DESCRIPTION

- FIG. 1 is a front elevational view of a tomahawk, showing my new design, the rear being a mirror image thereof;
FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view thereof;
FIG. 4 is a top plan view thereof; and
