[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a base for a writing instrument, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a base for a writing instrument showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view, the left side being a mirror image thereof;
FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof;
FIG. 5 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof.
The writing instrument in FIG. 1 and the cord fragment in FIGS. 1 through 6 are depicted by means of broken lines for illustrative purposes only and form no part of the claimed design.
