[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a jewelry chain, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is an edge view of an individual link of a jewelry chain showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is an elevational view of a jewelry chain showing our new design, comprised of links as shown in FIG. 1;
FIG. 3 is a top plan view of the link shown in FIG. 1;
FIG. 4 is a side elevational view shown with the chain rotated 90 degrees from the position shown in FIG. 2. The chain in FIGS. 2 and 4 are of indeterminate length and repeats itself lengthwise.

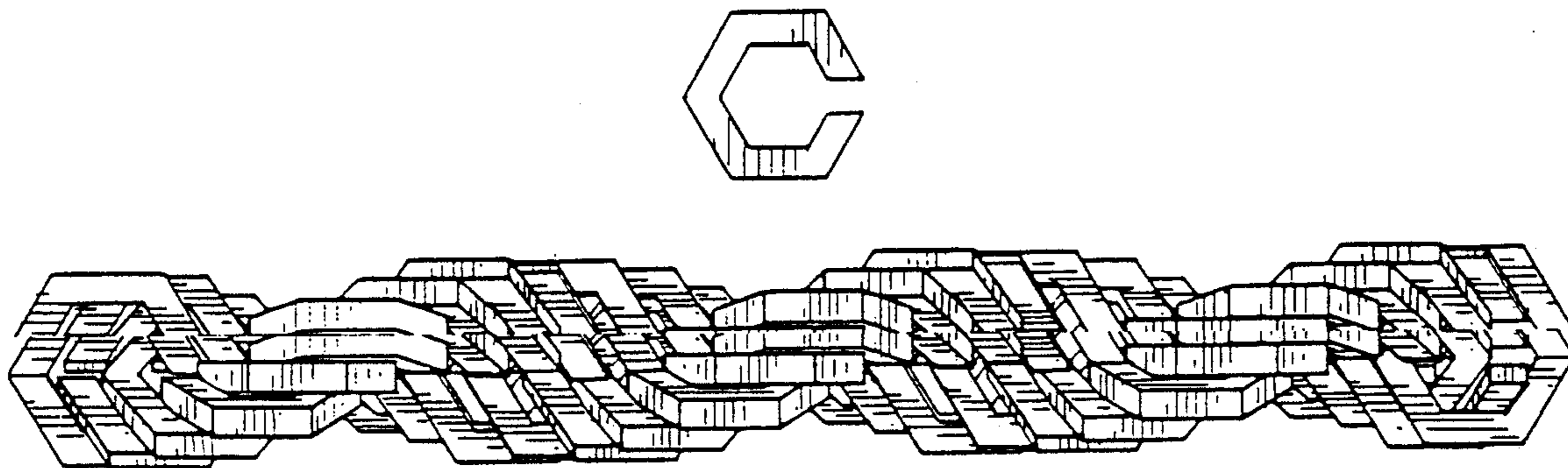

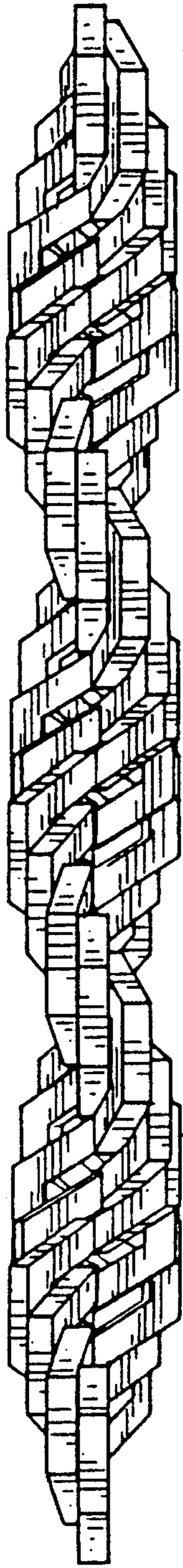

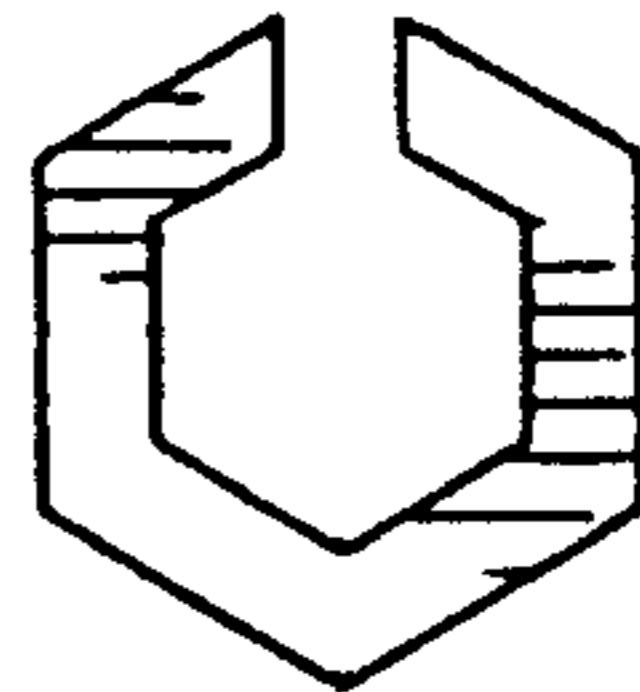
