DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a right side elevational view of an alarm clock showing our new design;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;
FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof.
The rear, not shown, is substantially a mirror image but with no clock face thereof.

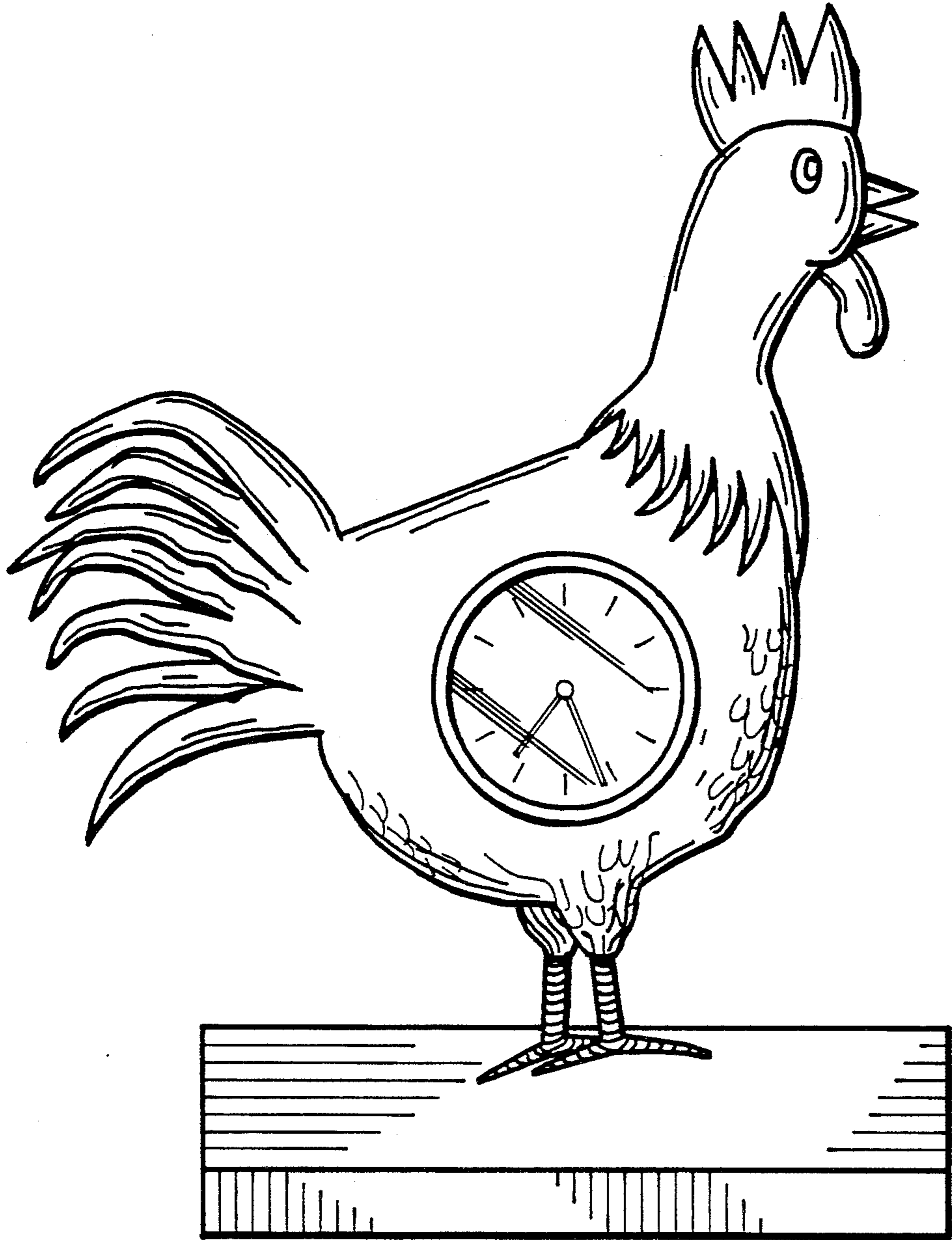
