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[57] **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a combined jacket and separable hood, substantially as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a combined jacket and separable hood showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 7 is an inside elevational view thereof, in an open position;

FIG. 8 is a front perspective view thereof, the hood shown lowered;

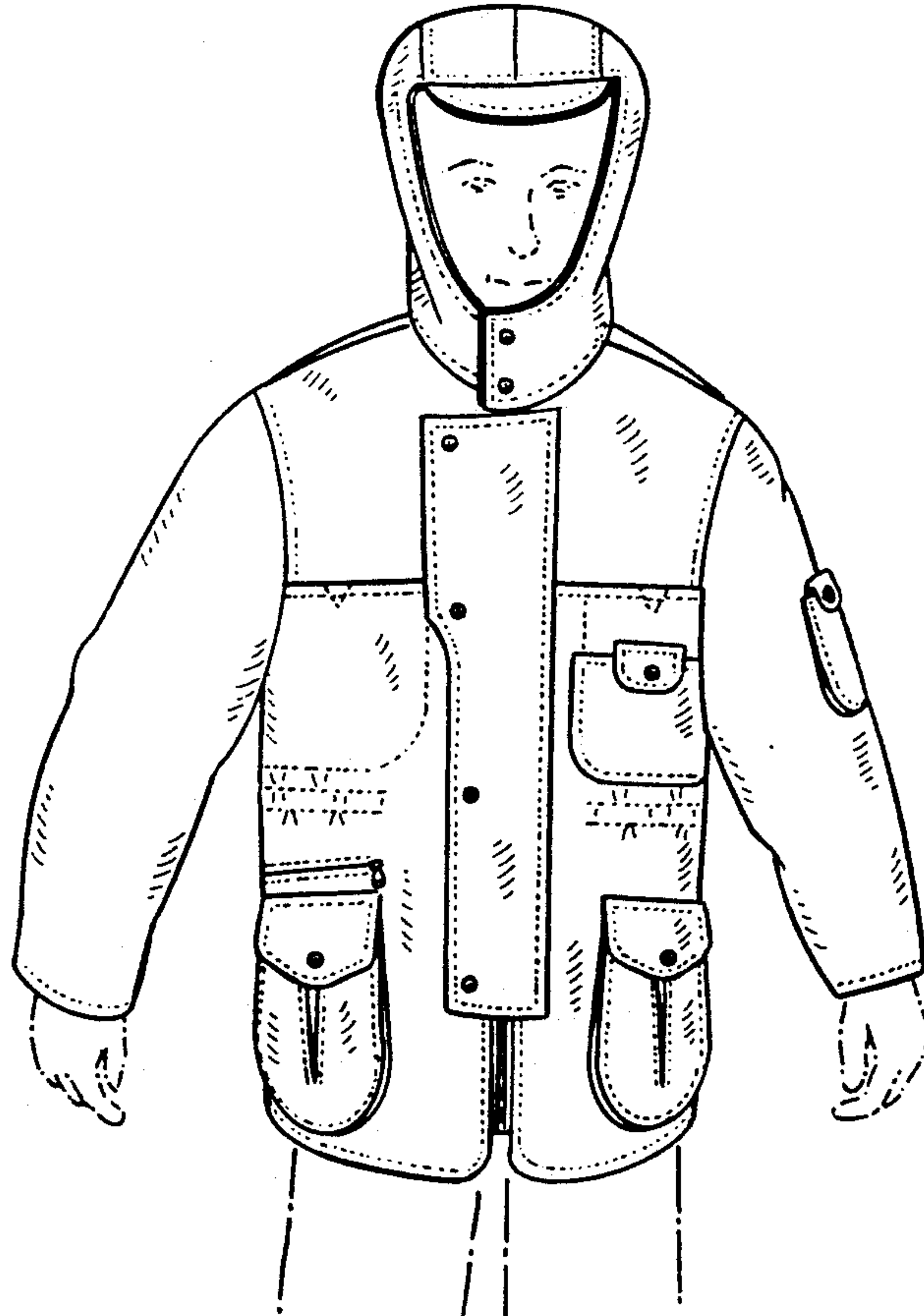
FIG. 9 is a rear perspective view of FIG. 8;

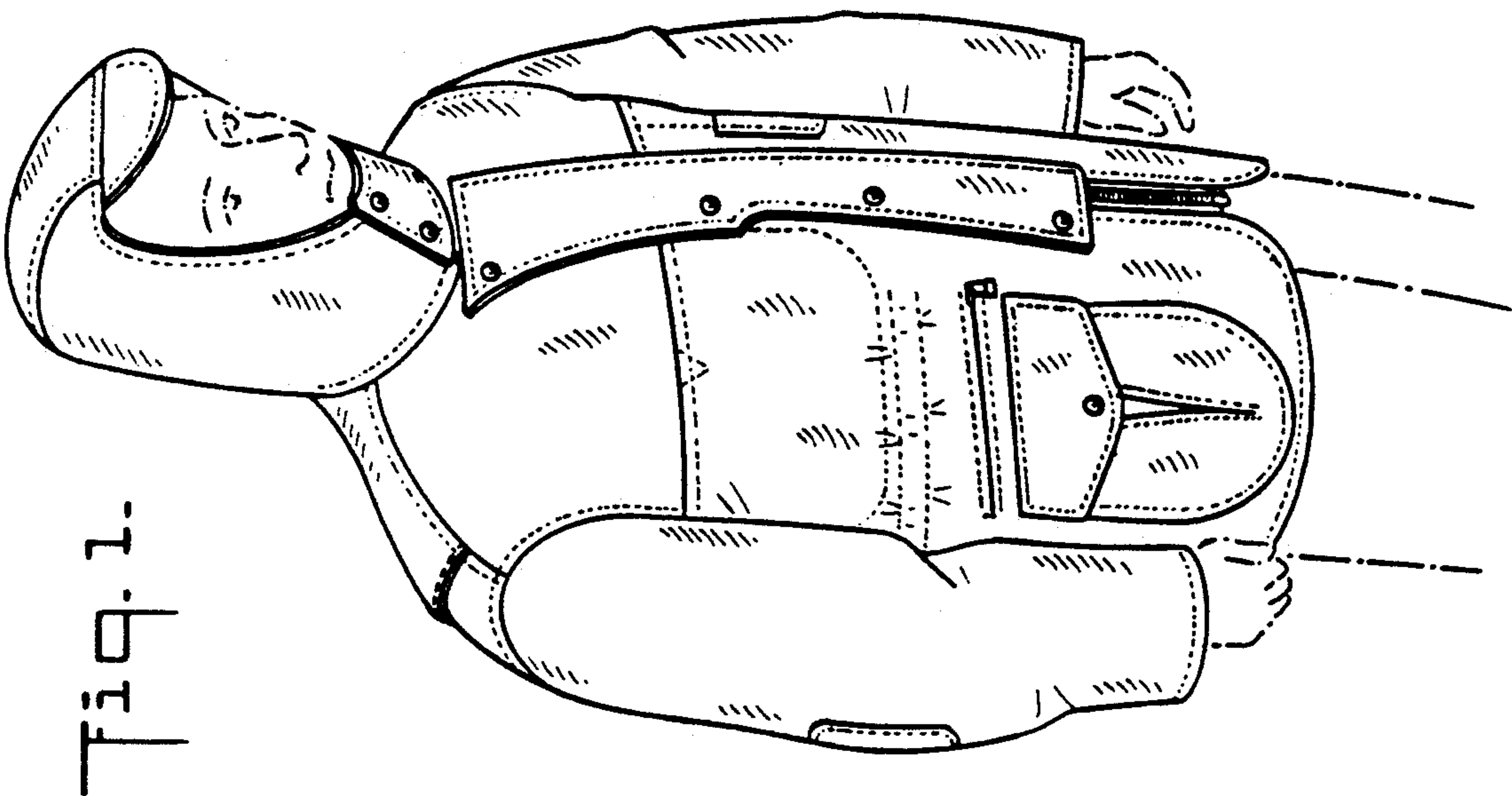
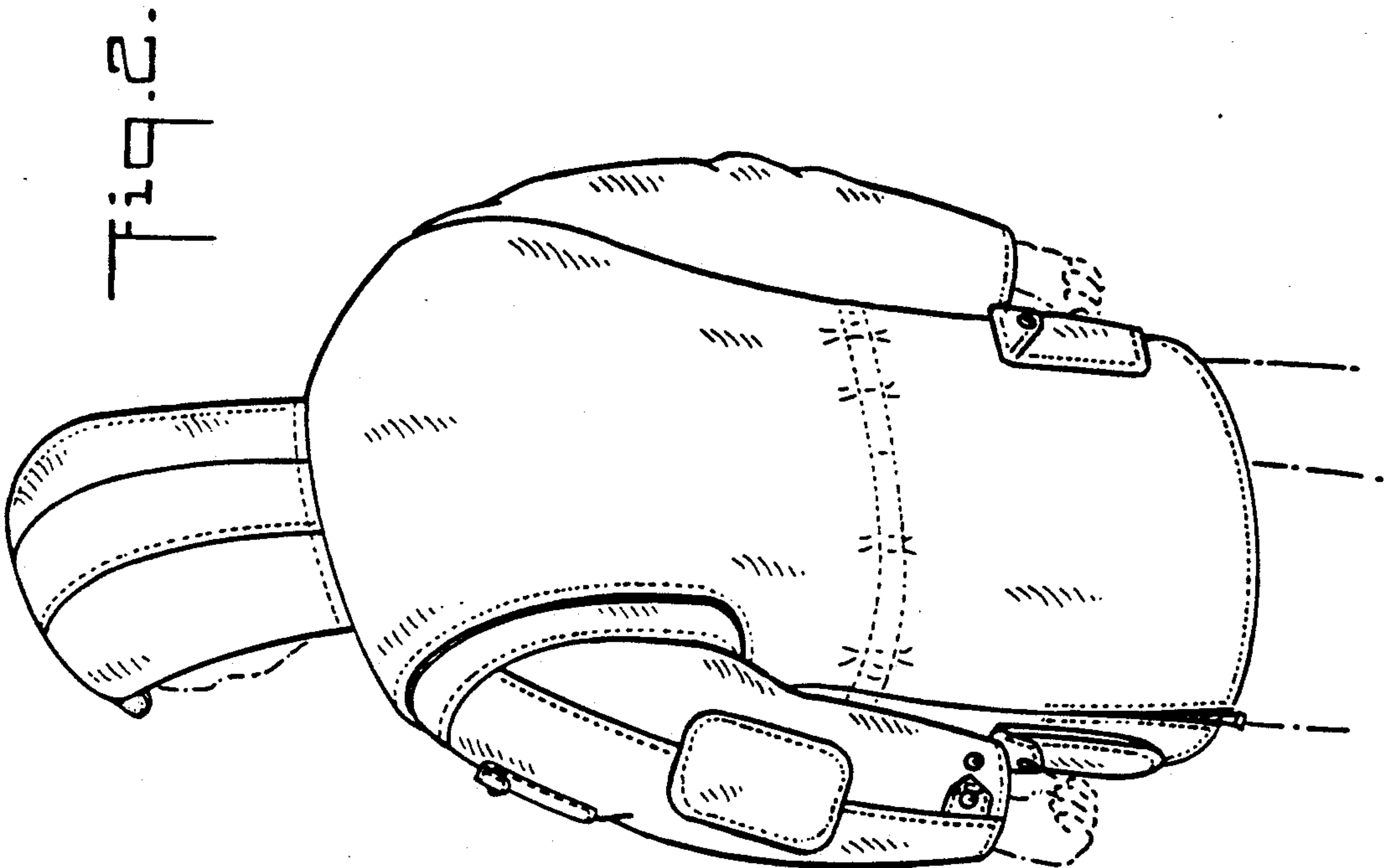
FIG. 10 is a perspective view of FIG. 1, the hood being completely removed; and

The dotted lines shown throughout the views represent conventional stitching.





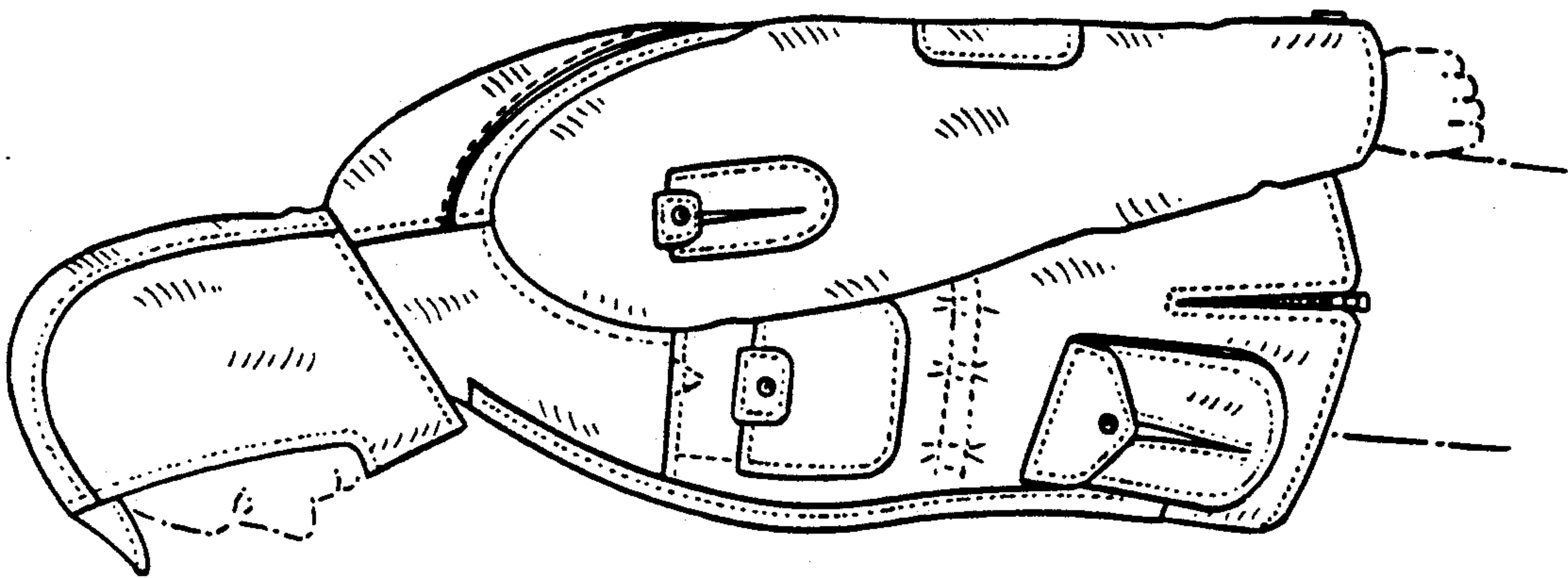

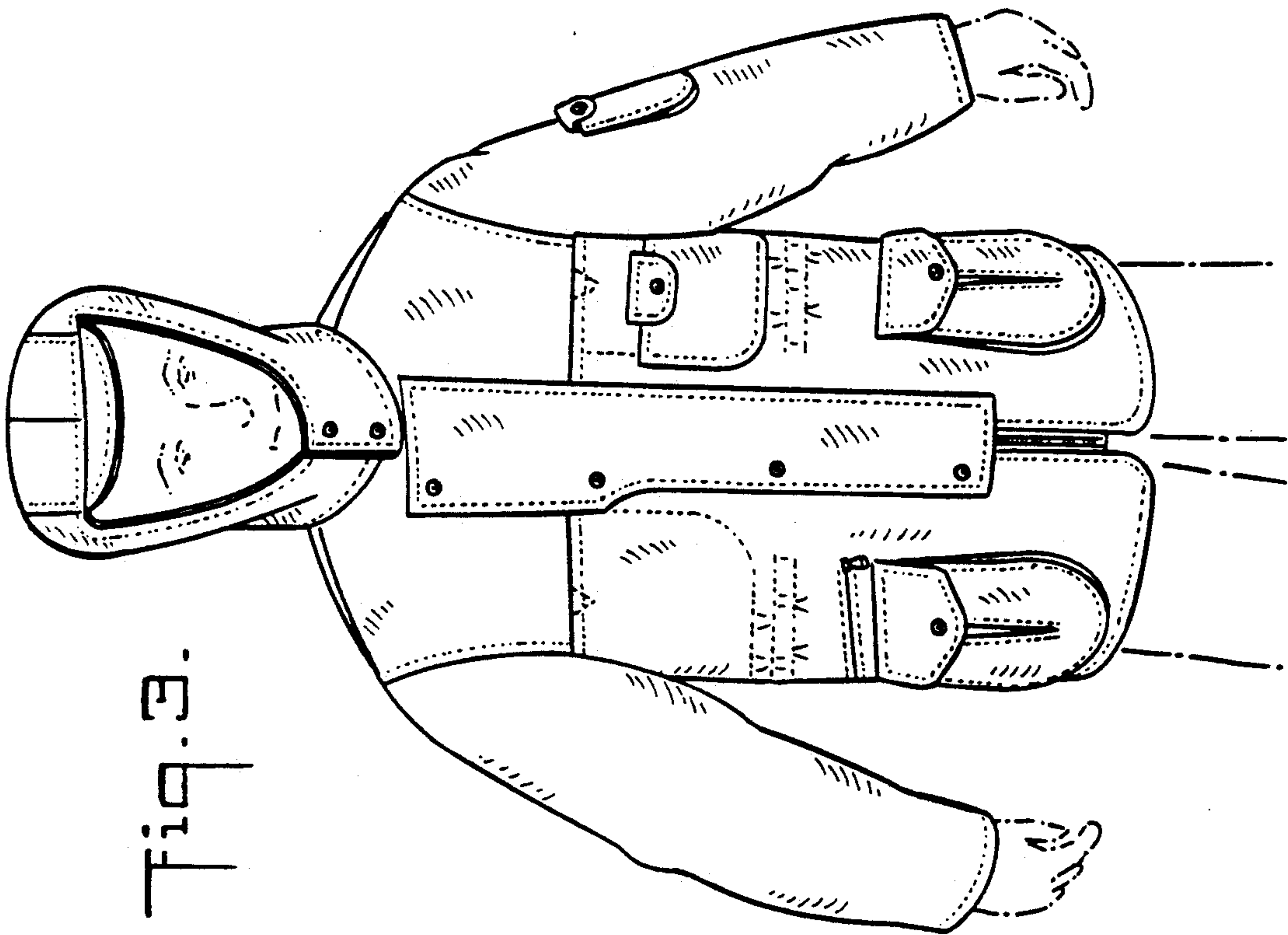

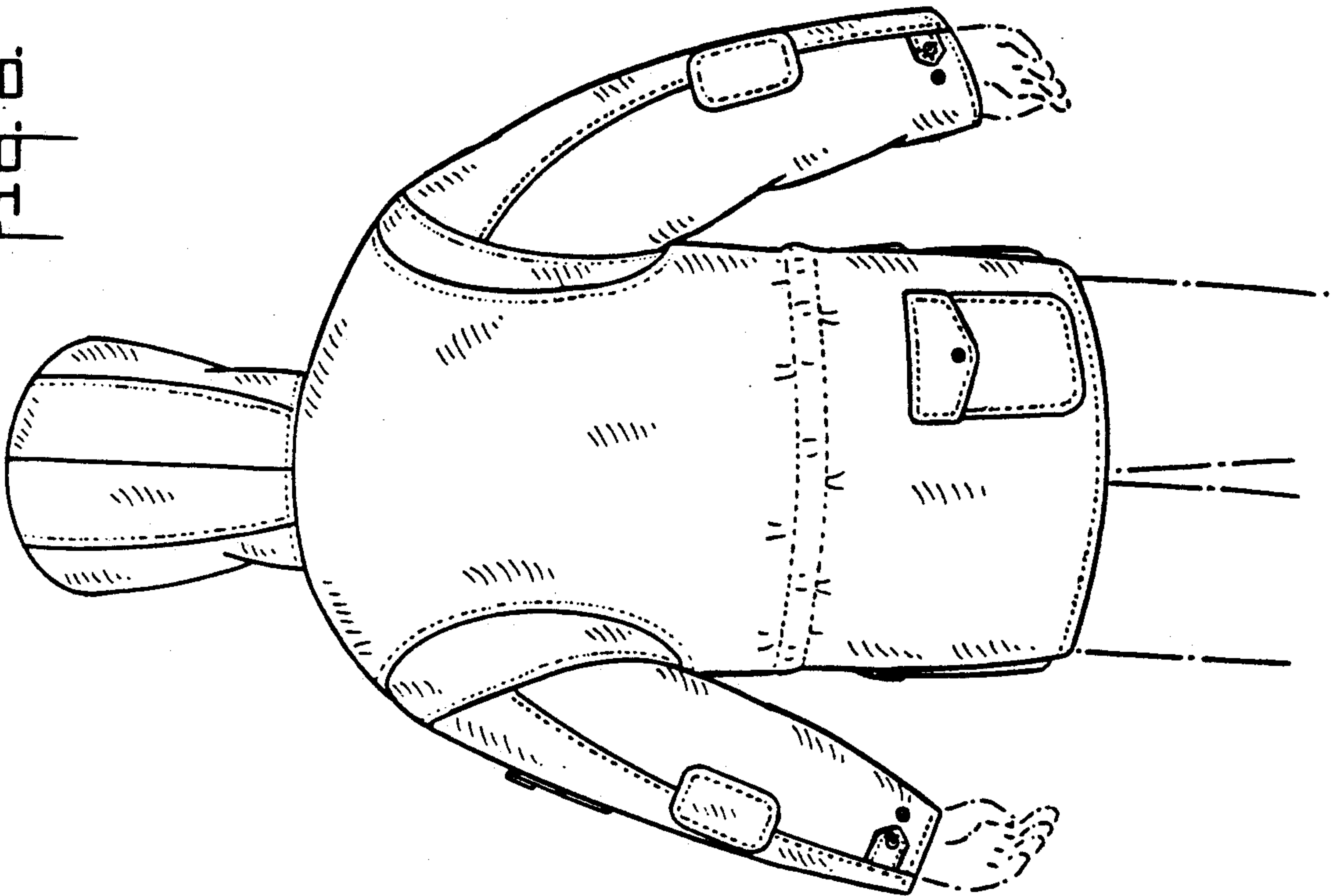
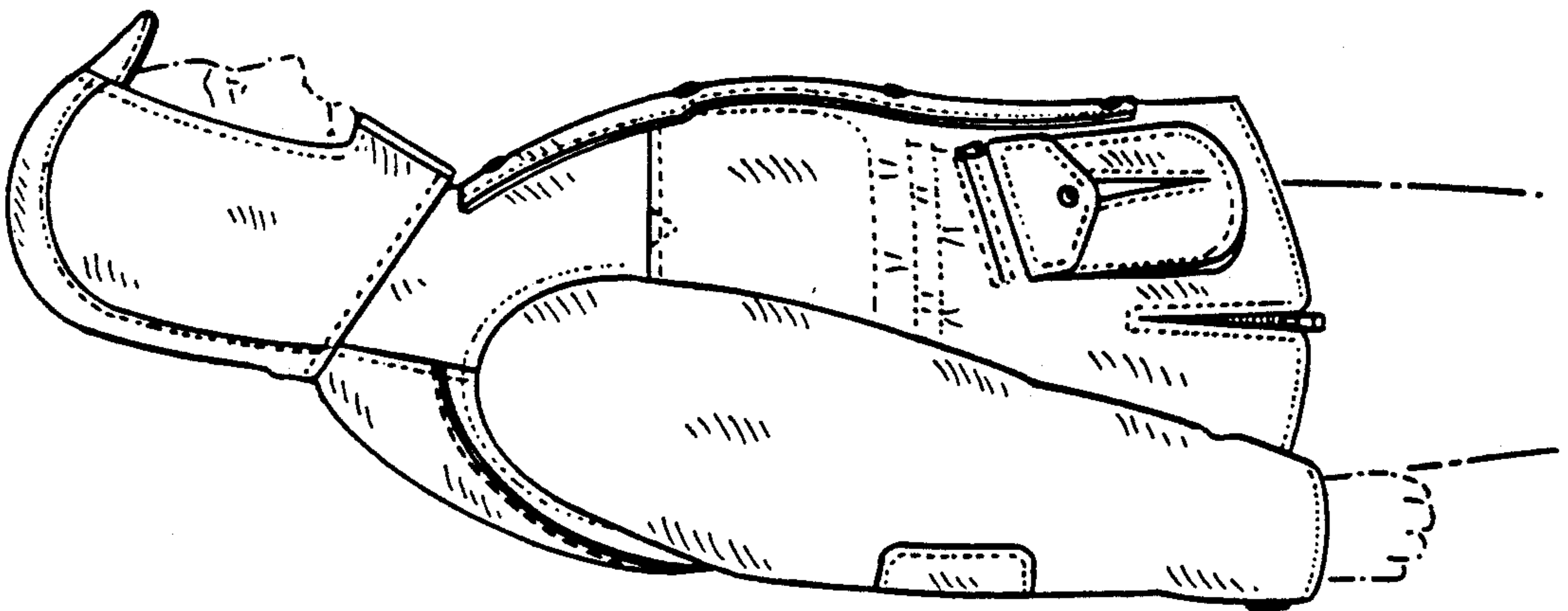
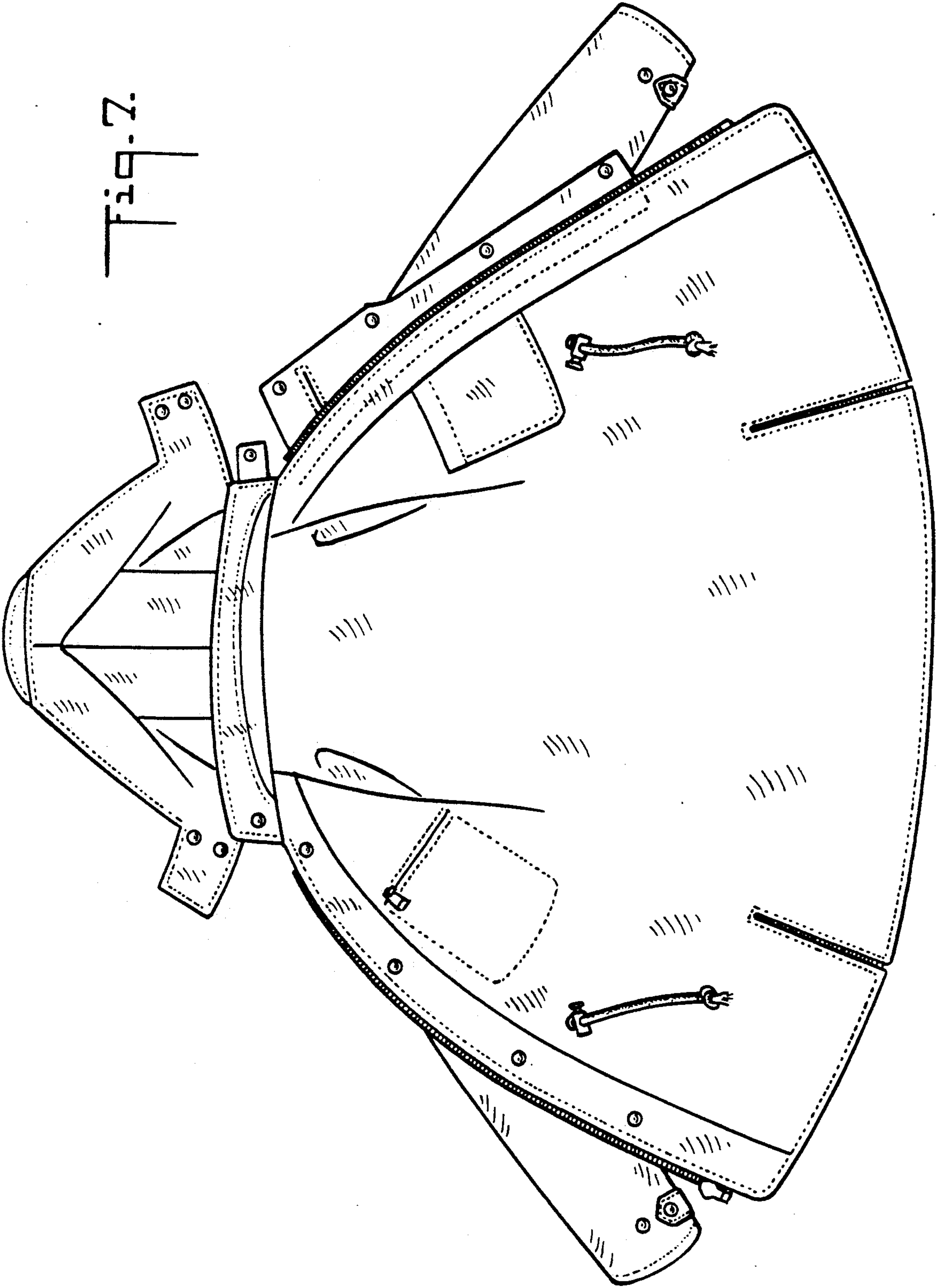

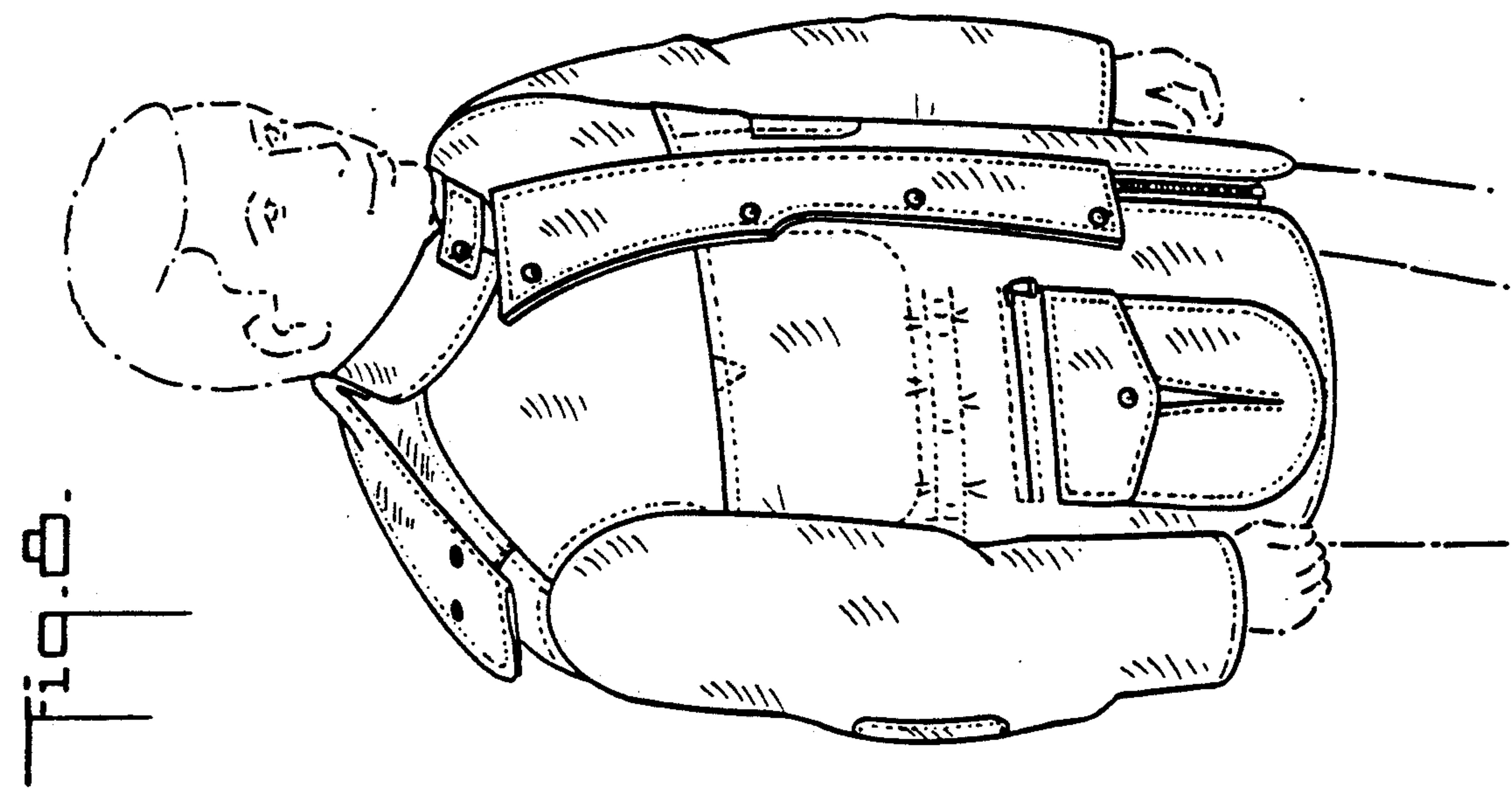
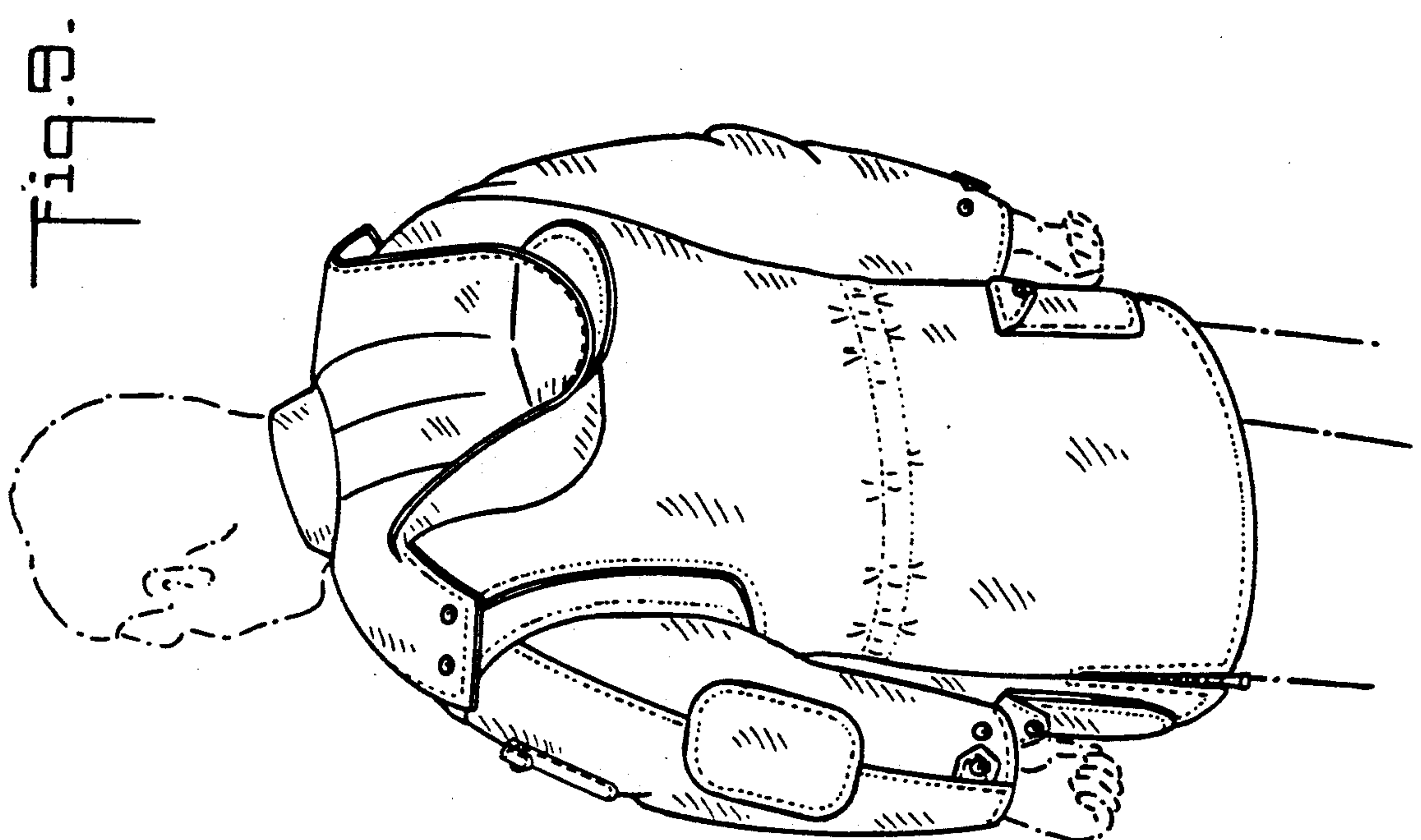

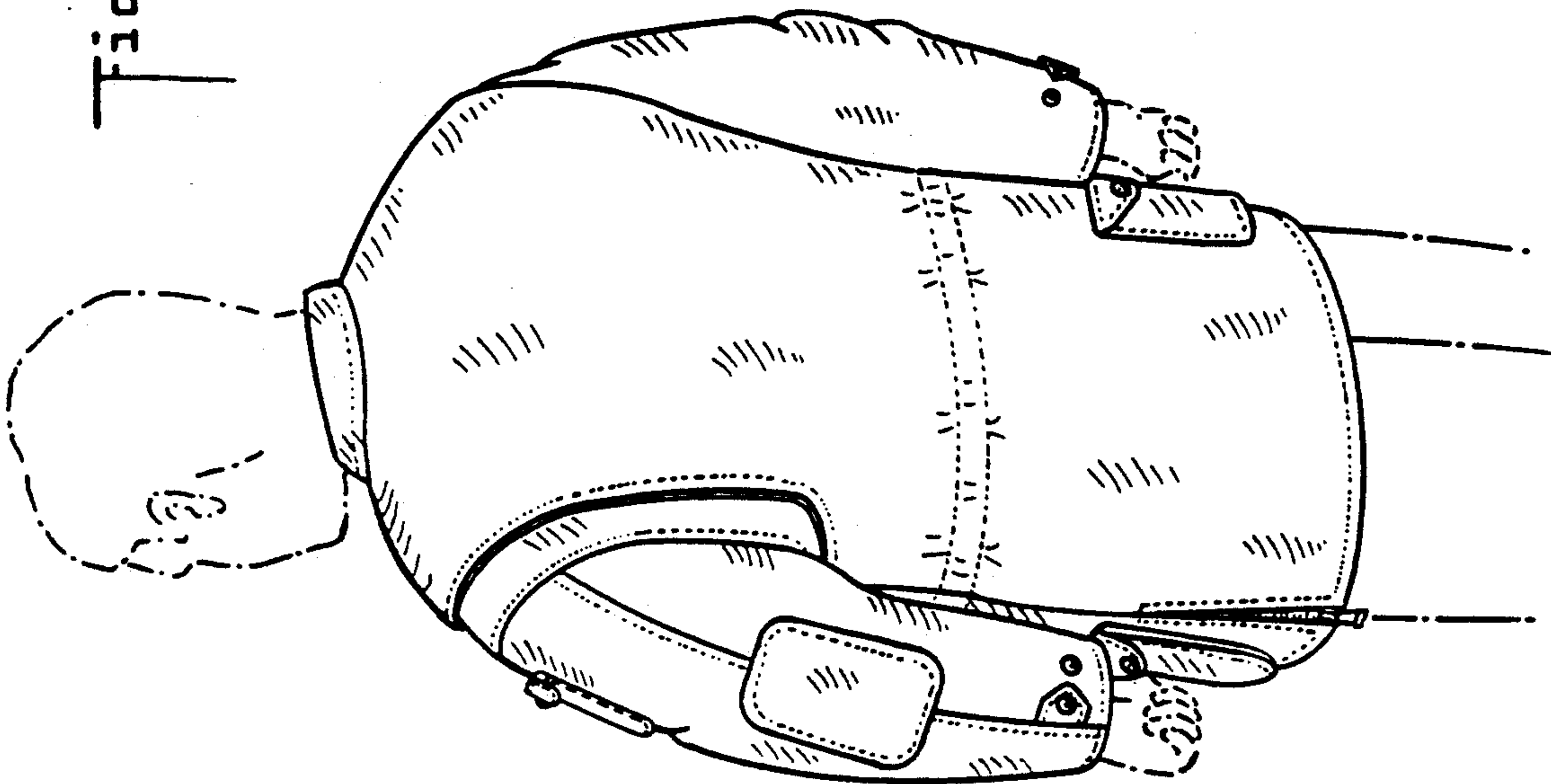
