[57] CLAIM

The ornamental design for a combined handle and escutcheon, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the combined handle and escutcheon showing my new design;

FIG. 12 is a bottom view of FIG. 7.

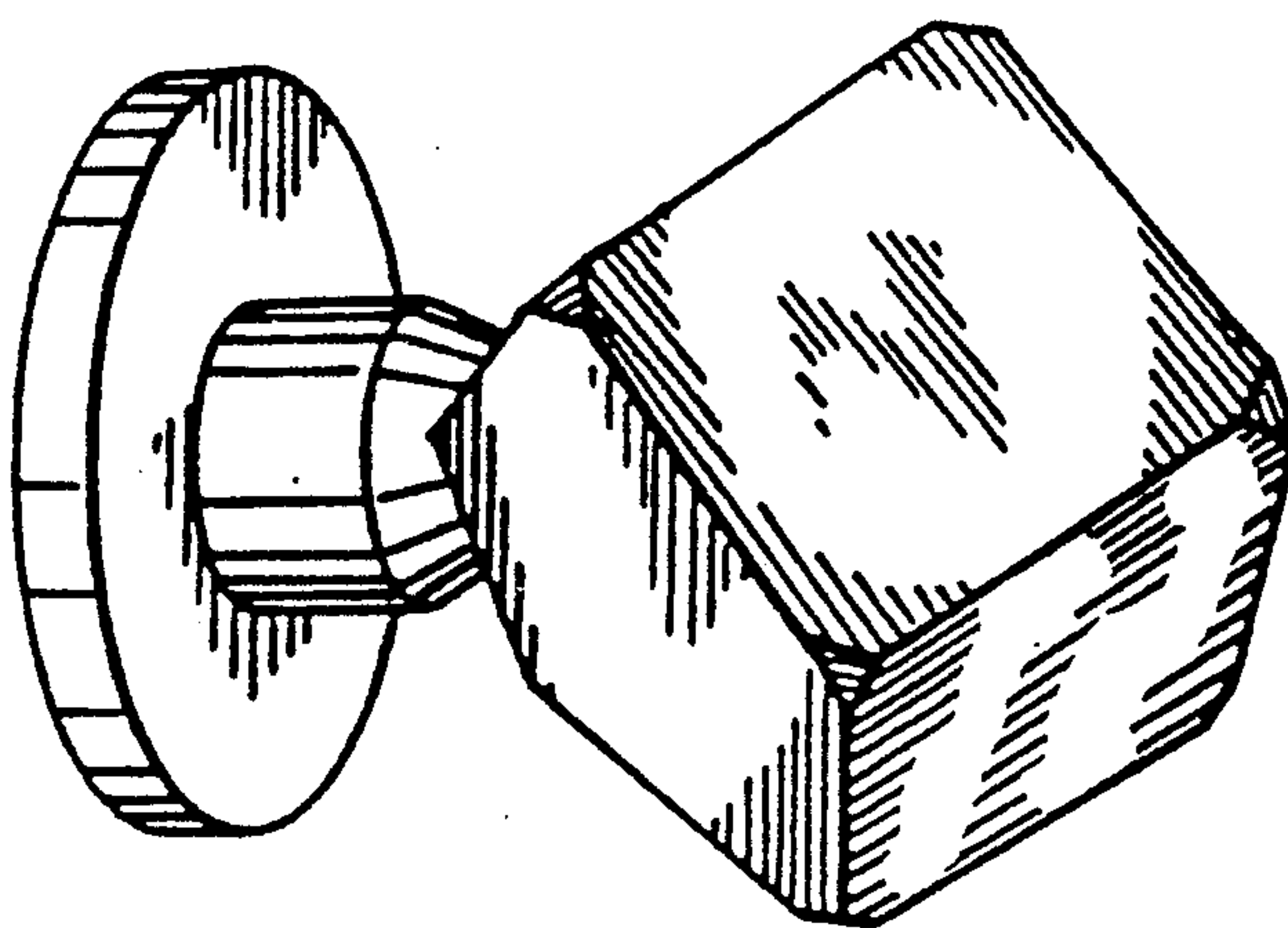
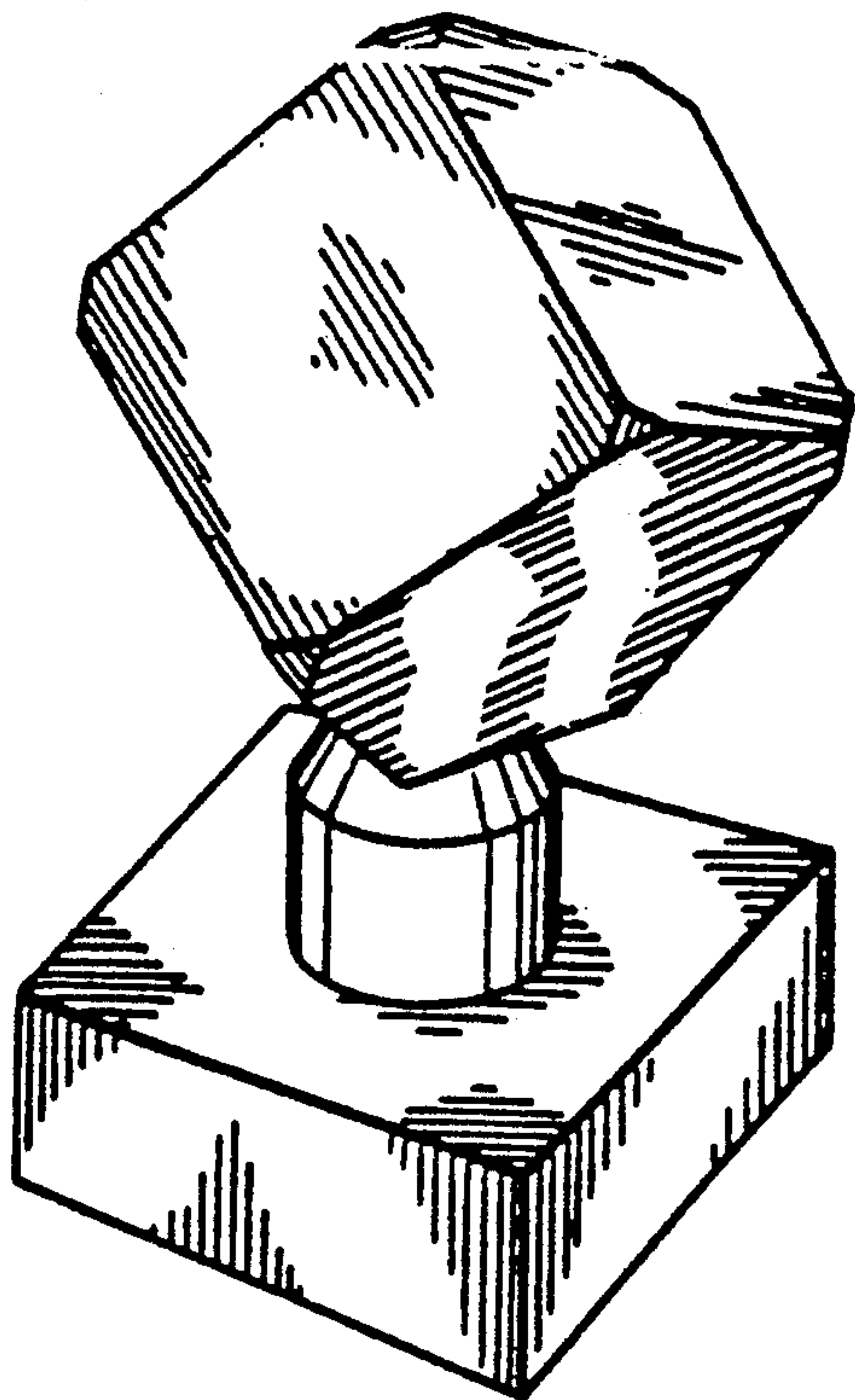

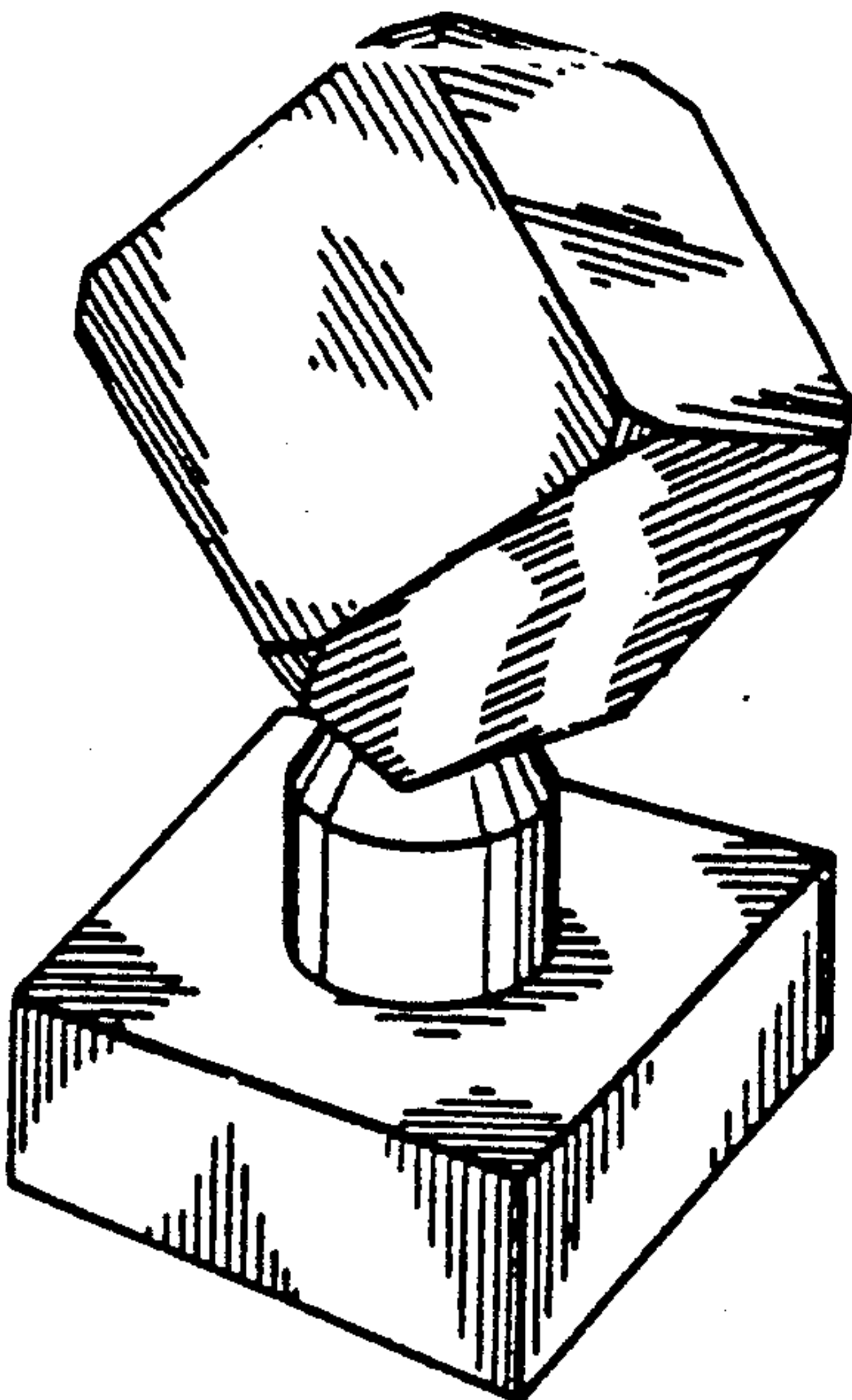

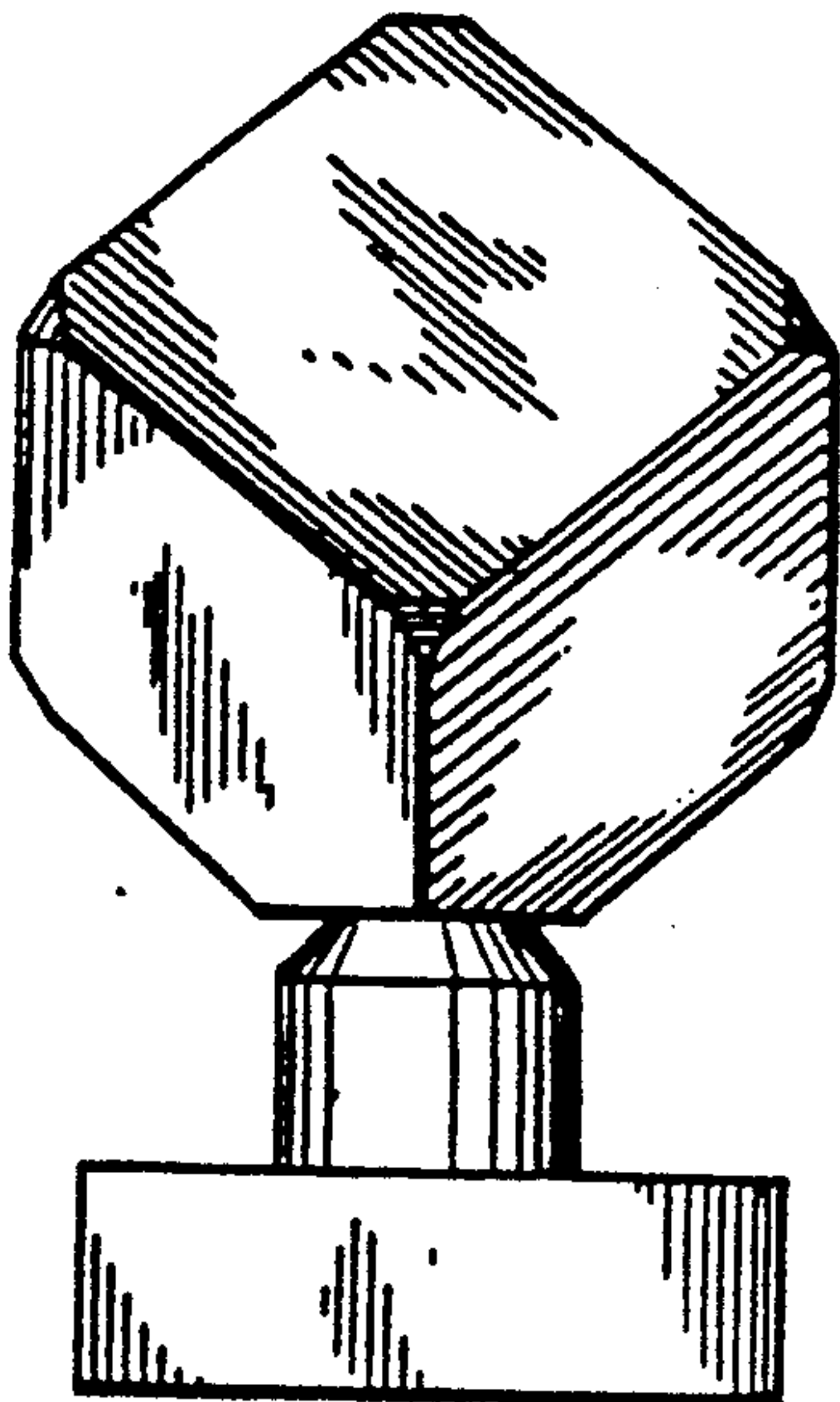

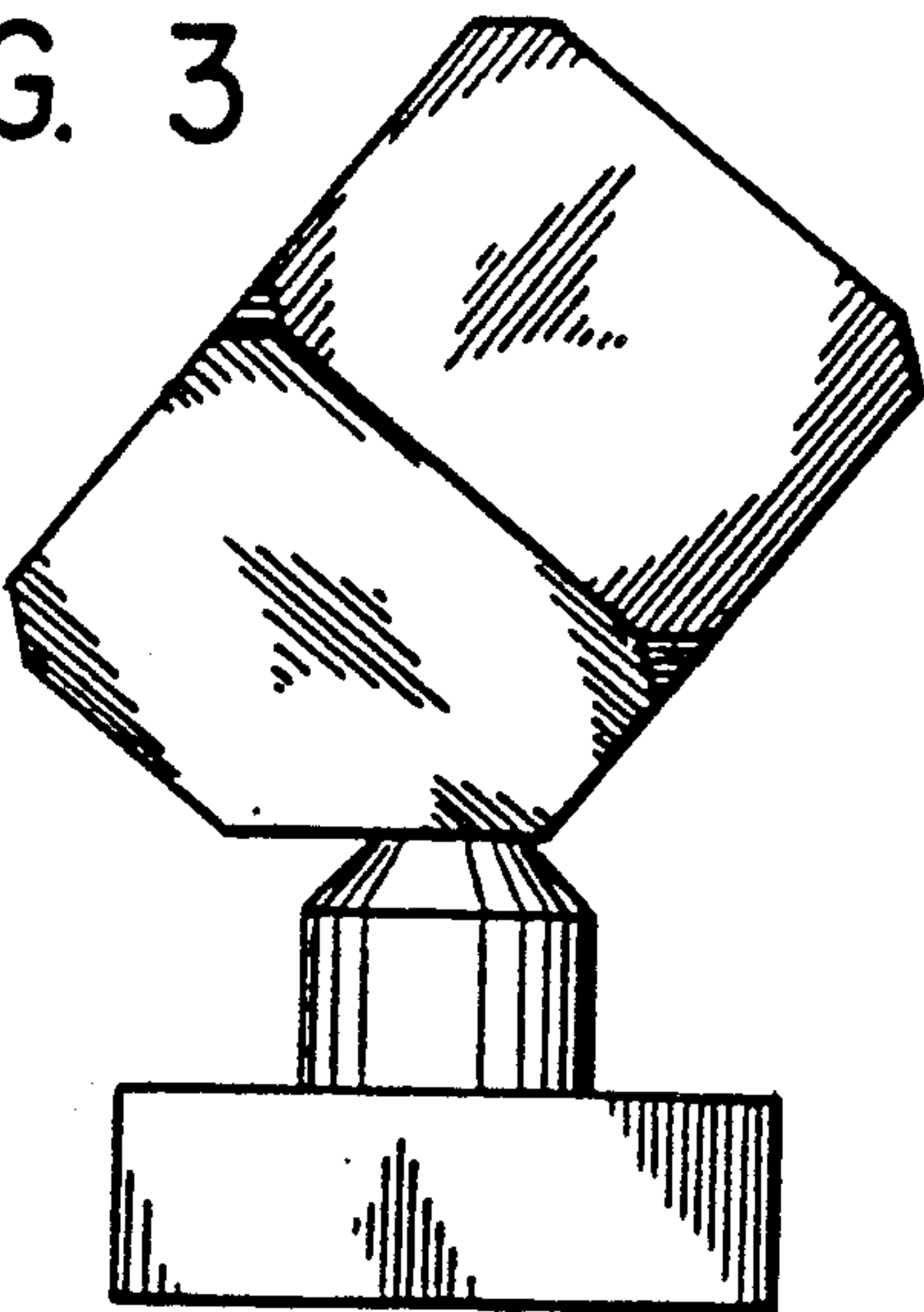

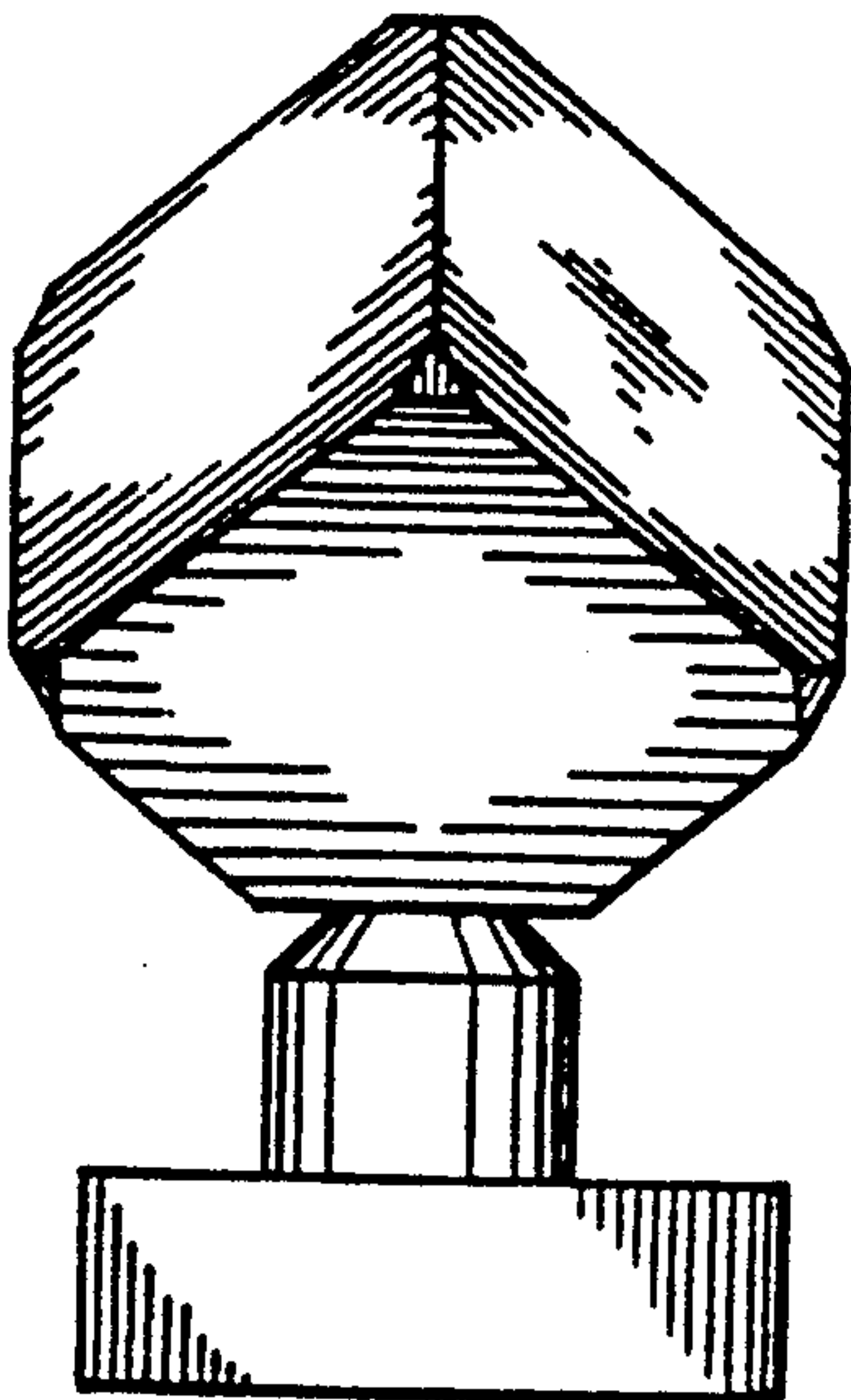

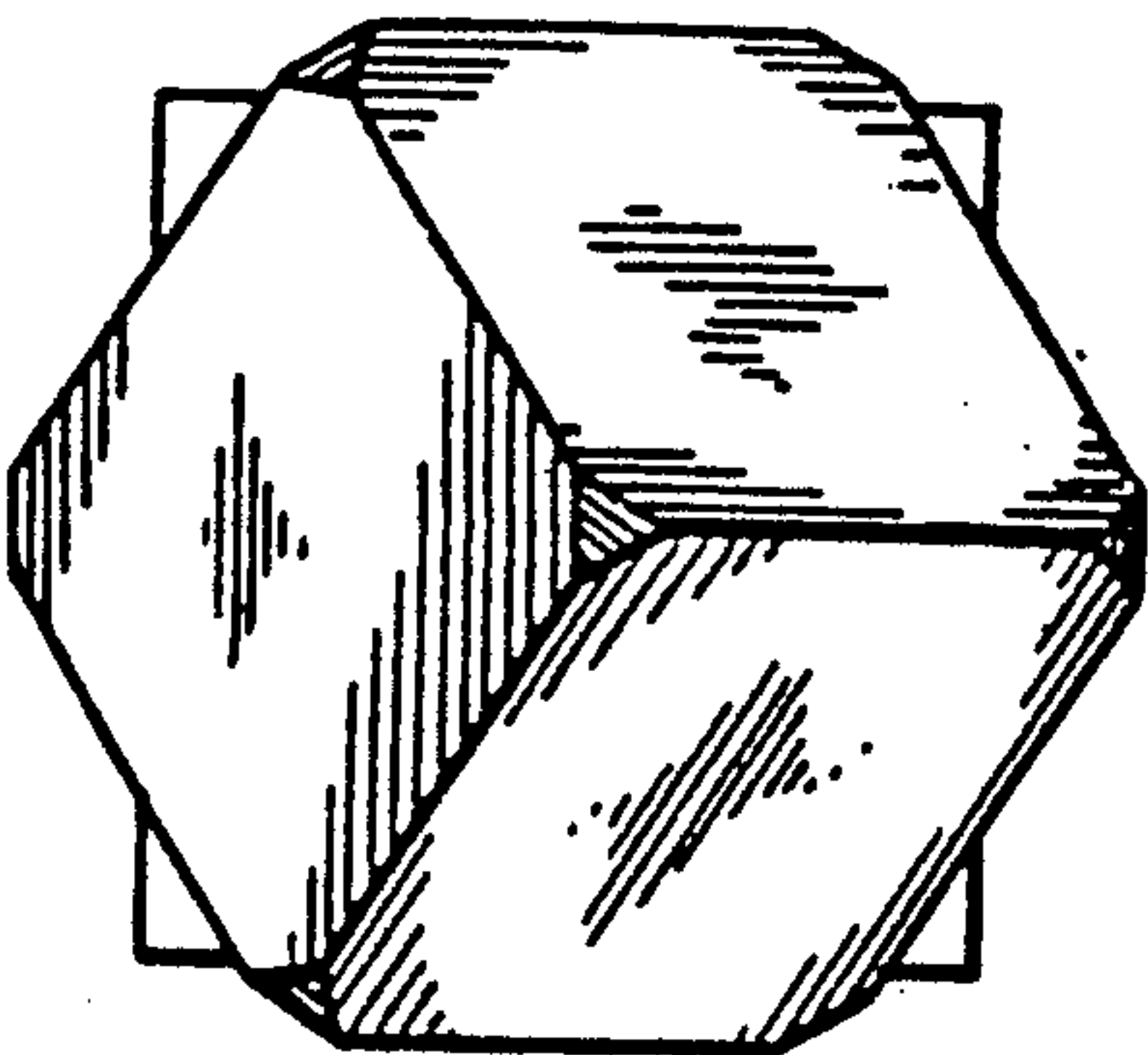

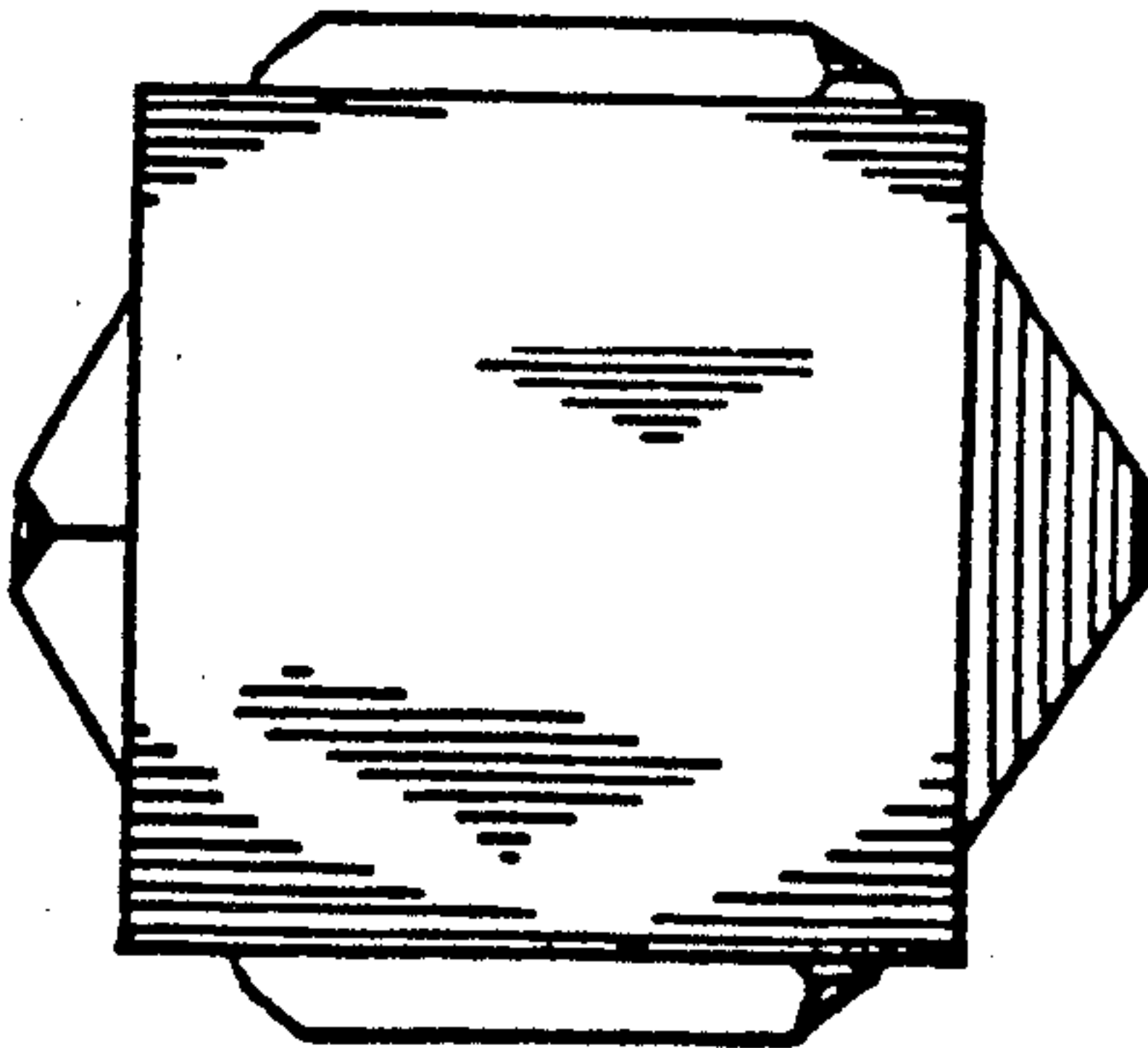

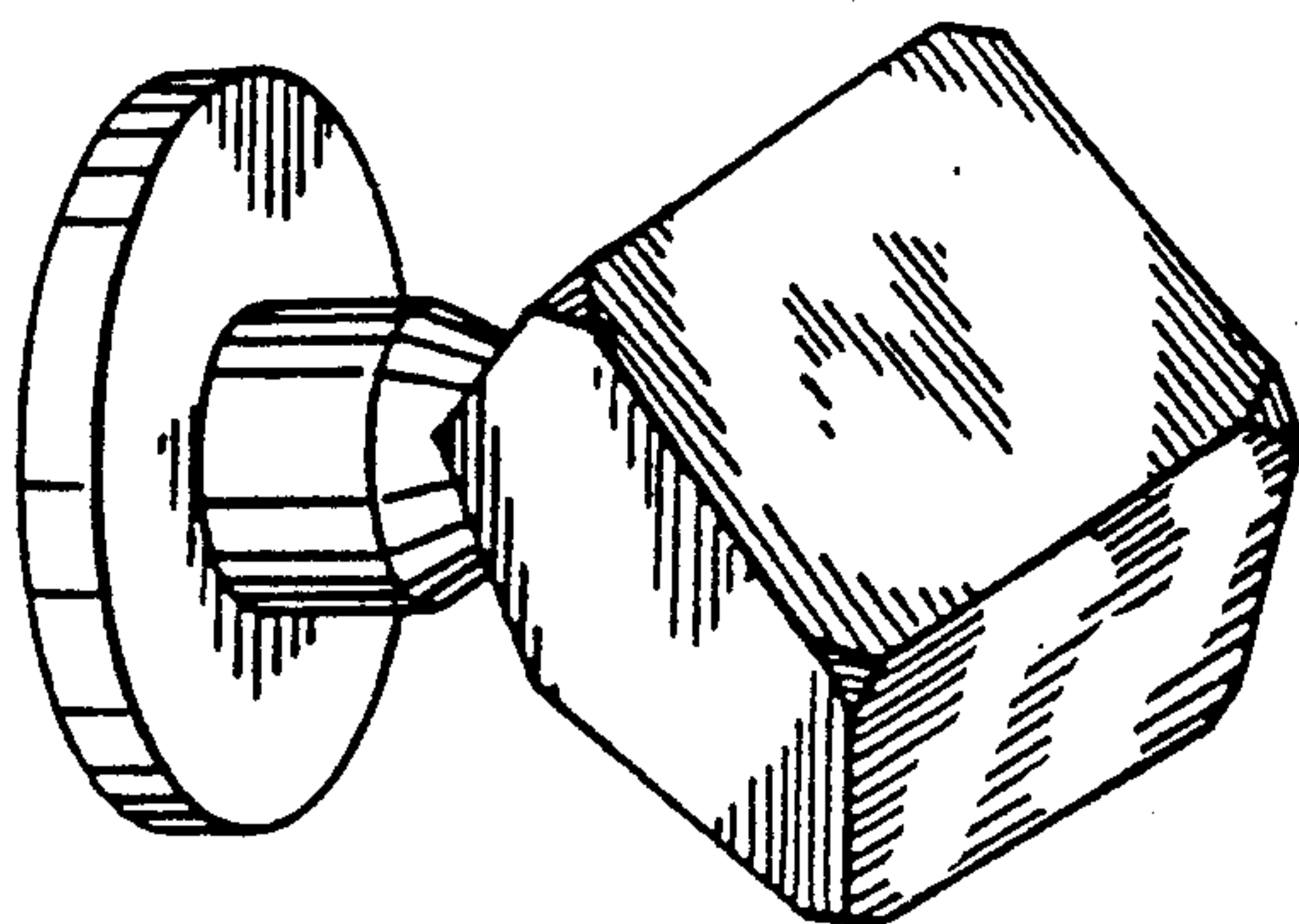

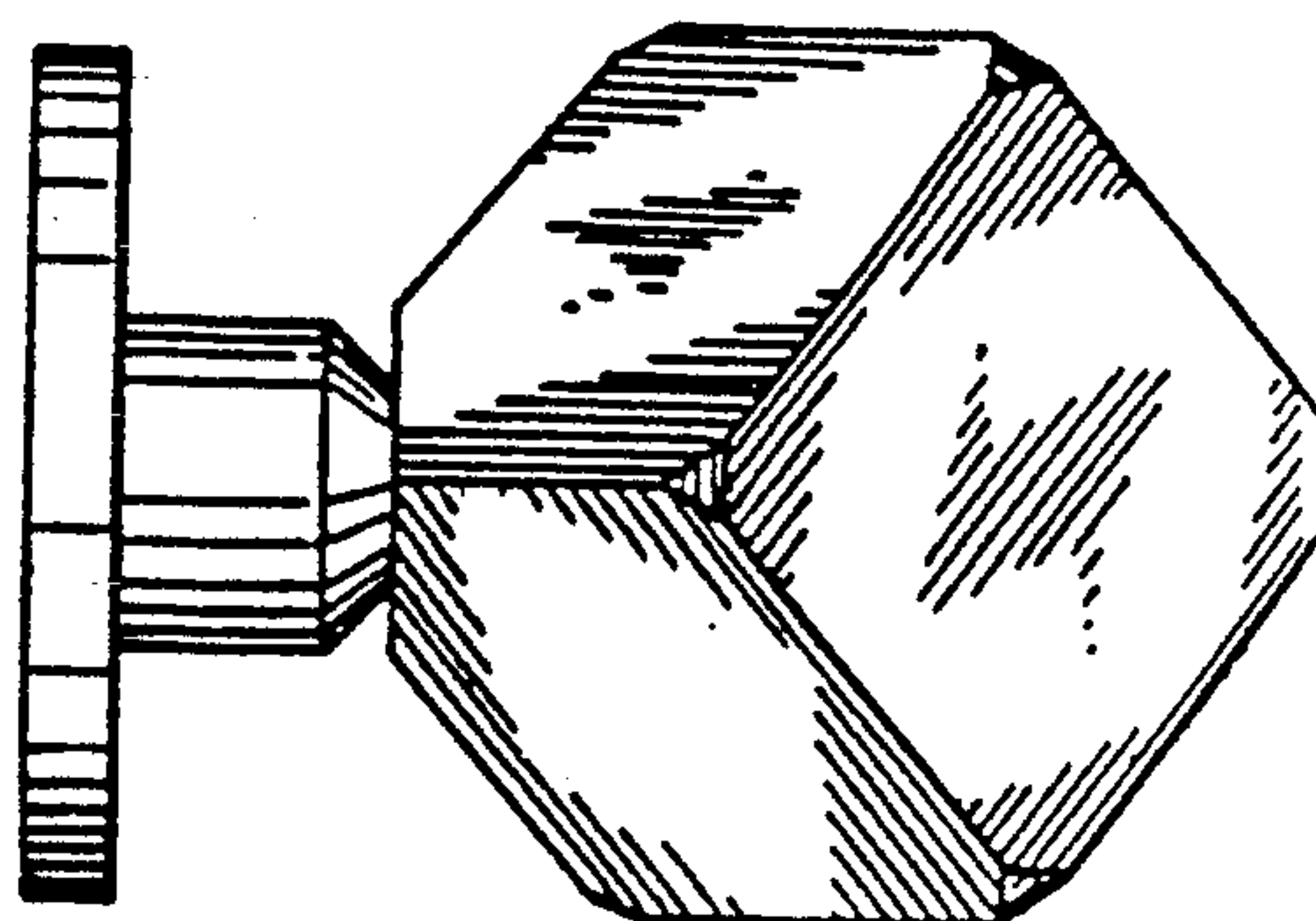

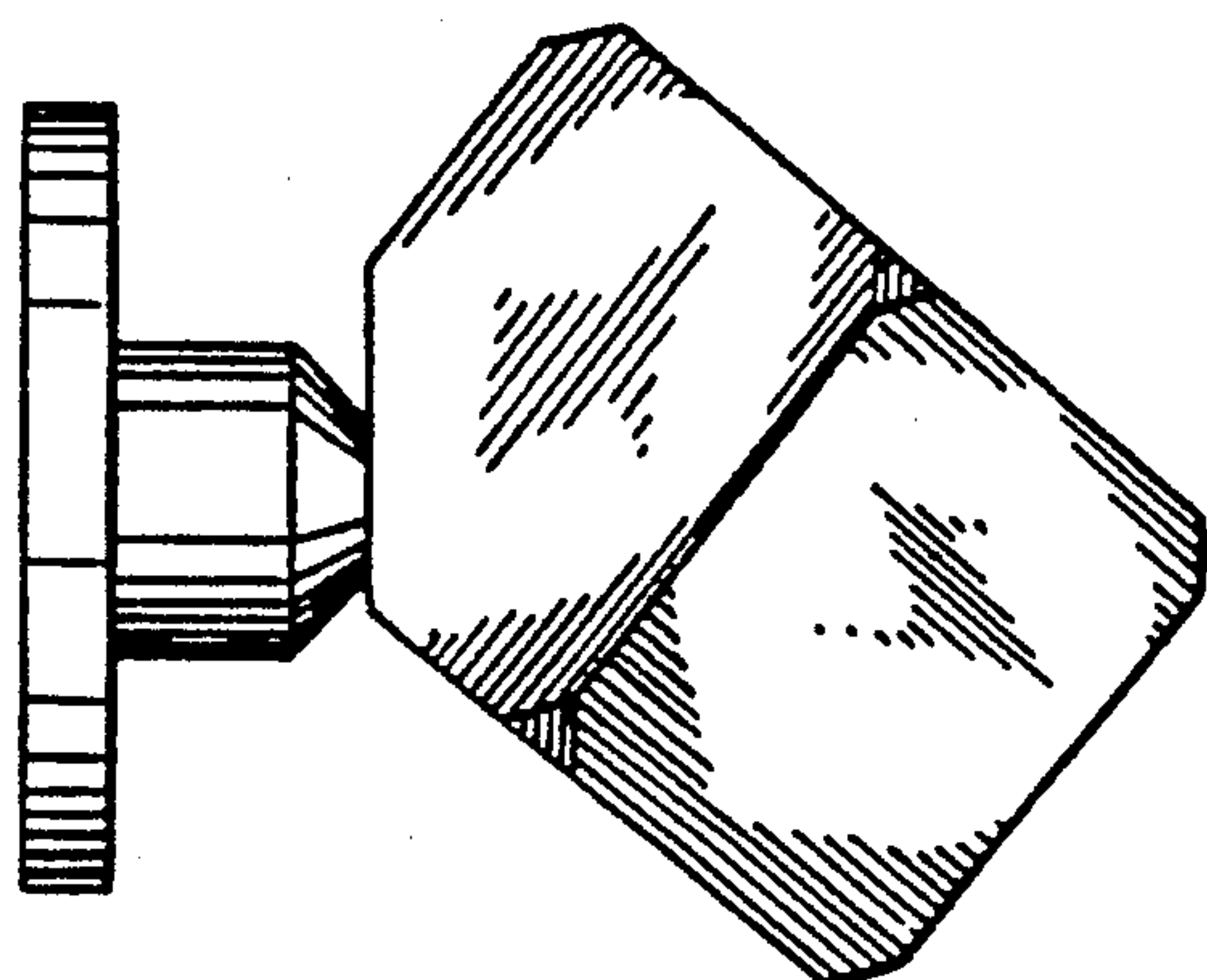

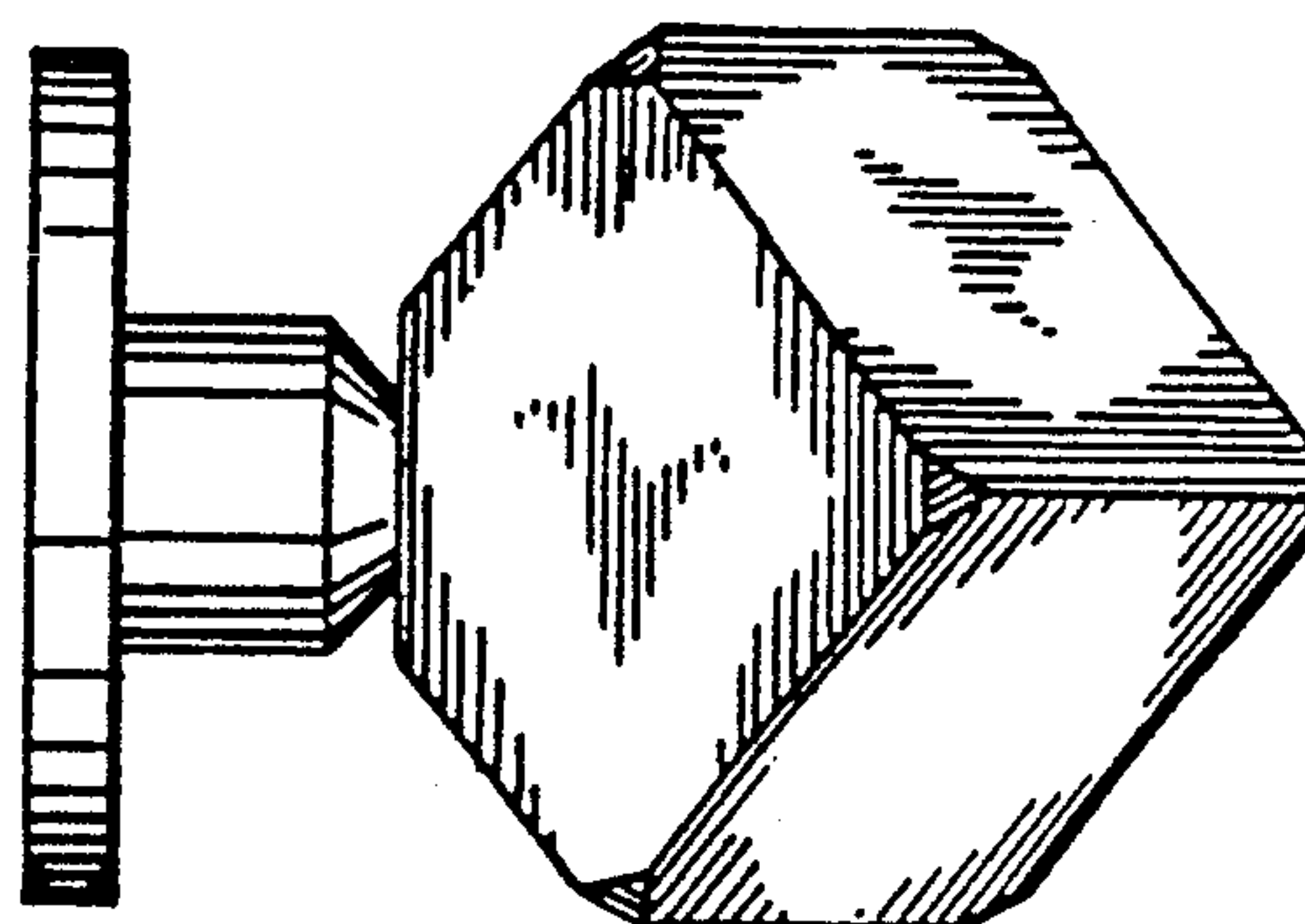

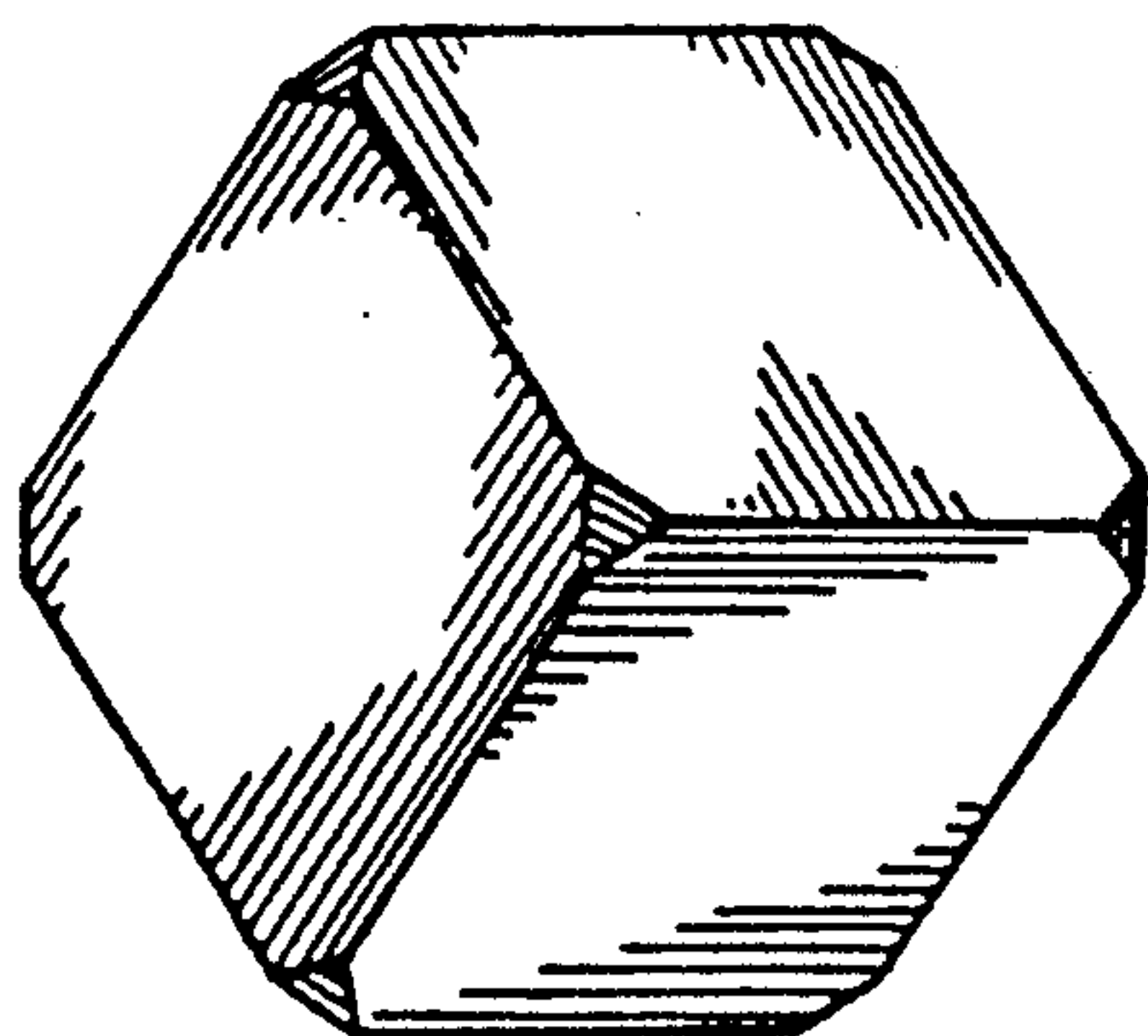
