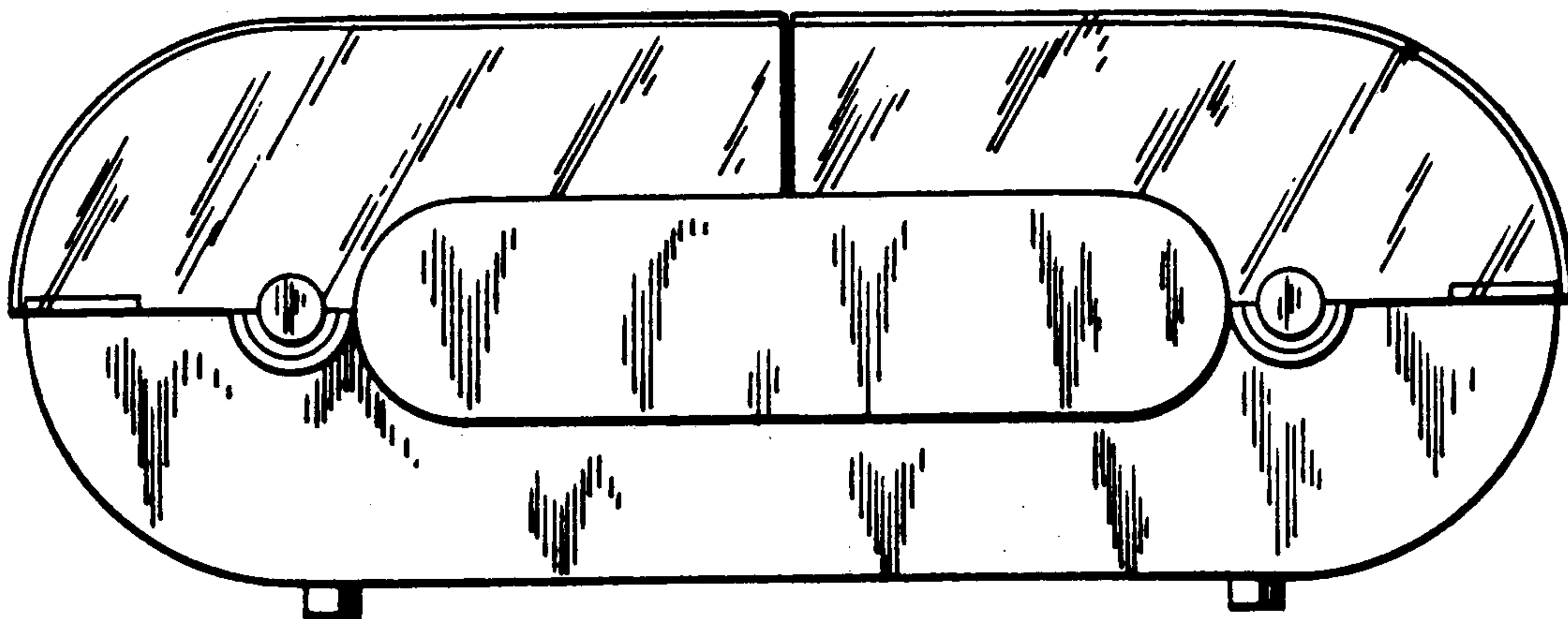

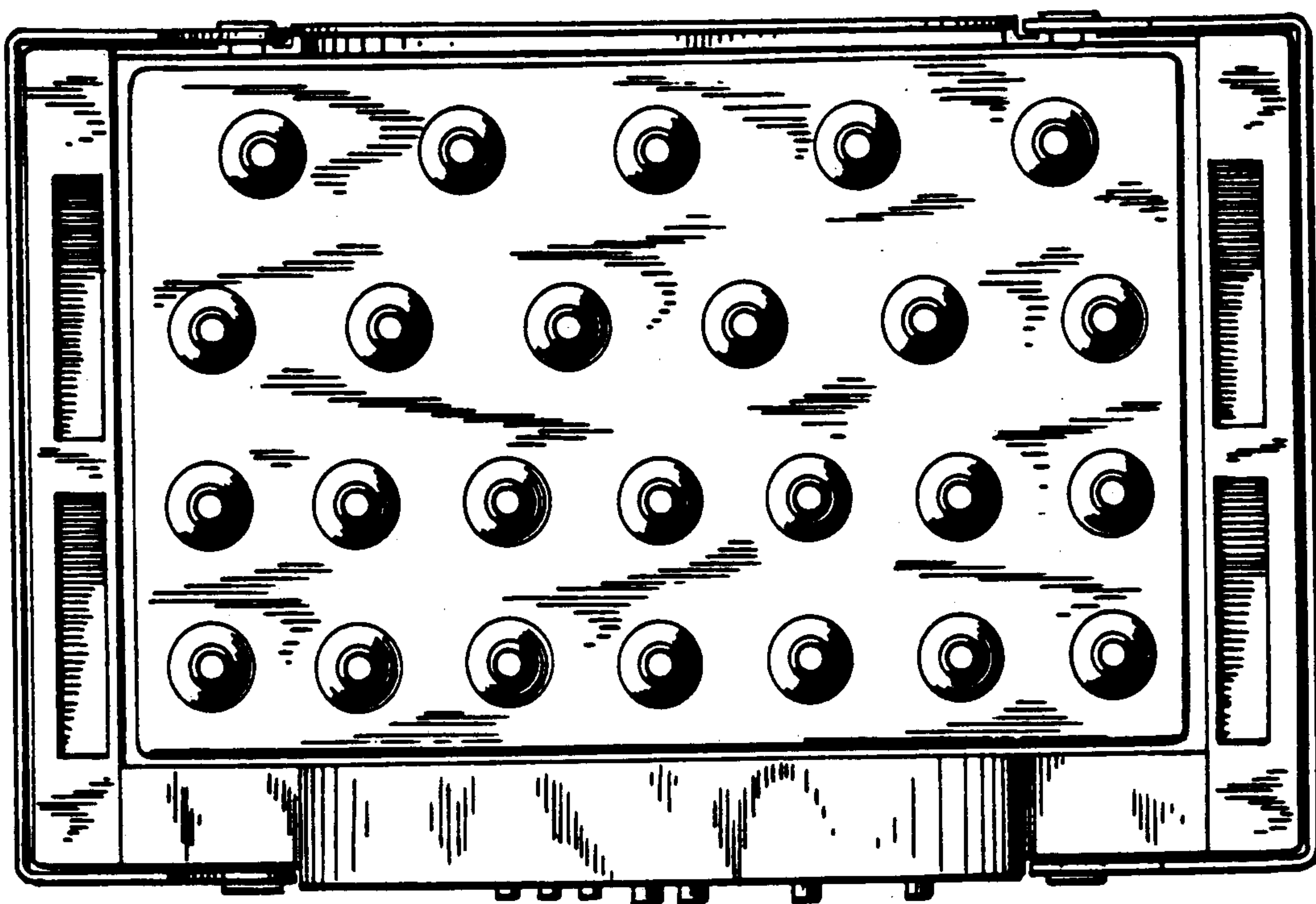

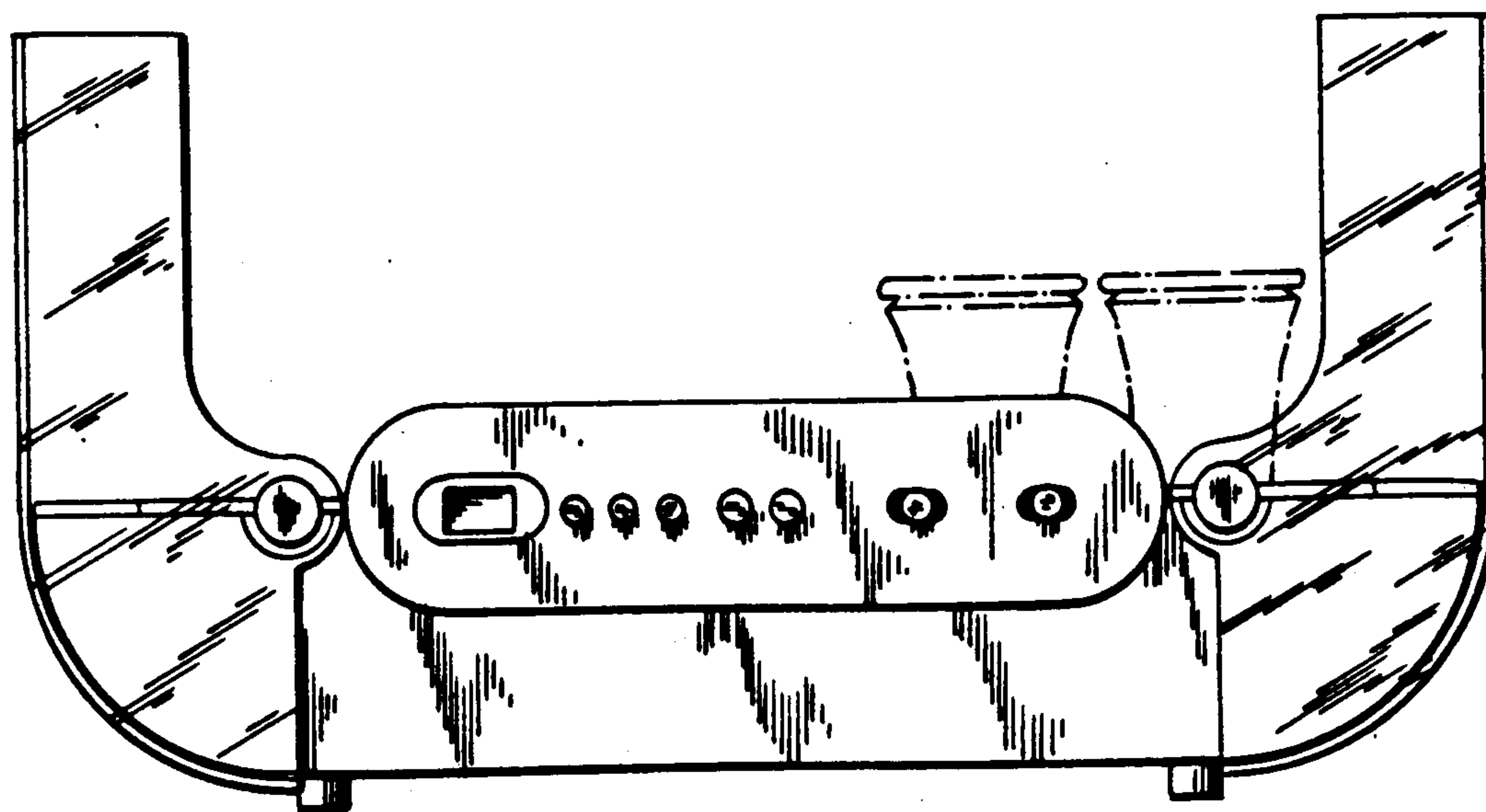

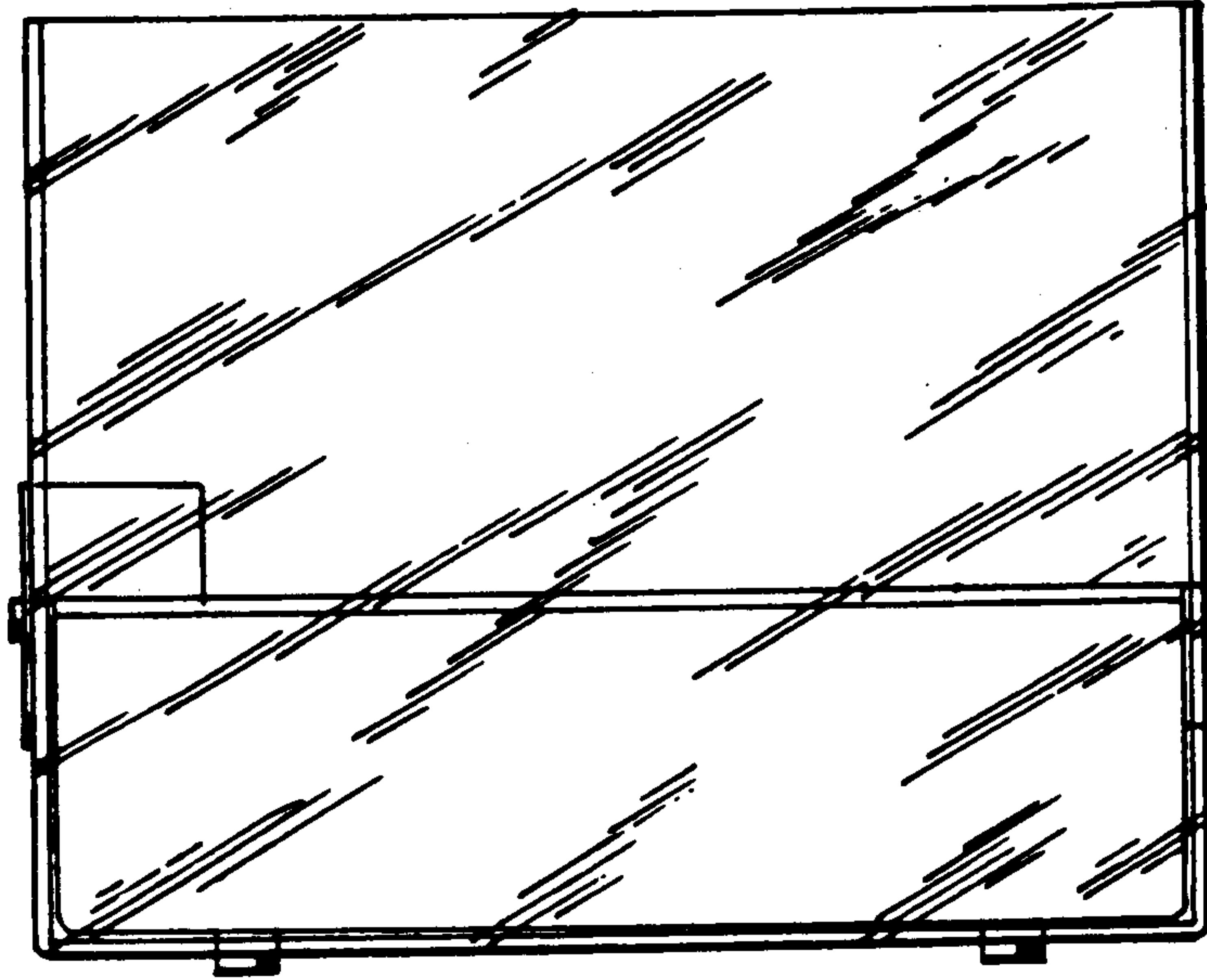

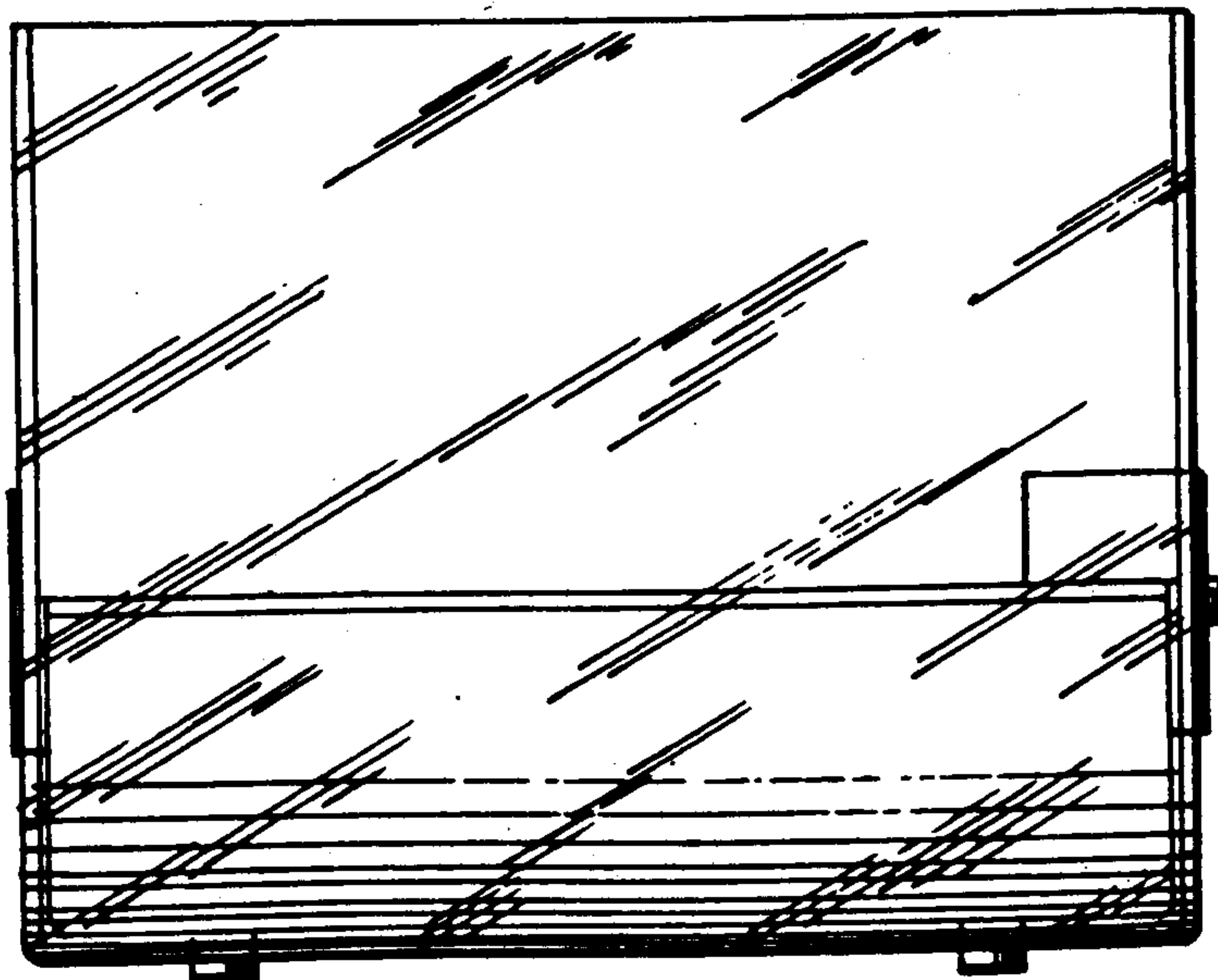

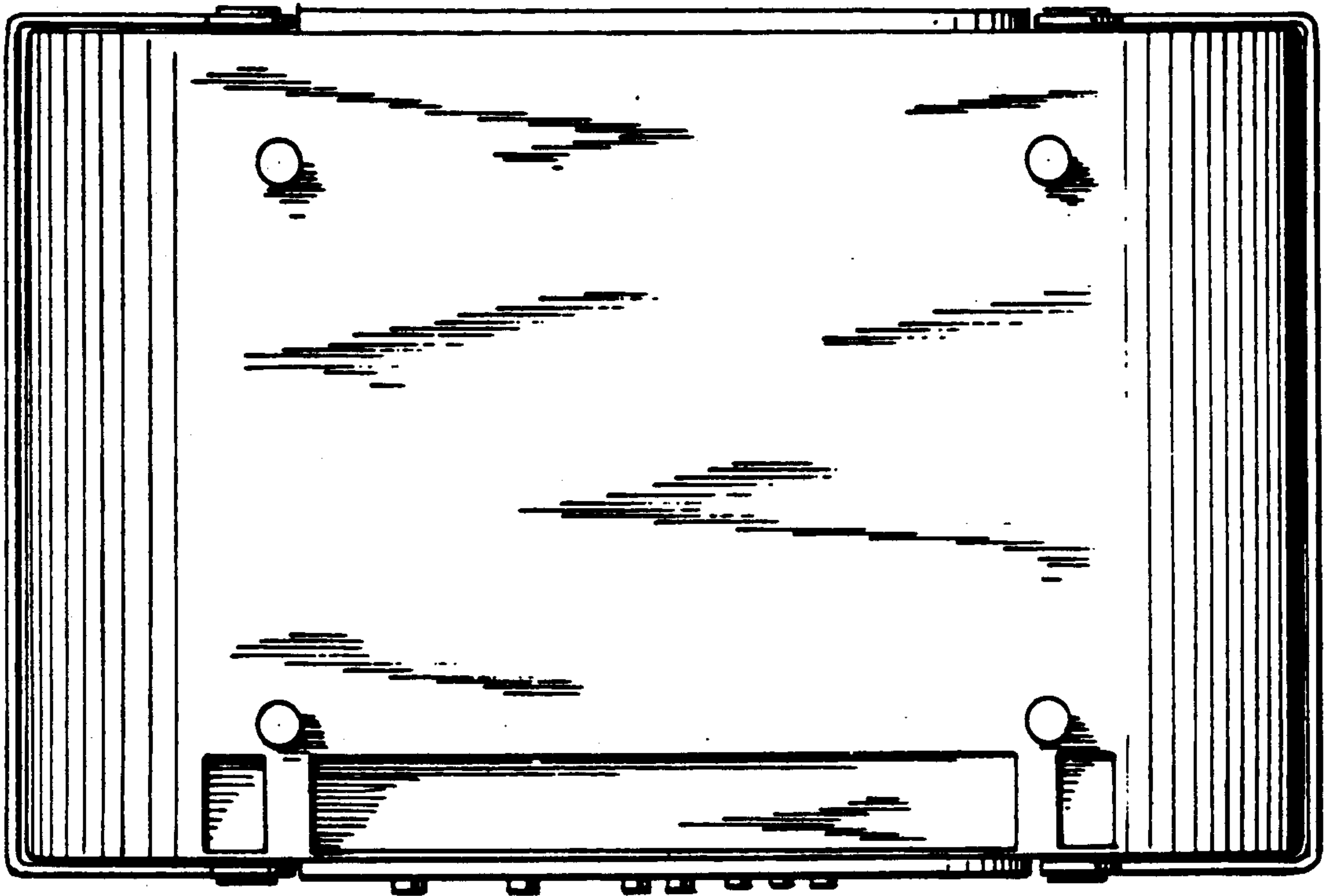
