FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an insect electrocutor, showing my new design;

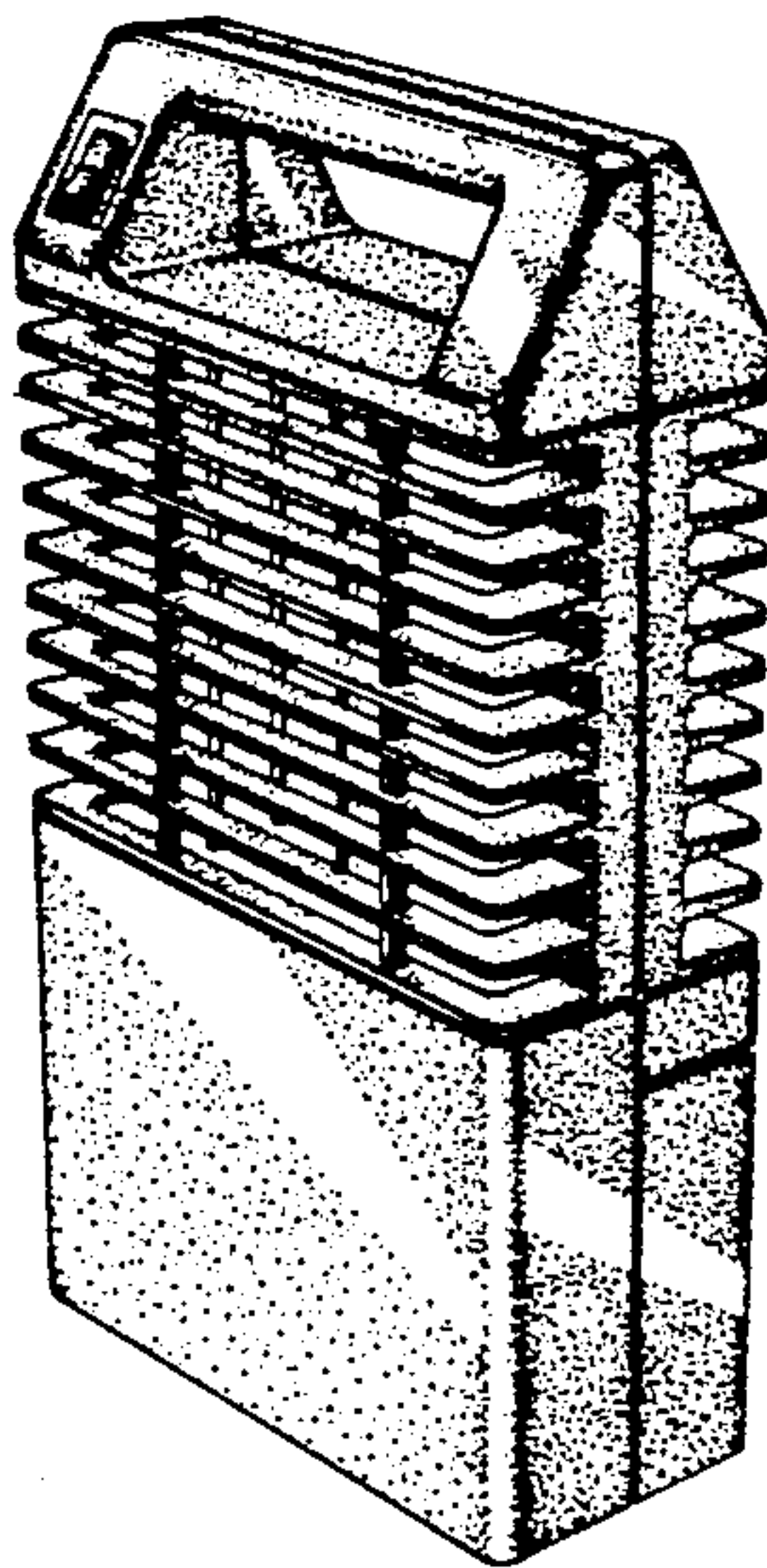
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view, the left side being a mirror image thereof;

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view thereof.



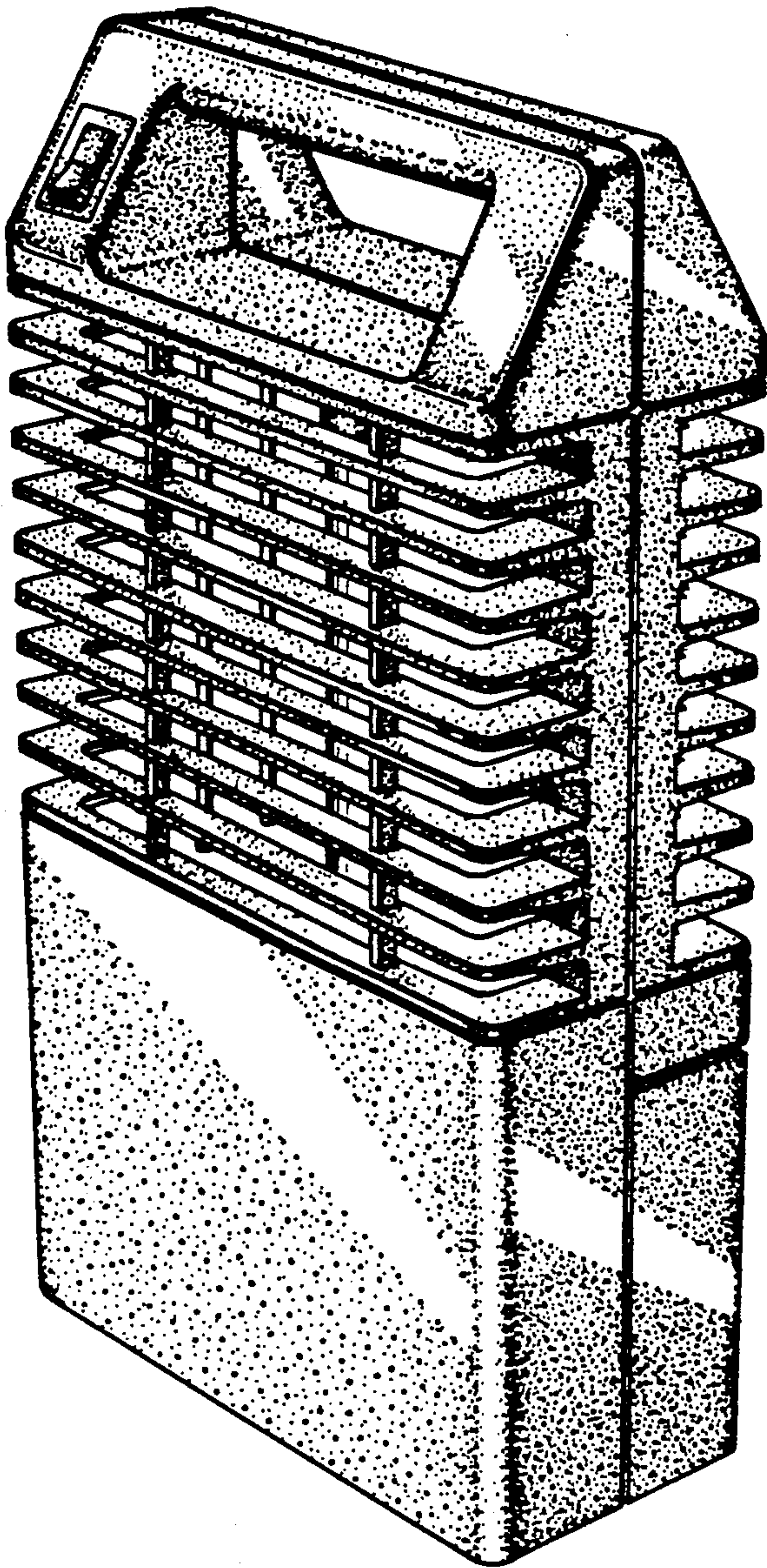

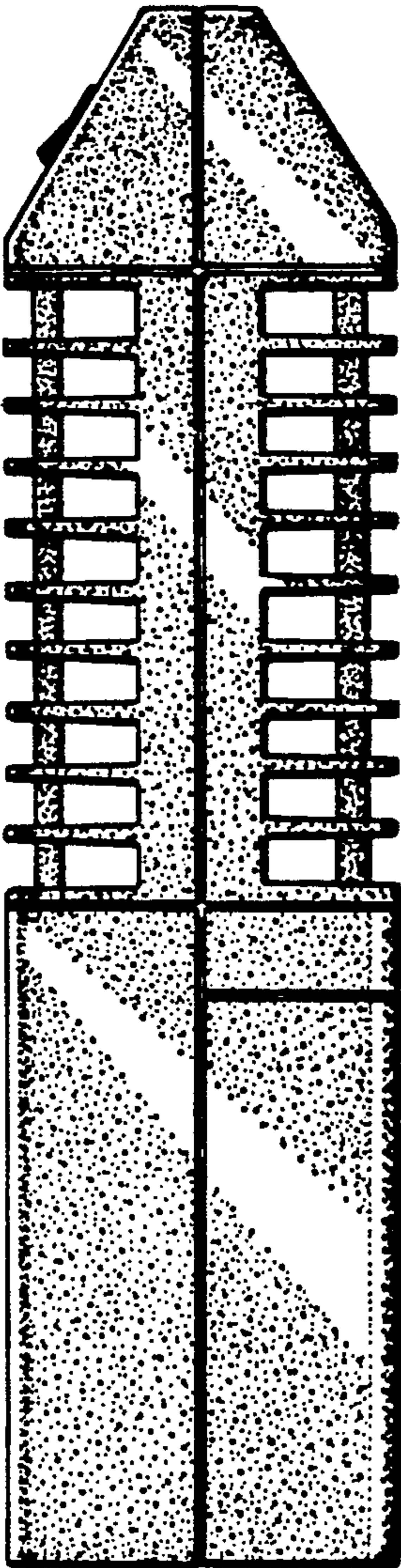

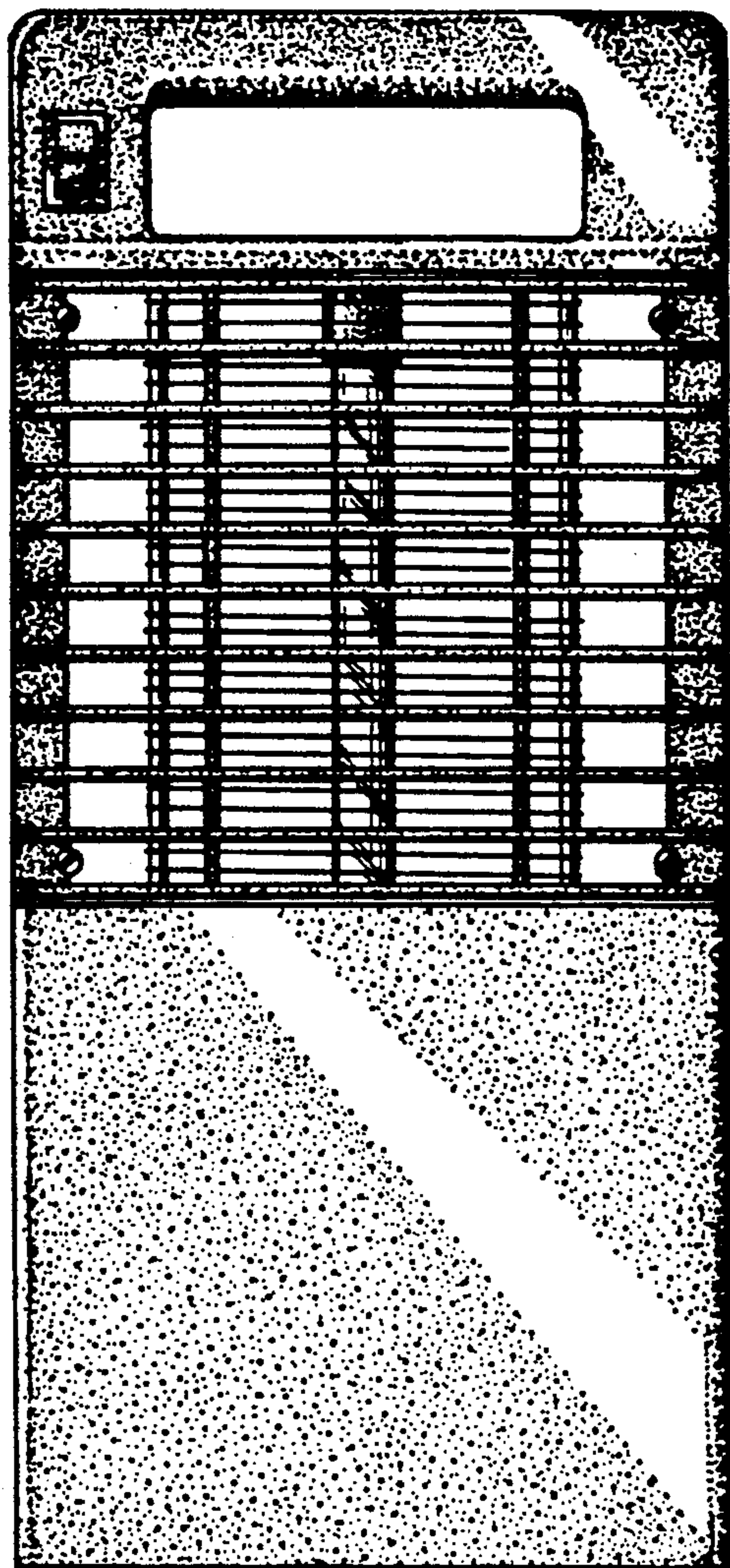

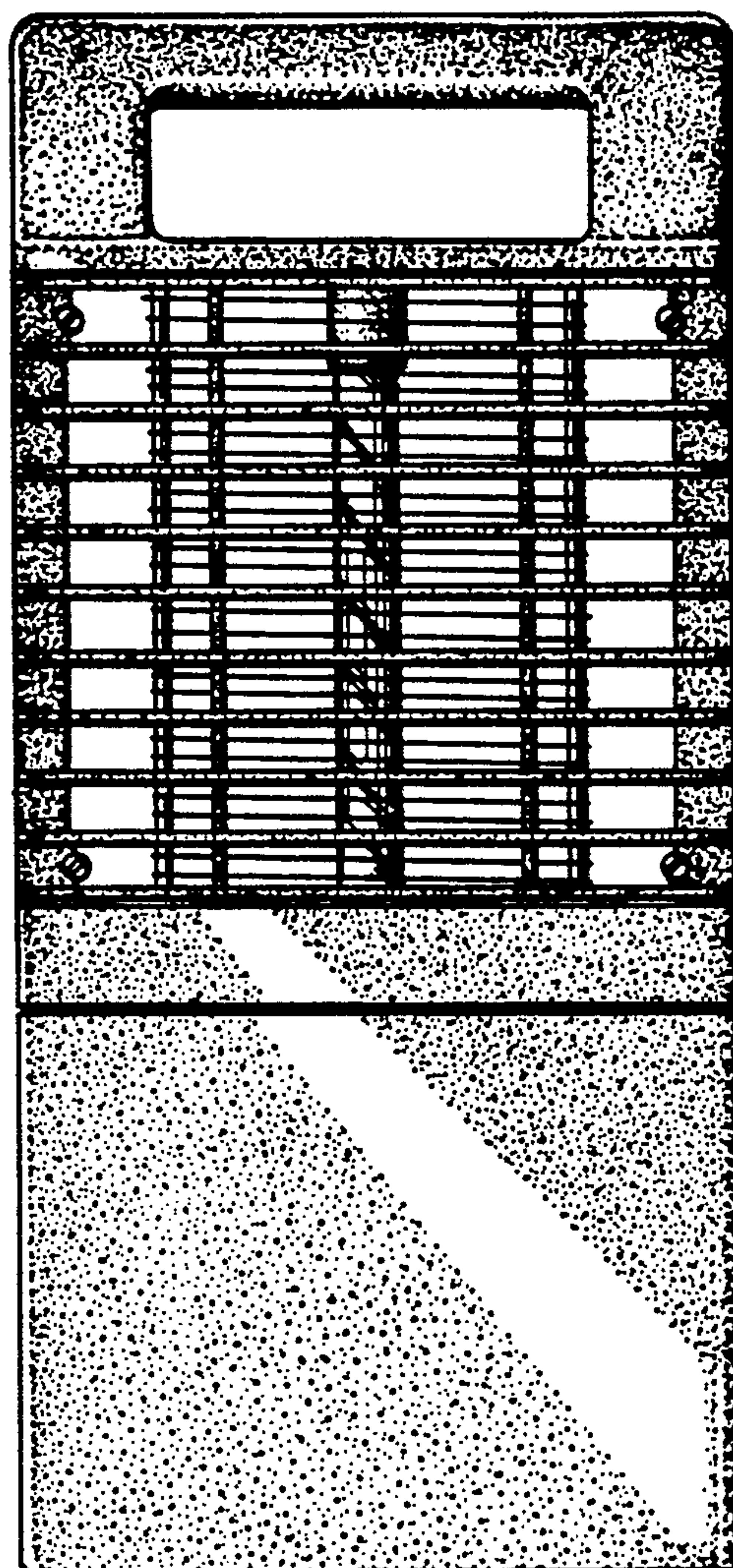

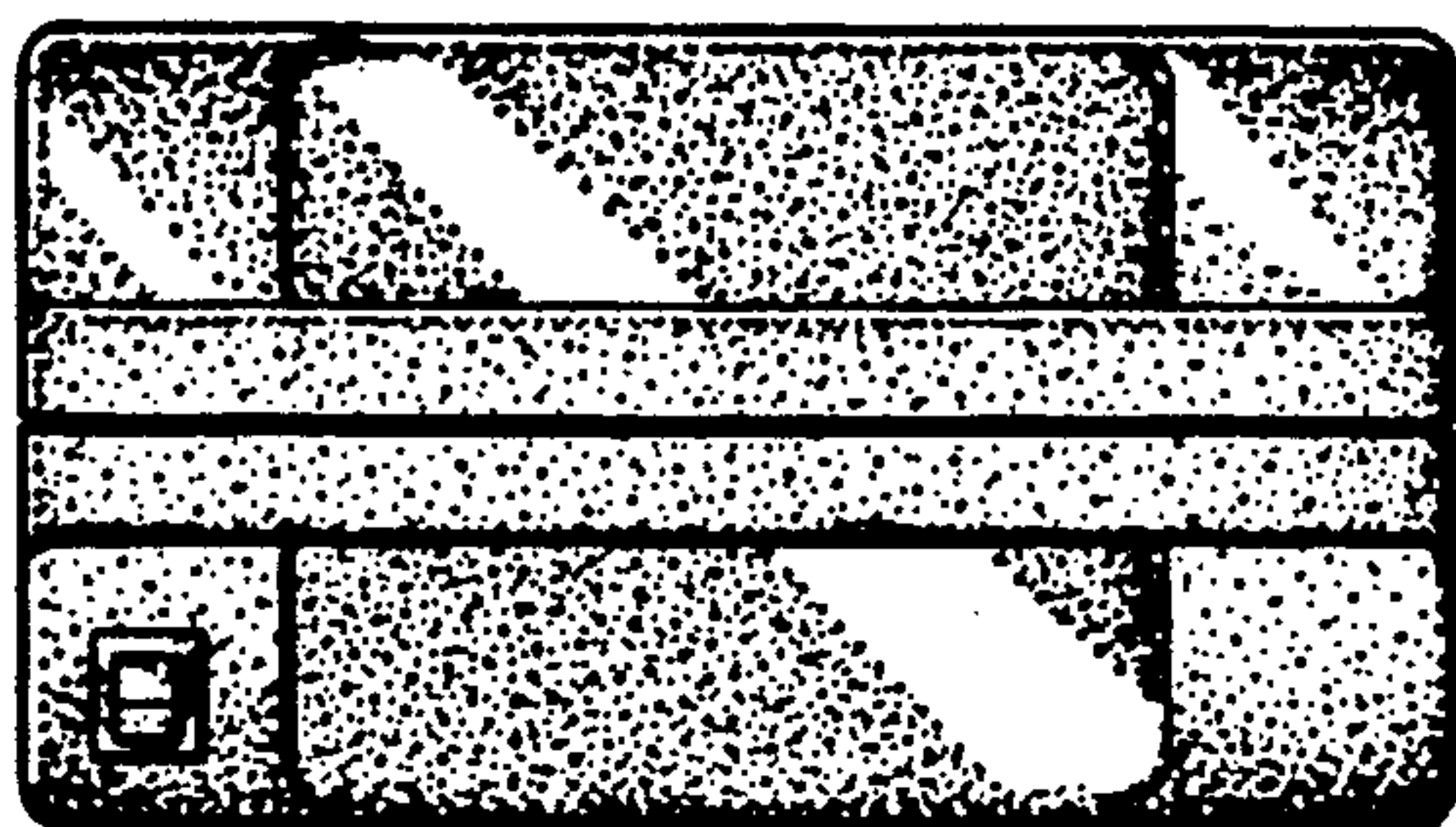

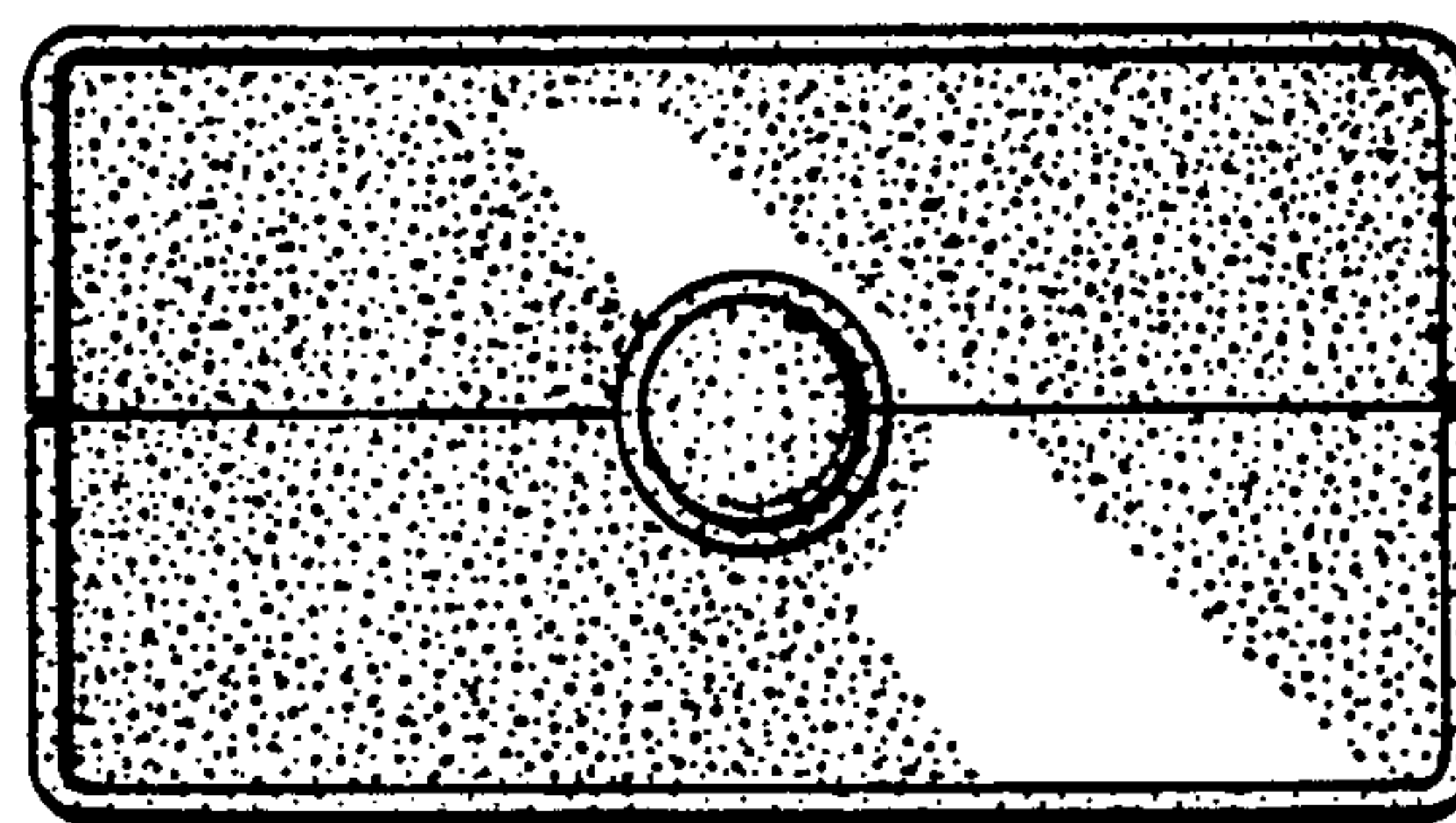
