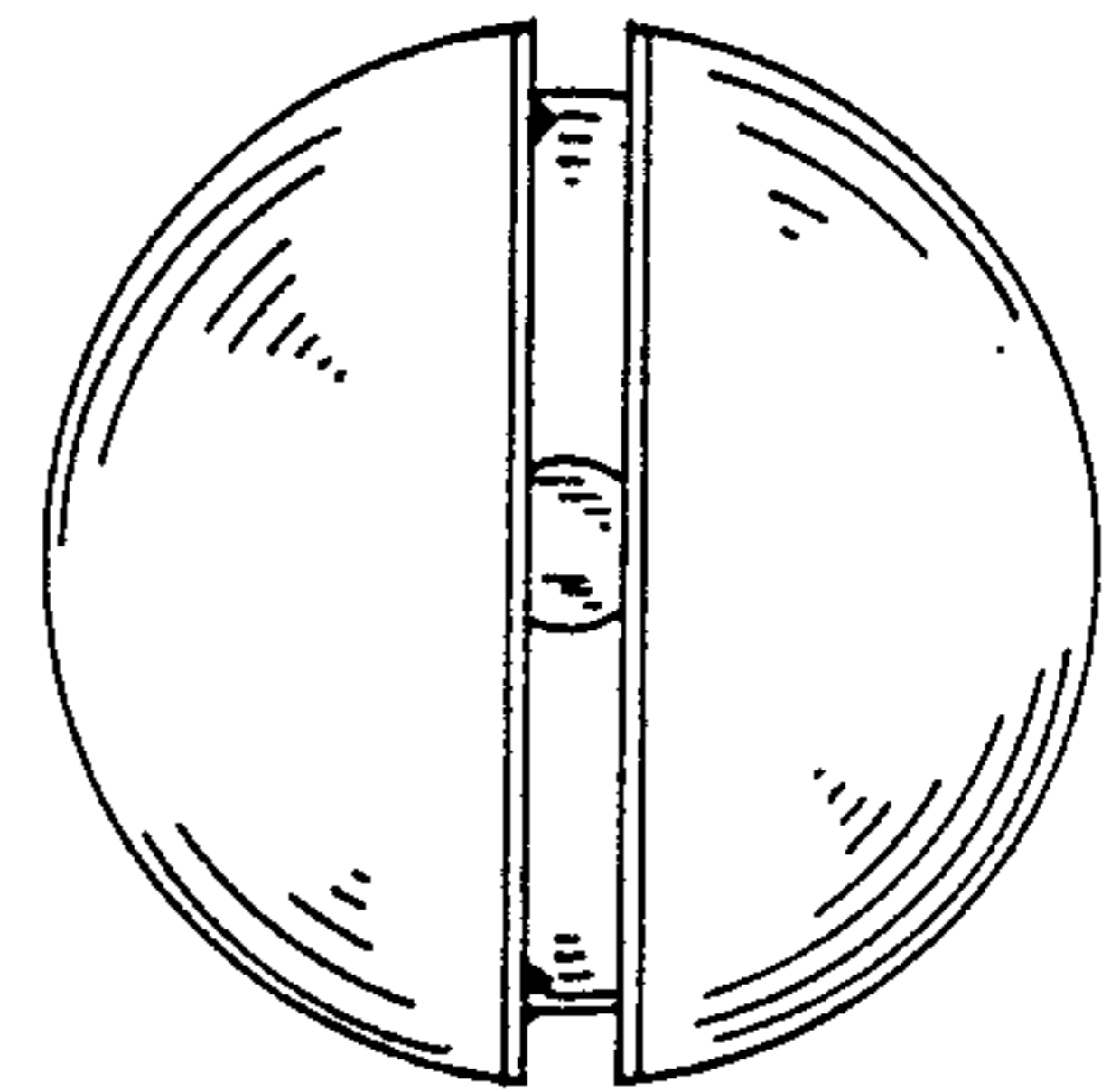
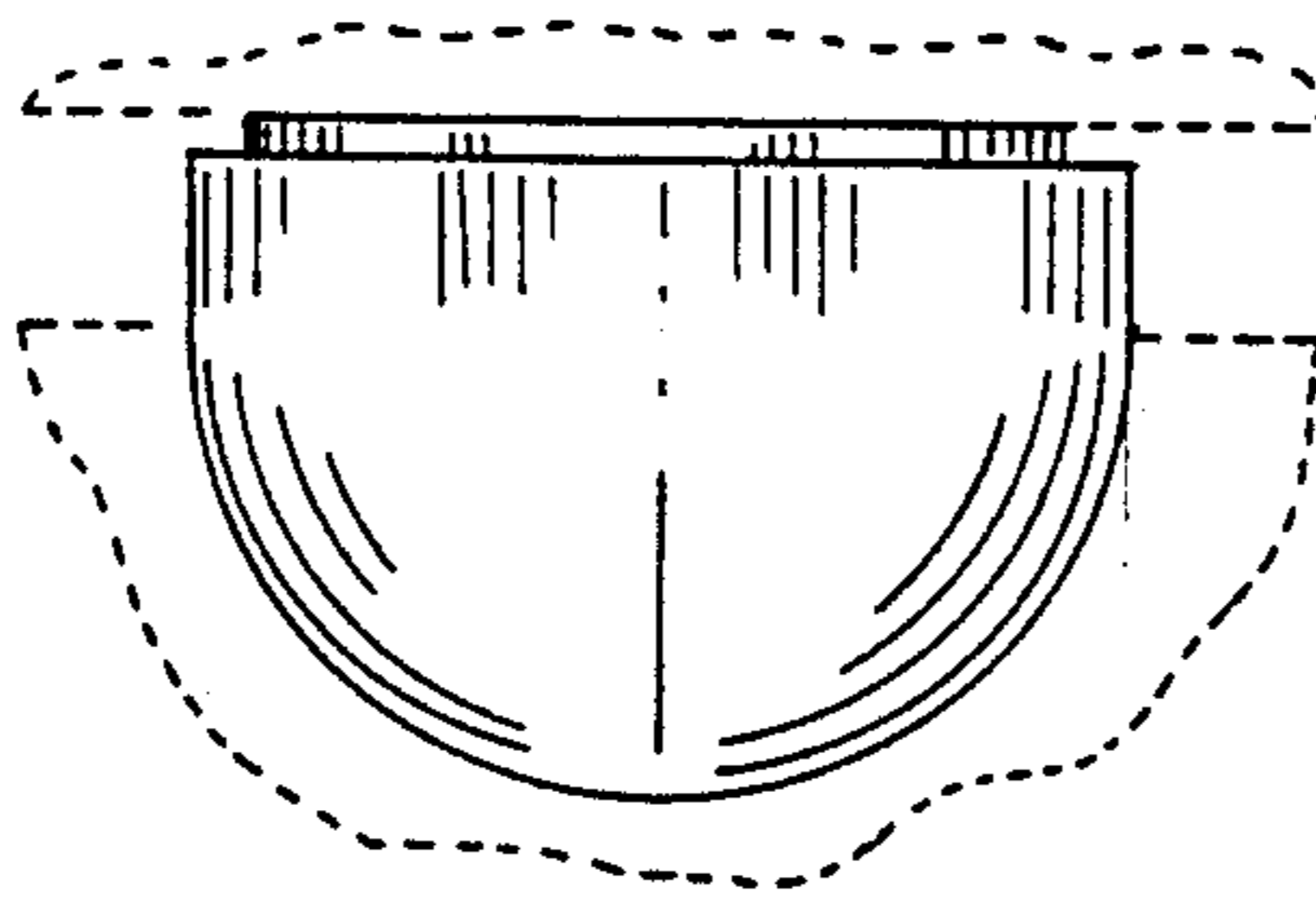
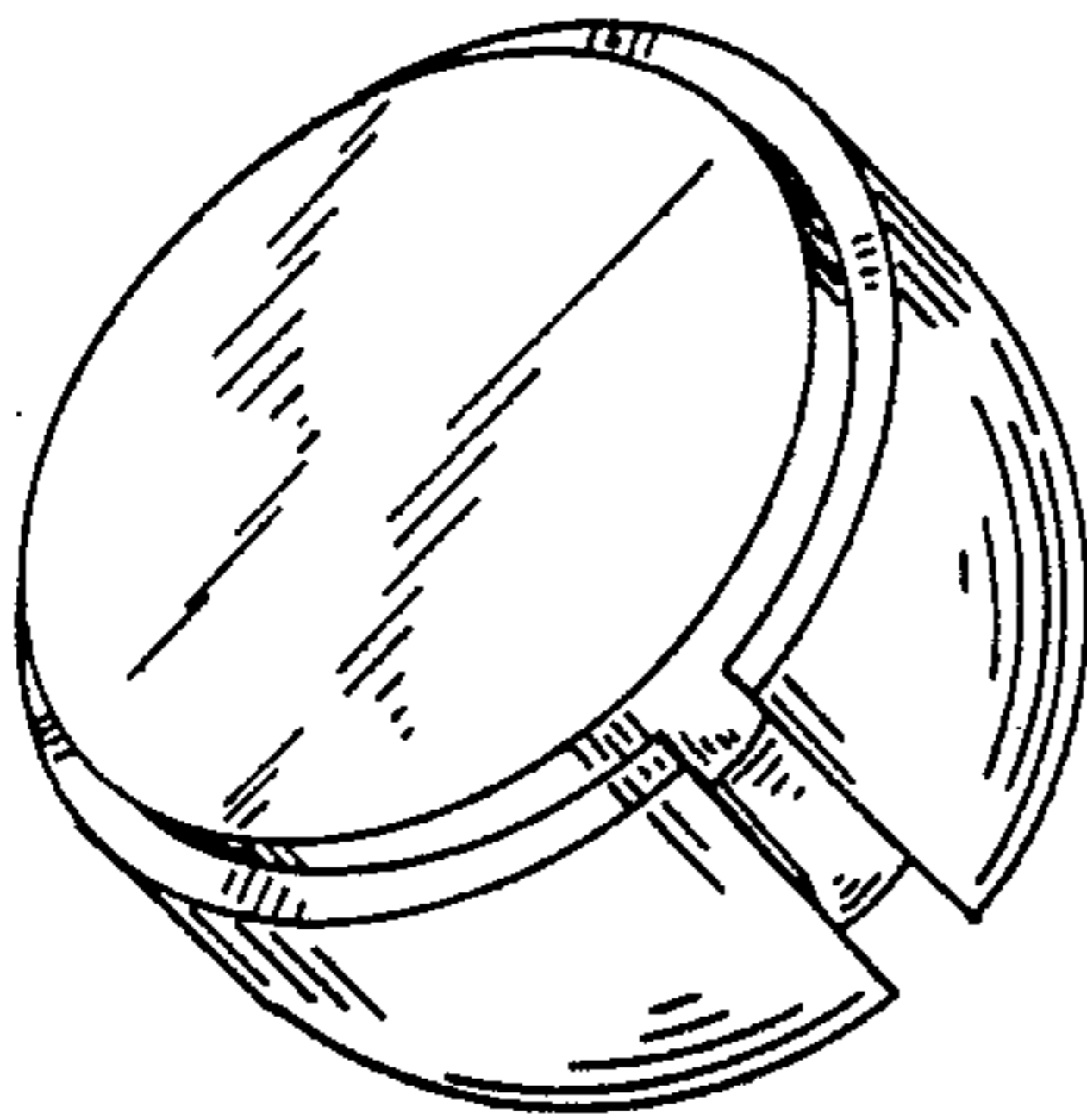
The view of the other side is identical to the side shown

of the design herein.



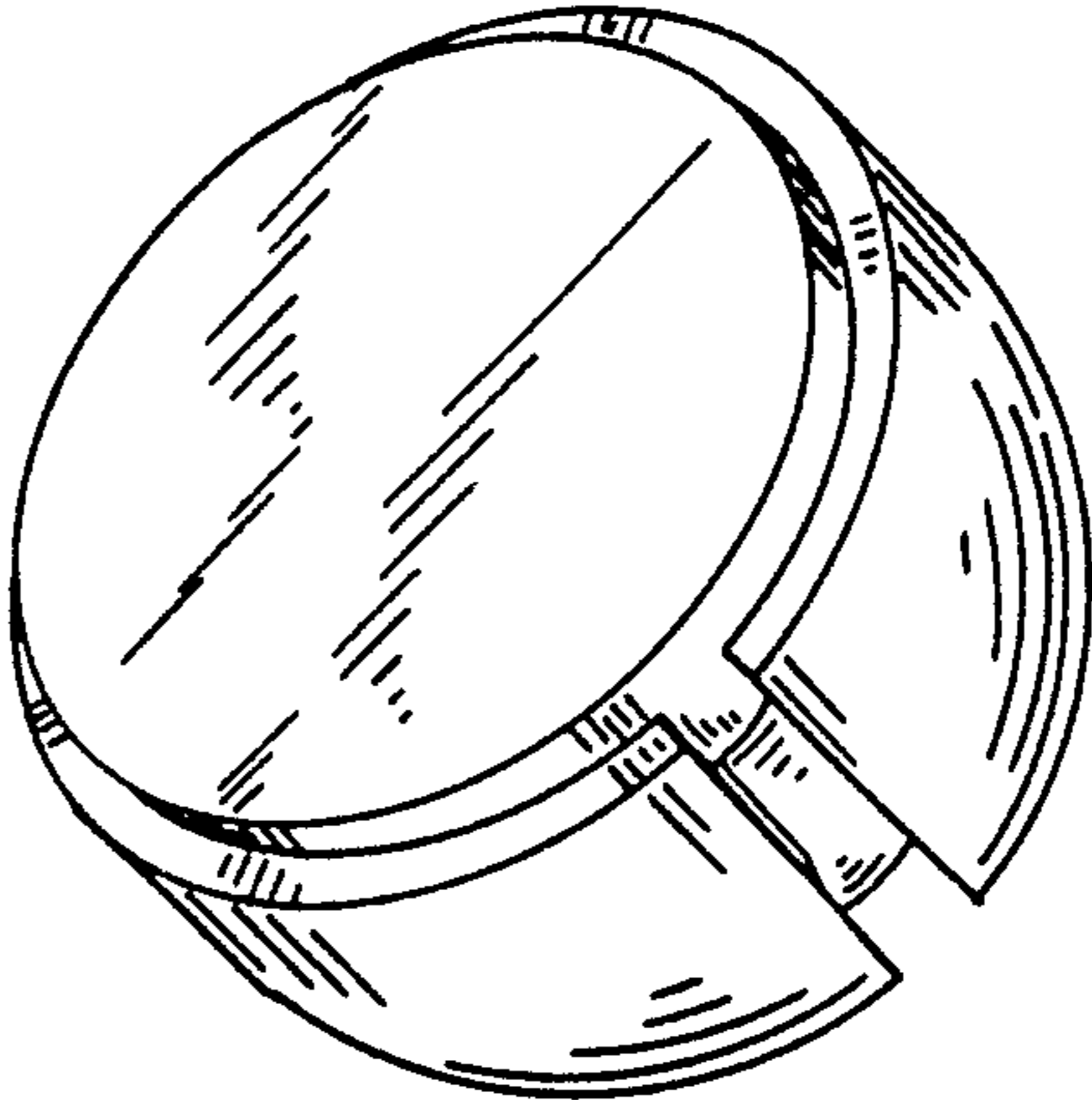

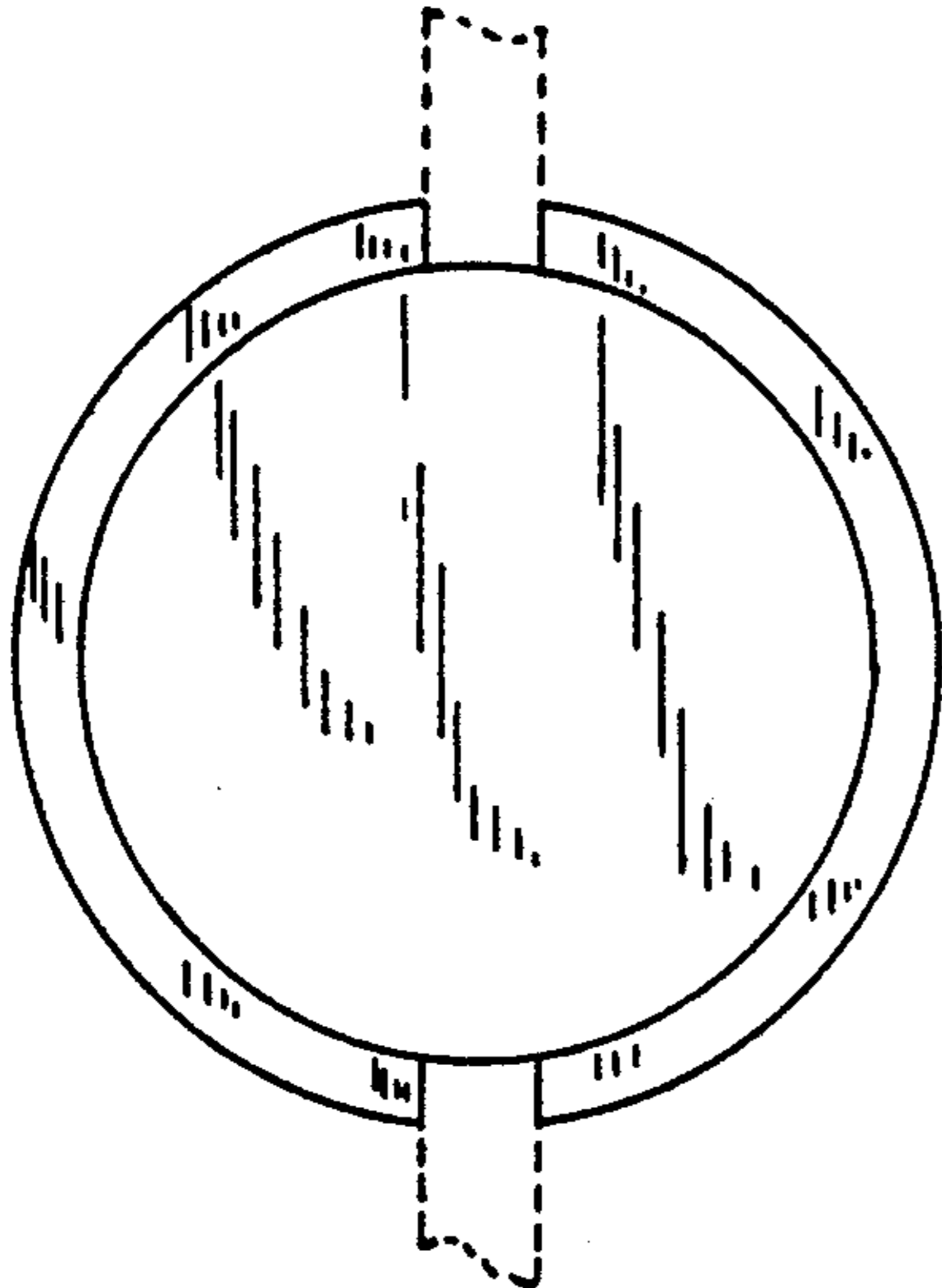

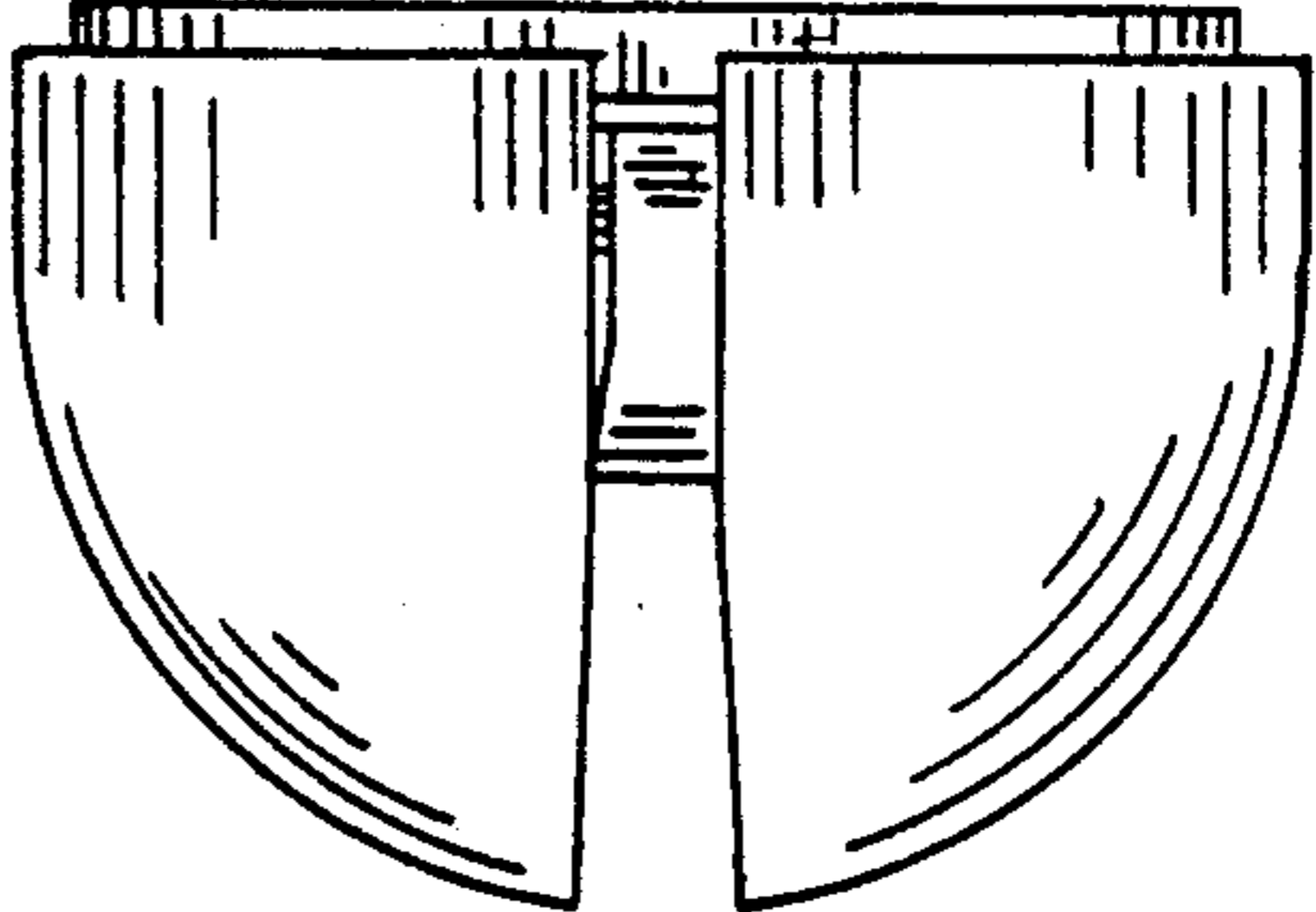

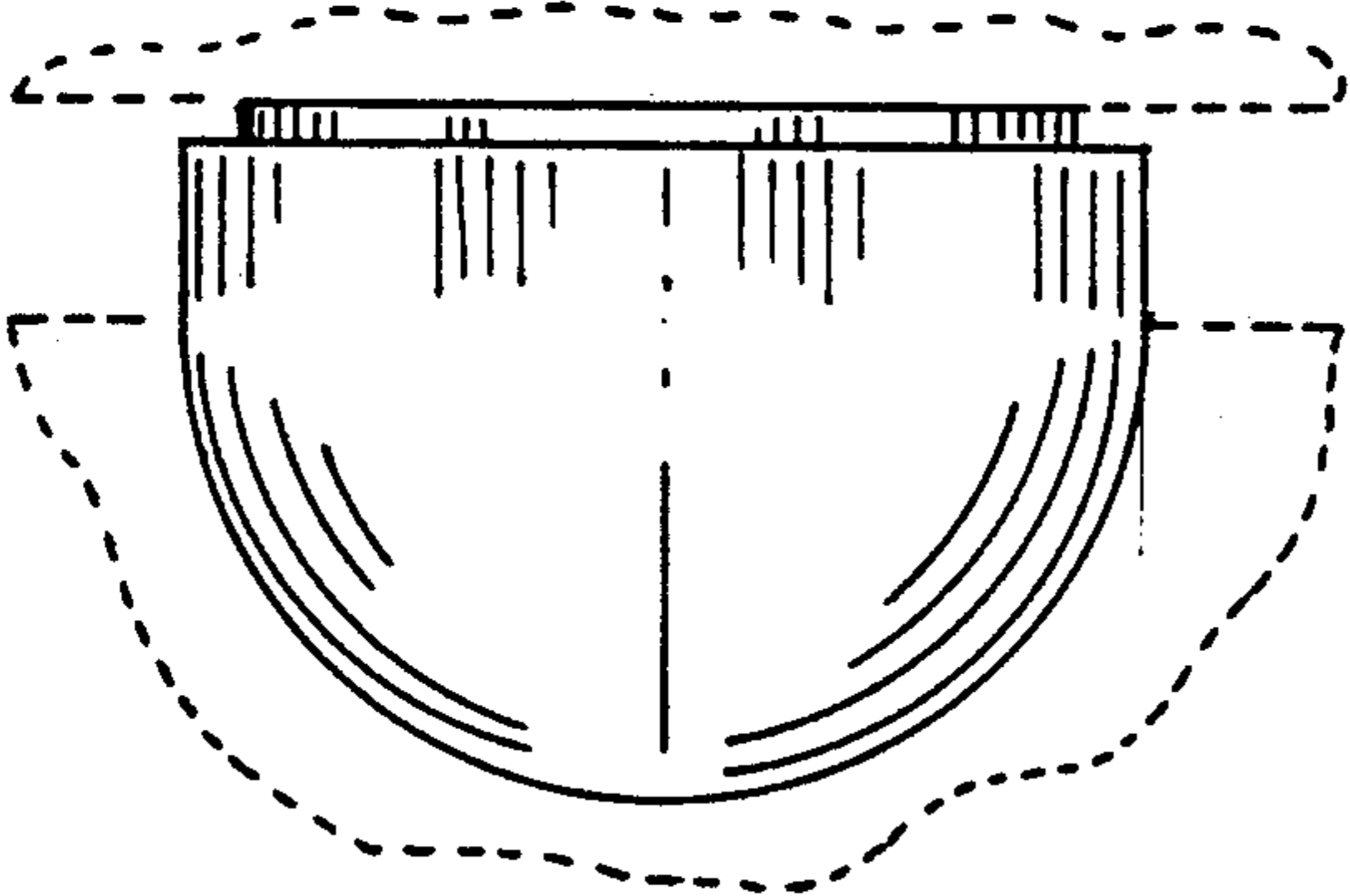

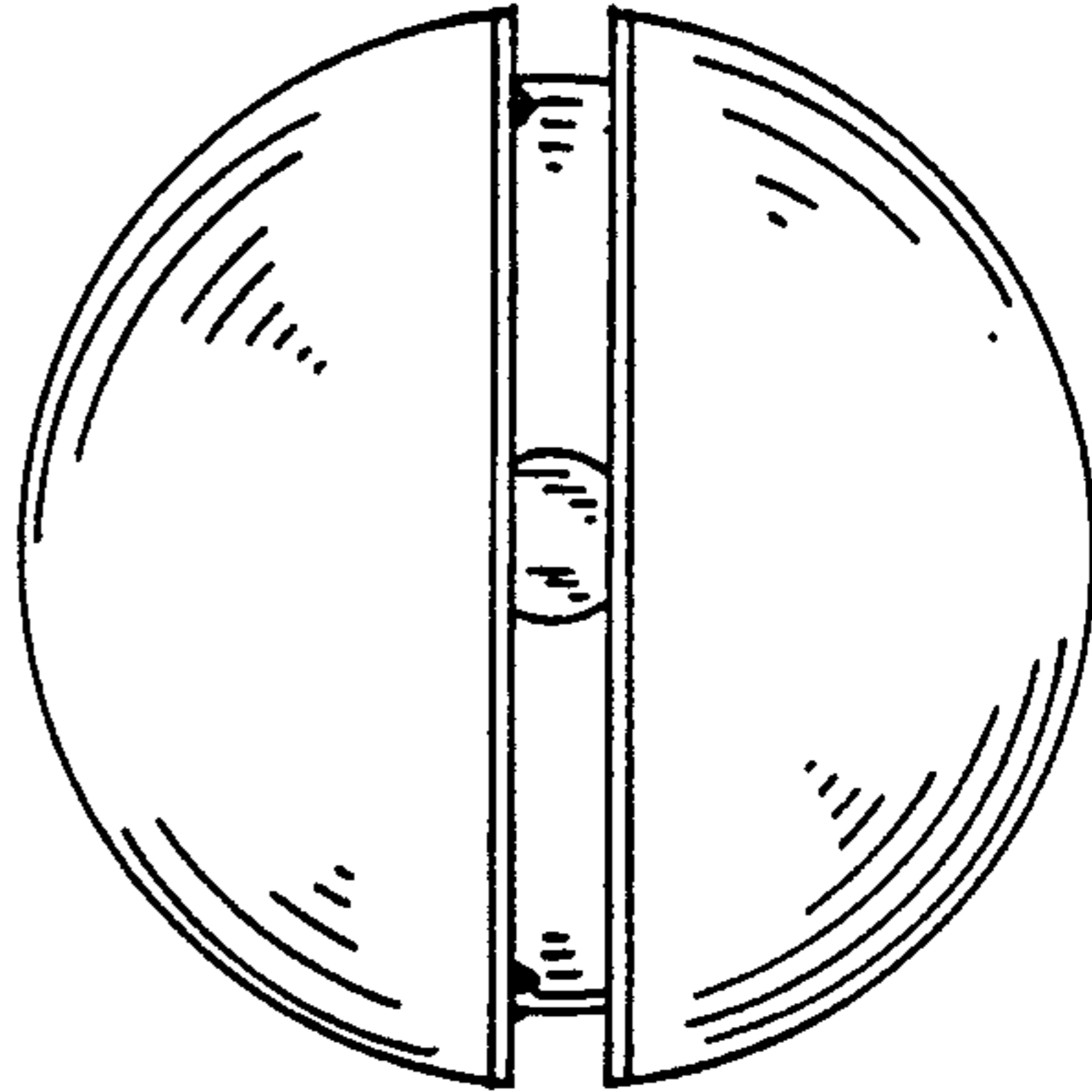
