[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for an outsole of shoe, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a bottom plan view of a shoe outsole showing my new design;
 FIG. 2 is a side elevational view of one side of the shoe outsole shown in FIG. 1;
 FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the other side of the shoe outsole shown in FIG. 1;
 FIG. 4 is a cross-sectional view taken along line 4—4 of FIG. 1; and
 FIG. 5 is a cross-sectional view taken along line 5—5 of FIG. 1.
 The broken line showing of a shoe upper in FIGS. 2 and 3 is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.

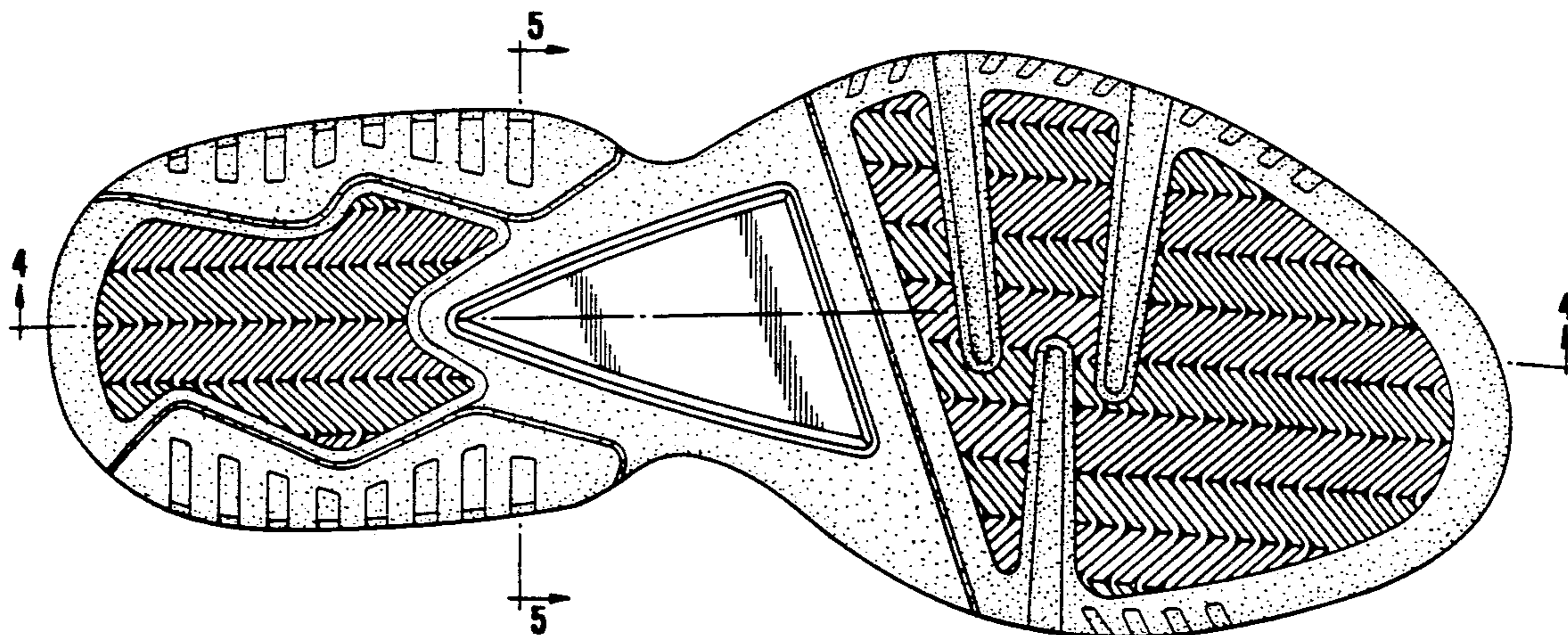

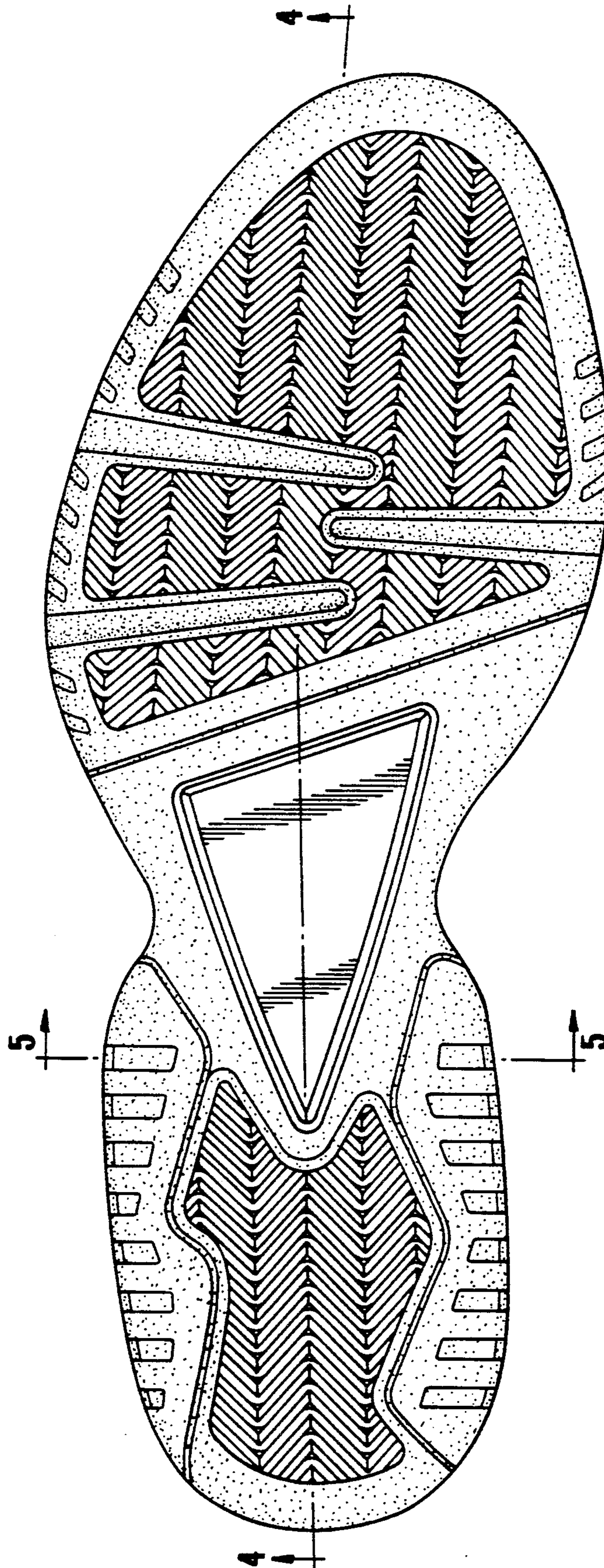
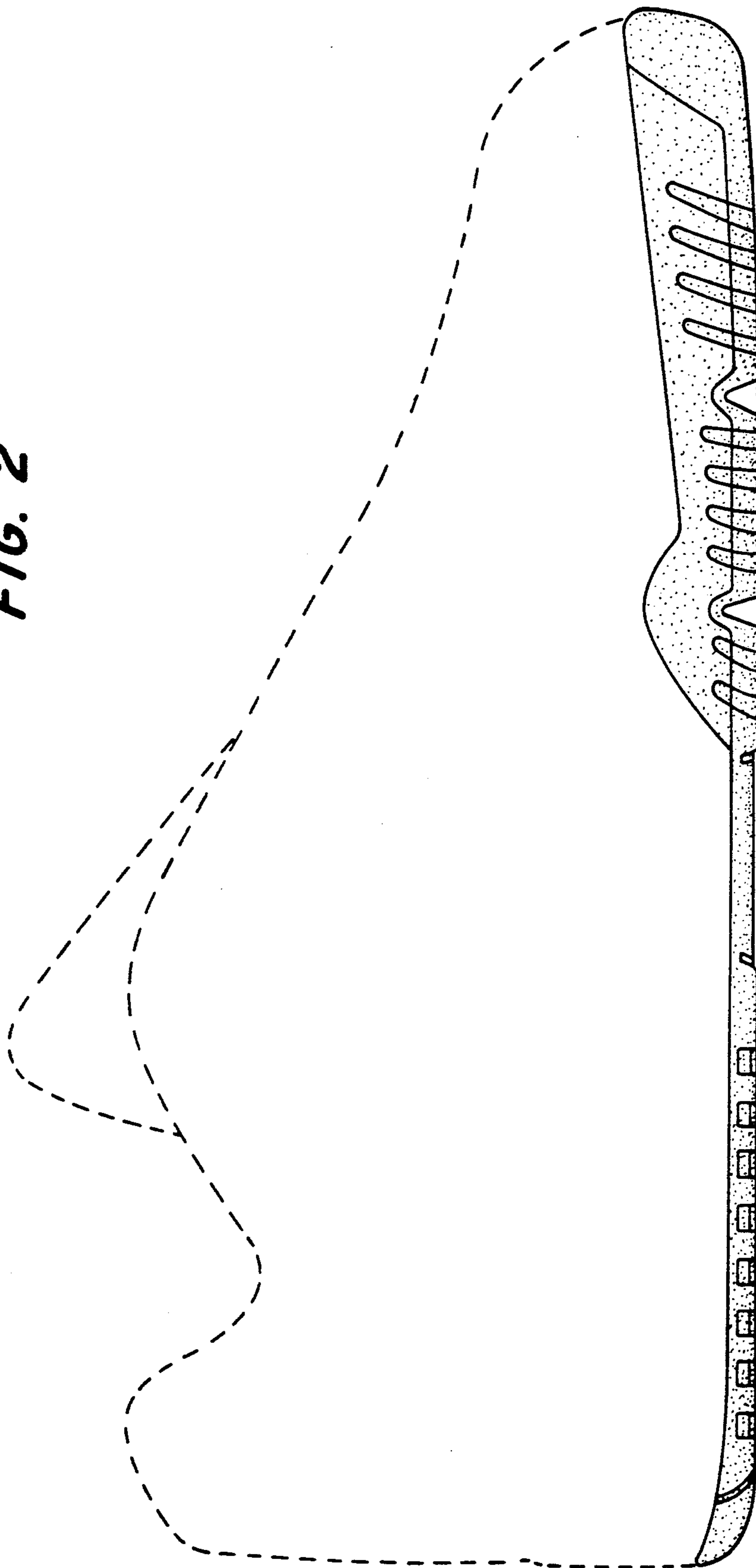

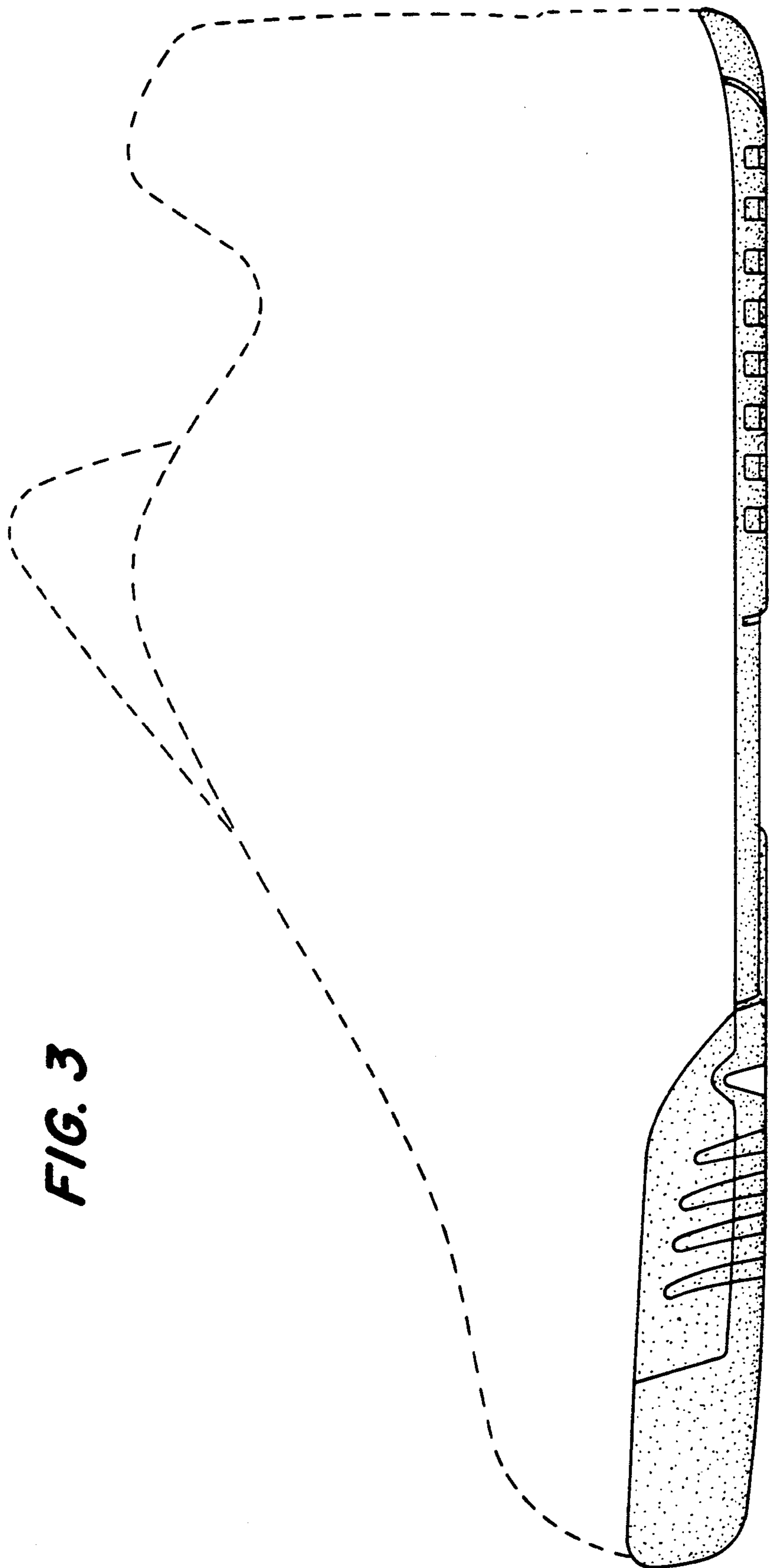
