## **DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an accessory case or the like showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a side elevational view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof;


FIG. 5 is a top plan view thereof;


FIG. 6 is a perspective view thereof, showing the front top flap in an open configuration;

The broken lines shown in FIGS. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8 represent conventional stitching.

















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
