The ornamental design for a jewelry chain, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a side elevational view of a jewelry chain showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a top plan view, the opposite side view being a mirror image;
FIG. 3 is an end elevational view;
FIG. 4 is a sectional view taken along the lines 4—4 of FIG. 2; and
FIG. 5 is a sectional view taken along the lines 5—5 of FIG. 2.

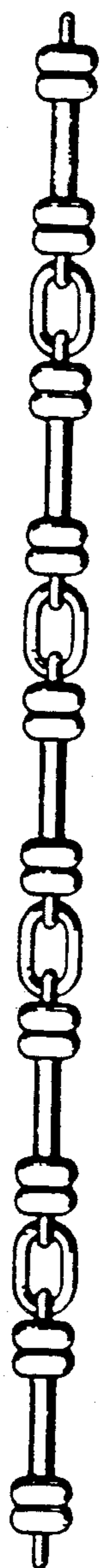
