FIG. 7 is a front elevational view thereof.

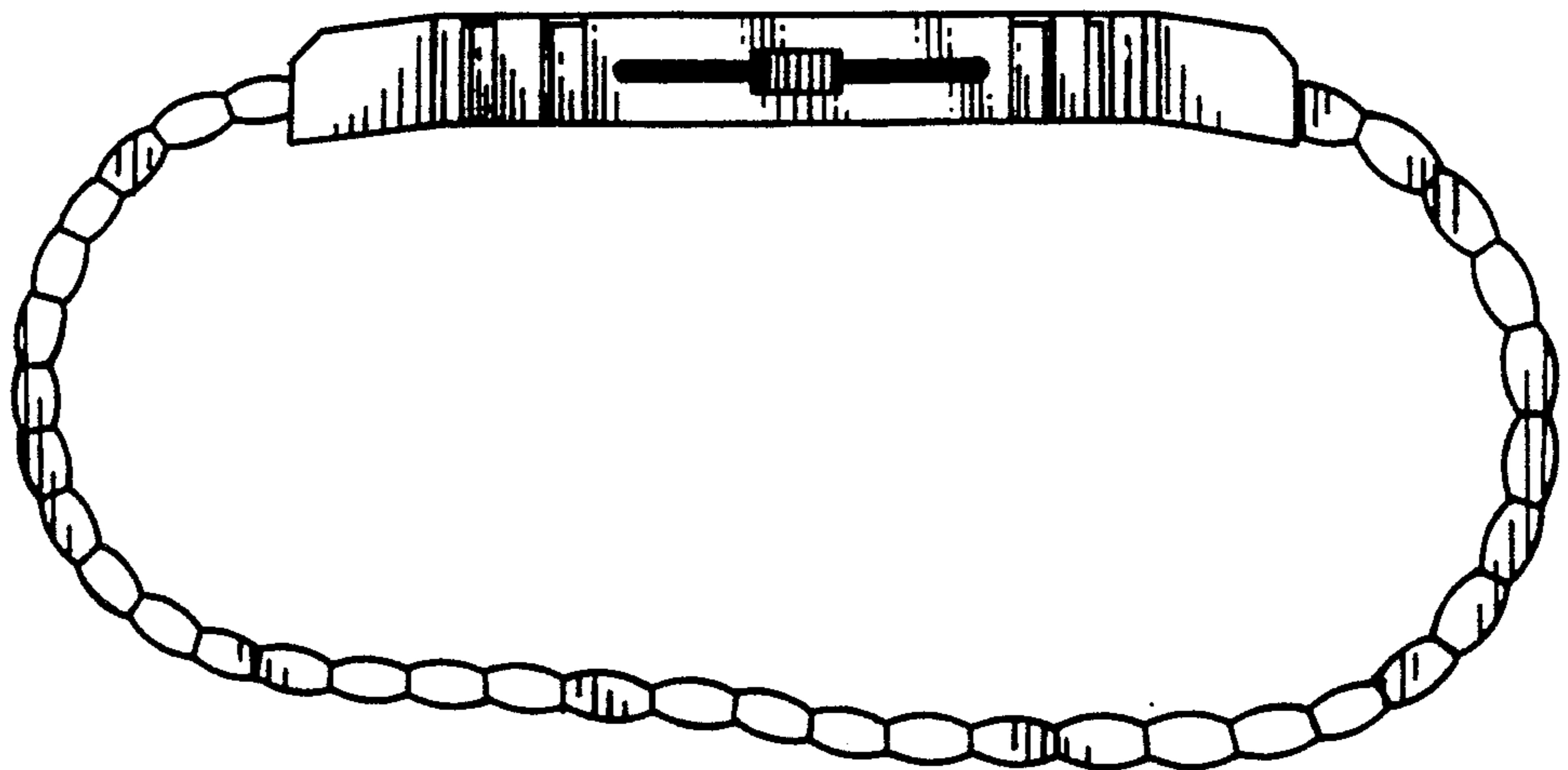

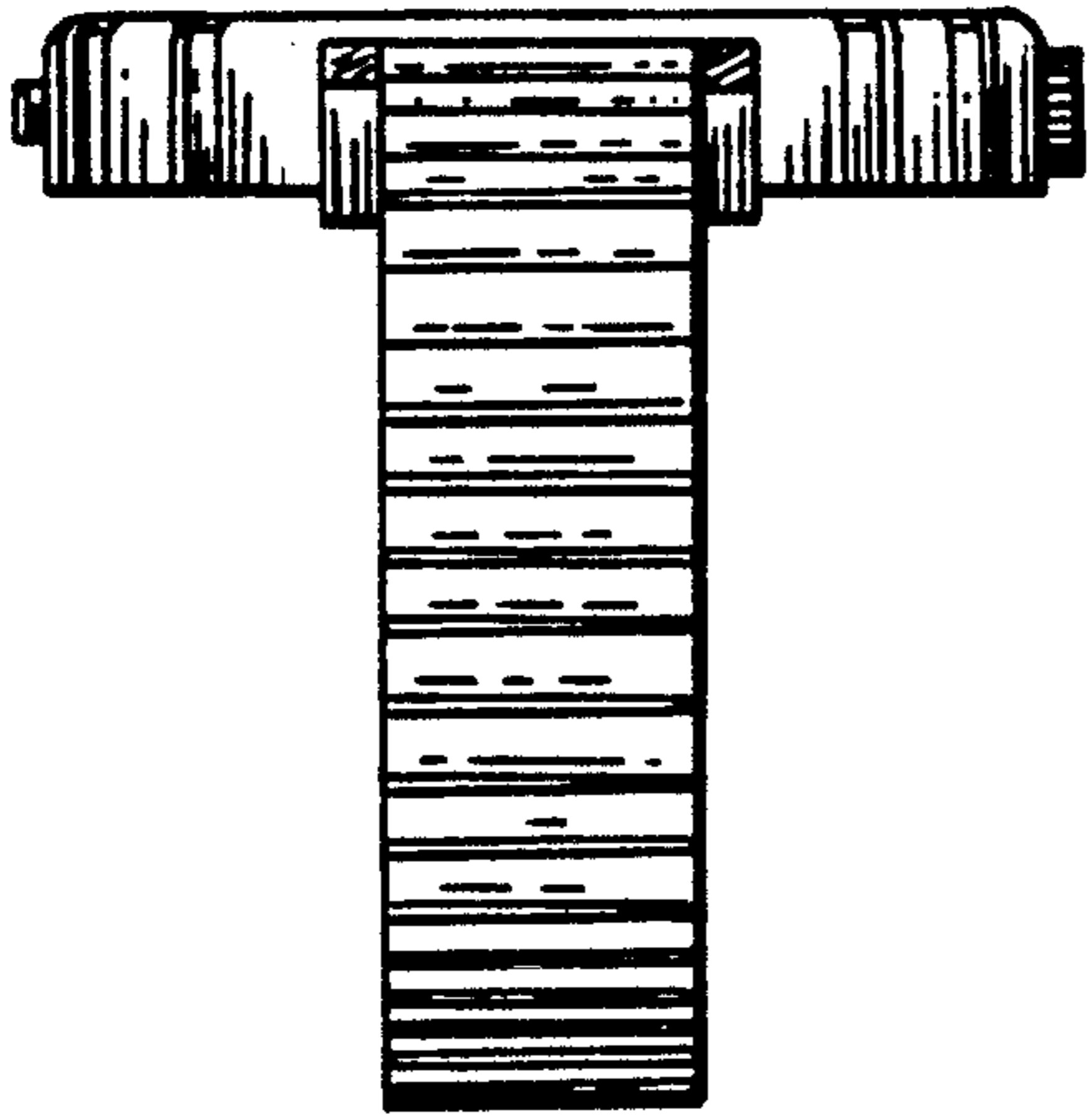

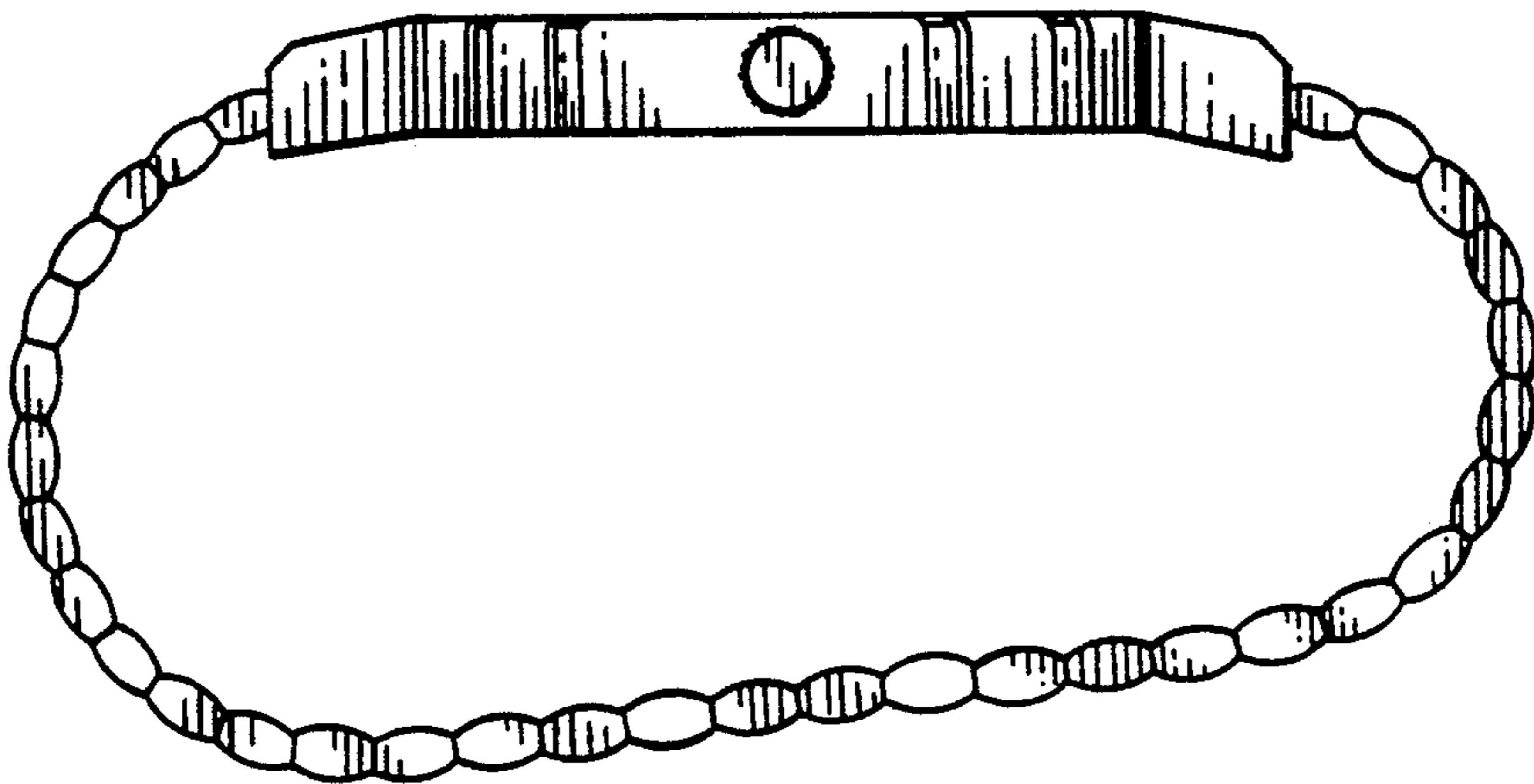
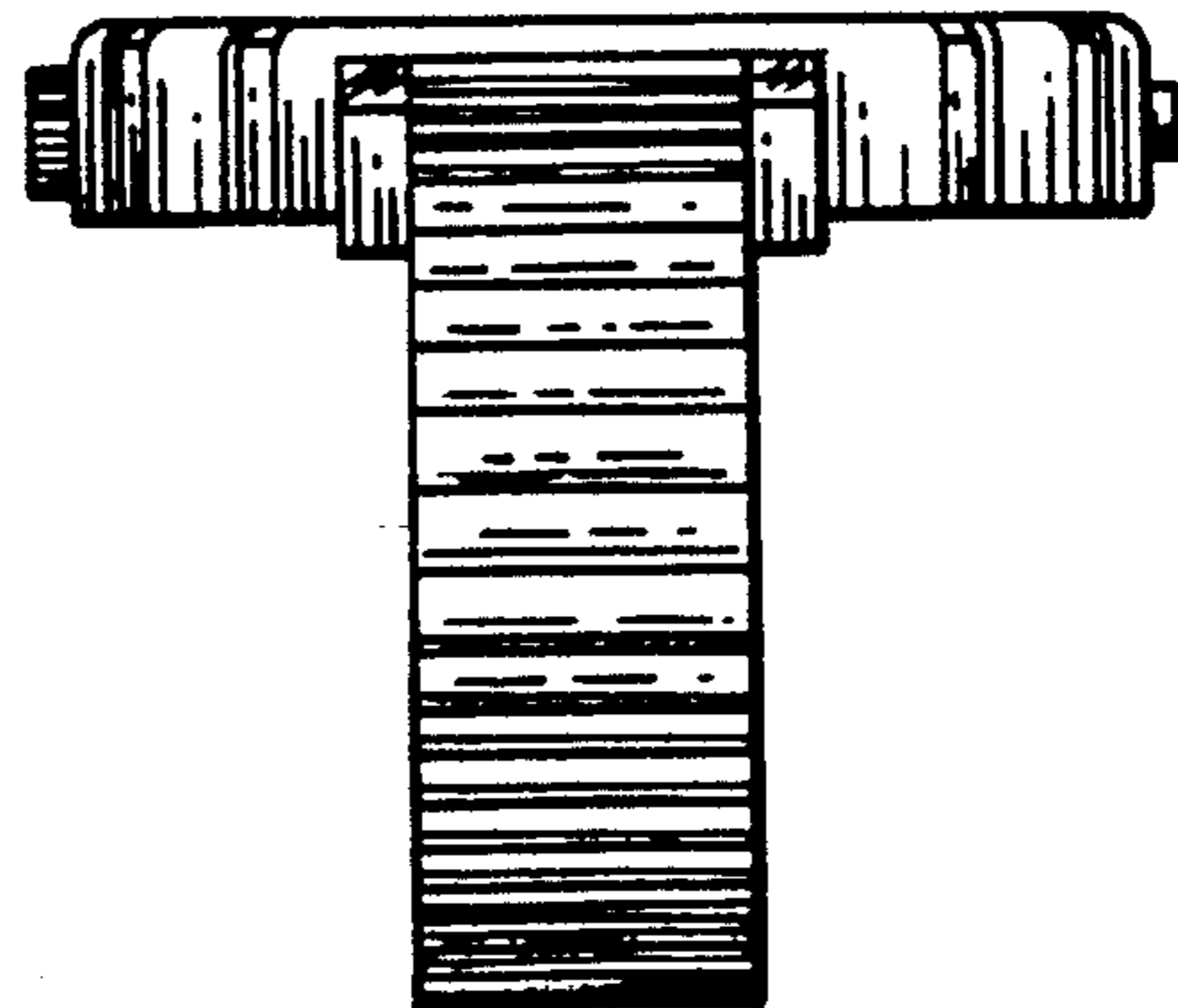

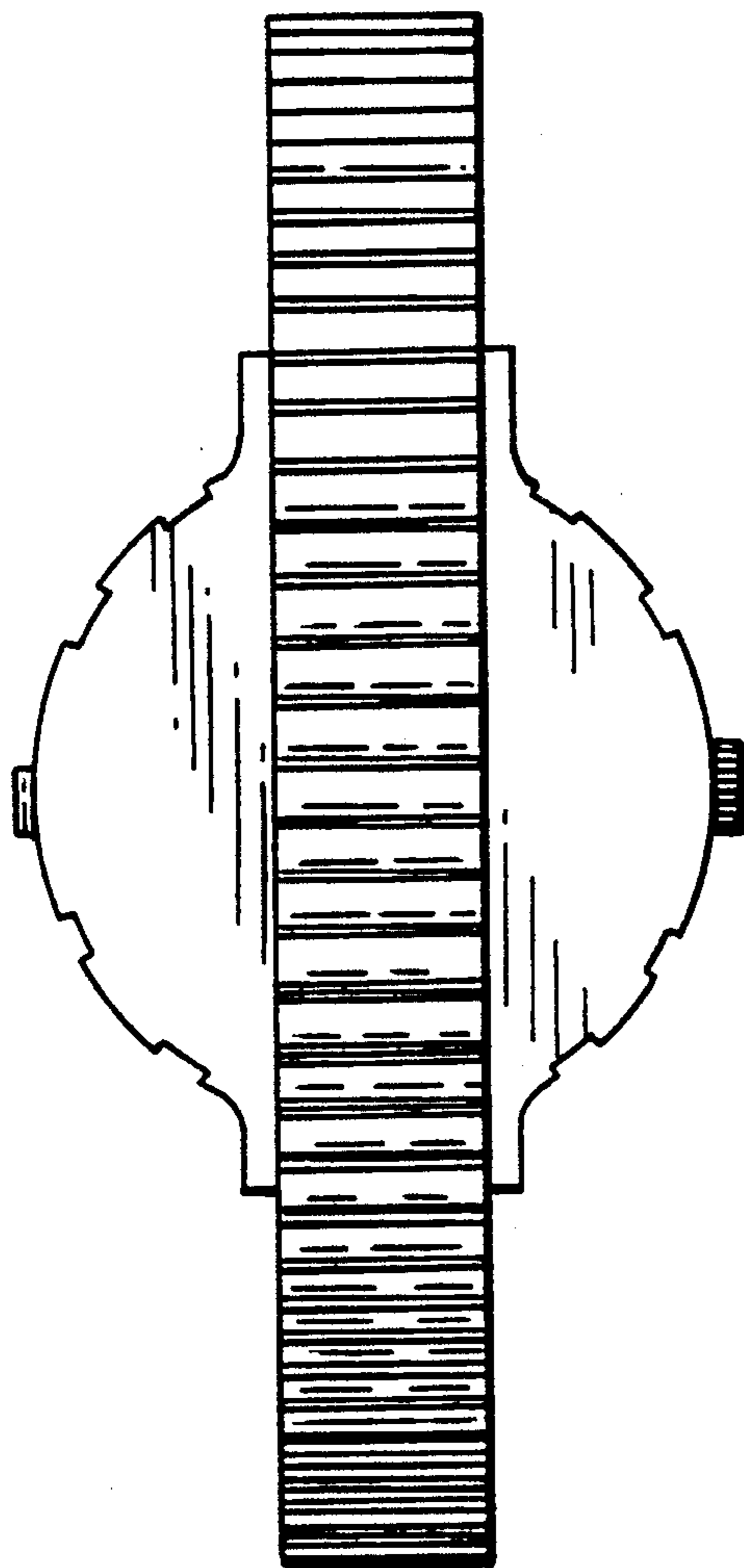
